## Ways Slavery Affected Black Families And Still Has An Impact Today

### Broken Traditions

African family traditions, which varied according to national origin and religion, could not be replicated in the New World after Africans were forced into slavery. The slave trade was responsible for breaking up African families. Husbands, wives and children could be sold separately because U.S. law did not legally recognize their families.

### Broken Families

Enslaved Black people were denied a secure family life. Because they were property and could not legally marry, a permanent family could not be a guaranteed part of enslaved people's lives. They had no right to live or stay together, no right to their own children, and it was common for enslaved parents and children to live apart.

### Illiteracy


Schooling was not an option for enslaved children, and, in most states, it was illegal to teach enslaved Black people to read and write.

### Unpaid Workforce

This use of unpaid labor to produce wealth lay at the heart of slavery in America. Enslaved people usually worked from early in the morning until late at night. Women often returned to work shortly after giving birth, sometimes running from the fields during the day to feed their infants.

### Broken Legacy

Enslaved families were also divided for inheritance when an owner

# Study: American parents are the unhappiest out of 22 countries

American parents are less happy than their childless counterparts.

And the parenthood "happiness gap" is greater in the United States than in 21 other countries studied, according to a briefing paper prepared for the Council on Contemporary Families.

Researchers wrote they were astonished to discover "the negative effects of parenthood on happiness were entirely explained by the presence or absence of social policies allowing parents to better combine paid work with family obligations."

"The policies that helped parents the most were policies that also improved the happiness of everyone in that country, whether they had children or not," the report said. "Policies such as guaranteed minimum paid sick and vacation days make everyone happier, but they had an extra happiness bonus for parents of minor children."

The cure for the happiness gap is "public policy that, in particular cases, combining paid work with parental obligation," said Robin W. Simon, a sociology professor at Wake Forest University.

"And this is interesting and important: These policies don't come at a cost to nonparents. Everyone benefits," she said.

A new high-tech mattress detects hanky-panky and informs the owner via a mobile app.

Reacting to a report that Spain has a high rate of infidelity, a Spanish mattress firm didn't take the news lying down, the Local in Spain reports.

Durmet developed the Smarttress and its "Lover Detection System." Twenty-four ultrasonic sensors measure "suspicious movement" in the bed, transmitting data of the tryst, including a 3D mattress model to show where most of the

(continued from page 1) died, or because the owners' adult children moved away to create new lives, taking some of the enslaved people with them.

## Mortality Rate

More than one-half of Black infants died before they were 1 year old. This mortality rate was almost double that of whites.

Although the survival rate improved after enslaved children reached a year of age, their mortality rate continued to be double that of whites until they were 14 years old.

## Soldiers' Lives

During the Civil War, approximately 180,000 Black soldiers served in the Union army.

The families of these sol-

diers frequently camped in makeshift villages near the army to be near their husbands, sons and fathers.

The soldiers assisted them as they could — sharing food and clothing from their own military rations when possible

## Rape of Women

Slave women were constantly sexually abused by white men, and they had no legal right to resist that abuse.

"To oppose the rape of Black women in effect meant opposing slavery.

A Black woman's body was not considered her own. Control over her body was passed from white person to white person along with a bill of sale."

# 9 Interesting Facts About Divorce for Black Couples

Falling in love is easy. Falling out of love is a little more complicated – especially when it leads to a divorce.

Chicago matrimonial attorney Lester L. Barclay has guided more than 1,000 couples through divorce and shares his insights in the

new book *The African-American Guide to Divorce & Drama: Breaking Up Without Breaking Down*. We caught up with the happily married father to get his surprising findings from the frontlines of divorce in the Black community.

**#1 It Takes A Village to Get a Divorce**  
 “When you’re Black, you’re not just married to one person, you’re married to a family. You’re married to a community. You may be married to a church.

We’ve always embraced the concept that it takes a village. In many instances, people’s outside influences have significant impact over how we view things.

It’s ‘I can’t make a move unless I talk with my pastor.’ We see litigants who will stand up before the judge and say I want to pray about this first or I want to talk this over with my family.

Other people don’t always understand the position of community and family structure. For instance, you’ll have a grandmother who will come to court and the judge will say, ‘Well this is between the mother and father.’ Well in many instances, that grandmother is the one who is taking care of the kids.”

**#2 Women Pull the Purse Strings**  
 “What makes our divorces different is that our community is formed around a matriarch. African-American women tend to be better-educated and higher-wage earners so when you’re ending a marital relationship the economic factors come into play.

If you have an African-American woman who has her master’s degree and she’s married to someone who has a high school diploma and works at the post office, she’s not going to voluntarily pay alimony for maintenance to him.

And so, the whole negotiating position of African-American women is much stronger when you see that they control the money. 40 or 50 years ago we were renters, now we’re owners.”

**#3 Mental Health Neglect and Marriage Don’t Mix**

“African-Americans don’t do as well with getting therapy. So for Black people who are having marital problems that may lead to divorce, we’re resistant to any kind of intervention by

mental health. We perceive that, if I have to see a therapist, than something’s wrong with me.

Often times, we don’t have the same resources available to us that the broader community has and even when we do have those resources, the stigma can be very challenging. For instance, African-American men rarely want to do therapy. And sometimes,

Black women will say, ‘I’ve got to go see a lawyer and I’ve got to get out of this because I think we’re spinning our wheels. The train is stuck in the depot and because he won’t seek therapy.’”

**#4 Conditioned for Call and Response**  
 “When we go to church, we yell out, ‘amen.’ If the preacher is off-tune, then you’re, ‘Oh Lord, please help ‘em.’ We’re just a more expressive people. I’ve seen White judges and lawyers who don’t fully understand how we express ourselves.

A couple could be fighting like cats and dogs before the judge, but in the hallway, they are back friends again. And the judge looks at them and says, ‘Oh my God those people are out of control.

’ But they might drive back in the same car. Just because we express ourselves a certain way, doesn’t necessarily mean that others understand what we mean when we express ourselves.

**#5 A Bad Marriage Can Have a Good Divorce**

“Just because you have failed at your marriage, you shouldn’t fail again with a divorce. The drama from a divorce can often determine the course of how things progress in the future. If you end your marital relationship in an amicable way, that often sets the tone for how you interact in the future.

But if it’s hostile and he’s angry at her or if she feels a sense of betrayal, all those things will likely not be forgotten. He will always remember that she cannot be trusted. She will vilify him.

50 percent of all marriages end in divorce, whether in the church or outside of the church. **(continued on page 4)**

# Kevin Hart shares what his dad's drug addiction taught him about fatherhood

Recently, Kevin Hart appeared on “The Howard Stern Show,” and while he was there, he opened up about his father’s addiction and why his past isn’t something he is ashamed of.

“From ages two through eight my dad did what he could before his addiction got out of hand and he disappeared,” Hart said. “The way I see it is things happen for a reason. If my dad hadn’t been around and didn’t do drugs, I may be handling my success differently. I may be on drugs; I may be searching for something.”

Hart said that watching his father make those kind of mistakes inspired him to want to be better and to avoid those mistakes so that he could be “such a great father.”

He also credited his mother with keeping him off the streets.

“My mom was such a strong woman she said, ‘Look, regardless of whatever your father’s doing and where he is, I have a job to do raising you, you’re going to do what you’re supposed to do and you’re going to grow up to be two intelligent men’ — with me and my brother,” he said. “School was of the importance, and then with our neighborhood — it wasn’t a good neighborhood — she kept me off the streets. I applaud my mother. Rest in peace.”

We have to look at how we can end marriages in a peaceful way that gives dignity to both parties and keeps in mind doing what is in the best interest of the children if involved.”

## #6 Divorce is for Spouses, Not Children

“All children of a divorce are impacted by their parents’ divorce. Most children will tell you that they want their parents to be together. But they have little control over the outcome of a divorce situation. What tends to happen in the African-American community is that many fathers who get divorces from their spouses simply divorce the whole family and walk away. I have seen lawyers who don’t look like myself who will think, ‘I’ve gotten her the house, I’ve gotten her the kids. I’ve gotten her alimony.’ But that wife is saying, ‘more important than all those things is that he has a relationship with our children at the end of the day.’ That lawyer thinks he or she has done a great job for that client and at the same time, they don’t recognize the impact this is having on this family in the future. When a father divorces his children, when he divorces his spouse is a very tragic thing in our community.”

## #7 Different Skills Needed for Divorce

“Divorce is the ultimate disposal of the marital relationship. We plan for weddings, we plan for funerals but we do not plan for divorce. I tell folks considering divorce you need to look before you leap because for an African-American woman who has been dependent upon a husband for health insurance, there’s a possibility that you may lose your medical coverage. There’s a possibility that you may go from living in a home to living in an apartment. So all these dynamics go into the ending of a marriage, which can also be expensive. If you do decide to get divorced, settle your emotional issues before you begin dealing with your legal issues to avoid a drawn out and procey process. If you take a custody battle to court, it could easily cost you \$30,000 to \$75,000 in legal fees.”

## #8 Mother Doesn’t Always Know Best

Our family structures have changed. Now we see fathers emerging as custodial parents where the mother use to automatically get custody in most jurisdictions. In many instances today, we’re looking at the parent who can act in the best interest of the children.”

## #9 Apologies Can Be a Divorce Anecdote

“One of the things that I have found is the most inexpensive way to maintain a relationship is the ability to say, I’m sorry. Sometimes people have a very difficult time with that, even though they may indicate otherwise that they’re able to basically communicate that part. It’s very difficult for some people to say I blew it and I want to work through this. And so in many instances, some families could be saved.”

## Pragmatic Airway Resuscitation Trial (PART) Risk/Benefit Public Announcement

### Researchers at the Medical College of Wisconsin are studying the best ways to treat Cardiac Arrest.

This notice is to inform you of a research study on cardiac arrest that will begin in Milwaukee County in August 2016. The study will be led by the Medical College of Wisconsin and Milwaukee County Emergency Medical Services (EMS). Cardiac arrest is a major public health problem. There are about 400,000 cardiac arrest cases in the U.S. every year and only about 10% of people survive. This national study will compare two airway tubes that are used by EMS providers to keep a person’s airway open to give them oxygen during a cardiac arrest. This study could affect any person with cardiac arrest that is helped by Milwaukee County EMS. This study is also being done in Birmingham Alabama, Dallas Texas, Pittsburgh Pennsylvania, and Portland Oregon.

### What happens when someone has a Cardiac Arrest?

A Cardiac Arrest is when a person’s heart suddenly stops beating. When the heart stops beating it is an emergency because blood does not reach important organs like the brain, lungs or kidneys. This can injure these organs. EMS providers treat cardiac arrest by performing cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR). This includes breathing for the person by inserting an airway tube into their windpipe to keep their airway open to give them oxygen. EMS providers currently use one of two airway tubes – an “endotracheal tube” or a “laryngeal tube.”

### Why do we need to do this research?

Right now both of these airway tubes are approved by the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and are commonly used by EMS providers. Both methods are used by Milwaukee County EMS, but prior studies have not shown whether one works better than the other. The reason for this study is to compare the endotracheal tube to the laryngeal airway tube to see if one is better for patients.

### Are there risks to this research?

All research has risks. Using either of these airway tubes has potential risks, including: not being able to place the airway, having to try more than once to place the airway, the tube being placed incorrectly, the tube not allowing enough air to pass into the lungs, vomiting after placing the tube, injury to the throat/mouth area, and a collapsed lung. These risks have been carefully examined and found to be small and reasonable given the possible benefits to patients. Patients who have been enrolled in this study will get all other regular treatments for cardiac arrest. All information obtained from the study will be kept private. The findings from this study will be shared at meetings and in scientific journals to help others, but information that could identify a person will not be used.

### What is the benefit of this research?

This study may help others in the future. One type of airway tube used during cardiac arrest could be better for people than the other. People will not receive money for being in this research study and it will not cost a person anything.

### If you are an adult and live in Milwaukee County, you may be in this study.

Cardiac arrest is an emergency and the EMS providers have to act quickly to treat a person. This means that there is no time to get permission. People with cardiac arrest are unconscious and cannot agree to join. In studies like this, a person’s consent is not possible. This type of research is called an exception from informed consent for emergency circumstances and is approved by the FDA. If you do not want to be in this study you must ask to not be included. You will be sent a bracelet or necklace to wear that tells EMS that you are not part of the study. You will still receive all regular treatments. The FDA requires that researchers notify communities in cases when research is being done and consent is not possible due to an emergency (FDA Code of Federal Regulations, Title 21, Section 50.24).

**Opting out of this study** Anyone who does not wish to be enrolled in this study may opt-out by wearing an opt-out bracelet or necklace. The Milwaukee County EMS providers are trained to not enroll anyone who is wearing this bracelet or necklace. An opt-out bracelet or necklace may be requested free of charge by either calling the Resuscitation Research Center at (414) 805-6493 or email at RRC@mcw.edu
