#### Lori Lightfoot makes history winning Chicago mayor race

Former federal prosecutor Lori Lightfoot easily won the Chicago mayor's race Tuesday, earning support from every part of the city to defeat a longtime political insider and become the first Black woman and openly gay person to lead the nation's third-largest city.

Lightfoot, who had never been elected to public office, delivered a commanding victory over Toni Preckwinkle, who served on the City Council for 19 years before becoming Cook County Board president.



Lightfoot promised to rid City Hall of corruption and help low-income and working-class people she said had been "left behind and ignored" by Chicago's political ruling class.




#### Janet Jackson Refuses To Perform At Rock & Roll Hall Of Fame In Protest Of "Leaving Neverland"

#### SDC seeks candidates to run for Board of Commissioner post, fight poverty

The Social Development Commission (SDC) is seeking candidates to run for the Board of Commissioners post and help fulfill the agency's mission to empower Milwaukee County residents with resources to move beyond poverty.

Representing residents in the six districts SDC serves, elected commissioners become the voice of people experiencing poverty. Commissioners influence policies and programs that impact county residents living in

Elected Commissioners are expected to represent their constituents by attending monthly board meetings and committee meetings they are assigned to.

"People living in poverty know exactly what they need to improve their condition," says SDC's CEO George Hinton. "That's why it's critical they're represented at the highest levels of this organization. Their voices need to be heard. We need people in the community to give us the solutions, not the other way around."

The Commission board is comprised of 18 citizens living in Milwaukee County with one-**George Hinton** third representing the public sector, one third representing the private sector and one-third

representing Milwaukee County's low-income community.

#### **MPS** board member loses seat to MTEA backed challenger

Wendell Harris lost his bid to retain his Dist. 2 seat on the Milwaukee Public School Board of Directors Tuesday. He lost to Erika Siemsen, who collected 5,338 votes (59.92%) to Harris' 3,542 votes (39.76%).

Harris, who was the lone incumbent running for a board seat, was not only running against Siemsen, but the Milwaukee Teachers Education Association (MT-EA), the union that represents the district's teachers.

The MTEA backed a slate of five candidates for the board. A number of them are former **MPS** teachers and/or union officials.

The union had

been critical of Harris and his support of educational options other than public schools, such as charter schools (especially noninstrumentality charter schools).

Harris went from MTEA darling to arch-enemy two years ago when he went against the union's efforts to block a successful charter school, Carmen, from integrating with a failing high school, Pulsaski.

The integration of the two schools allows poor and minority children to leave traditional—albeit failing—

#### **Cancer rates** higher in several **African American** city ZIP codes

Data collected in a recent Medical College of Wisconsin (MCW) study revealed higher rates of cancer in several Milwaukee ZIP codes that are predominately

Titled: "Breast and Colorectal Cancer Survival Disparities in Southeastern Wisconsin," the study uncovered cancer health disparities by race and ethnicity.

The ZIP codes impacted by the higher rates of cancer where the majority of the population is Black are: 53205, 53206, 53208, 53210, 53213, 53216.

"For the three predominant cancers: breast, prostate and colorectal, African Americans are twice more likely to be diagnosed with those diseases, as well as die," said Lauren Matthews, a community program coordinator for the MCW Cancer Center's Cancer Prevention and Outcomes Program (CPOP).

Recently, the CPOP conducted nine focus groups in the city, and conducted in-depth qualitative interviews which shined light on topics including individual experiences with cancer screening, knowledge of cancer disparities and what participants believe constitutes a healthy community.


The group consisted of both cancer survivors and those who didn't have cancer. One group consisted only of men and focused on prostate cancer.

Matthews believes education, biological reasons, and the quality of care are contributing factors in the higher cancer disparities in Black ZIP code.

#### Educator's research during wrongful discrimination fight reveals disproportionate number of terminations of Black teachers by MPS

In response to what she believes was a wrongful termination as a Milwaukee Public School (MPS) teacher Beverly Williams is doing more than just fighting to right the wrongs she experienced.

She is calling for a formal investigation and audit of MPS for alleged discriminatory actions against African American employees, especially in the area of discipline and termination.

Williams, who taught in the district for 20 years, said in a written statement she was terminated on February 15, 2017 from her job as a special education teacher at Lloyd Barbee Montessori School based, she said, on acts of racial/disability discrimination. The former teacher also claimed she was harassed and retaliated against.

"I was terminated while actively litigating another discrimination case against the school district with the state of Wisconsin Equal Rights Division," Williams said in a written statement outlining her struggles to get just compensation for discriminatory practices by the district.

That case involved the principal at Barbee Montessori who, according to Williams, committed racially discriminatory acts against her during her tenure there.

Williams was a special education teacher for students with emotional, behavior, and cognitive disabilities at Barbee Montessori. She sustained a back injury when a student pulled a chair away as she was about to sit down. Williams also had a door slammed against her back by another

The former teacher claims she was denied worker's compensation and MPS took back more than 40 hours of sick time with the denial. Williams retained an attorney and pursued worker's compensation, which she failed to get.

Williams filed another complaint with the Wisconsin State Equal

Rights Division after her termination and received a "probable cause" decision which found a number of her complaints valid, including refusing to reasonably accommodate a disability, terminating the employment of complainant of disability, and termination of employment of the complainant because of race.

The case was filed in federal court in January of this year.

Williams' reason for pushing for the audit investigation stems from data she discovered while fighting her wrongful termination case. The data revealed deep seated racial disparities in discipline and termination between African American and White MPS employees.

"My wrongful termination was part of the 116 African Americans who were terminated from Milwaukee Public Schools in 2017," Williams said, noting that only 23 Caucasians were terminated during the same period of time.

The data, which covers a period between 2010 to 2017, shows terminations and discipline practices are skewed against African American

employees.

From 2010-2017, 631 African American MPS employees were terminated, while only 296 White employees were terminated in that same

"The disparities in terminated employees based on race reflects the bias that has been occurring in Milwaukee Public Schools for a period of time," Williams stated.

Williams has also talked with former employees who have experienced discrimination, harassment and retaliation based on age, disability, as well as race. "There were also

some who were harassed after being injured and denied worker's compensation or forced to resign, take leave or termination."

The former teacher believes the data warrants a full investigation and audit into the practices of Milwaukee Public Schools regarding fair labor laws and violations of civil rights laws. Williams believes her claim of discrimination against MPS is only one example of the continuous pattern of violations of civil rights and fair labor laws occurring in the largest public school district in Wisconsin.







#### A pox on American elected officials who avoid military service

"This is war. This is not a game of cricket..." Sessue Hayakawa, "The Bridge on the River Kwai" (1957)

With righteous attention on President Donald Trump surprisingly cleared of collusion with Russia in the 2016 election -- and his plan to use military construction funds on a wall to stem illegal immigration at the Mexican border -- it's worth noting Trump and many elected officials shamefully never

That said, I detest two-faced, high elected politicians who avoided the military -- especially those who finessed the Selective Service system. You know, draft-dodgers. Some prime examples of those who blatantly shirked their duty are ex-President Bill Clinton, ex-Vice-President Dick Cheney (who was Secy. of Defense in Gulf War I) and Paul Wolfowitz -- a former hawkish Deputy Secv. of Defense.

Inasmuch as the President of the United States can lead this nation into war -- and send young men and women to possibly be killed in the line of duty -- I would be much more confident in their judgment if our President has served in the country's military.

This is why I so admire my great good, friend, former U.S. Rep. Charles Rangel (D-NY). A volunteer member of the U.S. Army, Rangel was awarded a Purple Heart and Bronze Star With Valor for his Korean War service the 1950s. Another reason was his annual introduction of a bill in Congress to bring back the military draft, which I support...

In my case, my oldest son proudly served 20 years as a volunteer member of the U.S. Navy, and I fulfilled my military obligation as a lieutenant in the U.S. Army for eight years -- active and reserve -- in the 1960s. As a columnist with the New York Daily News (1987-91), I spoke out strongly about nonserving politicos on several occasions.

Which brings me to another good friend -- the celebrated Pete Hamill who, along with the late, iconic New York columnist Jimmy Breslin, was the subject of a wonderful HBO documentary "Breslin and Hamill: Deadline Artists," which premiered Jan. 28. Its repeat showings should not be missed.

In a devastating New York Post column on Jan. 18, 1991, Hamill personally agreed in print with one of my columns on the subject.. He took to task Vietnam dove-turned Persian Gulf hawk Rep. Stephen Solarz (D-Brooklyn); Sen. Alfonse D'Amato (R-N.Y.); Rep. Newt Gingrich (R-Ga.); Sen. Orrin Hatch (R-Utah); ex-Defense Dept. official Richard Perle, and Vice President

are required to collect at least 50 signatures from residents in their district. Candidates are urged to collect at least 50 additional signatures in case of discounted names. Nomination forms used to collect signatures can be picked up at SDC located at 1780 W. North Ave. between 8 a.. to 5 p.m.

Nomination packets and signatures are due on Monday, April 15 by 5 p.m. Signatures are to be collected and returned to SDC's executive department.

On election day Tuesday, May 7, voting will take place from 12 noon to 6 p.m. There will be one voting site for each of the six districts. Polling site locations to be announced.

Then, when I revealed I once interviewed Tupac, his eyes opened with curiosity and awe, which faded when I mentioned that the rapper had dirty fingernails and burnt fingertips. But his frown quickly turned to a smile in acknowledgment of what that description implied.

Those facts did not deflect from who the rapper was.

To top off the brief—albeit enthralling conversation—he declared matter-of-factly that, "I was born in the wrong generation," a reference that he missed out on the beginning of the hip-hop era, as well as a generational cultural shift that provided a blueprint for today's society.

Before he could explain himself, I blurted out: "The Chinese have a saying: 'may you be born in exciting times.'

"You are lucky to be a part of the most exciting time in world history, whether you realize it or not. You will be part of a movement that will change the world for the better."

I then told him how lucky he was, and how jealous I was.

I've lived through several generations, and each had its own high and low points. Each was exciting in its own right, but the future may be the best.

I further said his wisdom at such a young age—he couldn't have been more than 11-years-old—and his desire to be a change agent, as

government (public) schools.

Harris was one of five African Americans to run for a Milwaukee school board seat. Black board candidates squared off against each other in two races. Marva Herndon defeated Shyla Deacon to become the representative for Dist. 1. Herndon won by 33 votes. She collected 3,125 votes to Deacon's 3,098 (both 50%).

In the District 3 board race, Sequanna Taylor defeated Catrina Crane. Taylor received 4,321 votes (75%) to Crane's 1,463 votes (25%).

Harris' defeat leaves the board without any Black males on that governing body. Mark Sain, was one of two other Black board member on the board. He did not run for reelection.

The other, Michael Bonds, stepped down to focus on teaching. He is a professor at UW-Milwaukee

There may be a recount in the race for Wisconsin Supreme Court. Brian Hagedorn defeated Lisa Neubauer...for now. Hagedorn won by the slimmest of margins, garnering 605,728 votes to 599,768 for Neubauer.

The 50.2% to 49.8% margin allows a recount if Neubauer asks for one. Wisconsin law allows for recounts if the race is within one point. If it is within 0.25 points, taxpayers would pick up the tab. If it is above that amount but lower than one point, the losing candidate must pay for the recount.

As of Wednesday, Neubauer was within the margin where she could ask for a recount, but her campaign would have to pay for it.

If a recount is held and Hagedorn wins, his victory would widen the conservative majority on the state's high court (5-2) and ensure liberals couldn't win a majority in 2020. In judicial races in the Milwaukee Metropolitan area, Derek C. Mosley won

another term as Branch 2 judge on the city's Municipal Court. He garnered 44, 854 votes (98.85%). Danielle Shelton, an African American assistant public defender, beat incumbent and former Gov. Scott Walker appointee Andrew Jones for the

(57%) to Jones' 53,404 votes (43%). More diversity is coming to the Village of Brown Deer with the elections of two African American women to two village positions.

Branch 40 County Circuit Court judgeship. Shelton received 71,647 votes

Wanda Montgomery defeated incumbent Carl Krueger for the village presidency. Montgomery garnered 1,553 votes (54%) to Krueger's 1,338 votes (46%).

Business woman and UW-Milwaukee instructor Nakia Spencer (who was profiled in the March 13 edition of the Milwaukee Community Journal) was one of two candidates to be elected to the Village Board. marched off to fight in the desert."

Some examples of politicians who did their duty are ex-Secy. of State Colin Powell and Sens. John McCain, Max Cleland and John Kerry -- all of whom were in Vietnam. President John F. Kennedy, ex-Sen. Bob Dole and ex-President George H.W. Bush fought heroically in World War II and suffered grievously. Of course, there were more.

Fair is fair, however and boisterous, bullying Donald Trump is not the only recent President who failed to serve in the military. Sad to say, ex-President Barack Obama also did not serve. And like Trump, he easily could have done so via the Reserve Officers Training Corps (ROTC) in college or, by simply enlisting, as did Rangel. When my service as a second lieutenant in the Corps of Engineers began

in 1959, I was married and the father of two children. But admittedly "gung-ho," I thought long and hard before declining an offer by a supersharp Black company commander to recommend me for parachute school or Ranger training if I "re-upped." How well I recall the redneck White sergeant at Camp A.P. Hill, near Fort Belvoir, Va., where I was stationed, who, not noticing me among a large

gaggle of shave-tails, mockingly referred to this dark-skinned Black officer as "Captain Midnight." That night, I took the sergeant into the company street and severely reamed him out. He apologized. As for those who avoided the military, Bill Clinton's case is most egregious. A stone-cold draft dodger, the disgraced ex-President admitted to a

1969 flirtation with the ROTC to avoid Vietnam -- joining after receiving a draft notice. He bailed out, suspiciously drew a draft number high enough to ensure he would never be called, and fled to England.. Of course, some of our greatest Presidents did not serve, most notably the physically impaired Franklin D. Roosevelt, who led the nation in the great-

est conflagration in history -- World War II. Yet, I am tired of politicians who, for self-aggrandizement, are critical of others for failing to serve in the military, or for a suspect or spotty record. By the same token, I sincerely admire male elected officials, regardless of party affiliation, who were in the nation's armed forces in peace or war --

voluntarily or though the draft. To me, there is no middle ground. Unless you are physically unfit or have some mitigating family circumstance you serve, just as I served, and my son served. Period. It's easy for non-serving, big-mouthed politicians and lame-brained news media types to sound-off about military matters. Happily, however, some

never got in harm's way. But it's just as easy for voters to figure this out and vote for someone who has. I trust the voters.
