# “HOPPING” ALONG KING DRIVE?

Plans announced recently by Mayor Tom Barrett to push forward with extending The Hop streetcar outward from downtown have early support from Alderwoman Milele A. Coggs and Alderman Russell W. Stamper, II.

During an announcement recently at Gee’s Clippers on N. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Dr. in Bronzeville, Mayor Barrett outlined plans to fund construction of an extension of the streetcar to the Wisconsin Center (convention center) and to fund engineering and planning work on extensions to Bronzeville along N. Martin Luther King, Jr. Dr. and W. North Ave. and to Walker’s Point along S. 1st St. and W. Pittsburgh Ave. via N. Milwaukee St.

The extension work will require legislation that must be approved by the

Common Council. If approved, funding would come from a variety of sources, including Tax Incremental Financing district payments and federal grants.

Alderwoman Coggs, Chair of the Finance and Personnel Committee, said the extension to Bronzeville (via N. Vel R. Phillips Ave. and the Fiserv Forum) would bring development and jobs along N. MLK Dr. and its corridor.

“The extensions are the first step in bringing the streetcar beyond downtown and into the community, and it is

something that I have supported all along,” Alderwoman Coggs said.

“I look forward to residents, business owners and neighborhood stakeholders benefitting from it, and I think there is a palpable degree of excitement about it in the community.”

The City of Milwaukee spent more than 13 months conducting a Transit Oriented Design study with regular public feedback sessions in Bronzeville and in Walker’s Point, and the input received during those sessions is helping to guide the work going into planning the streetcar extensions, Alderwoman Coggs said.

“The impact of extending the streetcar has been laid out in the city’s sessions, and the public has provided helpful comments and feedback that will ultimately help to ensure that those living along and near the street-

## Property Values across the City of Milwaukee Continue to Increase

The 2019 City of Milwaukee property assessment shows continued improvement in the residential and commercial real estate markets. Total residential and commercial value combined for the 2019 valuation is \$28.1 Billion, just 2% under the 2008 pre-Recession peak, and up 5% from 2018.

Commercial property values increased 7.7%, driven by downtown development as well as growth in large residential development in Districts 6, 12, and 14. Higher growth in commercial value city-wide compared to residential can help reduce property tax increases for homeowners.

"Milwaukee continues on an upward economic trajectory," said Mayor Tom Barrett. "This increase in assessed values shows the investments we have made in Milwaukee's neighborhoods are paying off."

City-wide, the average detached home's value increased 2.9%, to \$111,979. Combined with a 4.9% increase in condo values, the average residential property value is up 3.2%, to \$117,601.

Every Aldermanic district saw an increase in total and aver-

age residential value. Districts 15, 6, 12, and 1 saw the greatest percentage increases, ranging from 12.2% in District 15 to 6.1% in District 1.

The neighborhoods surrounding Sherman Park increased 2% from 2018. Total commercial property value also increased in every district.

Also encouraging is the growth in overall assessable sales activity. So-called "arms length" sales are used as the base for assessments, ensuring distressed sales like foreclosures do not artificially deflate values.

Residential arms-length sales as a share of total sales have tripled since 2012, reflecting the decrease in foreclosed property on the market and increased interest in home buying across the city.

As Mayor Barrett highlighted in his State of the City speech, sales of City-owned property since 2014 represent over \$100 million of the 2019 residential assessed value. Those sales are concentrated in Districts 6, 7, and 15.

Individual homeowners are likely to see some change in

their assessment. Approximately two thirds of all property owners had increased values, and approximately one third decreased.

City of Milwaukee 2019 property assessments will be mailed starting Friday, April 19 and property owners should expect to receive them by the end of next week. Milwaukee conducts an annual valuation of property to make sure tax assessments are as fair as they can be, and track closely to market trends.

This week's mailing of assessments begins the "open book" period where property owners can ask contact the Assessor's Office with questions regarding the value of their home and file appeals if they disagree with the assessment. Assessments must be appealed in writing by May 22, 2019.
