Nonprofit Seeks 60,000 Men to Help End Human Trafficking

Five-week HEMAD Campaign launches to raise awareness and seek an end to societal scourge

A small faith-based nonprofit community service organization hopes to raise an army of at least 60,000 men before the end of the year to oppose human trafficking and the commercial sex trade.



The campaign received the backing of leaders from law enforcement, state and local politicians, religious institutions and business leaders during an online news conference today.

“We are facing an epidemic in our state and our nation that most people don’t realize exists, even though it’s out in the open,” said State Rep. Jason Fields. “It’s human trafficking involving the commercial sex trade – a multimillion-dollar criminal enterprise that exists in cities, suburbs, small towns and rural areas – and that is victimizing vulnerable teen boys and girls in every community.”

Fields, who has introduced or supported a number of bills aimed at helping human trafficking victims escape the commercial sex trade, led the kickoff of the HEMAD (Human trafficking Educators working with Men and boys to stand Against the Demand) campaign. HEMAD asks men to take a public stand against human trafficking and the commercial sexual exploitation of adults and children.

FPC Executive Director is responsible for all policy, financial, operational and strategic matters of the Fire and Police Commission.

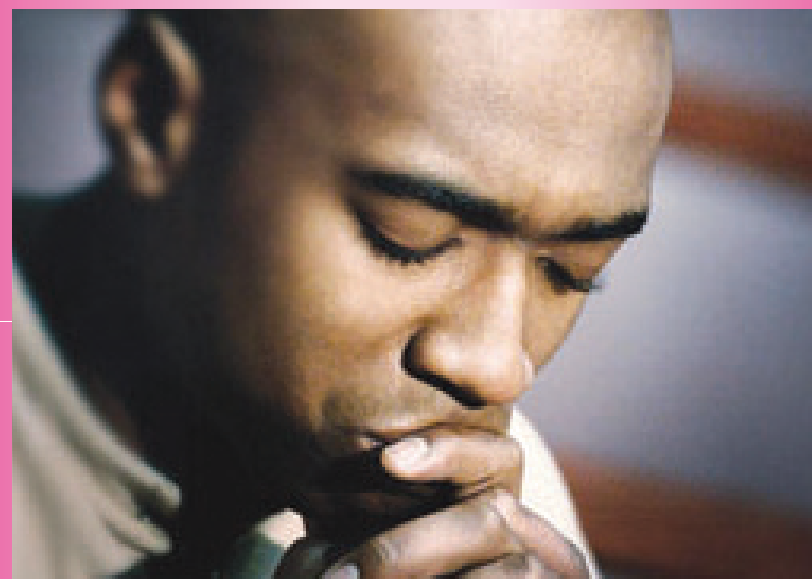

COPING WITH COVID-19



HALF OF WISCONSINITES SAY THEY HAVE SUFFERED FROM ‘QUIET STRESS’ THIS YEAR, REVEALS SURVEY

Over a quarter of adults say social distancing and loneliness has been their biggest stressor this year.

- 19% say they are more likely to turn to alcohol to alleviate stress as compared to pre-pandemic times.
- A third admit to suppressing their emotions and say these feelings emerge after they’ve been drinking.
- 48% say the reason they would hide their feelings if suffering from stress so as not to worry family or friends.

With a global pandemic still raging across America, resulting in separation from loved ones due to social distancing, as well as growing unemployment rates and economic uncertainty for many, it is perhaps no wonder there has been an increase in the need for mental health treatment.

With disruptions to many Americans’ social lives, it may be difficult to reach out for help during this time, which can lead to people restraining their emotions and keeping them inside.

This is often referred to as ‘quiet stress’ and while it may not sound serious, it can contribute to a range of different illnesses, such as addiction, lowered immunity and heart disease.

American Addiction Centers, a leading provider of substance

addiction treatment resources, conducted a survey of 3,000 adults, which found that over half (51%) of Wisconsinites say they believe they have suffered from 'quiet stress' this year.

More widely known symptoms of stress often include visible outbursts, shouting, swearing and anger.

By comparison, 'quiet stress' can cause an individual to underreact and not speak up about how they feel.

This can lead to a state of inertia, whereby even though we feel overwhelmed, we ignore important tasks and don't act on certain situations that require change.

Therefore, 'quiet stress' can result in a sense of emotional paralysis, which could leave us unable to emerge from negative situations.

It appears that being isolated ranks high up as a stress trigger for many people, as over a quarter (28%) of respondents say the thing that has made them the most stressed this year is social distancing and loneliness.

This was followed by personal finance (23%), being unable to see loved ones (20%), personal health (15%) and relationship issues (13%).

Although it is possible to learn to subdue your body's stress responses, eventually these emotions will emerge and could manifest negatively

in the form of a suppressed immune system, social withdrawal or unhealthy habits like excessive drinking.

The survey also discovered that nearly 1 in 5 (19%) respondents admit they are more likely to turn to alcohol now to alleviate stress as compared to pre-pandemic times.

Additionally, 1 in 3 (33%) people who say they usually internalize their emotions within admit these feelings emerge after they have been drinking.

Moreover, for many, the pandemic has resulted in heightened anxiety levels, as well isolation, loneliness and boredom that may be brought on my spending more time at home – all of which can become potential triggers for excessive drinking.

Finally, the survey revealed that nearly half (48%) of people say the reason they hide their feelings when suffering from stress is because they don't want to worry friends or family. Nearly a quarter (23%) said the reason they hide their feelings is out of fear of appearing weak.

Additionally, 17% said it's because they want to avoid dealing with it, and 13% don't believe it is an issue that needs to be discussed.

'Compared to traditional symptoms brought on by stress, it can be difficult to diagnose those caused by 'quiet stress' as they may manifest in

different ways.

If you notice you are procrastinating on tackling important tasks, excessively drinking, more prone to getting colds or feeling 'stuck' in difficult situa-

tions, it could be worth evaluating whether you are internalizing your body's responses to stress,' says a spokesperson for American Addiction Centers.

'If you feel overwhelmed at the thought of reaching out to a loved one about it, contact your local care clinic for help from a trained professional, such as a counselor.'



Nonprofit Seeks 60,000 Men to Help End Human Trafficking

The campaign will run five weeks - lasting until Dec. 28. Organizers hope 60,000 men will take the HEMAD pledge this year. Last year, the goal was 6,000 men – twice the number from 2018. Thanks to social media, the campaign went viral with more than 45,000 men in 11 states and two foreign countries taking the pledge.

HEMAD is a program of Convergence Resource Center (CRC), a faith-based nonprofit community service organization helping women rebuild their lives after trauma with an emphasis on justice involved women and female survivors of human trafficking.

“The statistics are staggering,” said Acting Chief Michael Brunson Sr. of the Milwaukee Police Department. “Eighty percent of human trafficking cases in the U.S. involve sex trafficking, and this is a crime being committed in every county in our state. One in three runaways will be lured into sexual exploitation within 48 hours of leaving home and the average age of entry into the commercial sex trade is 13 – that is a kid in the seventh grade!”

“In 2019, more than half of the criminal human trafficking cases in the U.S. were sex trafficking cases involving children,” said Chief Deputy Denita Ball of the Milwaukee County Sheriff’s Office. Ball served 25 years in the Milwaukee Police Department, including time in the Sensitive Crimes Section that deals with sex crimes. She said that while law enforcement agencies are working together and sharing information, they need the public’s help.

“Traffickers are using social media platforms to recruit and advertise,” she said. “The average trafficker has five victims who see an average of 30 “clients” a day – seven days a week. We need more citizens to get involved. If you see something, say something and call police. You might save a life.”

“We will not tolerate these horrific actions in our community and we’re going to fight harder than ever to turn these numbers around and save these children and young adults,” said Milwaukee Mayor Tom Barrett.

He added that the city is working with CRC, the Milwaukee Joint Human Trafficking Task Force and other groups to fight human trafficking.

During the online event, Fields showed a brief video illustrating the issue of human trafficking and how men can play a key role in ending the demand of sex trafficking. He then led the dozens leaders in a pledge to stand up against traffickers.

“HEMAD is doing important work in building awareness of the signs of human trafficking,” said Wisconsin Attorney General Josh Kaul in a statement. “Wisconsinites can help combat this terrible crime by standing up and pledging to take action against it.”

A study on sex trafficking of juveniles and young adults by the Medical College of Wisconsin found that 55 percent were under age 18 when they were first trafficked for sex and one in four had been trafficked multiple times.

The study recommends additional training for street-level police officers to better distinguish between prostitution and sex trafficking of adults, focusing awareness and prevention efforts toward individuals at risk for sex trafficking victimization,

identifying and addressing the factors that enable sex trafficking to occur in certain areas and developing ways to identify locations where juveniles are trafficked through collaboration between the community, the criminal justice system, local healthcare systems, and social service and advocacy agencies.

“About 300,00 children are at risk of being sex trafficked each year in the U.S.,” noted Fields. “That’s the combined populations of Kenosha, Racine, Waukesha and Wauwatosa or Green Bay, Eau Claire, Sheboygan, Oak Creek, Mequon and Germantown. That’s a lot of kids and they are worth saving!”

Fields added that nearly 45,000,000 cases of human trafficking have been reported to the National Human Trafficking Hotline (888-373-7888 or text 233733) in the past five years and the number of human trafficking cases in the U.S. is rising every year.

“This is a multimillion-dollar demand-driven industry that we need to put out of business. We can squash that demand by publicly taking a stand,” said Fields. “I challenge my fellow community leaders in the state assembly, the state senate, county commissions and city councils, school boards, civic organizations, churches and block watch groups to take the HEMAD pledge and share it with their constituents.”

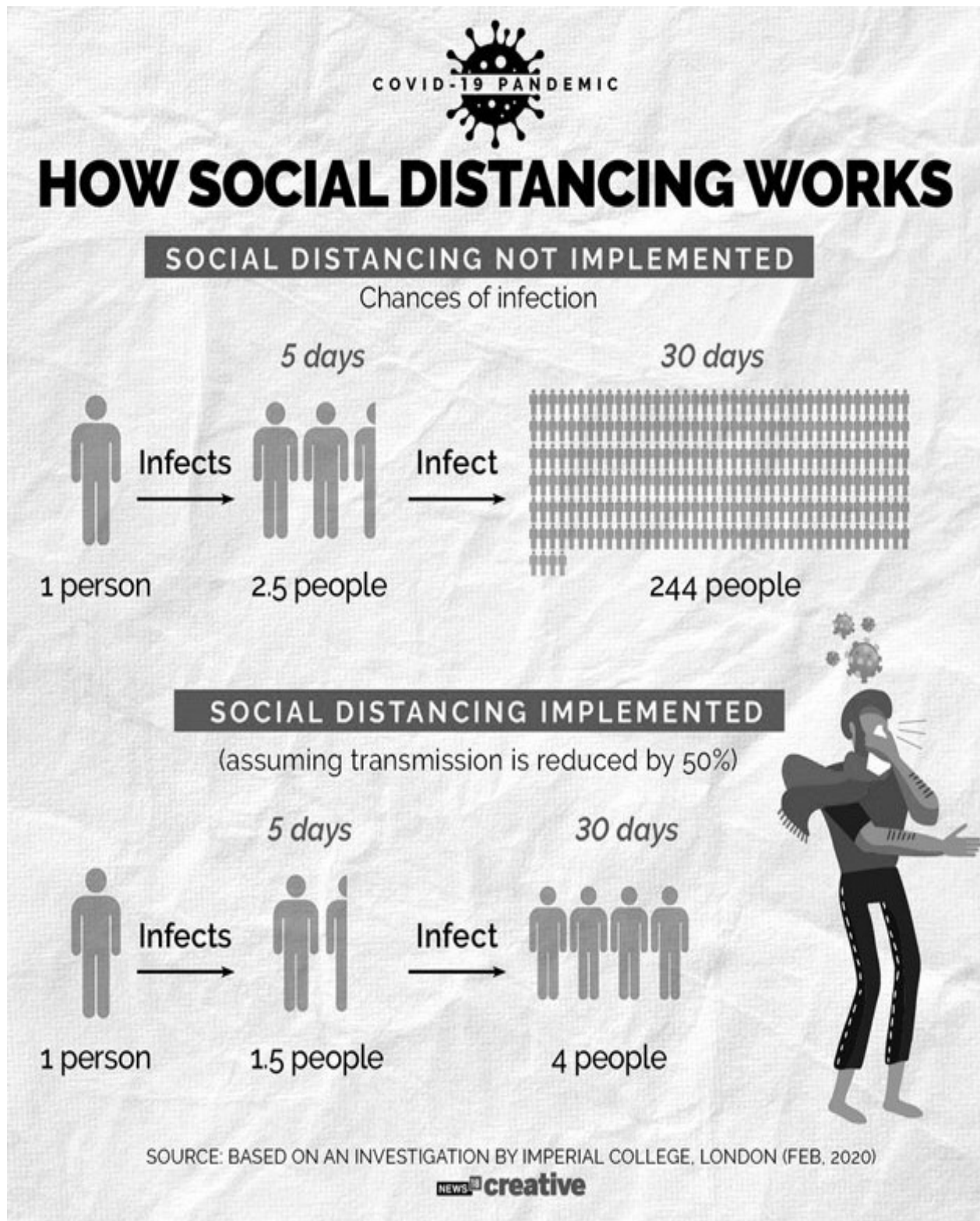

Science and went on to earn his Juris Doctor from the University of Wisconsin Law School. He grew up in the Sherman Park Neighborhood and attended Milwaukee Public Schools.

Todd is currently a member of the Board of the Directors for the Wisconsin Justice Initiative and Legal Action of Wisconsin, as well as a member of the Wisconsin Association of African-American Lawyers.

Todd will succeed Griselda Aldrete. His appointment as Executive Director of the Fire and Police Commission is subject to Common Council confirmation. A public meeting will be convened so residents have the chance to hear directly from Todd and ask questions.
