"I live, breathe and embody it. I am a preacher's kid and I've worked in various Kingdom capacities, including preacher and teacher of the Word, worship leader, usher, maintenance, Sunday School teacher, Treasurer, Youth leader, Minister of Music, and Regional Mass Choir Director of the Minnesota, Wisconsin, and the Dakotas Council," she shared.

Yet, we first met Bishop Parchia Price when she was a journalism/public relations student at University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, from which she graduated in 1985.

She learned sales, under Dr. William Rogers, a teaching professor at UWM, and director of the MCJ's Community Directory, where Monica Parchia worked.

A committed trainee, we knew she would be with us for a brief time, for she had already begun classes at the Milwaukee Theological Institute; and was co-producing a first of its kind television show, with Dr. Rogers, called "Pushing for Excellence," where she interviewed the likes of Oprah Winfrey, Les Brown, Cicely Tyson and others.

The show lasted two years, an accomplishment in local television programming.

New skills were nested with each move and position as God was training her, testing her, and providing and guiding her, "according to His purpose!" And, while Bishop Monica's parents continued to



serve in Milwaukee, she was being moved to return home to assist them.

Today, she serves as President and CEO, with all educational and fiscal responsibility, of Early View Academy of Excellence K12, that employs 45 people and educates 400 scholars at the 7132 W. Good Hope Road. She received her Master's Degree in Chaplaincy in 2016; and a Doctorate Degree, in 2017, from the International Police and Fire Chaplain Association Bible College and Seminary.

And she is the first female to be voted vice chair of the Minnesota, Wisconsin, and Dakotas Council (MWDDC). In 2019, she was elevated and consecrated to the office of Suffragan Bishop which is part of that Council. She works with Bishop Dr. Richard D. Howell and is the first female in the State of Wisconsin to hold this honor, under the auspices of the parent body, The Pentecostal Assemblies of the World, Inc..

A woman of FAITH, FAMILY, FELLOWSHIP AND FORTITUDE, BISHOP DR. MONICA PARCHIA PRICE shares her life with her husband, and friend, Elder Ricky Price, Sr., who is Superintendent of the Christian Education Department. All around us, people are becoming increasingly hopeful that the pandemic, state mandates and COVID-19 fatigue will soon be in the rearview mirror.

The development and distribution of three vaccines have contributed to this collective sigh of relief—but not so fast!

According to a recent New York Times article, public health officials estimate that

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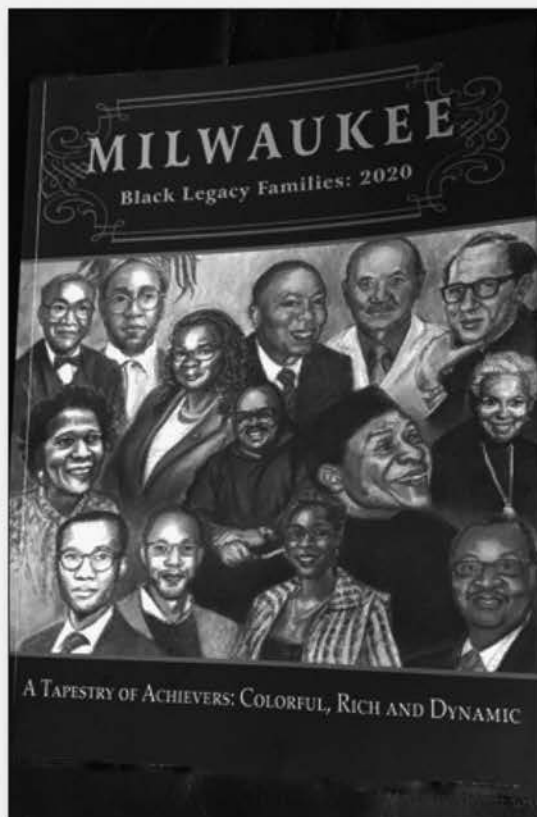

between 70 to 85 percent of the population needs to be vaccinated before people should start moving about freely in society. Among some Blacks, there is also a ‘wait and see’ attitude.

In other words, some Blacks want to find out if those getting vaccines now have any adverse side effects down the road.

While the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is expected to release relaxed guidelines regarding social distancing in the coming week, experts like Dr. Anthony Fauci, the nation’s leading infectious disease expert, continue to advise people to be cautious as we prepare for our ‘new normal’.

Dr. Fauci has suggested that small gatherings at home without masks are "low risk" IF the people present have received both doses of the COVID-19 vaccine.

Health professionals like Dr. Sandra Millon-Underwood, a Professor at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee College of Nursing, are doing their part to ease the minds of Milwaukee’s Black residents.

As a member of Nurses Affecting Change and program director of Partners in Pursuit of the Promise, Dr. Underwood and her colleagues are reaching out to populations where Blacks live, work, worship, shop, socialize, and otherwise engage to educate them on a variety of health and wellness issues, including COVID-19.

“We go into housing units, worksites, faith-based institutions, community centers, barber and beauty salons, and anywhere people frequent to help educate individuals about COVID-19 and about getting vaccinated,” said Dr. Underwood.

The nurses and community health workers involved with these initiatives have also distributed more than 1,500 FREE personal protection kits that include face masks, sanitizer, soap, tissue, and educational materials to better educate and inform the community about the prevention and mitigation of COVID-19. Lately, Dr. Underwood and her colleagues have also held virtual sessions with groups of home healthcare workers, senior meal program participants, breast cancer survivors, and local churches addressing concerns about the vaccine.

“One of the things I’m sensing is that people have a lot of questions surrounding the vaccines. We’re providing them with opportunities and forums to express their concerns and then respond to their questions and concerns with clinical and scientific information as we know it. Many are skeptical and want to wait.

For those that want to wait I suggest that ‘waiting’ is fine, but while they are trying to make up their minds about taking the vaccine, I encourage them to continue to express their concerns, ask questions, gather information, talk with their doctors, and schedule an appointment for the vaccine.

“I believe that it is important to secure your place in line (for the vaccine), then you are better positioned to make an informed decision. You can always cancel or reschedule the appointment if needed. Once you get a better sense of how others are responding to the vaccine, you’ll be ready when it’s your turn,” said Dr. Underwood.

A website connecting residents with available vaccination sites is now ‘live’ and will be available statewide by April 1, at [www.vaccinate.wi.gov](http://www.vaccinate.wi.gov). Not all vaccine providers will be participating, and more will be added over time. A phone option will also be available.

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# BLACK CREATORS AND THE FAIR FIGHT

**TP3 PRODUCTIONS RELEASES ORIGINAL INDEPENDENT COMIC SERIES "FAIR FIGHT" FOLLOWING THE BLACK SUPERHEROES LENNOX, ULTRA, AND HUMAN THROUGH THEIR BATTLE TO OVERTHROW THEIR ALIEN OPPRESSORS**

On March 26, TP3 Productions of Milwaukee will be independently releasing an original comic book series titled "Fair Fight" which features an all-black cast of heroes. "Fair Fight" is an introduction to the universe that Milwaukee native, Tyree Pope III, created when he started writing comic books.

"It's a story about three people, Lennox, Ultra, and Human, who are trying to escape the harsh reality of enslavement to an alien race who uses them as tools for intergalactic war. The aliens come to Earth and mutate the genetics of humans to turn them into superweapons," said Pope.

The inspirations for Pope's heroes are as unique as the planets in our solar system. Lennox's namesake is Lennox Lewis, the man who knocked out former professional boxer Mike Tyson. The all-knowing Human was created out of a desire to embody the whole of mankind and the powerful female lead, Ultra, is the collection of all the strong women that Pope has looked up to throughout his life.

Even though "Fair Fight" takes place in a fictitious universe, the names and personalities of Lennox, Ultra, and Human are not the only similarities between ours and the world they live in, Pope ex-



## ULTRA

Ultra is the "Alpha Dog" or at least she thinks so. She can create and control electromagnetic energy or things affected by it. She is very outspoken and tends to bite off more than she can chew. She is the first in line to challenge anyone. Quite obsessed with becoming powerful. Most characters fear her and she loves it.



## Lennox

Lennox is a witty character with multiple abilities such as telepathic and ice related powers. He plays the beta to Ultra's alpha characteristics. He's laid back, he knows, he's the smartest person in the room, plus he knows what everyone is thinking.



## Human

Human is an all powerful being that is more mystery than substance. Human plays the comedic relief and makes fun of the stereotypes of comic books. He rarely shows his powers because he is focused on developing Ultra and Lennox.

plained. “In every story there is a different parallel,” said Pope. “The journey that they are going on is the journey that black people have been going through for the last 400 years. The basis of their story, running away and trying to escape enslavement is just a metaphor. The reason it’s called “Fair Fight” is because they [heroes] have superpowers and the fight becomes even.”

Once the fight becomes even, the heroes can go back and save the rest of humanity. This sentiment is something Pope hopes will continue to happen among his fellow black creators. Community is at the forefront of what he and many others in Milwaukee are trying to do.

“Helping the unheard voices be heard is something that I have always been trying to do,” said Pope. “We need to open the doors to more black creators and most of the time it’s just the resources holding us back.”

“Once the resources become available, we thrive, we can bring the unknown creators to the table and show them how they can be successful.”

As a black creator in the comic book industry, Pope acknowledged that he is somewhat of a rarity. This lingering fact is what has pushed him to labor over this dream for the last five years.

He is motivated both by his desire to flourish professionally and to create a more welcoming world for all members of the black community.

By making each main character a powerful black individual, he is providing youth like his nieces and nephews with figures in pop culture who look and speak like they do.

“Otherwise they are going to grow up trying to be something that they aren’t,” said Pope. “They are going to try to fit into a niche that might not necessarily fit with them. They don’t need to feel like they need to change who they are or the way they talk to be successful.”

“That’s what’s so important about hearing voices and vocabulary like your own because it’s not going to be shown anywhere else unless you do it.”

To any other black creators who are trying to pursue their dreams, Pope offered up some simple knowledge that he pulled together throughout the creation of “Fair Fight.”

“It’s a tough road and expensive route if you want to pursue it independently,” said

Pope. “You’re going to have to put your everything into it and just tough it out. The best way to do it is to work with a group of people who want to do the same things as you. Find that group, find your niche and just hang in there with them. Whatever you want to do, learn the business, learn how it works, and find the right people.”

Pope said that the best way for those outside of the black community to support the efforts of creators like him is to just share. Whether the support is financial, demonstrative, or emotional, Pope said it is all appreciated.

“If you support “Fair Fight” you are supporting my entire career, this is launching me into the comic and entertainment field,” said Pope.

“This is my introduction to a new world and when you support someone like me, you also support the next me, it trickles down. You support all of the people who have helped me build a better platform and helped me build a better future, for comics and my community.”

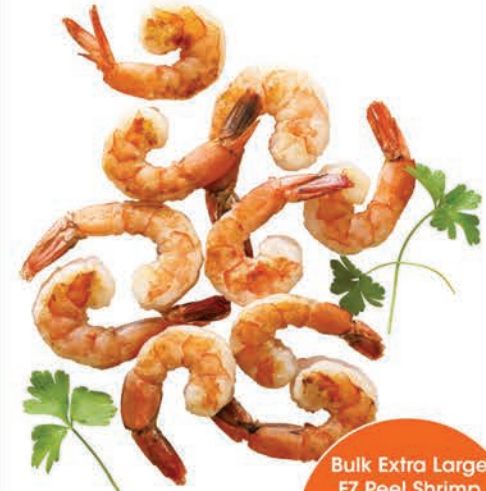
