Supreme Court Upholds Obamacare

In a significant victory for the Biden-Harris administration and Americans who depend on affordable health care, the Supreme Court rejected the latest challenge to Presi-



dent Obama's signature legislation.

The challenge stemmed from whether the individual mandate could be cut from the rest of the law or whether the justices should strike down the entire law.

Former President Trump made it his mission to get rid of the law, which has provided mil-

5 Ways to Teach Kids Money Basics

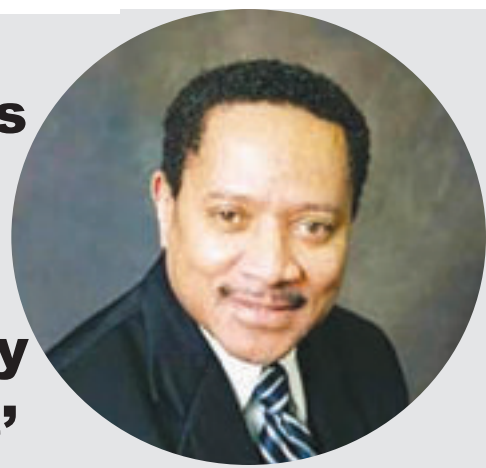

"We don't celebrate the 4th," my Fulani Princess told the White couple, sparking a look of shock and confusion.

I don't know if the couple's reaction was rooted in disbelief or bewilderment.

Or maybe it was rooted in the fact that it came from an eight-year-old African American child.

Before my granddaughter could elaborate, I quickly interceded, asking if the couple had ever read Frederick Douglass's speech about the 4th?

It was actually a rhetorical ques-

tion, redirecting their attention from my pre-teen to me.

The couple walked through the neighborhood and stopped to say 'hello' when my granddaughter drove up on her bike.

She politely said hello to the couple and asked if she could pat their dog.

After I explained she was in Milwaukee for the early part of the summer, the man asked if she would be

here long enough to celebrate Independence Day?

They obviously didn't expect the response they received.

My granddaughter spent a great deal of her young life in our house-

hold and obviously had undergone our cultural indoctrination.

She was taught that contrary to what she may be introduced to in government schools, our ancestors invented the sciences, established






great kingdoms, and had persevered through the worst form of slavery known to mankind.

Our Fula princess has been brought up to believe that she is

lions of Americans with access to affordable health care, particularly during the coronavirus pandemic.

The court ruled 7-2, with Justice Stephen Breyer writing for the majority, striking down a lower court ruling and determining that the plaintiffs — Texas and 17 other GOP-led states — did not show that they have the standing to bring the initial suits.

“We conclude that the plaintiffs in this suit failed to show a concrete, particularized injury fairly traceable to the defendants’ conduct in enforcing the specific statutory provision they attack as unconstitutional,” wrote Justice Breyer.

“They have failed to show that they have the standing to attack as unconstitutional the Act’s minimum essential coverage provision.

“Therefore, we reverse the

Fifth Circuit’s judgment in respect to standing, vacate the judgment, and remand the case with instructions to dismiss,” the Justice continued.

“We do not reach these questions of the Act’s validity ... for Texas and the other plaintiffs in this suit lack the standing necessary to raise them.

Justices Samuel Alito and Neil Gorsuch dissented.

Reportedly, 31 million Americans have health cover-

age connected to the Affordable Care Act — also known as Obamacare.

Also, a guarantee of access to continuous insurance coverage is protected for more than 54 million people with preexisting conditions because of the health care law’s provisions that prevent insurance companies from canceling or refusing to establish policies because of pre-existing conditions.

Noted activist says MPS, teacher’s union failed students of color in midst of COVID pandemic

Dear MPS Superintendent Dr. Keith Posley, MPS Board President Bob Peterson and MTEA President Ms. Amy Mizialko:

I am concerned that MPS/K-12 Black and Brown children are being short changed, in this covid 19 educational environment over the past year plus 2020/2021 school years.

I see you all speaking on TV, but, yet I have not heard a word uttered about cooperation/partnership and solutions that will get our Black & Brown children caught up. We currently have 2 grand/great grandchildren in MPS. We have a graduating senior at High School of The Arts and our 3-year old, great grand, at Maple Tree.

The virtual environment was a challenge for them both, but they made it through with good parental guidance. That is not a given for a lot of our children and their families. We must do our part to help.

I also was the Executive Director until earlier this year at the SOS Center after school program for the last 3+ years and we had students who were so far behind that they will need summer school and special sessions, to catch up. Covid19 exposed a lot of the fragility and faults in our MPS education system, especially for Black & Brown Children. Parents had little resources to feed their kids in addition to losing their jobs and or being locked down at home.

In the early 2000’s MPS sent about \$100 million dollars (Neighborhood Schools Plan) to give our facilities, programs, curriculum, and infrastructure the ability to compete with the rising tide of choice and charter schools. The last year has given those schools the upper hand again because of the lack of creativity, you all as a team, failed to provide. MPS students also lost ground, especially in Athletics, to all suburban schools that surround us in SE WI, as you chose to exclude them from competing at any level while they watched their peers achieve those revised goals of competing on most athletic platforms including the state tournaments. Many of the surrounding school systems, and the choice and charter schools, found ways to engage their students in a combination of virtual and face-to-face learning.

Our kids are behind, MPS is losing kids at an alarming rate to those schools we compete with, and our streets are filled with young people, who every day, are involved in needless crime and youthful acts of violence...they have lost hope and drive along their way with no educational structure for them.

We need all hands/bodies on deck with MPS leadership, Board Leadership and the MTEA working together, to make sure that MPS moves forward and takes those children and their families with them to the promised land of educational achievement.

Please put aside the fighting, the public disagreements, and the dis-unity because the fact is...that we all work for the children and their parents who rely on MPS to provide the best education possible. We can’t expect the State
