Some assume I'm a conspiracy buff. For the most part, they're correct.

Not the ham and cheese variety, but those conspiracies grounded in deceit and whose outcomes can be seen, felt or tasted.

I'm particularly interested in conspiracies that negatively impact our tribe or create alligator-

filled moats to keep us out of the castle.

Obviously, I haven't fallen for the foolish fantasy of Donald Trump supporters who believe the presidential election was rigged, or a return to the 'good ole (bad) days' is the only hope for preserving America from being swallowed up by the twin whales of liberalism and diversity.

But I believe the government is complicit—if not the harbinger—of many evil deeds over the generations.

One of the obvious—albeit successful—conspiracies has been to blind people to the reality that the two intertwined political parties is not in fact a self-serving monopoly whose policies and platforms are mere mirages created to hypnotize naive poor and disenfranchised voters.

The fact that their 'clients' status does not change from election

to election is telling.

I contend both parties conspire to keep their constituencies blinded by the bright light of political rhetoric, fear-mongering, and false hopes.

for individuals 12-years-old and older as supplies last.

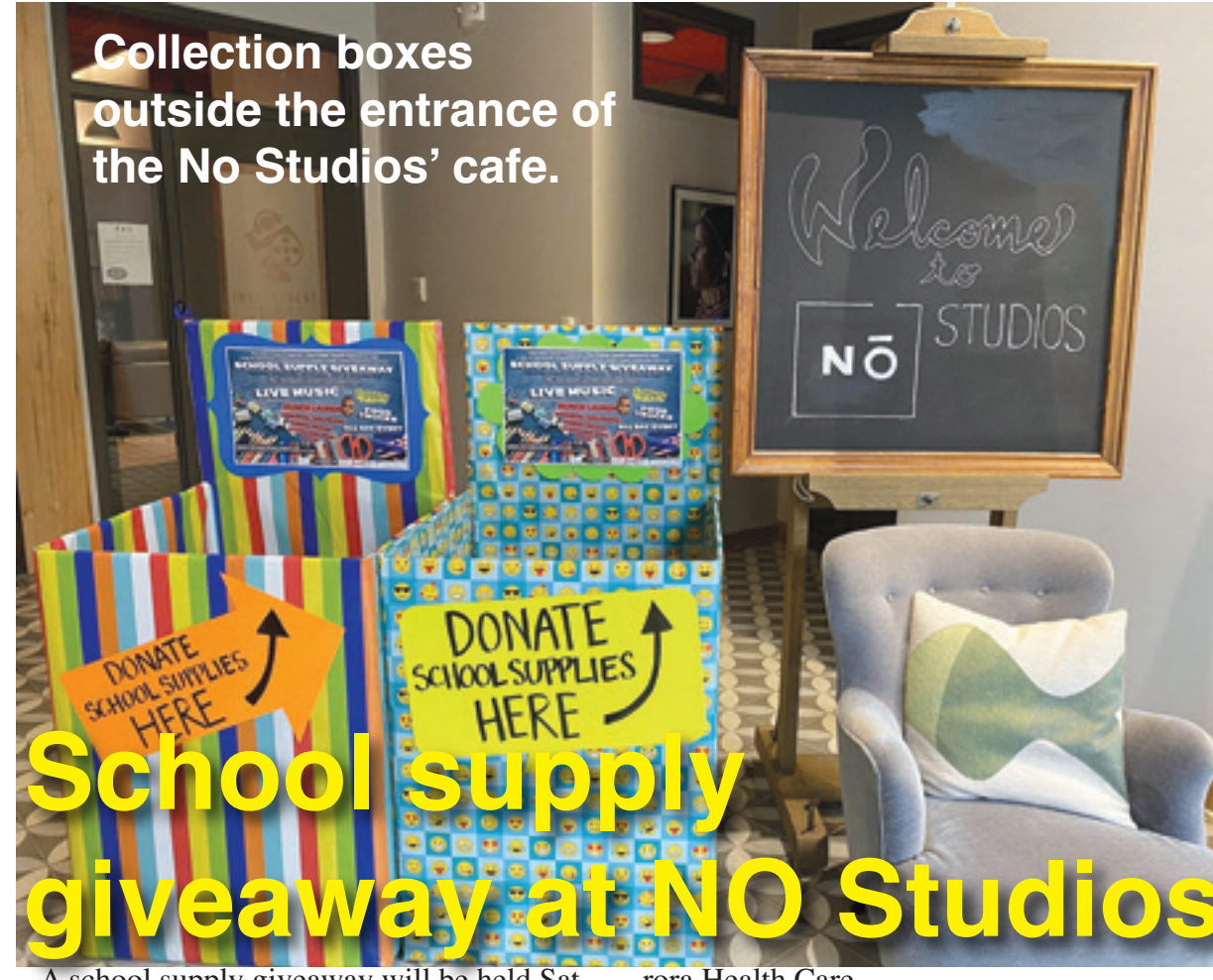
The event emphasizes MUL’s continued mission to lead through education, and the event sponsors represent the vast amount of support shown to the promising future of Milwaukee students.

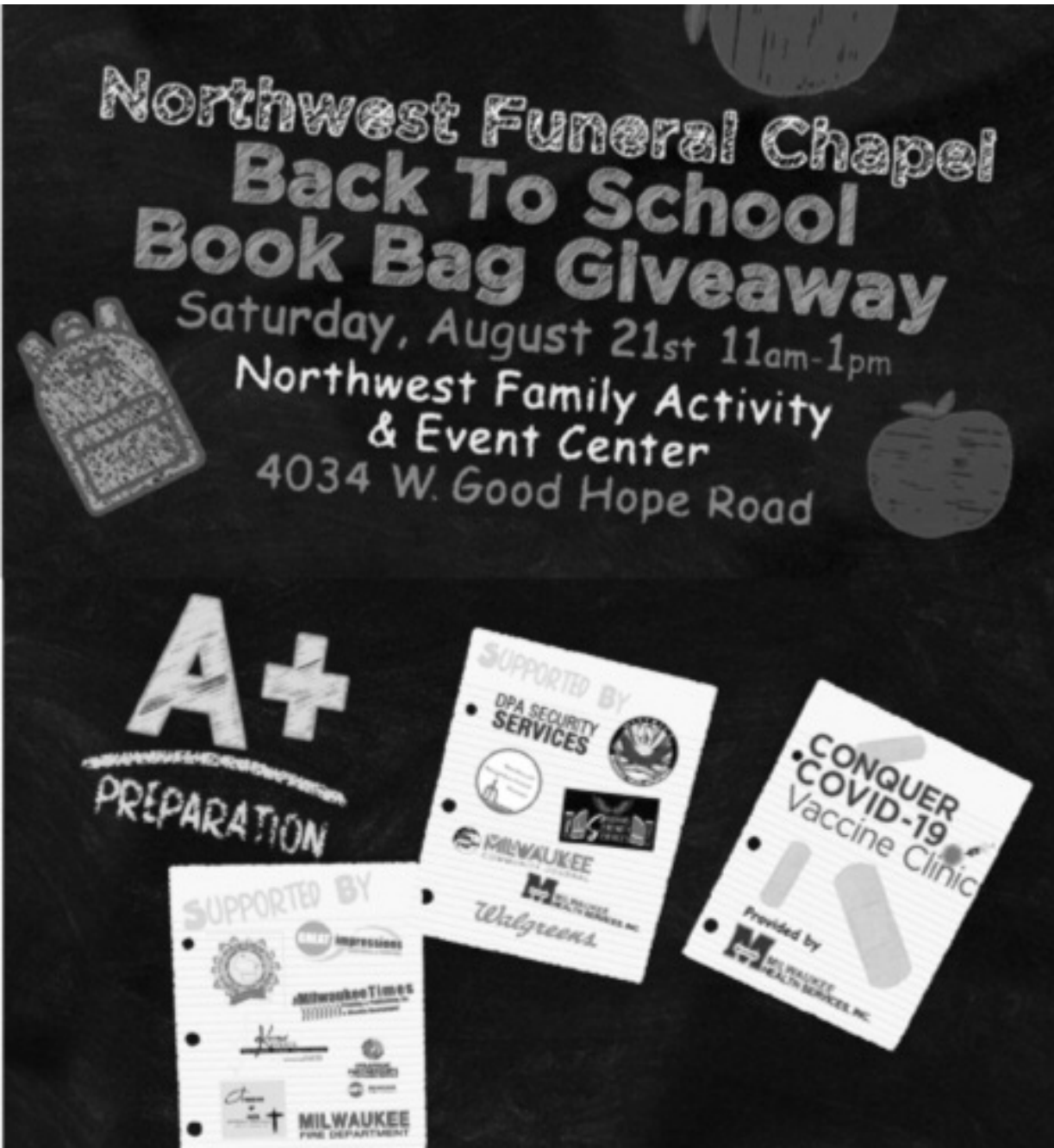

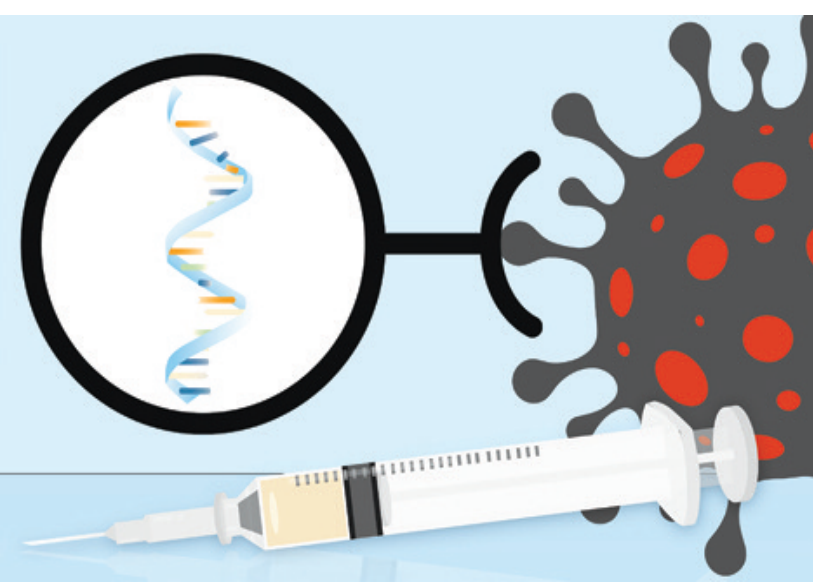

Immunocompromised people eligible for third dose of COVID-19 mRNA vaccine



On August 12, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) modified the Emergency Use Authorizations (EUs) for Pfizer and Moderna COVID-19 vaccines to allow use of an additional dose of COVID-19 mRNA vaccine for immunocompromised people who may not be fully protected from the first two doses.

Following CDC and Wisconsin DHS guidance, the Milwaukee Health Department has begun vaccination of all eligible individuals.

Additional vaccine doses for those who qualify will be available at the Northwest Health Center (7630 W. Mill Rd.) and Southside Health Center (1639 S. 23rd St.) without an appointment.

Those receiving the additional mRNA COVID-19 vaccine dose will not be required to provide written attestation of their eligibility.

Those who are unsure if they qualify to receive the additional dose should check with their healthcare provider first.

Eligible/Qualified Individuals include but are not limited to those 12 and older with:

- Active treatment for solid tumor and hematologic malignancies
- Receipt of solid-organ transplant and taking immunosuppressive therapy
- Receipt of CAR-T-cell or hematopoietic stem cell transplant (within two years of transplantation or taking immunosuppression therapy)
- Moderate or severe primary immunodeficiency (DiGeorge syndrome, Wiskott-Aldrich syndrome)
- Advanced or untreated HIV infection
- Active treatment with high-dose corticosteroids (≥20mg prednisone or equivalent daily), alkylating agents, antimetabolites, transplant-related immunosuppressive drugs, cancer chemotherapeutic agents classified as severely immunosuppressive, tumor-necrosis (TNF) blockers, and other biologic agents that are immunosuppressive or immunomodulatory

The CDC recommends individuals receive the same COVID-19 vaccine (Pfizer or Moderna) for the additional dose as they received for the first two doses.

If the vaccine product received

for the first two doses is unavailable, the other mRNA COVID-19 vaccine product may be administered.

At this time, there is insufficient data to support additional doses of COVID-19 vaccine for immunocompromised individuals who received a single dose of Johnson & Johnson vaccine.

Those who received the John-

son & Johnson vaccine should not seek out an additional mRNA vaccine dose.

At this time, booster doses for individuals with normal immune systems, whose immunity may have waned over time, are not recommended. The Milwaukee Health Department will adhere to evolving guidance from federal and state authorities.

good friend and now business partner, Dominique Alvarado. Dominique has over six years of culinary experience.


Tostada by Maranta will use only local farm-to-table produce and meat, with the Tostadas themselves made from organic corn and sourced in Madison by Latinx producers.

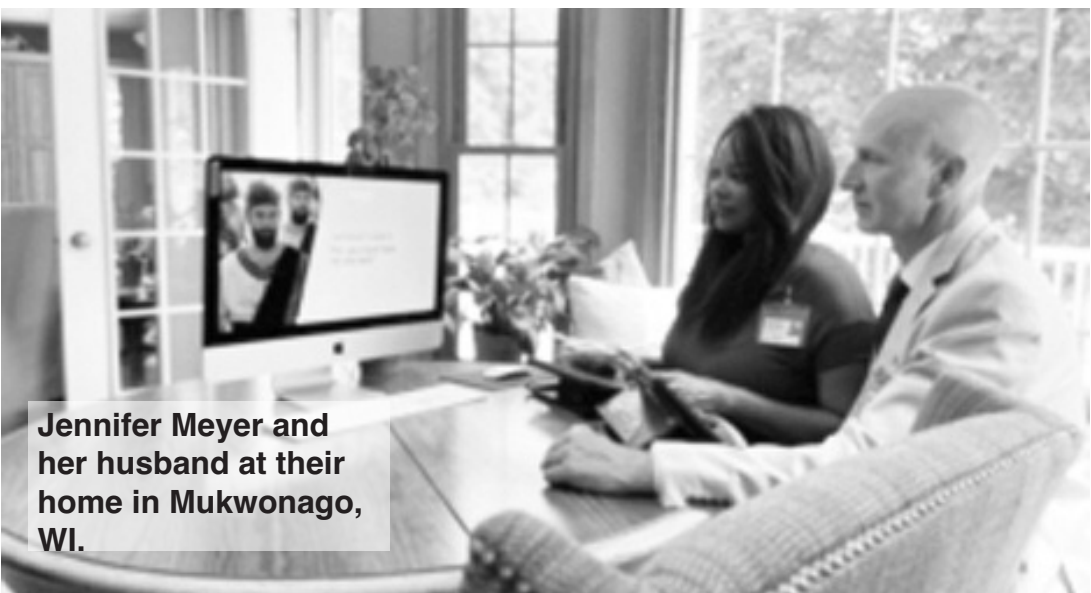

Jehovah's Witnesses Hold Global Virtual Event in 240 Lands, 500+ Languages

Breaking a century-old tradition, the largest convention organization in the world has moved its annual in-person event to a virtual format for the second time in as many years, canceling nearly 6,000 conventions in 240 lands.

For more than 100 years, Wisconsin experienced thousands of Jehovah's Witnesses from all over the Midwest streaming into its hotels and restaurants during their convention days each summer.

In 2020, the pandemic unexpectedly interrupted that tradition moving the international religious organization to cancel in-person conventions throughout the world and launch a

global virtual event. This was a first for Jehovah's Witnesses, who have held public conventions in stadiums, arenas, convention centers, and theaters around the world since 1897.

"Powerful by Faith!" is the theme of the 2021 global event, delivered in more than 500 languages to households throughout the globe during July and August 2021, uniting some 15-20 million people in 240 countries.

Since the convention is typically held from Friday through Sunday, the program is available in six installments corresponding to morning and afternoon sessions.

Sunday morning's session will highlight the symposium "Imitate Women of Strong Faith!" This presentation, focused on the courageous acts of some of the many notable women of faith from Bible times and the 20th century, will show the high value God places on women regardless of their age, culture, or economic standing.

Kathy Priem, of Slinger, Wis. said: "These women came from very different backgrounds—very different life experiences. I hope to benefit from what they all have in common: their example of strength because of their faith."

Few stories have captivated Bible readers as much as the account of the prophet Daniel. In the highly anticipated two-part feature film, "Daniel: A Lifetime of Faith," viewers will see his strong faith in action as he reacts to temptations, trials, ridicule, and the threat of death.

"Daniel's example in particular has always been of special encouragement to me," said Joel Culbertson, of Forest Park, Wis. "I can't wait to see his life story and how his many acts of faith come alive in a whole new way on screen."

Jennifer Meyer, of Mukwonago, Wis., agreed, saying that this film gives "an amazing glimpse into the feelings, struggles, and miracles Daniel experienced because of his faith in God."

The planning and translation of a program of this magnitude takes months of effort. With the uncertainty of whether it would be safe to bring thousands of people together in cities around the world, the organization opted for a virtual platform for the second consecutive year.

However, the move has not curbed the enthusiasm for the annual event. Congregations around the world are inviting the public to join them in this historic occasion.

"Faith has helped our global brotherhood to continue to thrive even during a pandemic," said Robert Hendriks, U.S. spokesman for Jehovah's Witnesses.

"Our faith will continue to unite us in worship—even virtually—as millions gather in private homes around the world to enjoy a powerful and inspiring spiritual program."

Signifyin’ about conspiracy theories

I’ve become somewhat of an aficionado of conspiracies related to Black America.

I’ve spent most of my adult life--my journalistic career--authenticating them.

And while some may seem bizarre, that generally means the conspirators have been successful. For example:

- Aliens have visited earth. We are not alone in the universe.
- Africans were the firstborn children of God (Nyame) and thus the chosen people.
- There is but one race.
- There are 16-year-old African American virgins.

Let’s start with the first conspiracy.

There is strong evidence the (your) government has conspired for decades to cover-up that aliens have visited earth.

For point of clarification, I’m referencing the government, not necessarily politicians. The government is a permanent, self-defining entity. Politicians, even those with lifetime tenure, are not.

And the government makes decisions politicians are often unaware of. They have a different agenda.

As such, it is plausible that presidents---present and past---may not be aware of ‘secret’ government information or activities. It’s called plausible deniability.

Evidence suggests that paradigm may be behind presidential ignorance about the actual assassins of John F. Kennedy and Martin Luther King, Jr.

We do know ‘The’ U.S. government made seven unsuccessful attempts on the life of Fidel Castro, and the CIA was probably involved in the attempted murder of the Deim brothers in Vietnam, Kim Koo of Korea, Nehru, Nasser, Papa Doc, and Aidede.

It’s okay if you don’t know those names, as they are but footnotes in His-story.

Instead, the U.S. agenda, the conspiracy to control world resources and other governments, has been hidden from public view for a reason.

We know the CIA was behind the murder of African revolutionary Patrice Lumumba. His crime was in seeing a united Africa.

And that same agenda to promulgate White Supremacy was put into play with the murders of American Black leaders, including Fred Hampton and probably Malcolm and King.

For the record, if you can’t find CIA fingerprints on local killings, turn left and down the street to the ‘Gay Edgar’ (also known as the J. Edgar) Hoover complex.

(I use gay not to disparage, but to bring to light his true denied sexual identity.)

You’ll find Hoover’s palm prints everywhere, including on the caskets of at least one Kennedy and dozens of Black leaders.

But you don’t have to leave the city to see secret conspiracies to undermine Black equality and justice.

Locally, former Chief Harold Breier (a big Hoover fan, by-the-way) maintained a similar program to the FBI’s COINTELPRO (Counter Intelligence Program).

I know because I was included in the racist chief’s ‘Red Squad’ information data bank, along with activists from Michael McGee to Father James Groppi.

I can’t verify if secret fraternities within the government operate based on their own agenda or whether some outside influence of elite shepherds controls the flock.

But there is superficial evidence to support both theories.

That’s among the reasons why I don’t fully trust the government or politicians. But not for the same reasons as those Racist Roaches who staged the January 6 insurrection.

Obviously, not all of the conspiracies are rooted in government, or the last century.

There’s been a conspiracy to hide the truth about the role of Africans in creating the first studies of math, science, and medicine.

It is not out of ignorance that the great civilizations of Africa are ignored in government education, it is the result of a worldwide conspiracy; White supremacy.

If you believe mankind (but apparently not women) we’re made in God’s image, would not ‘He’ (or is the truth different from that chauvinistic paradigm) is Negriod?

Another theological conspiracy is rooted in the illusion that Jesus—Yeshua, Emanuel---is Caucasian, with blond hair and blue eyes.

The blasphemous truth is a White Jesus is the cornerstone of White Supremacy.

Follow that conspiracy, and everything else falls into place.

I know the founders of this country conspired to create a system of apartheid.

Thomas Jefferson, a slave owner, and hypocrite wasn’t a victim of political pressure when he helped scheme a government that would justify the cruelest system of slavery known to mankind.

While Republicans and Right-Wingers are making an issue of Critical Race Theory, the historical truth is that ‘the’ government exterminated (murdered) 90% of the native inhabitants and justified that genocidal scheme as God-ordained Manifest Destiny.

Think about it:

Suppose Jefferson was faithful to the tenets of the U.S. Constitution and the advancement of democracy and self-determination. Why did he reject the appeal of Haitians in 1802 to assist in their quest to overthrow the French colonialists?

As history notes, Jefferson not only refused to help the Haitians, but imposed an embargo and economic pressure upon the tiny island so severe that it cemented a paradigm of poverty that continues to this day.

Why? Because White Supremacists initially felt if American slaves learned of the Haitian revolution, they would follow suit.

It wasn’t until 1862 that the U.S. recognized Haiti, right before the emancipation proclamation was issued. But hey, we needn’t go international to find good conspiracy examples.

It wasn’t a coincidence that Mayor Henry Maier destroyed Milwaukee’s Black Wall Street for an expressway that was never built.

Or that Milwaukee was and continues to be the most segregated city in the county, or that we host the nation’s highest poverty rate.

You can continue to live in a fantasy world if you wish. Still, the reality is the Milwaukee Common Council conspired to undermine housing ‘integration,’ as it installed systems of economic and educational apartheid.

In fact, it was only after President Lyndon B. Johnson signed a national housing discrimination law that Milwaukee followed suit.

A half-century later, Milwaukee is considered the worst city for African Americans in the country based on negative social indicators, including most segregated.

Did you know the Milwaukee School Board closed central city schools in the early 1970s as part of a secret plan to maintain a system of apartheid after they realized the federal court would cite it for keeping schools segregated?

The majority/major/white media conspired to hide the truth, ignoring how ‘voluntary’ for Black students meant ‘mandatory.’

Sadly, so too did the NAACP and many Black leaders who fell for the okay-doke and spread the word that we had not only reached the ‘mountain top,’ but discovered a diamond mine on the other side.

As it turned out, it was actually a zirconia hole as the number of

Black students who were suspended in their new ‘white’ schools soared, and the achievement gap widened significantly.

Seems like the only entities to question this conspiracy were a couple of Black political mavericks like Polly Williams and this newspaper, which declared in its very first edition that the desegregation process was a sham.

The U.S. Commission on Civil Rights took 10 years to reach the same conclusion.

But that wasn’t the only MPS-related conspiracy.

There’s also been a decades’ old conspiracy between the Democratic Party and the Milwaukee teacher’s union to keep ‘clients’ (Black students) educationally impotent, blocking opportunities for educational options.

The unified opposition to school choice, masterminded by the Democratic Party and the teachers union, has as its penultimate goal stopping Field Negroes from sending their children to the schools most teachers and politicians send their children to.

The House Negroes—the Black middle class—are generally on the same sphere as Whites, and thus their children excel in government education.

The problem is, Milwaukee is home to the highest Black poverty rate in the country.

The opposition to school choice and other educational options has never been about what is best for the Black children. But instead about power and profits. It’s been about the dollar, employment, and retirement benefits.

The coordinated conspiracy has included the utilization of ‘House Negroes’ and ‘Black pawns’ and profiteers to undermine the creditability of Black proponents of options and empowerment, including me.

It has included lawsuits (one by the NAACP) and smear tactics, frequently utilizing Black media that put profits before principle.

Additionally, there is irrefutable evidence that the two primary teachers’ unions have been paid or scared off Black and Brown ‘silver rights’ organizations.

What’s most disconcerting is that many Black leaders who ardently oppose educational options for their poor brethren send their children to private schools.

That ranges from Barack Obama to Jesse Jackson, half of the Democratic Party, and the current Wisconsin DPI superintendent, who says poor Black parents are better served in failing government schools. And oh yeah, she sent her children to private schools because she is ‘privileged,’ which I assume means White.

In fact, the defining action that sent me over the edge to permanent political independence was the state Democratic Party’s investment of \$750,000 in this year’s ‘non-partisan’ race for state school superintendent. The party spent resources from Black contributors for a status quo candidate whose sole credential was appeasing the teachers union.

Yep, there’s a conspiracy around every corner, from the pulpit to the podium to the playground.

There’s even a conspiracy to convince Black women that nappy hair—even straightened—is ugly or unattractive.

As a result, if you invested in wigs and weaves a decade ago, you’d be rich now.

Ironically, I actually hope there has been a conspiracy and coordinated scheme to create the conditions that have hobbled and hindered Black progress in this country.

I hope some old White men are smoking illegal Cuban cigars and drinking Remy XO as they coordinate a master plan to keep Black folks hating themselves, disinvesting from educational opportunities, and adapting Eurocentric culture at the expense of Africentric principles and values.

I hope that’s the case because I would hate to accept the alternative.

Hotep.

OP-ED: Your Company’s Pro-BLM PR Statements Better Match the Receipts

One year ago, after the brutal murder of George Floyd, the summer of 2020 gave us a great white awakening to the truth of systemic racism, and the big pledge to address it.

For a moment, it seemed like every company had tapped their PR agents to compose pro-BLM solidarity statements and pledged big bags of money towards racial equity. The arc of American history appeared to be bending towards justice.

But then, months later, we checked the receipts and discovered that those racial equity donations were never delivered. So, what happened?

The same thing that usually happens. Corporations cosplay as movement allies and then go back to being unprincipled capitalists after white attention moves on.

The Receipts Don’t Lie, Even If Executives Do

Currently, there’s no system for measuring how corporations are following through on their racial equity promises.

Most of the data publicly available only comes from the corporations themselves, and as we saw in the corporate hypocrisy surrounding

Georgia’s voter suppression bill earlier this year, we know that companies will put out a nice statement and then turn around and fund the oppressive politicians creating the problem in the first place.

So, it makes sense that companies want to keep their equity progress – or more accurately, lack thereof – close to their chests. Still, the data that is available paints a grim picture.

An analysis by the consulting firm Creative Investment Research finds that while 232 American companies pledged \$55 billion last summer, out of their collective \$746 billion in 2019 net income, only a measly \$250 million has actually been spent.

Not only does this fall flat in comparison to those grand promises these companies have made, but there’s virtually no data available for where that money even went.

Clearly, corporations thought they could make sweeping promises, ride out the storm, and then quietly back down when it became no longer politically popular. Public support for Black Lives Matter dropped to 48 percent this year, down from 61 percent last May.

That trend is even more pronounced for white Americans. 49 percent oppose BLM compared to 37 percent who support it, down from the peak of 43 percent last year.

This pattern of CEOs waxing poetic about their deep commitment to justice in public just to sit pretty on their piles of cash behind closed doors repeats across countless corporations.

For example: Jamie Dimon, the CEO of JP-Morgan Chase, penned a stirring message to his employees last summer announcing their pledge to equity and inclusion, and the company committed to investing \$30 billion over the next 5 years in racial equity programs. So far, they’ve delivered just \$40 million on that promise.

What makes these financial pledges even worse is that the vast majority of them are in-

vestments into intermediaries like venture capital funds and banks in the form of loans or strings-attached grants – things that ultimately serve the interests of the company making the “donation” by requiring a return on investment. That’s not advancing racial equity. That’s a paternalistic PR move.

All of this matters because we have all the money and solutions we need to achieve racial equity in this country – what we lack is the will. White capitalists can edit human genes, fly to space while Earth burns, and “reimagine” money as crypto and blockchains, but somehow can’t imagine, let alone fund, a better world for Black people. It’s time for these corporations to realize that they can’t buy the public’s good will with bogus ads and empty symbolism if they repeatedly fail to deliver equity for all.

Follow Through, Because We’re Going to Keep Following the Money

Following through on your commitment isn’t abstract. Publicize that equity audit report. Rid your organization of supremacist culture. Execute your DEI strategies and tactics. Hire Black consultants and vendors.

Increase promotions, representation, wages, benefits, opportunities, well-being and decision-making power of your Black staff members. Stop donating to political action committees, candidates, officials and parties who advance policies that discriminate and disenfranchise.

If you’re living the story you’re telling in your pro-BLM PR statements, these action steps are easy.

Remember. Black folks built this country for free. Following through on your pledged commitment to racial equity isn’t an act of benevolence. It’s the bare minimum you can do to repair the damage wrought by America’s original and ongoing sin of structural racism and refund the spoils you inherited from it.

Cut the check.
