Angry Alderman Hamilton says:

**“(I’m) Not leaving until sickening problem is addressed in Garden Homes!”**

Alderman Ashanti Hamilton recently vowed to camp-out near a string of city-owned homes near 26th and Atkinson until a mountain of debris and trash is removed from the neighborhood.

“I am angry and at my wits’ end with this problem, and my patience is gone,” the first district alderman said in a statement announcing his plan.

The homes Hamilton is targeting are for sale and are supposed to be maintained by the Department of City Development (DCD).

“But someone there has been asleep at the wheel and simply unresponsive (for some six weeks!) to the citizen complaints and the requests I have made to have the illegally dumped material removed,” said Hamilton.

The DCD blames the contractor and the

contractor blames DCD, Hamilton said. “All while the problem just continued to grow.

How bad is it?

Recently, Hamilton noted, a homicide victim was discovered under the trash. “Yes—a dead body was found and removed—yet the trash remained after the body was pulled out!”

The alderman said an area attracts good or bad depending on how it looks. “Well, the Garden Homes block I am (camping out) in is currently attracting open drug dealing, loitering drug use and prostitution. That’s about as bad as it gets, and a situation that makes people want to leave the city.”

Hamilton vowed to stay in the area of the homes until the materials are removed and the properties are made to look like attractive places for new residents to call home.

“I expect DCD to act with expediency to address the UNACCEPTABLE conditions here,” Hamilton said.

# Good City Brewing Will Donate 1% of Revenue to Housing!

*Pledge to support affordable housing efforts accompanies release of Home beer in cans.*

Good City Brewing announced recently that it will contribute at least 1% of all company revenue going forward to housing initiatives in Milwaukee.

“Good City was born out of an intentional commitment Dan [Katt] and I made to put down roots and seek the good of Milwaukee.

“As we thought about how we can push forward our mission... as a company, we kept coming back to the importance of rootedness and calling a place home, keys to which are affordable housing and home ownership,” said co-founder David Dupee in a statement. “We’re excited to focus our efforts toward supporting the amazing local nonprofits who are making it easier for everyone to put down roots and call Milwaukee our home.”

The company, which operates taprooms on the Lower East Side, at the Deer District and in suburban Wauwatosa, made the pledge as part of an announcement that its lager-style Home beer would now be available in cans.

“Home has quickly become one of our more popular brands, especially during the historic Bucks’ championship run.

“We’re excited to introduce a format that will make Home more accessible in the market,” said Katt.

Dupee told Urban Milwaukee that the organization intends to make the contributions annually through a soon-to-launch

application process, but would consider time-sensitive needs.

Good City opened in 2016 at 2108 N. Farwell Ave. and substantially expanded that facility in 2017.

In 2018, the partners announced the acquisition of the Century City 1 warehouse with plans to use the facility as a home for offices, future production space and like-minded tenants.

It opened its Deer District brewery and taproom in January 2019, but surrendered the lease on an event venue above the taproom amidst the COVID-19 pandemic.

The brewery opened a taproom at the Mayfair Collection earlier this year.

This isn’t the first time the organization has explicitly backed housing efforts. It used proceeds from its Black is Beautiful beer release in 2020 to support the Garden Homes neighborhood housing renovation initiative near its Century City facility.

The low-income housing tax credit project is being led by a partnership of the 30th Street Industrial Corridor Corporation business improvement district, Impact Seven and Garden Homes Neighborhood Association.

The housing funding announcement comes one day after a coalition of stakeholders announced a 30-year vision to address Milwaukee’s affordable housing shortage. That proposal calls for an additional \$135 million to be raised and invested in housing preservation and creation in the next decade.

# Race, Not Job, Predicts Economic Outcomes for Black Households



DURHAM, N.C. — During the decade-long economic recovery following the Great Recession, Black households lost much more wealth than white families, regardless of class or profession, according to new research from Duke University’s Samuel DuBois Cook Center for Social Equity.

Notably, while most other groups experienced an economic recovery between 2010 and 2019, Black professionals suffered losses in wealth, the authors found. Meanwhile, Black working-class families remained in the worst overall economic position. As a result, many Black

families entered the COVID-19 pandemic in a state of financial precarity.

“As the economy recovered, the typical Black household remained financially fragile and entered the COVID-19 crisis with less of a private safety net,” says co-author Fenaba Addo, an associate professor of public policy at University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill and faculty affiliate of the Cook Center. “By comparison, white working-class households had overwhelmingly middle-class levels of wealth -- and were better positioned for the economic uncertainty the pandemic brought.”

The paper is available online in The Annals of the American Academy of Political and Social Sciences.

The authors explored the roughly decade-long period following the Great Recession, starting in 2010 and ending in 2019, prior to the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic. The racial wealth gap was already sizable prior to the Great Recession and increased during and after, they found. During the recession,

Black and Latino households lost 48 and 44 percent of their wealth, respectively, while white households lost just 26 percent. As of 2019, Black households held less than fifteen percent of the net worth of white households.

The authors classified individuals and households according to both race (non-Latino Black, non-Latino white and Latino) and class (working class or professional managerial class, based on occupations).

“One of the important contributions of this study is our conscious effort not to treat everyone who engages in paid labor as members of the working class,” says co-author William A. Darity Jr., founding director of the Cook Center and the Samuel DuBois Cook Professor of Public Policy, African and African American Studies and economics at Duke University.

“We separate the working class from the professional-

managerial class and demonstrate this has strong implications for uneven recoveries from the Great Recession and uneven access to wealth across households.”

While economic outcomes improved for most non-Black households between 2010 and 2019, few Black households could keep up.

The percentage of both Black professional-class and working-class households who were middle-class or above fell between 2010 and 2019.

Also, Black and Latino-led households were less likely than white households to achieve these higher thresholds of wealth -- regardless of whether they belonged to the professional or working class.

The authors also identified households that are “wealth poor,” and thus in the most precarious economic position. in 2019, the federal annual poverty threshold was \$25,750 in annual income, or roughly \$2,100 a month. When a household’s total net worth is less than three months’ income (at \$2,100 a month), a household is classified as “wealth poor.”

The proportion of “wealth poor” families decreased from 2010 to 2019 across most racial and professional categories, but it increased among Black professionals.

Moreover, a majority of Black and Latino households -- across the working and professional classes -- fell into this economically precarious category.

These disparities have far-reaching effects. “Black households’ cumulative, intergenerational inability to acquire wealth continues to contribute to their sedimentation at the bottom of the socioeconomic distribution,” the authors write.

And without the ballast this wealth provides, Black households are more vulnerable during economic downturns -- and less able to reap the benefits of economic recoveries.
