THE MKE FELLOWS TEAM WITH PGA TO GO "BEYOND THE GREEN"



International Ryder Cup Event Provides Milwaukee Youth with Access to Careers in Professional Golf Industry

MKE Fellows, in partnership with the **PGA of America**, provided a once-in-a-lifetime, behind-the-scenes experience for over 60 Milwaukee youngsters to see "Beyond the Green" when they visited Whistling Straits Golf Course, home of this year's international Ryder Cup event.

One of the greatest sporting events in the world, the Ryder Cup brings the USA and Europe's best golfers and global attention to Wisconsin September 23-26, 2021.

"Beyond the Green" is designed to provide access to youth who need and de-

serve opportunities to enter and flourish in the professional golf industry and every field of human endeavor.

PGA REACH, the 501(c)(3) charitable foundation of the PGA of America partnered with the MKE Fellows allowing access to the Ryder Cup's inner workings, event operations, and top PGA leadership.

Milwaukee area youth from several Milwaukee Public Schools, Marquette University High School, Kappa Leadership Development League, Urban Underground, Pearls for Teen Girls, and the Watchmen from the Milwaukee Rescue Mission, learned about career opportunities in the golf industry directly from PGA of America leadership, special invited guests, and several powerful panelists including PGA President Jim Richerson, Milwaukee Bucks President Peter Feigin, actor/comedian Chris Tucker, Jordan Brand VP Gentry Humphrey, and others.

The day-long career awareness and exploration event also included an on-site tour of the Ryder Cup's inner workings at Whistling Straits as part of the PGA WORKS "Beyond the Green" event, the first-of-its-kind held during Ryder Cup week.

"We continue to partner with leading organizations



like the PGA and work purposefully to open doors and expand the career universe for Milwaukee youth," said MKE Fellows Executive Director John W. Daniels III.

"It doesn't get any bigger than the Ryder Cup and to provide our youngsters with personal and direct access to those who direct and control this \$84 billion international industry is monu-

mental."

sights about how gender and race impact women. In conversation with Phillip is recently retired Dr. Joan M. Prince, Vice Chancellor Emeritus of Global Inclusion and Engagement at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and a nationally renowned advocate for equity. Together they discuss the complexities and underscore the importance of understanding the unique experiences of women of color, to advance equity for all women in the Greater Milwaukee community.

“I am looking forward to my conversation with Abby and our discussion about how gender and race impact women in Milwaukee and across the world,” said Dr. Joan M. Prince.

“This is a critical topic, and the more people who join the conversation and understand the barriers women face, especially women of color, the better poised we’ll be to bring about real change and equity for all women.”

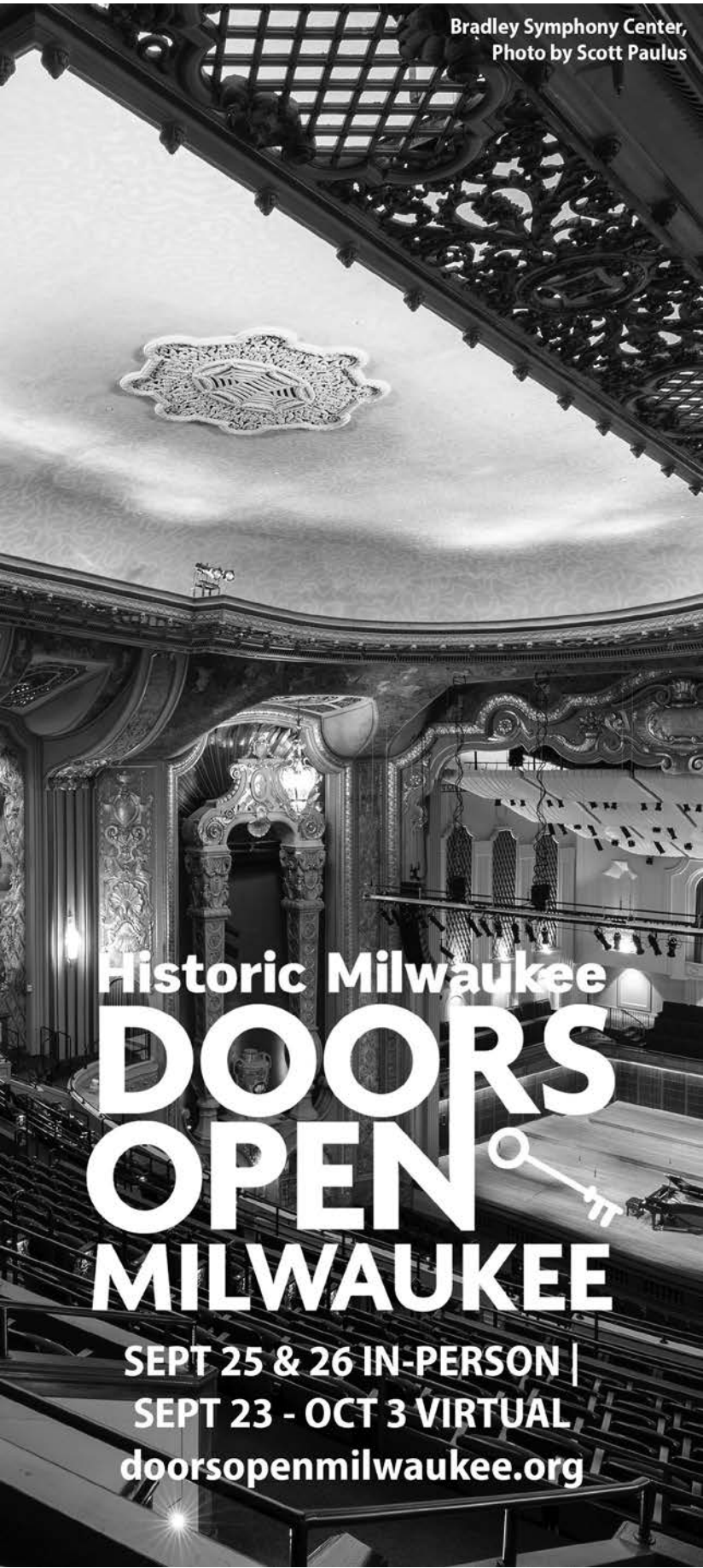

"When I think of Hispanic heritage in Milwaukee, I think of Walter, Alondra, Voces, UMOS, and those like them who fight day and night for our community and represent the best of Latinx and Hispanic leadership."

Walter Garron is a state commander of Los Brown Berets Wisconsin and has worked tirelessly since the beginning of the

pandemic to support those impacted by COVID-19.

Through food drives and advocating for improved working conditions for workers at the Patrick Cudahy Plant, Walter is a dedicated advocate, organizer, and leader for the community.

Alondra Garcia, a 2nd grade bilingual MPS teacher, is an immigrant and DACA recipient. Empowered by her identity, Alondra has worked with Voces de la Frontera to stand up for immigrant and workers' rights. Alondra recently leaned on her background to write eloquently in Milwaukee Neighborhood News Service about the need to create a pathway to citizenship.

Voces de la Frontera, led by Christine Neumann-Ortiz, works constantly to advance a pro-immigrant, pro-worker, and pro-student agenda at the local, state, and federal level.

Voces de la Frontera celebrated its 20th anniversary in 2021.

UMOS has been a staple in the migrant-worker and immigrant community in Wisconsin for decades, providing energy assistance, domestic abuse support services, housing assistance, HIV and tobacco prevention services, and more. UMOS celebrated its 55th anniversary in 2020.
