

October is National Breast Cancer Month! We again capture another opportunity to encourage our readers to remember breast health and address it, especially in October.

Breast Cancer remains a disparity that demands increased education and information. So, we went to Milwaukee Health Services Inc. and Dr. LaKesha Lawrence, MD, FACOG, board certified obstetrician and gynecologist, who shared pointers and challenged us to make this month meaningful with a take charge attitude about breast health and overall women's wellness.

Dr. Lawrence is located at 8200 W. Silver Spring Dr., which is one of the Milwaukee Health Services Inc. locations and has specialized in Women's obstetrical and gynecological and reproductive health for over 15 years.

"The pandemic halted many activities. Add the typical apprehensions, misinformation and health disparities, plus concern about Covid 19 exposure, some of our most vulnerable just stopped coming to the doctor's office. Now is the time to really focus again on women's health, including breast health, this month."

U.S. Senate candidate says his experience as educator, military vet gives him the advantage in campaign

If you think Mandela Barnes is the most qualified among the announced candidates running for the Democratic nomination for U.S. Senate—because he served in the state legislature and is

now lieutenant governor—and has (to some) the best chance to dethrone Republican incumbent senator Ron Johnson, think again!

Of the 16 currently declared Democratic candidates, Darrell Williams may have them all beat.

At least that was the thinking of this reporter after a recent phone interview.

While some of the candidates may have experience in grassroots activism, business (as an owner or executive), politics, health, sports management, education and military experience, this reporter felt Williams' varied experience in education, the military (serving two combat tours in Iraq and





Charles Warren: Judge, Chief, and Sensei

If asked to choose a local African American for a real-life docudrama based on their historical relevancy and individual accomplishments, Charles Warren would be on my shortlist.

If you didn't know him, you'd probably walk past the physically fit but unassuming community elder without realizing you just shared space with a true Black history maker whose name will also be etched in the monument of Black pioneers.

Hundreds of benefactors of his groundbreaking martial arts system will be on hand this Saturday to pay tribute to 'Sensei' (instructor) Warren as his karate system marks its 50th anniversary.

The event, set for the Four Seasons on Brown Deer Road, has been sold out for weeks, a testament to Warren's popularity and influence.

There's no question he is a martial arts innovator whose vision brought into focus a system that has positively impacted thousands of Black Milwaukee youth.

Yet, that is but part of the story.

Warren's life journey is worthy of a screenplay that could fit into several categories, from an authentic military action hero to a pioneer law enforcement officer.

He served for over 23 years with the Wisconsin Highway Patrol, was named chief of the Palmyra, Wisconsin police department, and is currently a municipal court judge in that community.

That's right, he currently holds the title of 'Judge Charles Warren.'

Both positions are historic firsts for an African American.

But his law enforcement career has another watermelon seed on top: Before those history-making accomplishments, Warren served two

tours as a military/police advisor in Kosovo during the height of that country's civil war. His history-making accomplishments aside, Warren will probably

ments aside, Warren will probably be best remembered for opening the first African American school in the state.

From a small room in the back of the old Northside YMCA with four students in 1970 to six schools throughout the state and an academy in Strpce, Kosovo, Warren has taught and mentored an untold number of youth and adults during his five decades of teaching here and abroad

His Kosovo school has produced some of the best martial artists in Europe.

They continue a tradition of inimitably trained and hard-edged fighters who have elevated Kempo Goju as one of the most respected fighting schools in the Midwest.

His local students (he also has dojos in Palmyra and Hudson, Wisconsin) are known for their aggressive style of fighting that strikes fear in the hearts of opponents in both professional and amateur tournaments.

And I'm not exaggerating!

I recall going to a tournament in northern Wisconsin many years ago, during which the head instructor of another dojo refused to allow his student to compete against ours.

He said we were 'too rough.'

'Tough or fearless' would be better descriptions, for that is what Kempo Goju has symbolized for decades.

Warren's students have excelled in competition over the decades, a fact that can be traced to his introduction of traditional training methods intermingled with unique fighting techniques.

In fact, Warren revealed in a recent interview that he originally named his (continued on page 5)

screenings like routine Mammography. " Dr. Lawrence continued, "Routine breast cancer screening is highly

recommended because early detection is the key to best treatment outcomes and the best chance for cure from this second leading cause of cancer deaths in women."

As women age, breast cancer risks increase, so starting at age 40, women are encouraged to have their annual mammogram every year. Using tools of mammography, such a digital mammograms and 3D (dimensional) mammography, especially for "dense breasts", physicians such as Dr. Lawrence can diagnose and treat breast cancers that are very small and still have the potential for best outcomes.

Patient complaints such as "a lump", a change in skin color appearance, retraction of the nipple or breast tissue, or pain, are not normal and should be reported immediately to your doctor. And sometimes, your doctor will use other tools such as the ultra sound and biopsies to gain additional information. These tools help to refine a diagnosis and shows if the tissue is benign or potentially cancerous.

"We are continuously talking, reassuring our ladies that we can be their resource for good health....breast health and women's health in general. We are in it to win it. And, we want our patients to trust our care and our desire to help them make the best decisions for "their"

"Exercise and good nutrition lead to healthy outcomes," Dr. Lawrence advised. "Obesity and breast cancer are statistically linked, as is diabetes, hypertension, and strokes. Obese women are ten times more likely to have positive mammography results. Our traditional diets are not helping our health outcomes. We must look more closely at the Mediterranean diet that focuses on anti-inflammatory foods; including olive oil, more fatty fish, such as sardines, salmon and mackerel; all fruits, leafy green vegetables and sauerkraut; and limited diary. Though the fermented yogurts; Kimchi; Kefir; and other probiotics are good diary alternatives."

Continuing Dr. Lawrence suggests "we eliminate the fried foods, limit alcohol, processed foods, and refined sugars." She recommends that we also increase our exercise: "150 minutes of exercise every week; 75 minutes of vigorous exercise every week. And, strengthbuilding exercises appear to decrease obesity and decrease breast cancer risks."

Breast Health is good health! Lower the risks by eating well, exercising often, ask questions, and get your routine mammogram screenings. Find a doctor you trust and use their assistance for health guidance.

In conclusion, your best health is everyday health! Here's to healthy eating exercising, tests, screenings and a trusted physician who takes your health as a win win...for you and for them! Breast month, 2021; we are in the PINK!

Afghanistan respectively), former interim superintendent of the Beloit school district (education in general), MATC instructor, and administrator of the Division of Wisconsin Emergency Management makes him (at least to the reporter) the front runner.

Not to mention his common-sense approach to issues on the election agenda such as the COVID-19 vaccination effort, job/business creation, gun rights, the vote, women's rights, education reform and the increase of the minimum wage, he is better positioned to connect with voters.

Once people of the state—especially voters in the senate district Williams wants to represent—hear what the reporter heard, they too just might say: Mandela who?"

"A lot of people ask what separates me from other candidates?" Williams recalled in the interview. "I have 29 years in the military, 26 years in education. Those experiences have transferable skills at the national level. No other candidate has my experience in (dealing with) critical issues."

One issue Williams said he would give laser-like focus to is the pandemic, just as he has as the administrator of the Division of Wisconsin Emergency Management. He strongly believes the best way to beat COVID is to be vaccinated. "It is our best defense. We must trust

the science. However, I will respect the rights of those Americans who do not get vaccinated for religious reasons."

Another area Williams would focus on like a laser is—of course—education. Williams believes his experience as an interim superintendent and as a 'turnaround principal' of several troubled MPS high schools makes him the person who can best articulate and deal with issues of education and children.

As senator, Williams said he would work to expand broadband services throughout the state, calling it a "civil right." He would also advocate for greater school funding and higher teacher pay and benefits.

Williams promised to work with schools, colleges, and universities to develop and expand entrepreneurship opportunities for students; as well as work with HBCU's (Historically Black Colleges and Universities)—as well as Historically Hispanic Serving Institutions—to "build a bridge" to recruit and hire more Black and Hispanic teachers "that reflect the diversity of our state and students."

One intriguing idea Williams has is the development of a 'teacher education pipeline' from high school to the classroom. This will allow the state to 'grow our own' teachers and keep them in Wis-

"If we truly believe diversity is our strength, we must be bold in our recruitment and retainment of more minorities to our state, especially within our schools."

As a veteran himself, Williams is acutely aware of the challenge's veterans and their families face, noting that veterans fight the war abroad and at

Though America no longer has troops in Afghanistan, the senate candidate did reveal veterans lost pay while on deployment.

Williams promised to advocate for greater benefits for veterans—and—for police officers and firefighters. "I'll advocate to expand educational benefits for Wisconsin Veterans and their families to include not only tuition, but room, board, and meals at the school of their choice (in-state or out-of-state). I will fight for expanded mental health services, better health care and we must address and provide better support to homeless veterans."

Williams noted in some states veterans with 100% disability don't have to pay property taxes; while in Texas, veterans with 70% disability don't pay property tax. "We must match other states or be better in compensation for disabled vet-

While Williams doesn't believe in 'defunding' the police, he does believe law enforcement agencies must review their policies, procedures, and budgets to see if 'community-building' programs can be implemented to rebuild the relationship between law enforcement and the community.

Though he believes in the right of Americans to bear arms, Williams believes too many guns are in the hands of people who don't need them. He added he supports gun safety courses for children, but not guns in school. Asked if he supports banning assault weapons such as AK-47, the candidate said he does not support banning them totally, insisting the problem is not the gun but the behavior of the person with the gun.

On voting, Williams said he doesn't support any initiative that prohibits that.

On police brutality, the candidate said police officers must be held to a certain level of accountability. "We can't resolve the problem with the same mindset that caused it.

We've got to take back our children!

Well, we've often thought it and now based upon the Facebook whistle blowers revelations while testifying before Congress, that social media company has deliberately encouraged division.

No wonder there has been so much negative energy surrounding the races. As soon as Barack Obama became President, things began to change; and over the past twelve years the conservatives (also known as 'The Right') got angrier and more defensive. We've all witnessed it, in children and also in

(continued from page 2) program 'Milwaukee Kick Fighters.'

After his students drew notice during a national karate tournament in the 1970s, it was suggested he change the name to a traditional karate moniker to gain greater acceptance in the karate

Thus was born Kempo Goju Karate, reflecting a merger of Japanese and Chinese styles.

It's almost impossible to separate his karate style from Warren's persona.

He was first introduced to Goju Karate as a teenaged Air Force non-commissioned officer while stationed in Japan, following a tour in Viet-

He quickly embraced and excelled under internationally recognized 'master' instructor Gogen

After his military service, Warren ventured to Albuquerque, New Mexico, where he studied Kempo under Bob Cumming. Upon returning to Milwaukee, he merged the

two styles to form his own system: Kempo Goju, a structure accommodating different body types. It includes both a hard and soft style of traditional karate, with Chinese boxing.

Kempo Goju is thus more realistic for real-life combat scenarios, particularly those in central cities where 'Ghetto Ryu' is an unstructured but deadly reality.

Sensei Warren first introduced his system at the Northside YMCA with four students, including the late Muhammad Sabir, who became one of his first black belts and became a catalyst for the system's growth.

Sabir made the transition last year. His impact, however, will live on indefinitely. He, too, will be recognized on Saturday. Warren's students include a who's who of no-

table African Americans, including African American physicians, politicians, entrepreneurs, and law enforcement.

I, too, am a proud member of that fraternity, having been initially invited to study with Sensei Warren and later joining Sabir for nearly four decades. All of my male children have earned Black belts, and I have grandchildren currently learning I recognized long ago the benefits of member-

ship in the fraternity and how it instills in Black youth---discipline, comradery, and self-maturation. In many respects, Kempo Goju serves as our Rites of Passage. It is not a coincidence that most of the system's

students come from single-parent homes. Or that Kempo Goju instructors fill a void left by the absence of a male role model in most of their lives.

"We are mentors," Warren confirmed. "And we take our mission seriously.

"Many parents are looking for guidance, someone to mentor their children; not just boys, but girls as well. It's a role we embrace.

'It's been my thinking since the beginning that we---instructors--- must lead by example. Those who stand at the front of the class must be an example to follow; instructors must be mentors who don't just teach karate. They must care for the welfare of the child and respect the adults we teach as well."

Thus, it should not be surprising that Warren's environment at the dojos that transcend self-de-

Sabir took that role to another level. As a former teacher with a Ph.D. in education, he set up classrooms in the basement of his dojo and tutored his students. He served the role of surrogate father to hundreds of children, including as a dis-

But as his system grew, his focus changed. Somewhat.

"Back in the day, we were known for being strong fighters, including the women. In the 70s and 80s, karate tournaments didn't have male and female divisions. Men and women fought each other. And our women usually came out on top." Chief/Judge/Sensei Warren pauses when I ask

him about his life's journey. He is an unassuming brother whose accomplishments resulted from a guiding hand--fate--

He never envisioned creating a karate style when he ventured into the dojo in Japan. And he was encouraged but didn't seriously approach his application for chief of police of the small community of Palmyra, which is halfway between Milwaukee and Madison.

Most surprisingly, he didn't know he was a candidate for municipal judge until he was told of a 'write-in' campaign initiated by residents without


