Historic Harambee neighborhood building named after Reuben & Mildred Harpole

Reuben Harpole, the "unofficial mayor of Milwaukee," earned another honor this week after Bader Philanthropies announced the newly renovated Harambee neighborhood building at 3338 N. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Drive will be

named in honor of him and his late wife, Mildred.

"Reuben and Mildred spent the majority of their lives serving our community on many levels – in our

schools, neighborhoods, philanthropy and through countless civic endeavors," said Daniel J. Bader, president and CEO of Bader Philanthropies in a news release.

"This building and its tenants were born in response to what we heard directly from our neighbors. It's only fitting we name a community building to honor their determination, perseverance and courage to make the lives of others better. It is a testament to their legacy that continues to inspire so many people today."

The historic Harambee building houses Sam's Place, a Milwaukee-based eatery and jazz café; Shalem Healing, a nonprofit clinic that serves the uninsured and underinsured; and Refua Medicinals, a business that combines the use of Chinese herbs with modern nutritional science.

Four things to know about the upcoming flu season

Thanks to COVID prevention measures, last year's flu season was among the mildest in years. Penn experts explain why this year may be different and how to prepare.

Flu shots are a simple way to lower the risk of getting hit with the respiratory virus this fall and winter.

With so much attention focused on the COVID-19 pandemic, it's important to remember that this is the time of year to consider another infectious threat: influenza. While flu viruses can circulate year-round, case numbers tend to begin climbing in October, peaking somewhere between December and February.

Three experts from the University of Pennsylvania have advice.

1: This year's flu season is likely to be harsher than the last

The director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention warned that the United States may be in for a severe flu season ahead. And Penn experts believe we're unlikely to escape with as mild a season as last year. "This year will likely see the return of a typical flu season as many of the other common respiratory illnesses are already returning," says Va-

nessa Stoloff of the university's Student Health Service.

"Yet it's also possible that ongoing COVID-19 prevention strategies will keep this year's wave of flu in check, says Kristin Christensen of the Perelman School of Medicine at Penn.

But she also notes that, due to the low number of flu cases last year, people built less natural immunity, and thus their immune systems might not be primed to fight off a bout with the virus.

"It's important that we all follow the current public health guidance and get our flu shot," Ashlee Halbritter of Penn's Campus Health says.

2: That mask you're wearing to prevent COVID will also help keep the flu at bay

Masking, physical distancing, washing hands often, and socializing outdoors have been shown to drive down the risk of transmitting COVID-19. And that's true for the flu as well. "We have learned that these behaviors have proven to limit the spread of most respiratory illnesses," Stoloff says.

Continuing to practice these measures through flu season, in addition to getting a flu shot, will minimize your risk of getting sick.

3: It's fine to get your flu shot at the same time as a COVID shot

When clinics first began administering COVID-19 vaccines, patients were advised to separate the shot from any other vaccine by two weeks. But times have changed. "We have found with experience that you can get it along with other vaccines, and your immune system will still respond well," says Christensen.

What patients should consider, however, is that getting more than one vaccine at a time could compound the generally mild side effects—headache, fatigue, a low-grade fever—that can accompany both shots. So, for those people seeking a COVID booster or initial shot at the same time as their flu shot, the choice is theirs. "People are making their own decision based on what is more convenient for them," Christensen says.

4: Health care providers are actively preparing to protect their patients

Even while hoping for a quiet flu season, clinicians are preparing for a surge in respiratory infections this fall and winter.

Flu and COVID-19 illnesses can overlap in their symptoms. Patients presenting with flu-like symptoms are now typically given COVID-19 tests as a matter of course, but Christensen says that, as flu season ramps up, they may also be screened for the influenza virus or other respiratory illnesses.

The flu is treated primarily with rest and fluid to let the body fight the infection on its own. Over-the-counter anti-inflammatory pain relievers may help with symptoms. An annual vaccine can help prevent the flu and limit its complications.

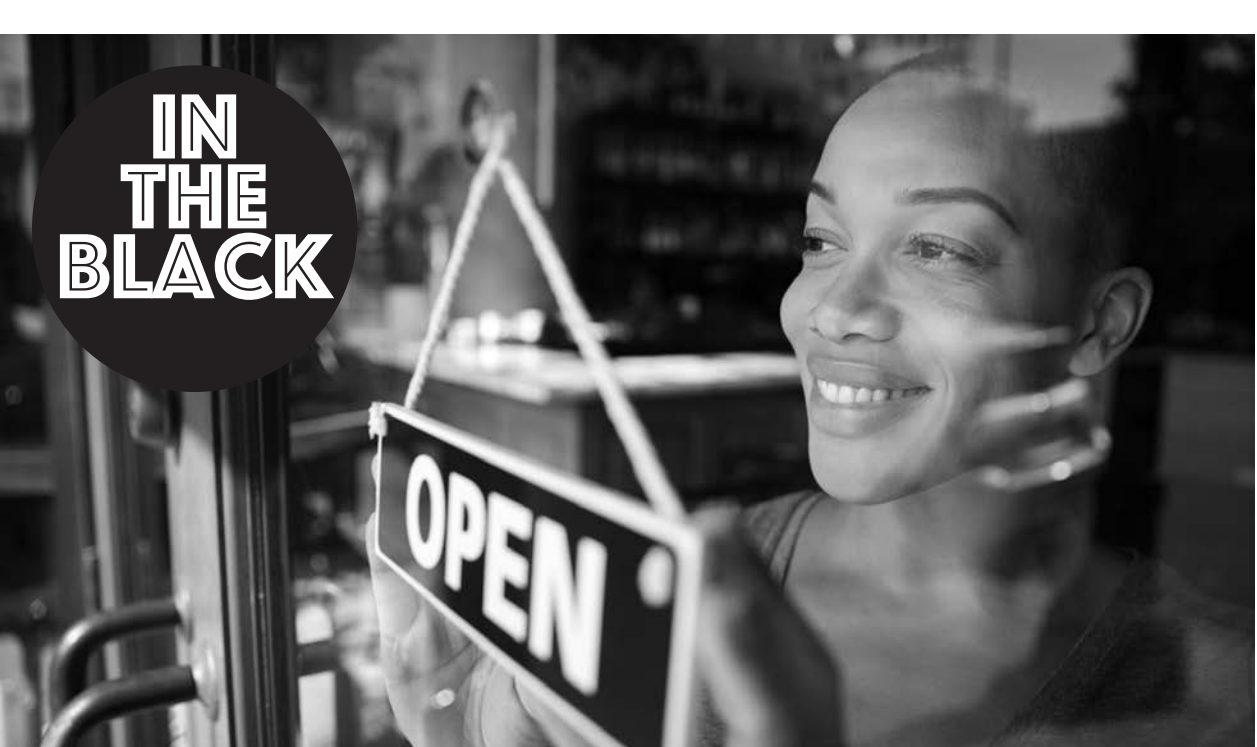

STEM Forward Announces Excellence in STEM Awards Winners to be recognized at the 18th Annual sySTEMnow Conference, Focusing on STEM FOR GOOD: Equity, Innovation, and Change

STEM Forward is thrilled to announce the 2021 Excellence in STEM Award winners, more commonly known as the Stemmy Awards. Help us congratulate the following:

- Education Category: Cedarburg School District. With the leadership of Alan Growth, Director of Curriculum and Instruction, along with a team of teachers, administrators, students, and community members, met tirelessly to define a new direction for STEAM education in the district.

Four areas were highlighted as significant change drivers: Continued emphasis on workforce-ready skills, new standards that impact K-12 instruction, industry changes that change the landscape for future employees entering the trades, and a need for more student engagement in design and engineering courses. These drivers and findings of the program review became a catalyst for recommendations to the Cedarburg School Board and community, followed by implementing these changes.

- Employer Category: Menomonee Valley Partners. A nonprofit organization that plays a key role as a convenor in Milwaukee to redevelop and revitalize the Menomonee River Valley. Its mission is to revitalize and sustain the Menomonee River Valley as a thriving urban district that advances economic, ecological, and social equity to benefit the greater Milwaukee community. Through the hard work of MVP and its project partners, they have continued programming to meet the needs of partnering schools and successfully expanded the programs to build the bridge between businesses of the Menomonee Valley and inspiring youth.

They have hosted several programs include Career Days in Manufacturing and Career Days in Engineering, bringing in 2-3 schools per season.

- Individual Category: Stacy Zaja. During her roles at Time Warner Cable, Rockwell Automation, and now, most recently at Northwestern Mutual, Stacy has always been committed and has advocated ensuring that all students, especially those underrepresented in STEM fields, such as girls and students of color, have the same opportunities to see themselves in a STEM career.

She has worked with other organizations to develop collaborative STEM initiatives that work towards achieving equity by addressing the identified problems collectively and integrating factors of Black and Latinx student motivation into STEM programming.

- Partnership Category: Milwaukee Tech Coalition and the Higher Education Regional Alliance (HERA).

As part of the MKE Tech Talent Accelerator Pre-Internship Program focusing on Ethics and Impact of Data and AI, 85 participants representing 27 different schools with 87% of participants identified as being part of a group historically underrepresented in tech completed all the requirements within ten weeks.

They earned a Foundations in Data and AI badge certified by HERA.

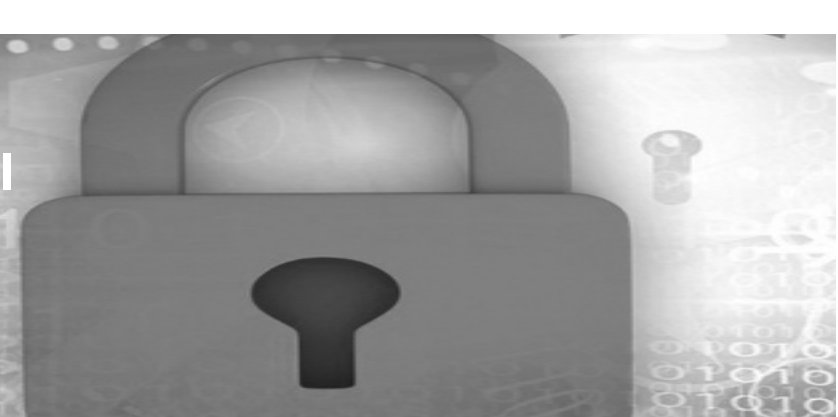
