Johnson Controls as Speaker Sponsor Welcomed Abby Phillip for a Conversation about Gender, Race and the Impact of Intersectionality

Last Thursday on Nov. 18, the Women's Fund of Greater Milwaukee Presented...Disruptors, Changing the Power Dynamics at the organization's annual event. During this dynamic luncheon, the Women's Fund deepened the community conversation about gender and race and the impact of intersectionality for women in Milwaukee.

To initiate the luncheon, Monica Shah-Davidson, board director, chair of the annual Women's Fund Presents event committee and key account executive at Google, welcomed everyone before introducing fellow board director, Starla Thompson, from the Potawatomi and Santa Ynez Chumash nations and one of the named Disruptors, for a land acknowledgement. Thompson highlighted the relationship

indigenous people have with our land and why it is important for everyone to engage as caretakers.

Following lunch, Marlika Vélez, board chair of the Women's Fund of Greater Milwaukee and senior director of marketing at Associated Bank, discussed the event's theme, touching on the importance of everyone coming together as a community to lift each other up and create equity for all women.

"The Women's Fund annual event is an opportunity for us to discuss an important topic impacting equity for women, and it was inspiring to see so many people engage with the concept of intersectionality at this year's event," said Vélez. "Because we all know, Milwaukee has many divides, and we need bridges in our beloved city. We are counting on all of you to be Disruptors."

Johnson Controls, as Speaker Sponsor, brought Abby Phillip, senior political correspondent and anchor of Inside Politics Sunday on CNN, to the event for a conversation with recently retired Dr. Joan M. Prince, Vice Chancellor Emeritus of Global Inclusion and Engagement at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and a nationally renowned advocate for equity. Together both Phillip and Dr. Prince discussed the need to recognize the layers of identity for women, especially women of color.

"In every room that I am in, because I am a black woman and I am aware of myself in relation to other people; I notice when there are people who are not in the room with me. It is obvious to me and I know there are perspectives missing. In my workplaces,

there have been perspectives missing at very important tables," said Phillip. "We, as a society, need to look at each other and solve problems together. It's okay to not know the answer, but it is important to put the work in to looking for the answer. It takes the combined action of each and every one of us to create lasting change."

Phillip and Dr. Prince discussed how important it is to have and join conversations with individuals from different backgrounds and viewpoints. It is hard to solve a problem when everyone in the room already has the same perspective. "I encourage a lot of women to harbor your ambition, nurture it, but do it in a way where you don't sacrifice who you really are," said Phillip.

As a final call to action, Phillip and Dr. Prince encouraged attendees to have important conversations about inclusion. Everyone is accountable for their actions, and having discussions about difficult topics, encourages change.

Additionally, the Women's Fund celebrated various "Disruptors" in the Milwaukee community, named by Johnson Controls as the Speaker Sponsor, Associated Bank as the Signature Sponsor and Baird, as Visionary Sponsor, along with numerous other event sponsors. These "Disruptors" are people who are changing the status quo and creating social change. They are innovative and breaking new ground. They are bold thinkers, leading by example, inspiring others, and shifting attitudes, behaviors, and culture.
