COMMUNITY MINISTERS ACCUSE CITY OF ILLEGALLY TAXING CHURCHES

As many as 50 central city churches may have been 'illegally' assessed taxes by the city last year, it was learned during a rally of area clergy and national civil rights leader Rev. Jesse Jackson Tuesday.

Several dozen African American ministers have participated in two rallies in recent weeks to protest what they call a 'tax and take' scheme by the city tax assessor in which churches have been threatened with foreclosure unless they pay city property taxes.

While the U.S. Constitution forbids taxing churches, that hasn't stopped the city from seeking revenues from churches using a controversial law that requires annual reporting guidelines.

That loophole has created a scenario where several excessively taxed churches have been forced to curtail programs or face foreclosure. At least two Black churches were foreclosed by the city, but were able to secure their mortgages back after paying large liens. Pastors were told they had to pay the assessments before they could appeal, prompting allegations of 'extortion.'

While the city assessor's office believes they are within the rights, many ministers said they are unaware of the state requirement.

Several ministers said the city has sought to circumvent state and federal laws by assessing taxes on church properties used for non-religious work, including playgrounds and schools.

Father Gregory Greiten, of St. Bernadette Parish, said the church's school building had been assessed \$42,000 over two years.

Another minister revealed he only learned of the city's assessment when he was approached. (continued on page 4)

approached by a fellow cleric who was interested in purchasing his 'foreclosed' church. The city had started the foreclosure proceedings without the pastor being informed.

"How insulting is that?" asked Rev. Greg Lewis, president of 'Souls to the Polls' and Pastors United.

Rev. Steve Tipton, pastor of El Bethel Church of God In Christ, revealed during a rally in October that the city was in the process of foreclosing on his church as well until he paid \$16,000 in back taxes.

"They (city) are trying to make it look like we're at fault for not complying with a state requirement when many of us are unaware of it," Rev. Lewis said.

"The bottom line is that the constitution says we are tax exempt. The founders recognize that we are a unique entity, providing spiritual and support services. How can the state or city supersede that proclamation?"

While the ministers have been lobbying city officials for several months about what they call 'strong-armed tactics by assessors,' Rev. Lewis said most of those efforts have fallen on deaf ears.

concerns.

Barrett said after the meeting that he strongly supported the tax-exempt status of churches and would investigate the issue.

He acknowledged the state reporting procedure might be confusing, and mistakes may have occurred.

Addressing media following the rally, Barrett asked, "what if you have a legitimate church that doesn't file? What should the penalty be?"

The answer to that question from several ministers is to follow the constitutional mandate.

The assembled clerics called for a moratorium on all tax collections until the matter is resolved. They also

After leaving the mayor's office, Reverend Jackson said that he was guardedly optimistic the issue would be resolved. However, he also threatened legal action if there was no immediate resolution.

He also said Milwaukee could find itself under the national spotlight if the matter is not resolved immediately. Jackson added the clerics are willing to go to jail if necessary.

"Many central city churches are hanging on by a thread," Rev. Lewis said. "The pandemic has severely hurt us. Some ministers are paying utilities out of their social security funds.

Rev. Lewis theorized the

large enough to make any significant contribution to that program.

He said it was ironic that there are daily news reports of large for-profit corporations paying zero taxes while the city is forcing small Black churches to close down.

Lewis also said he was disappointed with the apparent apathy of most Black alderpersons toward the churches' plight.

"We are doing the work the city should be doing. We are feeding the hungry and providing shelter to the homeless.

"Not all of our churches have the resources to do extensive outreach, but all of us are committed to doing the Lord's work.

The Black church is also the catalyst for civil rights and political activism, he said.

"We sent out notices, but none of them (alderpersons) even showed up for the rally. It seems like the only time we see them (Black politicians) is around election time when they come to solicit votes.

"Well, we're tired of the stale jokes and political rhetoric. If you are not willing to help us continue our work or show up when we need you, well...."

Following an October demonstration at city hall, City Attorney Tearman Spencer said he would investigate the law in question. Alderman Russell Stamper announced he would introduce a local ordinance to address the issue.

But for the most part, Rev. Lewis believes there has been little response from local politicians.

That may have changed

Tuesday when Rev. Jackson joined the local clergy, bringing national attention to their plight.

Rev. Jackson, who later traveled to Kenosha to meet the family of police shooting victim Jacob Blake, called the city actions a "sin."

The former presidential candidate and several ministers met briefly with Mayor Tom Barrett, who proclaimed support for their



Months before Kyle Rittenhouse was tried for killing two White demonstrators in Kenosha last year, my social media post theorizing the 'racist roach in training' would be acquitted sent shock waves of disbelief among my following.

Some critics thought I was premature in my postulation. Even in America, justice generally prevails.

One well-known activist working on his post-graduate degree said it was 'luridly' obvious Rittenhouse had instigated the shootings during the Kenosha demonstration culminating in the shooting of three and the 'murder' of two.

'Lady Justice ain't that blind,' another FB friend posited.

'How dare you suggest that a white supremacist would be set free for killing innocent people,' a distraught sister declared.

'He (Rittenhouse) came across the state line to kill Black people.

He's a racist, plain and simple,' said continued, adding, 'it would be an affront and another nail in the coffin of Black rights for him to go free.'

Well, affront it may be, but I was, unfortunately, nonetheless...correct.

That's not to say I'm patting myself on the back, for I agree with the sentiments, if not the conclusions of my social media claim.

But I also recognize most responded in anger, fear, and frustration at the possibility that he would be exonerated. Responses since the verdict have been likewise filtered through the haze of emotionalism, ignorance of criminal trial proceedings, and Wisconsin's confusing and myopic statutes on self-defense.

Obviously, and despite the hard evidence, many are of the mistaken belief that America has changed for the better since the conviction of Minneapolis police officer Derek Chauvin for the murder of George Floyd.

To them, I suggest a bag of those red dyed potato chips as they are forced to listen to a lecture on how this trial was as much about the origins of Critical Race Theory as it was about a 17-year-old punk who proved the existence of White Privilege when he was ignored by law enforcement while walking the Kenosha streets with an AR-15.

Thus, while I understand the angst of those who are both shocked and angered by the Rittenhouse verdict, I now say "get a grip," study history and open your eyes to the reality of 'American apartheid.'

I'm not a legal scholar and can't even practice law in my own home where my wife is the judge and juror, but there were defensible reasons where I felt Rittenhouse would be acquitted even before the Confederate flag was raised above the Kenosha courthouse:

Keepings up with the Kardashians.

No, the legal proceedings weren't a reality show script, but as soon as I learned the dream team of defense attorneys included a consultant from the O.J. Simpson trial, my second thought was 'djà vu.'

Google 'O.J. Simpson' if you're not old enough to know who he is and how his trial provided a template for the Rittenhouse fiasco.

The Rittenhouse 'verdict' illustrates the need for a bigger can of Raid!

Thus, it was not a coincidence that among the first experts brought in by the defense leadership was Dr. Jo-Ellan Dimitrius, who was part of the renowned Simpson team that turned the judicial system upside down and had White folks feeling in 1995 as we did when the jury brought in its verdict last week.

Simpson had been accused of killing his former White wife and her lover. And while we celebrated his exoneration, it wasn't because we felt he was innocent. In fact, most tribal members didn't consider him to be a true brother.

But we rejoiced when the verdict was handed down solely because of the impressive defense by a team that included Dimitrius, Black legal superstar Johnnie Cochran and Robert Kardashian, father of the billionaire reality show clan whose claim to fame is their practice of 'slutology.'

And speaking of déjà vu, the Rittenhouse dream team also followed the example of the Simpson team by sticking a Voodoo pin in the Kenosha prosecutors, drawing out the blood of incompetence and amateurishness.

Justice vs. Just-Us.

In America, the justice system is more often determined by the Latin legal phrase 'Justitia Cara est,' than 'Justitia est caecus.' (Look those up.)

In Ebonics, that means money talks louder than truth or evidence.

In other words, had Rittenhouse been forced to accept overworked and underpaid public defenders as his legal counsel, I'm sure he'd be heading to Waupun.

Instead, millions for his defense dollars flowed from every rat hole in the country. Many of his donors viewed the case through the same prescription lens used by Donald Trump, who is legally blind to race and reality.

The dye was cast when famed attorney Lin Wood stepped forward last year to provide the \$2 million bail for Rittenhouse.

That contribution spoke volumes about the national interest in the case and the resources available to create a protagonist out of a punk.

What was most illuminating was learning that a significant percentage of the donations came from the Evangelical Right for whom Donald Trump is considered a religious deity.

Compare that reality against the innocent Black man who ends up in prison because he can't afford a high school dropout to defend him.

The rich hire the best their money can buy. The poor get public defenders or try to defend themselves. Prisons are full of poor Black folks faced with that dilemma.

Highly-paid legal teams will bring in experts, undertake extensive investigations and research, and utilize strategies few novice attorneys are privy to.

The Rittenhouse team knew what color underwear the victims were wearing the week before the demonstrations.

They were able to delve into the histories of the victims, each of whom had criminal records (including a pedophile who was reportedly a racist).

The defense also sought out obscure witnesses, several of whom contradicted the prosecutor's claims that Rittenhouse was the provocateur.

A jury of whose peers?

The jury consisted of Kenosha residents, providing a critical indicator that Rittenhouse would be viewed under a 20-watt light bulb.

There was one sister on the jury pool of 18, but she was a token for

the most part.

Had the prosecutor maneuvered to get a jury of 12 African Americans, the outcome, obviously, would have been different.

Of course, that would not have happened even if Kenosha was 100% African American. Not only because the defense, judge, and state would have prevented it, but more so because Black folks view jury duty as if it were a pot of chitterlings left on the stove overnight in the August humidity.

While some of us complain about jury makeup in the state, that absence of Black folks results from the dichotomous reality that we shun our responsibility. Either we can't be found, don't want to serve, or can't hear instructions because we're deaf from that loud music from our cars as we drive.

In short, I never considered Kenosha to be a bastion of liberalism even though President Joe Biden won the majority vote in 2020 (Trump led in 2016).

Kenosha is a blue-collar city of 100,000 with a Black population of 11%. It is also the home of Jacob Blake, whose shooting by a Kenosha cop, Rusten Sheskey, sparked riots and demonstrations that culminated in the Rittenhouse killings.

Oh yeah, let's not forget that even though Sheskey shot Blake in the back 11 times as he entered his car, he was exonerated by a Kenosha jury. Had he not been freed, the Rittenhouse killings would never have occurred.

None of this is to say I was not hopeful Racist Roach Rittenhouse ('Triple R') would be convicted and put in prison with Big Black Bubba.

Even though he was 17-years-old when he crossed the state line from Antioch, Illinois, to supposedly protect a Kenosha business from rioters, Rittenhouse was old enough to know he was stepping into a man's shoes (make that coon hunting boots).

I entered the military two weeks after my 17th birthday. Shortly after that, I was taught to kill.

Two years later, I was sent to Vietnam with a similar weapon to the one illegally provided to Rittenhouse and essentially for a similar purpose.

If you recall, our presence in Vietnam was initially called a 'police action.' And in a sense, as outsiders with a vested interest in maintaining worldwide White supremacy, the North Vietnamese considered us vigilantes.

That's pretty much where the similarities end unless you theorize that both Rittenhouse and I were pawns of apartheid, albeit on different sides of the wall.

Twenty years ago, I might have been among the demonstrators in Kenosha. It is not because of my health that I wasn't there last year, but more so because that demonstration was appropriately waged between family members—an encounter pitting the opposing philosophies of cousins. Each of them enjoys the comforts of White privilege.

Sherwin Hughes posited on his show a few weeks ago that Whites hold the key to criminal justice reform, civil rights, and racial harmony.

Whites are in control of the political and economic systems.

And as I said when I announced the retirement of my worn-out protest shoes a few years ago, only Whites can convince their brethren to move beyond color and tear down the walls of apartheid.

The truth of the matter is we're essentially caught in the middle, stepped on by one side and used by the other.

A proposal submitted by the Milwaukee Christian Center (MCC) to create and distribute more than four dozen emergency support kits for homebound seniors from the southeast Asian community who live in the greater Milwaukee area has been selected to receive an AARP Wisconsin "Small Dollar, Big Impact" grant.

Grants are being awarded each month throughout 2021 to projects across Wisconsin that are designed to improve communities and make them better places for everyone to live, work and play as they age. Judges selected this project for a \$1,000 grant after reviewing dozens of proposals submitted from all over the state.

"This project fits perfectly with the spirit and intent of the Small Dollar, Big Impact grant program," said AARP Wisconsin State Director Sam Wilson.

"Our goal is to support communities as they make positive changes that inspire long-term progress on livable issues. This proposal hits that nail right on the head."

"Since our community is so diverse, I believe that it is our obligation to incorporate culture and ensure that all residents feel included and cared for."

Xiong-Buck added that, "providing emergency care packages that include culturally appropriate food alongside with COVID-19 prevention kits sends residents of our community the clear message that MCC takes its mission seriously."

All of the money will go towards purchasing food staples from Asian grocery stores and packing it into 50 kits along with masks and bottles of hand sanitizer.

The MCC will then distribute the kits to homebound seniors from the southeast Asian community — many of whom have been significantly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. In addition, the MCC will be able to provide

more wellness checks on homebound seniors and identify/address any of their other urgent, unmet needs by connecting them with the necessary support structures and services.

Karen Higgins, Executive Director of the MCC said, the center recognizes the urgent need to do more in support of the southeast Asian community.

"Socially and economically, the pandemic has dismantled many critical support structures seniors within this demographic rely upon for their basic needs, ranging from nutrition and health and wellness to social and emotional supports," Higgins said in the grant application.

Through the creation of these kits, the MCC is responding to an urgent unmet request among the senior community to support their nutritional, cultural and social-emotional needs during this unprecedented time, Higgins said.

AARP Wisconsin's launched its "Small Dollar, Big Impact" grant program in 2020 and is now in its second year of helping proposed projects move forward in rural and urban parts of the state.

"We've seen how these small grants are making a huge impact around the State of Wisconsin. The Milwaukee Christian Center has been helping the local community for 100 years and know this grant will help them extend their reach to the 50-plus community," said Amber Miller, Associate State Director of Community Outreach for AARP Wisconsin.

Blame that condition in part on our refusal to study history, our apathy, and our ignorance.

Moreover, we often act out of the moment or fall prey to political rhetoric and symbolism. We also tend to focus on mirages in the desert of discontent.

For example, while many now denounce vigilantism in response to what happened in Kenosha, do we realize that thousands of our ancestors would not have survived acts of White terrorism without Black militias to defend us?

From Black Wall Street to Rosewood to last year in Louisville, where hundreds of armed brothers and sisters paraded during the Breonna Taylor protests, vigilantism has been a tactic we have used.

Are we now suggesting we abandon that strategy because of the Kenosha scenario?

Based on that line of thinking, should the armed Black Panthers who patrolled the Sherman Park area after that mini-riot a few years ago have been arrested since their patrols could have resulted in confrontations with thugs and terrorists?

Many suggest we need citizen patrols in our community today, protecting us against each other amid this pandemic of violence.

Sure, a case can be made that the verdict emboldened the Racist and Religious Right. But the proposition that it will anoint a new wave of White terrorists—vigilantes---will show up at civil rights protests intent on shooting protestors is ridiculous as it is far-fetched.

In fact, from what I heard, many of the 'good people at the Kenosha demonstration were also armed, including Rittenhouse's last victim, who insanely pointed a gun at him but didn't pull the trigger.

Moreover, while caught up in the emotionalism of this toxic scenario, we should not fall prey to the polarizing politics and how the incident is being 'used' as fodder by both sides.

The Right is using the verdict to further brainwash their constituency, some of whom have already armed themselves in anticipation of the avalanche of Mau Maus they expect to invade Wauwatosa and Mequon when the weather changes.

The Racist Right has already started soliciting votes for the midterms with Rittenhouse as their poster child. After touring right-wing media, I wouldn't be surprised if he isn't put on a dog collar and led around by Trump as an example of America's new Boy Scout.

Meanwhile, the so-called Left--Democrats---are using the verdict to convince us the sky is falling, and they are our only hope for survival.

Of course, as usual, they can't help us until we pay the piper. Unless we contribute our turkey and dressing money to them to save us from the evil Right, they will tell us Christmas will be canceled, and the Dollar Stores will close forever.

In this case, I'm not being facetious. Seconds after the Rittenhouse verdict, I received solicitations from the DNC and various Democrats soliciting con-

tributions to stop Trump, reform the courts, and fund poverty pimps to massage our fears.

Maybe it's the result of my being a soldier in the struggle for four decades, or because I am a student of both history and ‘History’ that I take this verdict with a grain of salt and a handful of aspirins.

I have traveled down this road far too many times to fall now.

Instead, as I was once told to view stumbling as 'falling forward faster.'

I mark the rock in the road and keep going.

True enough, the Rittenhouse verdict has fueled racial and political polarization in America. It was indeed an affront to our concept of justice and brought to light the divide that some suggest will end in another civil war.

But that doesn't mean we are not safe on the streets or shouldn't travel outside the 'safety of the central city, where we are on pace to set a new murder record.

One of my relatives who lives in a northern suburb among conservatives said she will now reconsider going out of her home.

That can't be the answer, although her situation may change if the pendulum of justice swings the wrong way in another celebrated case being tried that concluded in a manner many expected the Rittenhouse trial to end.

While we shouldn't view the Rittenhouse case through the same prisms as the Ahmaud Arbery trial, they are interlinked in many respects, including the self-defense plea of the two White racists accused of murdering the

unarmed 25-year-old Black man who was jogging through their neighborhood.

Defying all logic and common sense, those racist roaches also tried convince a jury that Arbery provoked them, and thus their ‘execution’ of him was in self-defense.

The fact that one of them stood over the dying brother declaring he was just another "f...king nigger (not the n-word)" placed the umbrella of racism over that case.

There were numerous protests following the Rittenhouse verdict, most of them calling for changes in the criminal justice system and an end to racism. In Portland, demonstrations led to a melee prompting a declaration of a 'riot.'

Those reactions were but a pop gun compared to the atomic bomb I assume will explode if the murderers of Arbery are exonerated.

I predict that won't be the case. However, don't put a lock on your bomb shelter.

The truth is the lack of action by both political parties to address criminal justice and police reform has taxed the patience of many to the point where any spark may set things off.

In the interim, while it may be appropriate for emotional outbursts when the situations warrant such a response, realize that when your eyes are clouded with tears, you can't see the fist coming at you.

Thus, while the Rittenhouse verdict may embolden the Right, it does not serve as a declaration of another Fort Sumpter.

Nonetheless, I suggest we keep our eyes open and our ammunition dry. In other words, the Rittenhouse verdict has increased the number of racist roaches who are boldly scurrying around, hop-

ing to take over our homes.

If nothing else, it's obvious we now need a bigger can of Raid.

Hotep.
