

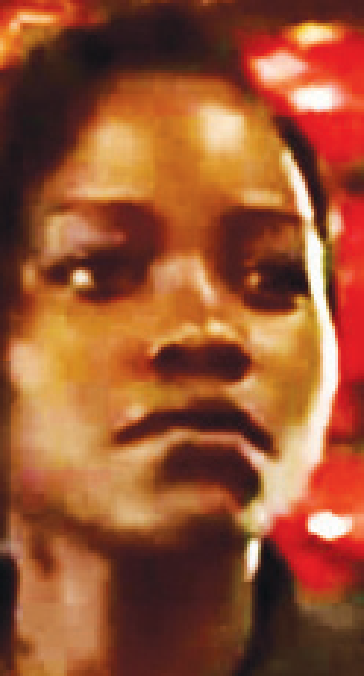

# MLK DAY OF SERVICE EVENTS TO HONOR DR. KING

Weekend of **MLK Day**  
**of Service** Events  
Culminates with  
**Health Fair Monday!**

Dr. Martin Luther King said, “Everybody can be great because anybody can serve.” Observed on the third Monday of each year, MLK Day is the only federal holiday designated as a national day of service.

On this day, Milwaukee joins Americans across the nation who are stepping up to make our communities more equitable and taking action to create the Beloved Community of Dr. King’s dream.

On Monday, January 17, from 10AM - 3 PM, several Milwaukee groups will host an event featuring COVID-19 testing and vaccinations, flu shots, health education games, food giveaways and much more as part of the MLK Day National Day of Service.

The volunteer-led community event is being held at the Lovell Johnson Quality of Life Center, 1530 W. Atkinson Ave., in the 53206 neighborhood of Milwaukee.

Organizers include Jump at the Sun Consultants, LLC., the Wisconsin African American Tobacco Prevention Network (WAATPN), Wisconsin Tobacco Prevention and Poverty Network (WTPPN), WI Wins, Health Connections, Inc., and the Lovell Johnson Quality of Life Center.



The event is being supported by the Milwaukee Health Department and funded by the Greater Milwaukee Foundation, Zilber Family Foundation, DHS COVID Vaccine Outreach, DHS Tobacco Prevention and Control Program, and Milwaukee County.

Gift cards of \$50 will be provided to those who receive their first COVID vaccination and \$25 for second shots or boosters during the event, while supplies last. Free t-shirts, COVID safety supplies and other gifts and prizes will be provided, while supplies lasts.

The groups will also be hosting other MLK Day of Service activities throughout the weekend leading up to the Day of Service Monday. On Friday, teams of volunteers will be going door-to-door at various public housing buildings, administering the rapid COVID tests, providing COVID education and outreach and information on smoking cessation.

On Saturday and Sunday, teams will head out to visit with retailers in the Milwaukee Suburbs and City of Milwaukee, distributing posters highlighting the T-21 federal law, which raised the age to purchase tobacco to 21 years, and the WI-Wins program, a statewide program created to reduce youth exposure to tobacco.

In addition to the in-person event on Monday, the Wisconsin Tobacco Prevention and Poverty Network and Wisconsin African American To-

# Milwaukee Health Department Distributes Free N95 Masks

*Masks will be available at Milwaukee Health Centers and Milwaukee Public Libraries*

After handing out 500,000 N95 masks in less than three days, the Milwaukee Health Department will distribute another round of 500,000 N95 masks beginning Thursday, January 13, while supplies last. In all, the Milwaukee Health Department will distribute over one

million masks in a week. N95 masks will be provided via drive-up only at the Northwest Health Center (7630 W. Mill Rd.), Southside Health Center (1639 S. 23rd St.), Menomonee Valley Site (2401 W. St. Paul Ave.), and Milwaukee Public Library branches during regular operating hours. Full list of locations and hours is at [milkwaukee.gov/masks](https://milkwaukee.gov/masks). "Masking is critically important to mitigating the spread of COVID-19, and the higher quality N95 masks are even more effective in protecting against the Omicron variant," said Milwaukee Health Commissioner Kirsten Johnson. "The Milwaukee Health Department staff is doing their best to get these masks into the hands of our community, but we ask everyone to ex-

ercise civility and patience." During the first round of mask giveaways, staff reported some unfortunate hostile actions from those waiting for masks. The Milwaukee Health Department reiterates that all protocols are in place to safely and equitably distribute the masks and asks everyone to follow the rules. The staff is thankful to the vast majority of individuals

who practiced kindness and look forward to continuing the important work of protecting the Milwaukee community. Each car will receive a pack of twenty N95 masks. These masks are reusable if properly sanitized between uses. To sanitize an N95 or KN95 mask, remove the respirator and place it in a breathable paper bag.

Close the bag and allow it to sit at room temperature for at least 72 hours before reusing the mask. This process can be repeated but should not exceed five times before discarding the mask. Individuals are encouraged to follow the Milwaukee Health Department's social media pages for updates on mask availability, as the supply is anticipated to be distributed quickly.

# Gov. Evers, OCI Announce Cost of COVID-19 At-Home Tests to be Covered by all Health Plans

*New requirement comes from Biden Administration as Omicron Cases Surge*

MADISON — Gov. Tony Evers and OCI announced today, beginning January 15, all health plans will be required to cover the cost of over the counter, at-home diagnostic COVID-19 tests for their members.

This requirement applies to both private health insurance companies and group health plans, like those provided by an employer.

“Testing continues to be a critical component of helping slow the spread of COVID-19 and keeping our communities healthy and safe, and thanks to this new requirement, COVID-19 tests are going to be even more accessible for Wisconsin-ites across our state,” said Gov. Evers.

“Especially as cases continue to surge and our healthcare providers are already stretched thin, we’re encouraging Wisconsin-ites to take advantage of at-home testing and available local testing clinics

so that our healthcare providers can continue doing their important work in our clinics and hospitals.”

Under these new guidelines, required by the Biden Administration, COVID-19 tests may either be free or reimbursed by the insurer.

Health plans and insurance companies are incentivized to set up a network of pharmacies or retailers so their members can conveniently order or pick up these tests that will be covered upfront.

“Access to testing is critical as Omicron continues to spread through our communities,” said Insurance Commissioner Nathan Houdek. “This new requirement will help stop the spread of COVID-19 by making it easier for everyone to test themselves at home.”

If a health plan or private insurer establishes a network of pharmacies or retailers, then they are permitted to limit the reimbursement for tests purchased outside of that network to \$12 per test.

For example, if a consumer chooses to purchase a two-pack of COVID-19 tests online through an out-of-network retailer for \$34, then they may only be reimbursed \$24 for the cost of two tests.

If a health plan or insurance company does not set up a network to prevent upfront costs for their members, then they must reimburse the full cost of the test, even if the test costs more than \$12. Plans are required to cover eight individual tests per month for each person covered by the plan.

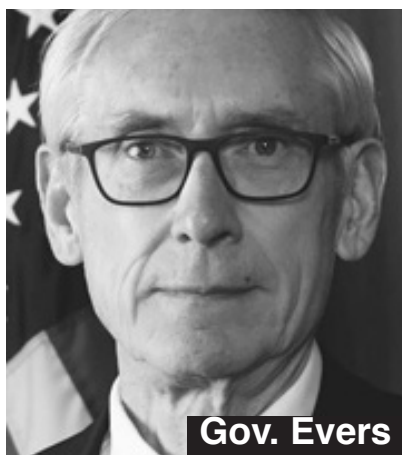
Health plans and insurance companies are not required to cover nor reimburse the cost of testing that is not diagnostic in nature.

For example, a health plan is not required to cover COVID-19 tests that an individual takes on a regular basis as a condition of employment.

There are also testing options available for people who are uninsured. The state of Wisconsin has teamed up with Vault Medical Services to offer COVID-19 tests for everyone who lives in Wisconsin, with or without symptoms, at no cost. This new service allows people to collect their own saliva samples for testing in their home. Visit COVID-19: At-Home Collection Kit to learn more.

“DHS supports the federal government’s efforts to expand access to free at-home COVID-19 tests,” said DHS Secretary-designee Karen Timberlake. “To ensure everyone has access to free COVID-19 testing, we want to re-

Need a break from COVID mania and winter melancholia? A dose of pure escapism may help. For 122 minutes this often generic but surprisingly engaging espionage action/thriller may take your mind off your troubles. You'll suspend belief for James Bond and all his improbable stunts. You're perfectly OK with Shang-Chi fighting a dozen men at

time when that's really impossible. So, show some respect for the five petite women in this adrenaline-rush who kick ass like MMA champs. Is it plausible? No. Fun to watch? Yes. Part of the captivation is the script by Theresa Rebeck (TV's *Smash* and *NYPD Blue*) and writer/director Simon Kinberg. They spin a tale full of intrigue, seasoned with enough plot twists and betrayals to keep you guessing and guessing until the mayhem careens to false ending after false ending. Normally this kind of contrivance is folly. Here, it takes atten-

tion away from the film's B-movie qualities. Director Kinberg's filmography is impressive: Producer of *Deadpool* and *The Martian*. Writer for *Mr. and Mrs. Smith* and *X-Men: Apocalypse*. His only previous feature film direction was on *X-Men: Dark Phoenix*. Now, tasked with guiding a cast and crew and choreographing action scenes it's obvious he's still working out some kinks. It's

most notable when the kinetic movement dies down and the four or five heroines just sit and talk. E.g., after a small victory, the women have drinks at a bar and converse, way too much. Other misguided exposition-heavy scenes flounder too. A cleverer director would always give the ensemble a "bit of business" to do. As they talked, they'd load guns, demolish a room, or make cookies—

something to keep the viewer's attention off the film's shortcomings. Sitting idly is a no-no. Some nutjob has invented a data key drive the size of a mini-iPhone that can remotely down a plane, hack computers and destroy the world bit by bit. Mace's (Jessica Chastain, *Zero Dark Thirty*) job as a CIA agent is to buy and confiscate the device. As is said, "...the enemy is invisi-

ble like ghosts ... they can destabilize entire countries from the simple reach of their keyboards." She and fellow agent Nick (Sebastian Stan) arrange a lunchtime rendezvous at an outdoor Parisian café. It's a simple cash for weapon pickup with Luis (Édgar Ramírez, *Carlos*), a rogue operative. Nothing goes right. Nothing. They and others are in hot pursuit of a

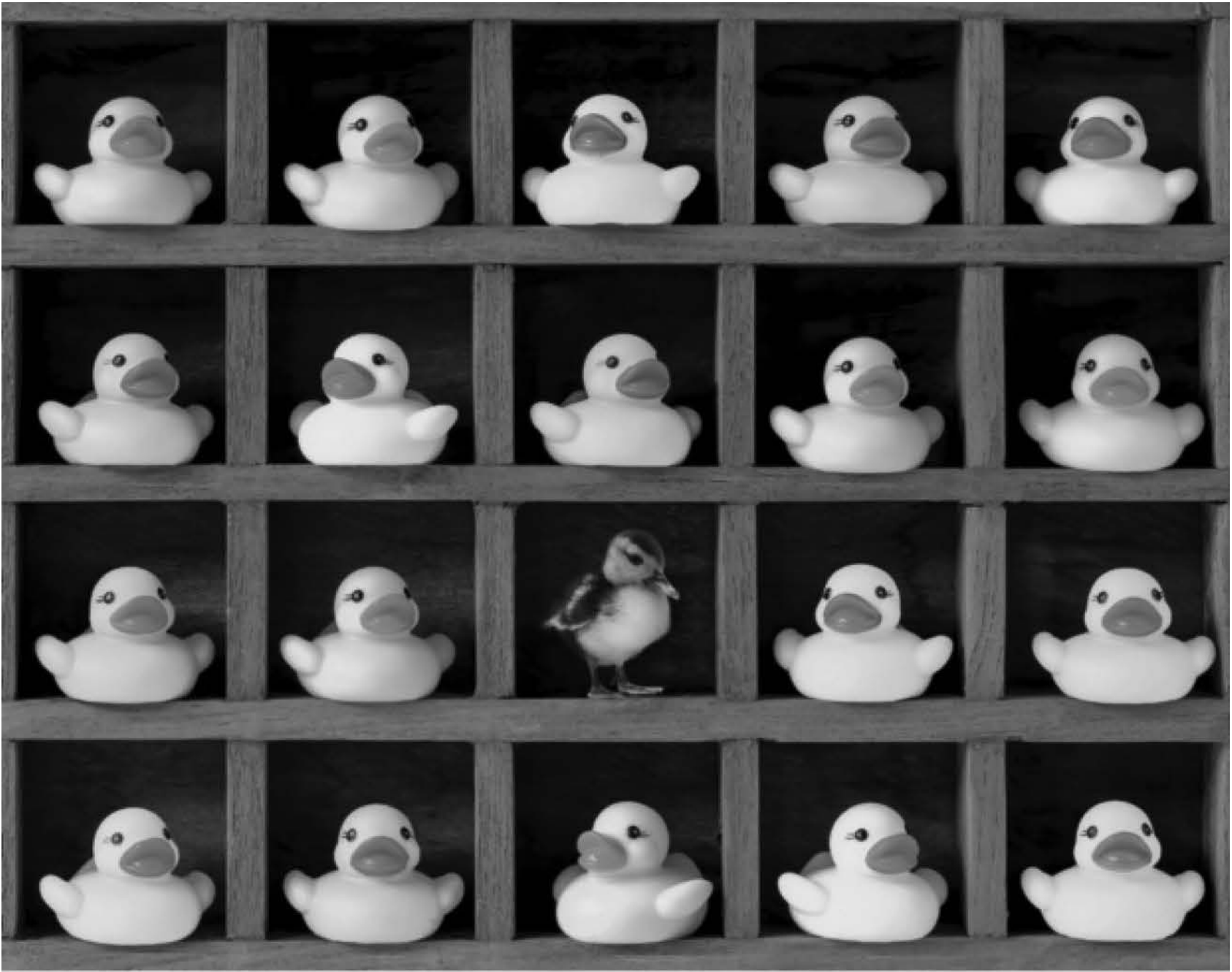
