Employ Milwaukee joins Advocate Aurora Health and community partners to promote healthcare careers

The new Milwaukee Healthcare Workforce Initiative uses employer-led training to expand Southeastern Wisconsin's healthcare workforce.

Employ Milwaukee, the workforce development board serving Milwaukee County, has created the Milwaukee Healthcare Workforce Initiative (MHWI), a program to increase underrepresented populations' access to quality health care careers through training and guaranteed job interviews at Advocate Aurora Health.

The MHWI is now accepting registrations for the no-cost training that includes job shadowing, an introduction to hospital operations, and an overview of healthcare career paths and job application success.

Individuals who complete the program are guaranteed job interviews at Advocate Aurora Health.

"In today's climate, the need for increased numbers of trained healthcare workers is significant," said Chytania Brown, Employ Milwaukee President and CEO.

"At the same time, unemployment remains too high for people of color in Milwaukee. We're excited to bring this solution-oriented program to the table."

Developed with Advocate Aurora Health, the Milwaukee Healthcare Workforce Initiative is a three-year project funded by a \$500,000 grant from the Medical College of Wisconsin's Advancing a Healthier Wisconsin Endowment.

"Advocate Aurora's greatest asset is our team members, whose diverse backgrounds, cultures and experiences reflect the communities we are privileged to serve," said Dayla Randolph, system vice president,

Advocate Aurora Health. "Increasing the pool of diverse, qualified job candidates is critical to the future of Milwaukee's healthcare industry and to the wellbeing of our residents."

The program will offer customized curriculums that address both job seekers' and employers' needs, and will cover direct health care roles as well as opportunities in administration, environmental services and food services departments.

"The pandemic continues to have a severe impact on people living in zip codes of underinvestment," Dr. Greer Jordan, Chief Diversity and Inclusion Officer at the Medical College of Wisconsin said.

"Working to diversify our regional talent pools promotes an adaptive response to the rapidly evolving workforce and environment of healthcare."

Additional partners include Social Development Commission, JobsWork MKE, Greater Milwaukee Urban League, RiverWorks Development Corp. and Journey House. Each organization will assist with candidate recruitment efforts.

Potential participants are encouraged to reach out to Employ Milwaukee for more details.

MATC SELECTED TO HELP ADVANCE RACIAL EQUITY IN MANUFACTURING

College one of 13 institutions that will work to create racially inclusive future for business and industry

Milwaukee Area Technical College will share its experience and expertise in a national effort to make manufacturing more racially diverse.

MATC is one of 13 community colleges recently selected by The Century Foundation (TCF), the Urban Manufacturing Alliance (UMA) and eight urban workforce development organizations concentrated in the Midwest to work on the project, called Industry and Inclusion 2.0.

The colleges, selected through a competitive process and funded by Lumina Foundation – a national philanthropy focused on equity and educational attainment – will collaborate to devise solutions to bolster the nation's manufacturing sector, develop credential-based training programs to create a more racially inclusive future for manufacturing, and deepen relationships between employers and communities.

"MATC is thrilled to be part of this alliance," said Becky Alsup, dean of the college's Manufacturing, Construction & Transportation Pathway.

"There are so many great jobs with family-sustaining wages for people of all backgrounds.

"We look forward to seeing how we can advance the talents of our community members of color and our local employers here in the Milwaukee area."

Manufacturing capacity has been growing rapidly and accelerated during the COVID-19 pandemic.

But even before the pandemic, federal estimates indicated that the United States needed an additional 2.4 million manufacturing workers over the next decade.

Manufacturing's resurgence presents an opportunity to open the sector's well-paying jobs to more workers of color, many of whom faced unemployment during the pandemic at disproportionate rates.

"Community colleges are uniquely positioned to connect more people, particularly people of color, to well-paying and sustainable jobs, such as those in the manufacturing industry," said Andrew

"Our coalition will work to align credential programs at community colleges with the industry, and to ensure that a more diverse workforce feels supported and is able to take advantage of such opportunities."

MATC serves as a diverse talent pipeline and economic growth engine for the Milwaukee area, with the college, students and alumni generating \$1.5 billion in economic impact to the region annually.

At MATC, 82% of technical diploma and 88% of associate degree grads gain employment within six months of graduation, and 77 percent

of graduates choose to work within the region. The college partners with more than 900 employer advisors to ensure that MATC maintains top quality programming and industry applicable curriculums.

"Manufacturing provides much-needed opportunities for equitable economic development in American cities," said Lee Wellington, executive director at the Urban Manufacturing Alliance and co-organizer of the coalition. "

The past few years have underscored the importance of local production ecosystems, from producing essential personal protective equipment to responding to increased demand for energy efficient materials, and much more."

WEDC program spurs innovation with \$170,850 in seed money

MADISON— Five organizations with fresh ideas on how to strengthen entrepreneurship and support new business ventures have won a total of \$170,850 in a new grant program administered by the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation (WEDC).

The Entrepreneurship Partner Grants, awarded on a competitive basis, aim to promote entrepreneurial growth across the state and impact underserved communities by funding new programs.

Community organizations in Wausau, Beloit, Milwaukee and Rhinelander were chosen to receive funding.

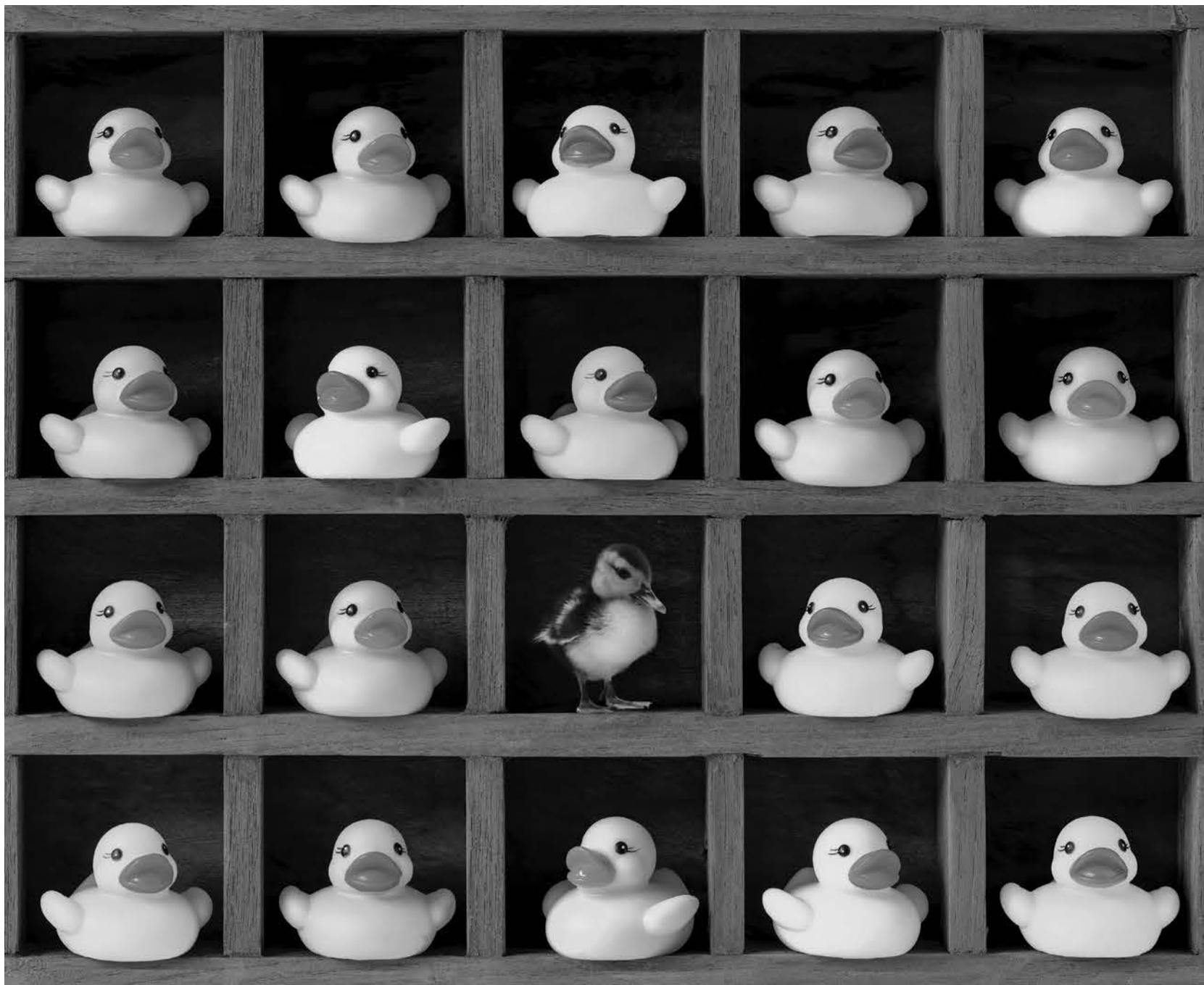
