## Wisconsin's Unemployed Among the Most Likely To Be Heavy Drinkers In America, Study Finds!

Study compares unemployment vs heavy drinking in each state in America.

Alaska has the highest rate of unemployed heavy drinkers in the U.S.; Utah has the lowest.

Within Wisconsin, Menominee County has the highest rate of unemployed heavy drinkers in the state.

Dane County has the lowest.

A nation-wide study by Rehabs.com, a leading provider of addiction treatment resources, has found that Wisconsin ranks in 2nd place in America based on the ratio of heavy drinking to unemployment, meaning the state's unemployed are (statistically) among the most likely to be heavy drinkers in America. Using data by



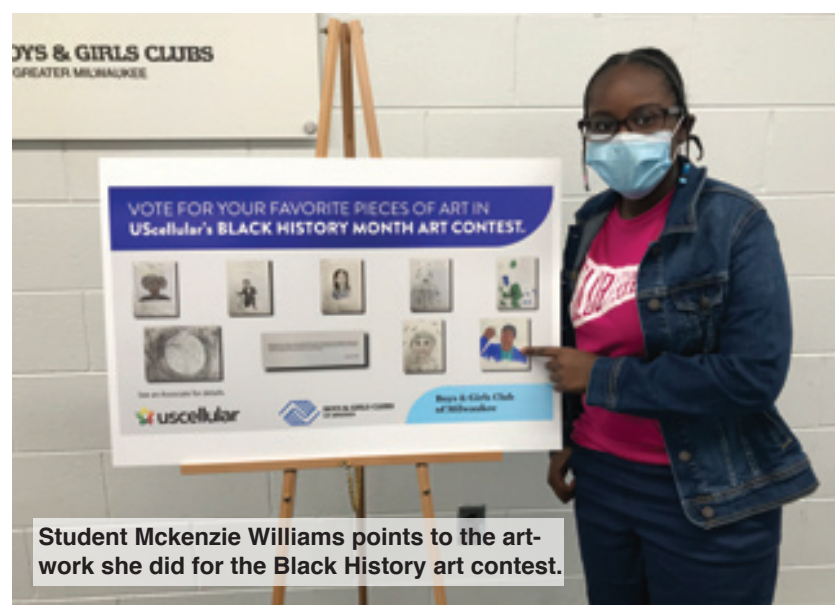
County Health Rankings, the number of heavy drinkers were identified as well as those who were unemployed. These figures were then weighted by the local working population size to calculate a ranking within the state.

Ranked in first place was Alaska, with 79,782 excessive drinkers and an employment rate of 6.1%. Those in the Beehive State came in last place, with 349,642 excessive drinkers and an unemployment rate of 2.6%.

More locally, Menominee County emerged in first place overall for the highest rate of unemployed drinkers in the Badger State, with 497 excessive drinkers, and an

8% unemployment rate. Comparatively and more positively, Dane placed last in the state. The county's 59,623 excessive drinkers compared against a 2.4% unemployment rate.

### What is heavy/binge drinking?

Binge drinking is a serious – but also considered a preventable – public health issue across the country. It's estimated that 77% of the cost of excessive alcohol consumption in the U.S. is due to binge drinking, and most binge drinkers are not alcohol dependent. That is, they typically don't struggle with a complete inability to stop drinking, or crave alcohol to the point that they can't focus on anything else. These costs, however, are a result of loss in workplace productivity, criminal justice costs and healthcare expenditures, among other expenses.

Defined as a drinking pattern that increases an individual's blood alcohol concentration to 0.08 g/dl or above, this usually occurs when women have four or more drinks over approximately a two-hour period. For men, it's typically five or more drinks in the same time period. These limits are lower for women because they

tend to have smaller bodies and less water to dilute alcohol, so the concentration of alcohol in their blood will be higher than in a man who drinks the same amount.

## Why can heavy drinking be a risk to health?

The risks of alcoholism have been widely discussed, and many are aware of the negative consequences that can ensue, such as increased risk of car accidents, serious falls and injuries and alcohol poisoning. However, fewer people know that long-term heavy drinking is also associated with:

- *High blood pressure*
- *Heart arrhythmias*
- *Increased risk of developing diabetes*
- *Higher cancer risks, including cancers of the breast, pancreas, liver, lung and gastrointestinal system*
- *Mental health problems*
- \* *Fetal alcohol spectrum disorders*
- *Memory and learning issues*

## What is the social impact of heavy drinking?

The social impact of alcohol abuse is a separate issue from the health and financial costs involved. This impact starts by negatively affecting home and family life first.

These issues can then extend into the community and possibly have a detrimental effect on society as a whole (much in the same way that excessive drinking creates costs to the US).

Interpersonal and family relationships can be disturbed by heavy drinking patterns, potentially resulting in ongoing conflict.

These trends can carry over into the workplace due to factors like poor performance, absenteeism or even accidents as a result of alcohol use.

A combination of the above consequences of heavy drinking can also negatively impact the quality of life of both the drinker as well as their loved ones.

## Treatment options available for alcohol use disorder

Although alcohol use disorder is common in the United States, they are treatable.

A wide variety of rehabs, addiction treatment programs, and aftercare services are offered to help people find a program that is best for them.

If you have developed an alcohol addiction, understanding your options for treatment is important.

Alcohol rehab centers can offer you the medical attention and support you need to pursue and maintain sobriety.

Proper treatment facilities provide patients with care from medical for the treatment of their alcohol use disorder (AUD).

Many people benefit from inpatient treatment since they are separated from the triggers that lead to them drinking and can focus solely on their recovery.

In addition to treatment for alcohol addiction, many facilities

A recent study by Swiss economists came to the demotivating conclusion that long commutes destroy happiness.

Up until this study's release, the conventional wisdom among other economists was that long commutes did not make people unhappier than others – rather, based on the economic principle of rational choices, they saw commuting as a tradeoff that you are prepared to put up with the tediousness of long-distance travel in order to do a job that not only remunerates you well, but also improves your general wellbeing.

But it turns out – they were wrong – people who undertake regular long commutes are just plain miserable.

The Swiss economists' hypothesis has been further reinforced by subsequent research which shows that long commutes can have significant effects on people's physical health too.

A person's likelihood of becoming obese increases by 6% for every hour spent commuting, as well as an increased risk of high blood pressure.

Long commute times are linked to factors like insufficient physical activity, and poor sleep habits.

As our post-pandemic world has seen a remarkable shift in employees moving to a WFH or hybrid model, it appears millions of workers across the country are reaping the mental and physical health benefits of no longer having to commute.

Indeed, 1AND1 Life, a mental health and wellness performance company, conducted an analysis of official data from County Health Rankings, and calculated how many workers in each state have reduced their risk of developing mental and physical problems, such as obesity, high blood pressure, stress and fatigue, by choosing to work from home instead.

The study revealed that a whopping 764k Wisconsinites who previously commuted over an hour per day before the pandemic, are now working from home and are living healthier lives.

When broken down by state, almost 5 million Californians have reaped the mental and physical benefits of WFH since the pandemic started.

Even in the Wyoming, which is the least populated in America, over 73,000 employees who previously spent a minimum of 20 hours behind the wheel each week are now WFH.

A survey of 1,000 employees by 1AND1 Life revealed that more than half (58%) said the biggest benefit of not having to commute to the workplace is being able to spend more time with family (like having breakfast together), while 20% said they're getting in more hours of sleep each night.

This makes sense considering the chain of negative events that can occur at work if you've had a poor night's sleep previously! Another 14% said they now have

more time to get household chores done before the day starts when there's no work commute involved.

And nearly 1 in 10 love the added benefit of being able to have a proper workout in the morning.

It seems we are a nation of big sleepers as 46% of respondents say they use this extra time of not having to travel, to sleep in a bit longer, while 20% spend it making a healthy breakfast before work.

Seventeen percent do housework during this time and another 17% get in their daily workout.

Surprisingly, however, nearly 1 in 5 (18%) respondents said they actually miss commuting long distances to and from work.

And almost half (45%) of those who still have long commutes said weight gain concerns them, given that studies show a direct link between these two lifestyle factors.

'Of course, there's no denying that the pandemic has had devastating effects on the lives on many Americans,' Thomas Drew, Co-Founder & President of 1AND1 Life Inc.

'On a more positive note, however, there have been unexpected health benefits as a result of the change in peoples' work habits, contributing to an overall happier, healthier lifestyle.'

also specialize in rehabilitation from substance use disorders and co-occurring mental health conditions, and offer patients treatment in a private residential setting or outpatient treatment services.

'Heavy (or binge) drinking is an extremely common pattern of drinking among people with or without an addiction to alcohol says a Rehabs.com spokesperson.

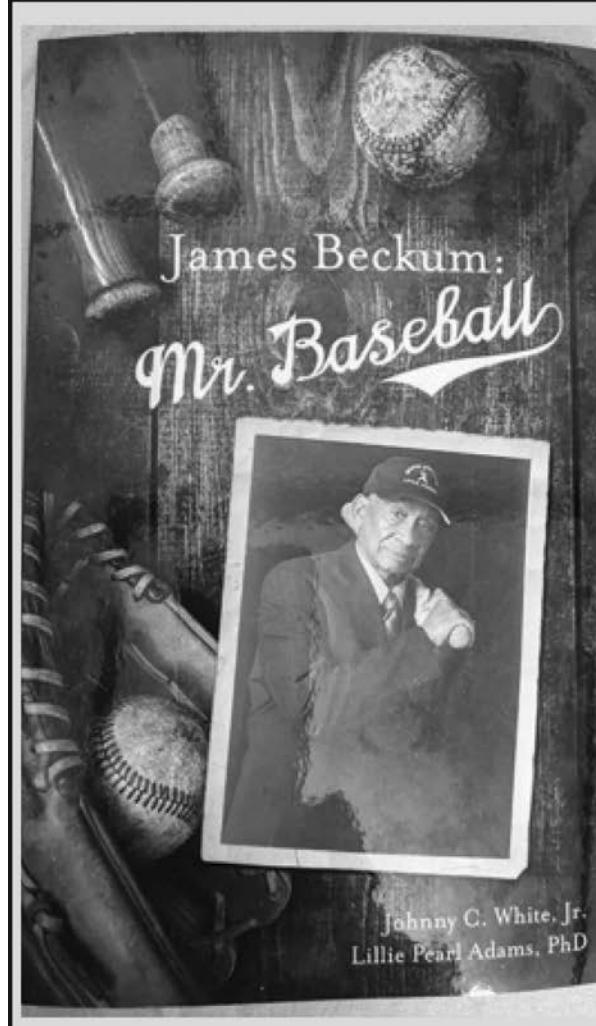
