## NATIONAL URBAN LEAGUE Releases State of Black America Report with Troubling Findings

National Urban League President & CEO Marc Morial said factions of state and federal lawmakers, working in concert with shady political operatives and violent extremists, are dangerously close to dismantling American democracy and establishing autocratic rule.



The organization's 2022 State of Black America report outlines "the conspiracy and the urgent case for a national mobilization to protect and defend our most sacred constitutional right," Morial noted in the report titled, "Under Siege: The Plot to Destroy Democracy." "The anti-democracy wave that began to rise after record-high Black voting rates in 2008 and crested with the Supreme Court's 2013 decision in Shelby County v. Holder to gut the Voting Rights Act has now broken against 'The Big Lie,' the relentless campaign to invalidate the 2020 election," Morial wrote.

Using data and analysis from research

partner, The Brennan Center for Justice, the Urban League noted that this year's edition of The State of Black America exposes the four main tactics employed in the plot: gerrymandering, voter suppression, misinformation, and intimidation. "Politicians have used these tactics for generations, to exclude voters of color and to give their parties an edge," Morial said. "But never before has the nation seen such an insidious and coordinated cam-

paign to obliterate the very principle of 'one person, one vote' from the political process. 'It is an astonishing reversal of a two-century moral arc that has bent, if slowly and unevenly, toward universal suffrage,' he said. In acknowledgement of Georgia's status as "ground zero" in the assault on democracy, the Urban League released the report at an event at Clark Atlanta University featuring students from Atlanta's four HBCUs, Urban League affiliate presidents from around the country, and other national civil rights leaders. The release coincided with the 2022 launch of "Reclaim Your Vote," the National Urban League's civic engagement campaign, celebrated with a voter mobilization rally on the university's Promenade. A news release noted that, for the first time, The State of Black America includes a companion poll, the Pulse of Black America. Conducted by Benenson Strategy Group, the poll found that an overwhelming majority Black Americans believe strongly in the power of their vote

# Three key steps for first-time home buyers



For those considering home ownership for the first time, it may seem as if there's a long list of details to tackle once the search begins. However, before potential buyers even start looking at homes, there are three important steps to take. The first step is getting your finances in order. Checking your

come ratio may be too high. So, if you are thinking about buying a house in the next year or so, hold off on doing any other major purchases so your credit rating is as high as possible. Once you have an idea of how much house you can afford, do some thorough research on the recurring expenses that come (and keep coming) before and after you've made your first mortgage payment.

Make sure you know what you'll be paying for closing costs, moving, insurance, taxes, utilities, repairs, upkeep, and even potential changes to your commute. The third step is establishing a relationship with a REALTOR. A REALTOR can help with the first two steps and more, so it's a good idea to find one before you're ready to start looking. "It's never too early," Walters says. "We have systems in place to help us stay in touch with people and nurture them until they're at the point where they're



to make a difference when it comes to social and racial justice, police violence, and economic opportunity.

"But almost as many agree that elected officials are not doing enough to protect voting rights and are in fact doing more to limit voting rights than to protect them," the authors stated.

They said the 2022 Equality Index, the National Urban League's semi-annual calculation of the social and economic status of African Americans relative to whites, is 73.9 percent, slightly up from the re-

vised 2020 Index of 73.7 percent.

Rooted in the Three-Fifths Compromise of 1787, which counted enslaved African Americans as "three-fifths" of a person, the Index would be 100 percent under full equality, the authors wrote.

Officials said because of a lag in data collection, the 2022 Equality Index does not capture the full effect of the COVID-19 pandemic or the resulting economic recession, but does capture changes during the pandemic for homeownership, unemployment rates, and school enrollment.

"For these metrics, the 2022 Equality Index illustrates how precarious social and economic gains are for Black Americans," said economist Rhonda Vonshay Sharpe of the Women's Institute for Science, Equity, and Race, who analyzed the Index for the report.

"It is also evidence of how vulnerable Black Americans are to economic and public health crises.

The Equality Index is an aggregate analysis of centuries of structural racism that can be a starting point for crafting policy to dismantle anti-Black racism in America."

# Cleaning out the basement reveals memories that are good, bad, and ugly!

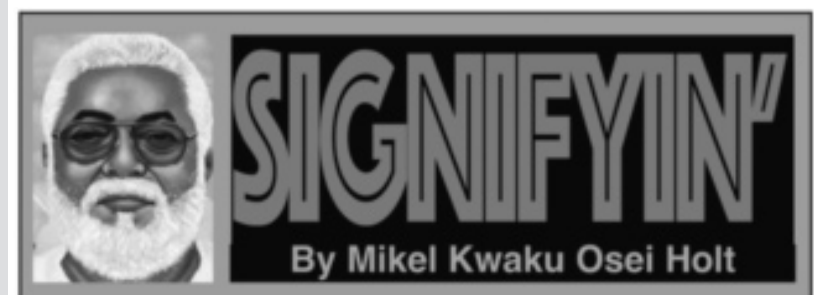
I admit it: I'm a hoarder.

Any doubt about the validity of that reality was erased last week as my wife and I moved my home office from one side of the basement to the other, unearthing a ton of materials I've collected over the last 30 years.

Sorting through the material was, indeed, a walk down memory lane. Good and bad. Pretty and ugly. Timeless and forgettable.

Some of my discoveries and reactions follow:

An hour into my 'disentombing' project, I found a brochure for a 'Reach for the Stars' workshop held at a local government school on December 10, 1985.





I only vaguely remember the event, but I remember the catalyst: educator and activist Janice Anderson.

The workshop was one of several projects to address the dual problems of poverty and fatherlessness in the African American community.

Reach for the Stars, Anderson explained in an article in the MCJ, was necessary to address what she called "those feelings of hopelessness and futility associated with the ramifications of being born in the female-headed household paradigm

## As we celebrate 4/20, let’s remember that the ‘weed man’ has been gentrified by White people

Today (Wednesday), April 20, or 4/20, is the one holiday I make sure to celebrate every year.

As a person born and raised in Los Angeles, I’m serious about the green I burn, the edibles I eat and all things cannabis. I believe, much like Smokey in Friday, that God/Allah/Yahweh/Jehovah put this plant here for us to enjoy it, so I do, every chance I get.

In the days before legalization, when you wanted to get something to smoke, you either had to go to a sketchy part of town to score on the street, or you could call up the “weed man” and take your chances with his reliability—or lack thereof.

The weed man was always hit or miss. You never knew what strain he was going to be carrying or if this was going to be a bad week for him, and he only had dirt, sticks and stems. He might tell you he is on his

way and then take another two hours to get there.

He may even not show up until the next day, but you know what? As shoddy as his service was or is, he was our weed man, and we respected the game and his hustle.

These days, 18 states and Washington, D.C., have legalized cannabis for adult use, and 38 states have legalized it for medical use.

According to the ACLU, “Black people are still more likely to be arrested for marijuana possession than white people in every state, including those that have legalized marijuana.”

The ACLU looked at arrests for marijuana offenses between 2010 and 2018. On average, Black people are 3.6 times more likely to be arrested for marijuana offenses than white people.

Keep in mind that 9 times out of 10, marijuana arrests are for possession charges. Just having a joint on your person is considered a crime—if your skin is dark.

that has become the new normal in the Black community."

The organization was a unique mentoring program that sought to provide products for dysfunctional families with a vision, discipline, and crafted goals. It was hoped the involvement of similar programs would slow the devolution of Black dysfunctionality.

At the workshop, 48% of Black households were headed by an impoverished sister. Today that number is over 72% and is a significant reason why Milwaukee hosts the highest Black poverty rate in the country.

Among the boxes of photographs I've started sorting through was one of a Nazi rally on the appropriately titled 'Southside.' The late Donna Rogers and I were the only Black journalists covering the rally. Ironically, we were forced to stand in a space reserved by the sheriff's department inside the roped-off area.

The fact that we were among the racist roaches was bad enough. Worse was the aim of Black protestors (who had marched across the viaduct) carrying cartons of eggs which they pelted upon the racist roaches---and us.

While trying to clear away some space in the storage room (that's Black folks speak for combination furnace room/closet), I discovered a box marked 'Mom's junk.'

I was given the box following my mother's passing several years ago.

There was no date or indication of what was in the box. It contained a rotary dial telephone, a percolator coffeemaker, and an envelope with several black and white photos of my parents.

One of the photos told of a communal event with women dressed to be seen and men in their Sunday best with processes, including my father.

There was also a metal clothes hanger in the box. And since there was no clothing, I assumed it was used by us 'po (not to be confused with poor) folks as a television antenna.

One of my first jobs was serving as my father's robotic remote control.

As such, I could be in the outhouse, but when Pops called out to me, I discontinued whatever I was doing and ran toward the black and white 25-inch television.

I didn't need to know what channel to turn to since we only had three during my youth. It's hard to believe today, but television during my childhood went off the air at 11 p.m. At that point, all sets played the national anthem---again, and again, and again-- to indoctrinate us.

I found a half dozen posters that reflected various periods of American Apartheid---history that puts a stamp on Critical Race Theory.

One of the posters was of a musical called 'If the Man in the Moon were a Coon,' by Fred Fischer. Don't know who he was (but I hope he's in hell, and the devil is a former slave). The musical starred White folks in 'black-face,' eating watermelon and chicken.

The play opened in the early 20th century in New York. Don't know if it won a Tony.

Another poster featured international superstar Josephine Baker, performing topless her legendary 'banana dance' in Paris in 1925. Baker gave up on America and moved to France, where she felt she was treated like a human being vs. a neo-slave.

Another poster highlighted baseball legend and pioneer Jackie Robinson, who, as the first African American in the major leagues, endured the rants of racists and death threats because he dared to play 'America's favorite pastime.'

Few people know that Robinson and Harry Belafonte, and Sidney Poitier formed an organization to bring young Africans to America to attend college. One of their 'clients' was named Barack Obama, Sr.

I can't remember why I kept a clipping of a 2006 event that featured former NFL quarterback and Superbowl MVP Doug Williams as the keynote.

From Grambling State, Williams broke the NFL color line (among pro quarterbacks), proving, among other things, that Black quarterbacks are as intelligent as White ones. Think about that.

Williams was the first Black player selected in the first round of the draft (only one team expressed interest) despite a college career that bordered on being great.

After facing discrimination, he left to play in Canada, returning in the mid-1980s to back up a Washington Redskins' team that he led to the Superbowl championship.

Among my crates of photos was a black and white pic of a press conference led by Howard Fuller and Mike McGee describing the latest in a series of demonstrations by the Justice for Ernie Lacy Coalition.

Lacy was our local George Floyd and was murdered similarly---albeit by a member of Milwaukee's Finest (although I can think of another word starting with an 'f' that would be more appropriate).

The police union sought to subvert a trial of the assassin and went so far as to threaten the district attorney, E. Michael McCann, with a recall election if he pursued an inquest.

Another box contained dozens of campaign buttons. Each of them details how little fruit has been collected despite our blind allegiance to the Democratic Party over the century.

You may not realize it, but the Confederacy was started by the Democratic Party. They also proudly lynched thousands of Black and white people to keep them from voting and organized the KKK and other hate groups.

One of my favorite buttons is a Jesse Jackson for President promotion.

To be honest, I've never fully trusted Jackson (and expressed disdain for him when he was paid thousands of dollars by the teachers' union to denounce school choice, even though he sent his kids to private schools). His story (as opposed to history) will suggest Jackson's presidential bid in 1988 was derailed when he was overheard by a Black journalist referring to New York as 'Hymie Town' (a negative reference to Jews). But the truth was, neither America nor the Dems were ready for a Black president.

And some say it still isn't.
