Affordable High-Speed Internet Comes to Westlawn Gardens



Residents of the revitalized housing community will be eligible to receive free internet access thanks to a partnership between PCs for People, the Housing Authority of the City of Milwaukee, and Microsoft.

Nearly 1,000 households in the Westlawn Gardens community will have access to affordable highspeed internet.

With support from the Housing Authority of the City of Milwaukee (HACM), and Microsoft, PCs for People built a 4G LTE tower to provide internet access to residents at an affordable cost of \$15 per month or completely free if the resident uses their federal Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) benefit.

Unlike many other high-speed internet service providers, PCs for People does not require a contract or credit check.

Westlawn Gardens residents will receive the first month of service free of cost, as well as a free modem.

"PCs for People is thrilled to join the exciting and transformational outreach provided by the Housing Authority of the City of Milwaukee in the development of the Westlawn Gardens community," said Thami Hastings, Community Impact Manager at PCs for People. "This project demonstrates the best of public/private partnerships and how we can meet residents' needs by working together.

It is a model that will inspire PCs for People as we advance digital equity across the country."

Nearly 1,000 housing units are planned for Westlawn Gardens with 773 completed or under construc-

The high-speed internet will be available to all of the homes, as well as the neighborhood's playgrounds and garden.

This expanded connectivity area

was requested by the community and supported by the Housing Au-"By connecting more residents of

Milwaukee, affordable, high-speed internet can add to our economy and to educational achievement.

It is an effort to empower everyone, and I appreciate all the support this project has received," Milwaukee Mayor Cavalier Johnson said.

As part of this initiative to improve digital access, PCs for People and Microsoft will provide a complimentary Microsoft Go 2 computer to the first 100 residents registered in the pilot phase.

All Westlawn Gardens residents can also purchase low-cost laptops and desktops through the ACP bene-

"Our world is becoming more digital every day, but people without broadband and a device to use it are effectively cut off from opportunity," said Vickie Robinson, general manager of Microsoft's Airband Initiative. "We're proud to work with the Housing Authority and PCs for People to ensure all residents of Westlawn Gardens have greater access and adopt affordable connectivity – and the opportunities of the digital world beyond."

HACM is developing Westlawn Gardens as a mixed-income, mixeduse neighborhood to meet the community's housing, retail, and social service needs.

With 958 affordable and marketrate housing options, new parks, playgrounds, retail spaces, and partnerships to deliver services to neighborhood residents, Westlawn Gardens is helping to transform Milwaukee's northwest side for generations to come.

"Great communities are built through partnerships, and we sincerely thank the partners who are ensuring that every resident of Westlawn Gardens can participate







The New Norm! Is it going to far?

America's secret PC Police have changed the country's socio-cultural rules, and it's left some of us confused, disoriented, and justifiably afraid

A wrong word today can destroy your career, or worse.

A protracted glance can be grounds for allegations of sexual assault. Even verbalizing your Christian tenets can invite an arrest by the PC Police.

A generation after Black Power salutes and group hugs, brothers today are afraid to embrace tribal members for fear of being charged with sexual harassment. To reject an embrace from a member of the LGBTQ growing community is to be labeled a homophobe.

And Lord help us (no pun intended) don't utter that seemingly

harmless joke of 10 years ago. They will burn you at the stake as they did the Salem witches accused of hierarchy. (Hmmm, it sounds eerily similar to prejudicial coon rumor, doesn't it?)

Even prayer can get you in trouble. Under today's rubrics, being a Christian or Muslim brings seemingly conservative liabilities that can have you in court, where you hope a Republican judge awaits. Unless they carry their bible upside down, as Donald Trump did.

The U.S. Supreme Court—which is reportedly on the verge of rescinding abortion 'rights'-- is reviewing the case of a Washington state football coach who has maintained his 'illegal' habit of praying after games.

Even worse (according to 'liberal' parents who filed complaints), many of his players have joined him during these talks with our/the Supreme Being.

It's irrelevant that the prayers included thanking God/Nyame that there were no injuries from a sport that will probably be outlawed in a few years by the same people who

don't believe there should be winners and losers in athletic competition.

It's been decades since the PC government outlawed prayer in the schools, but that hasn't stopped it.

Public acknowledgment of Christianity has become outlawed (much like under Roman and Nazi rule).

Instead, if asked, it will be called

meditation or even protest. Kneeling at a government-sponsored event is sanctioned only if you lie and say you're protesting American injustice or the Just-us system.

But that might be changing.

Apparently, only atheists are immune from government scrutiny today. Still, I would venture to guess if one accidentally utters a previously acceptable greeting like 'Merry Christ-mas,' they too could find themselves forced to turn in their PC card.

They have been convinced the Black nuclear family paradigm is no longer valued, nor is marriage, even though it is our African heritage, the paradigm our ancestors viewed as a

spiritual and cultural requisite for na-

tion-building.

Contrary to the accepted norm of plantation politics and miseducation of the educracy, children bought up in that construct are more likely to go to college or technical careers, stay out of prison, buy homes, and go into government jobs. Like politics.

Today, there are almost twice as many African American families headed by a single, impoverished mother than in two-parent paradigms.

Yet, to suggest that the disproportionate Black poverty, high school dropout rates, and criminal involvement can be traced to that prototype is to be labeled conservative, Republican, or a sellout.

Indeed, silence or acceptance is required today for many terms or situations we innocently applied a few days ago.

You can no longer call a friend a 'punk' anymore. (But you can call them a nigger (n-word), bitch, or hoe.)

Back in the day, a punk was someone who couldn't fight, missed a basket, or refused to participate in a juvenile misdemeanor.

Rarely did it actually mean a homosexual, although the implication may have discriminated against them because it implied they were weak.

because it implied they were weak.

From experience, I can attest that's not true, nor do they fight like girls, arms flying and claws bared.

In today's 'norm' (if you can use that fluid term), you can no longer hug someone who is not a relative or child.

I recently heard of two law enforcement officials who came under judicial scrutiny for supposedly allowing their hands to brush across two women's knees (knee caps) during separate conversations.

They would have been executed if their hands lingered.

There was a time when I could stand close and not be accused of invading a woman's space. And being a touchy, feely kind of a person, I might occasionally shake a woman's hand. Today, I hesitate.

Which prompts the question of why these rules only apply to men.

A woman can touch any part of a man, and it will be considered either an expression of friendliness or a joke. Actually, it's sexist, too. Or is there a loophole in the law?

Along those lines, I was recently asked to consider starting a self-defense class for women at a local fitness center.

Five years ago, I would have jumped at the possibility.

Today, I'm not so sure.

How do you teach self-defense without engaging a woman?

And I definitely can't show them how to attack certain vital parts of the body, although I assume the law allows them to touch me.

(For the record, I would only allow them to conceptualize a groin grab for obvious reasons.)

Section two, subchapter four of the

PC Handbook, explains the penalties for referring to a woman as anything other than a lady if that term applies. I hope we can still call them sister, although that will probably be outlawed soon, as it might be confused with a pronoun.

Most alarming to those brought up as Black Christians (which is historically different from White Christianity as invented by this country's founding fathers) is that we have been told our religion is outdated and promotes sexism and homophobia. Granted, their bible does. But we practice liberation theology. Where does that concept fall?

Moreover, the new covenant only became a topic of concern when it was discovered that Jesus/Yeshua was a brother---dark as copper with hair like lamb's wool, the bible says.

Today you can't declare yourself to be a Christian without undergoing criticism about tenets on homosexuality, misogyny, or at the other end of the spectrum, abortion.

One of the most glaring cultural restrictions is prayer.

In today's new norm (if I can use that term), you can't even look at a person too long. Particularly a woman if you're a straight man another suggestive time that has been outlawed by the PC Police as it implies those who are not 'straight are crooked.

I wrote a column some time back in which I sarcastically asked how long a man could look at a woman's behind or profile at the fitness center. I called it the 'Three Second' rule, and it was premised on a confrontation a friend had at a central city gym.

He was accused of sexual assault for looking at a sister's behind for a full four seconds.

The woman said the brother in-

vaded her space and sent negative vibes to her that would have a long-term emotional impact.

Photographer's Experience of Kent State 1970 · HOWARD RUFFNER



How Black Milwaukeeans reacted to the tragic May 4,1970, Kent State University shootings By Richard G. Carter

For one generation of Americans -- including my late Milwaukee parents, Sanford and Juanita Carter -- Dec. 7, 1941, is "...a date that will live in infamy," described by President Franklin D. Roosevelt.

For many in my Black Milwaukee generation, it was May 4,1970, at Kent State University. Four students dead, nine wounded on campus at the hands of the Ohio National Guard during an anti-Vietnam War protest.

Most memorable to most Americans – including many here -- is the shocking, Pulitzer Prize-winning photo inside the May 15, 1970 LIFE Magazine, of a teenage girl kneeling over a fatally wounded student..

But the widely hailed LIFE cover photo of one of the wounded -- headlined "Tragedy at Kent" -- was taken by another student, Howard E. Ruffner, a stringer for LIFE, who received the Polk Award. Ironically, Ruffner loaned a zoom lens to student John Paul Filo, who took the inside photo which earned a Pulitzer.

After news of the shooting made newspaper and television headlines in Milwaukee, I received concerned phone calls in Cleveland from local Black news colleagues and friends who knew I was working in Ohio.

George F. Sanders – a Korean War veteran and one of my co-workers at The Milwaukee Star – wondered why he didn't see Black students in the photos, or in TV news coverage. I told him I'd check with two of my White reporter colleagues on the Plain Dealer who were Kent State journalism grads.

"I'd be surprised if those Guardsmen didn't look for some Blacks to shoot," barked the fiery Sanders – an outspoken pro-Black activist. I later reported to Sanders that I was told Kent State had a number of Black students, but none seem to be visible in the crowd of protesters.

"Too bad, I don't blame' em," he said. "Still, with so many brothers getting wasted in Vietnam, I'd been there protesting if I'd known about it."

Milwaukee Journal reporter Jay Anderson – another former colleague at The Star – also expressed outrage at the shootings, and suggested that I get The Plain Dealer to send me to Kent State for insights.

A few hours later, I heard from other Black Milwaukeeans, including Reuben Harpole, Marlene Johnson, John Givens, Alvin Russell, James Reed and girlfriends Evelyn Bailey, Gloria Harpole, Beverly Pitts and Julia Traver, wondering how such a thing could happen. When I told them about Anderson's suggestion, they agreed. "You can write better than those White boys," Evelyn When I approached my editor, he reluctantly turned me down – opting to go with stringers who covered Kent State.

Fast forward to a night in 1979, when I accompanied

my wife, Janice, a Plain Dealer reporter, at her interview of Ruffner in his suburban Cleveland Heights home. At the time, he and I were Ohio Bell Telephone media relations colleagues. After her interview, I immediately called Anderson, Sanders, and others in Milwaukee to tell them what I'd finally learned.

"Sounds like you're privy to a great story," said Anderson. "Sure wish I knew about this in 1970 when the shootings happened." And, as usual, he had a journalistic suggestion. "You should write this up for The Milwaukee Journal. You know how much they like stuff by local talent-- especially Blacks born-and-raised here, like you."

But I decided against writing about it – and the reactions of Black Milwaukeeans -- until now, to mark the anniversary date, as it remains very disturbing news here and everywhere.

Although working closely with Ruffner for several years, we rarely discussed his experiences at Kent State. However, when I mentioned that my wife was eager to write about it for the popular Plain Dealer Sunday Magazine, he agreed to an interview. As he talked openly for several hours, I took my own detailed notes.

The day would hold much significance for the second-year Kent State broadcasting major than he ever dreamed. -- the cover of America's leading national magazine -- an unusual success for one so young. And his photos would also be used in subsequent court cases.

Over the next eight years, Ruffner was called to testify at numerous hearings and court trials, making him somewhat cynical about judicial proceedings. At the first Kent State civil trial in 1974, his deposition lasted eight hours. But the real story was told by the 304 pictures he took of the events leading up to, and including, May 4:

The ROTC building on fire; Gov. James Rhodes with a pained expression touring the damage; students burning the U.S. Constitution, hurling back tear gas bombs and making obscene gestures; fixed bayonets on raised rifles; the Guard taking aim; clusters of students around the dead and wounded; a large pool of blood; a long-haired youth dancing crazily around the blood and sopping it up with a black flag.

The Guardsmen had been sent to the campus by the governor after 3,000 of the 20,000 student population rampaged through the town that weekend, breaking windows and setting fire to the ROTC building.

"It wasn't until 2 a.m. the next day when LIFE called," Ruffner said, "because they couldn't find the negatives I sent, when I realized how important it was. Later, out of all the pictures from photographers who were present, they told me my work was being considered for the cover."

Ruffner said "I didn't see any of my pictures until LIFE printed them," shaking his head. "My role at Kent State was accidental, but it changed my life."

Memories of that day 52 years ago this week may fade, but for me and concerned Black Milwaukeeans, Ruffner's pictures remain -- a stark testimonial to our generation's own "date of infamy."




