## Basketball Hall of Famer, former Milwaukee Bucks, Detroit Pistons center Bob Lanier dies

One of the Bucks all-time greats and Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer Bob Lanier died Tuesday evening.

He was 73.

Lanier reportedly passed away following a short illness. It was believed he was battling cancer according to a quote by NBA great Kareem Abdul Jabbar.

"Bob Lanier was a Hall of Fame player and among the most talented centers in the history of

the NBA, but his impact on the league went far beyond what he accomplished on the court," NBA commissioner Adam Silver said in a statement.

"For more than 30 years, Bob served as our global ambassador and as a special assistant to David Stern and then me, traveling the world to teach the game's values and make a positive impact on young people everywhere."

The 6-foot-10, 250 pounder was a native of Buffalo, New York. He played collegiately at St. Bonaventure, and was taken first overall by the Detroit Pistons in the 1970 NBA Draft.

He played 14 seasons in the league, the last four of which — 1980-84 — came with the Milwaukee Bucks.

One of the Bucks all-time greats, Lanier spent five seasons in Milwaukee (1980-84), and led the team to division titles each year and to two Eastern Conference Finals appearances in 1983 and 1984.

During his time in Milwaukee, Lanier was one of the most popular Bucks players with fans and known throughout the community for his generosity and kindness.

His number 16 hangs in the rafters at Fiserv Forum.

## Thelma Sias to serve as commencement speaker at Marquette University, receive honorary doctorate

Thelma A. Sias will serve as the commencement speaker for Marquette University's Graduate School and Graduate School of Management on May 22, as well as receive an honorary doctor of humane letters degree.

A retired corporate executive, community advocate and activist, and professional speaker, Sias is devoted to mentoring and inspiring young leaders, building opportunities for executive women's leadership, driving political engagement, and advancing diversity in the community. She is the

founder and CEO of The Sias Group, which provides political and leadership consulting expertise.

"Thelma is a friend, trusted advisor and mentor to so many in Milwaukee and around the country,

experience with interest rate policy. They also said her testimony before the Senate Banking Committee suggested she wasn't sufficiently committed to fighting inflation, which is running at four-decade highs.

Cook has a doctorate in economics from the University of California, Berkeley, and has been a professor of economics and international relations at Michigan State since 2005.

She was also a staff economist on the White House Council of Economic Advisers from 2011 to 2012 and was an adviser to President Joe Biden's transition team on the Fed and bank regulatory policy.

Some of her most well-known research has focused on the impact of lynchings and racial violence on African American innovation.

Cook is only the second of Biden's five nominees for the Fed to win Senate confirmation.

His Fed choices have faced an unusual level of partisan opposition, given the Fed's history as an independent agency that seeks to remain above politics.

Some critics charge, however, that the Fed has contributed to the increased scrutiny by addressing a broader range of issues in recent years, such as the role of climate change on financial stability and

## Introducing 'THE BABY BOOMERS'

These unfair practices connected to the racism and segregation of the times and contributed to the unfair access to home ownership and higher education that are the basic tools for building "Generational Wealth," which was wealth passed on from one generation to the next. Some returning veterans received home loans and opportunities for

“Bob will always be one of the big men of basketball. Not just because of the size of his body, but because of the size of his heart,” said Jabbar another former Bucks and NBA legend in a Twitter post upon hearing of Lanier’s death.

“Bob and I are forever linked because of the Bucks and because of me complaining about dragging him up and down the court in ‘Airplane!’

“He will be greatly missed by the sport, by the fans, and by me.

“His death is a reminder of how vulnerable we all are to cancer no matter how big and strong we are and how we all need to be vigilant in fighting the disease.”

Lanier was an eight-time NBA All-Star, and was the MVP of the 1974 NBA All-Star game.

Lanier scored 19,248 points, grabbed 9,698 rebounds, and blocked 1,100 shots.

Lanier was elected to the Hall of Fame in 1992.

Silver called him “one of the kindest and most genuine people I have ever been around.”

“I learned so much from Bob

by simply watching how he connected with people,” he wrote.

“He was a close friend who I will miss dearly, as will so many of his colleagues across the NBA who were inspired by his generosity. We send our deepest condolences to Bob’s family and friends.”

higher education and business loans. The numbers of returning soldiers also led to an increase in the Birth Rate resulting in the creation of the “Baby Boomer” generation.

It was not all work and no play as Hollywood, produced two of its most popular movies that have stood the test of time and continue to enjoy popularity as today’s most watched classic movies:

racial disparities in employment.

Biden called on the Senate early Tuesday to approve his nominees as the Fed seeks to combat inflation.

“I will never interfere with the Fed,” Biden said. “The Fed should do its job and will do its job, I’m convinced.”

Fed Chair Jerome Powell is currently serving in a temporary capacity after his term ended in February. He was approved by the Senate Banking Committee by a nearly unanimous vote in March.

Fed governor Lael Brainard was confirmed two weeks ago for the Fed’s influential vice chair position by a 52-43 vote.

Philip Jefferson, a economics professor and dean at Davidson College in North Carolina, has also been nominated by Biden for a governor slot and was approved unanimously by the Finance Committee. He would be the fourth Black man to serve on the Fed’s board.

Biden has also nominated Michael Barr, a former Treasury Department official, to be Fed’s top banking regulator, after a previous choice, Sarah Bloom Raskin, faced opposition from West Virginia Democratic Sen. Joe Manchin.

Cook, Jefferson, and Barr would join Brainard as Democratic appointees to the Fed. Yet most economists expect the Fed will continue on its path of steep rate hikes this year.

## If you don't want to believe me about the abysmal state of MPS, maybe you'll believe Dan Adams!

*Editor's note. It's rare that I give up my column space for a guest author. This week is an exception.*

*Attorney Dan Adams is both a friend and colleague who served as a pundit with me on Sunday Insight with Charles Sykes.*

*I often joke that it took me 20 years to push Sykes to my 'dark-side.' Dan was already on my side of the ideological and philosophical fence.*

*The following article on the disingenuous Milwaukee School Board decision to give themselves a raise despite the district's standing as among the worst systems in the country mirrors my concerns.)*

Members of the MPS school board recently decided they deserved their share of the 4.7% pay raise they recently awarded all other district employees at the behest of the teacher's union.

Even before last week's pay raise, Milwaukee school board members earned \$10,000 more per year than any other school district in the state – and more than three times the average of the state's five largest districts.

In comparison, last year Kenosha voters actually cut the pay of their school board to a flat \$100 per board meeting.

In voting to raise their own pay, one school board member claimed, "... this is a full-time-plus job, because of all the research that has to be done."

School board service is certainly more than the 3 to 5 official meetings per month.

But all that still leaves quite a lot of "research" time before board members reach a 40-hour workweek.

And while last year's marathon late-night sessions spent stubbornly refusing to reopen MPS schools for in-person learning were undoubtedly taxing – maybe we should compare it to the experience of MPS working parents who did their jobs and proctored online school.

Tell me again, who exactly was working "full-time-plus" for MPS over the past two years?

If the School Board really is doing "full-time-plus" work – well, the results suggest the extra time isn't paying off as our community's kids aren't learning, families are fleeing, and the district's finances are in a doom loop hurdling toward insolvency:

- Just 3% – I wish this was a typo – of all students in MPS-run schools were on grade level in math last year.

And lest you think this is just about that difficult "new" math they're teaching in school these days, the district's reading results – 6% on grade level – aren't much better.

- The total district enrollment has declined by more than 3,000 students in each of the last two years, and by nearly 40,000 students since 2000.

- The district's \$1.3 billion proposed 2022-23 budget released this week shows just how dire the financial picture is, with annual structural budget gaps starting at \$40-60 million next year and growing wider as one-time COVID funds are exhausted.

In total, the cumulative five-year projected deficit exceeds



\$500 million.

For the last decade, the standard response to these challenges has been to lament either the (admittedly unfair) impact of state revenue limits, or the (admittedly unfair) funding cuts that accompanied Act 10 during the Scott Walker years.

But here too the story has changed: Last year, for the first time in a decade, MPS per-pupil funding from state and local sources actually exceeded the state average.

Meanwhile, Milwaukee's average property tax rates increased 18.6 percent last year, thanks almost entirely to the \$87 million MPS referendum passed in April 2020.

That's the second-highest spike among large US metros, behind only booming Nashville.

Effective property tax rates in Milwaukee are now more than 10 percent higher than Cook County (Chicago), IL – the notorious bastion of tax waste, governmental incompetence and corruption.

Remind me: Just what are city taxpayers – not to mention MPS students and families – actually receiving while the school board

and teacher union are working hand-in-glove to raise everyone's taxes to fund their own pay increases?

Aisha Carr was the only school board member courageous enough to vote against the raise, and she had it exactly right, saying, "I don't see any justifiable reason to provide a raise for us, because that is an ultimate reflection of our performance evaluation, and we owe it to taxpayers to give them a return on their investment."

And we haven't. ... Until we improve the conditions of our district, I don't think we're deserving."

She couldn't have said it better.

Perhaps the school board should revisit its salary study, and consider tying their pay to the district's student achievement, enrollment, and financial health. You know – like any succeeding enterprise.

Or they may use some of their "research" time to engage in a good faith discussion about whether the current system of board governance should survive at all given its ineffectiveness.

Regardless, in the interim,

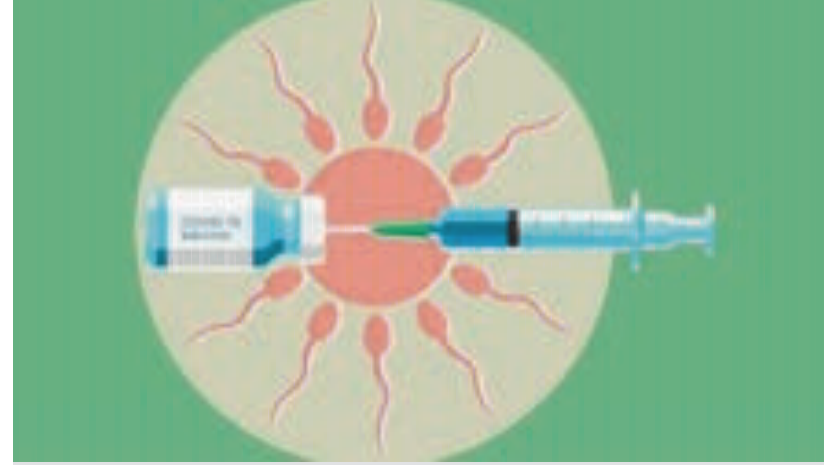

## COVID and Infertility

Within the month of May, special emphasis is placed on National Women's Health Week, an observance led by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Office.

The goal is to empower women to make their health a priority and help women understand what steps they can take to improve their health.

During a time when there appears to be waning interest in getting the COVID vaccine, we still hear from those who still grapple with the decision to get vaccinated because of concerns they have about potential negative side effects. One concern is that the vaccine can cause infertility.

The stigma attached to infertility takes a toll on mental health. Unfortunately, that stigma is especially damaging for Black women. Dr. Eynav Accortt, clinical psychologist and director of the Reproductive Psychology Program at Cedars Sinai Hospital, wrote an article titled Infertility and Mental Health Studies. The article stated: "Infertile couples experience significant and emotional distress. One study of 200 couples found that half of the women and 15% of the men said that infertility was the most upsetting experience of their lives." So, if women (or men) have concerns about the COVID vaccine and its impact on fertility, they will likely choose not to get vaccinated.

This article is intended to reduce those concerns while acknowledging the history of medical abuse of Black people.

Many Black people are familiar with the Tuskegee experiment on Black men with syphilis starting in 1932. Penicillin became the standard treatment for the disease in 1947, but was withheld from the men, many of whom died. Some who survived suffered long-term complications after the study ended in 1972.

While Tuskegee was a heinous act, many people are not aware that a century before that study, Black women were subjected to barbaric acts of experimentation. The first vaginal speculum, an instrument most women in the world are familiar with, was created by Dr. James Marion Sims.

Known as the founder of modern gynecology, Sims performed major surgeries without the benefit of anesthesia and proper sanitation on enslaved women.1 Until recently, a statue of Sims stood in Central Park across from the New York Academy of Medicine.

That grim information affirms the skepticism Black people, and women specifically, have about medical practices.

There are some facts about modern medicine that might provide solace. First, cautionary information has been shared about the COVID vaccine, as has been the case for all modern FDA-approved medications. Second, research from the developers Pfizer BioNTech, Modena and Johnson & Johnson was approved by the Federal Drug Administration (FDA). When there was a problem with the Johnson & Johnson vaccine, it was disclosed. The vaccine was removed from circulation until the company proved the issue was resolved.

There are several risk factors that can lead to infertility in men and

women. Absent from those factors are vaccines. Among the risk factors contributing to female infertility are abnormal menstruation, kidney disease, pelvic inflammatory disease, and endometriosis, according to Cleveland Clinic reports.

Concerns persist about possible side effects of the COVID vaccine, including infertility.

“There isn’t evidence that any vaccines — including COVID-19 — cause infertility,” said Dr. Rachel Villanueva, a Black OB/GYN based in New York City and president of the National Medical Association. “Though for men who have contracted COVID, some have experienced a temporary decrease in sperm count that, based on timing, could make conception a temporary challenge.”

A study from Boston University supports what Dr. Villanueva shared. In conclusion, trust Black medical professionals like Dr. Villanueva and the Black nurse Sandra Lindsay at Long Island Jewish Medical Center.

She was the first person in the country to get the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine on December 14, 2020. The shot was administered by a Black woman, Dr. Michelle Chester. Sandra did what so many Black women have done over the ages: she stepped up to lead the way for others. In the case of COVID and its impact on communities of Black and brown people, Sandra said she trusted science even though she was aware of past medical atrocities.

This information may put minds at ease. If friends and family want to get pregnant, they hopefully won’t let fears about the COVID vaccine stop

them from trying. May is the month dedicated to Women’s Health. There are other resources available in addition to those listed within this article. Take advantage of the information and pursue your dream of pregnancy.
