THE WEEK THAT WAS!

A search for the truth, and justice; celebrating 'The Day of Jubilee,' and saluting all Fathers!

Like millions throughout the country, we were glued to our televisions last week Thursday watching the hearing of the January 6 Committee. It's chair, Congressman Bennie Thompson from Mississippi, reminded us of the advocacy and tenacity of late civil rights warrior Medgar Evers and his late wife Myrlie who took up his mantle after her husband's death at the hands of an assassin.

With passion and compassion, Thompson laid out the attempted coup, perpetuated by former President Donald Trump.

The committee's vice chair, Liz Chaney of Wyoming (a Republican), continued laying out the case of what happened that infamous day. Not desirous of berating the actions of a twice impeached sitting president, Chaney charged that our country should be very concerned about an attempted insurrection that forcefully overtook the halls of Congress, producing a number of deaths, and tested the strength of our constitution.

A re-evaluation of the meaning of 'victimhood' is sorely needed!



Sid Fumbanks and I were talking about our Motherland experiences when the young Black couple approached.

Sid was standing in the doorway of his barber shop on West Hopkins while I was positioned near the curb adjacent to my 'mid-life crisis mobile' (a 2006 convertible sports car).

I was so immersed in our conversation that I didn't initially see the couple until they were within a few feet of us, at which point the young prince asked for 'permission' to cross our path.

Maybe you missed it, so I shall re-

peat it.

The young brother, holding hands with his 'unweaved and unwigged' princess, paused before crossing our path to solicit 'permission' to invade our space.

I can't speak for Sid, but the rarity of that scenario prompted me into silence.

In fact, I was awestruck until I heard the young brother utter 'thank you as he and his princess exited our space.

As if scripted, Sid and I said in unison: 'home training.'

It was a beautiful scene, an image

we naively thought would be more common after we marched across the country throwing stones at the apartheid-reinforced castle walls, threatening violent revolution unless our civil rights were granted, and wasted endless hours standing in voting lines believing some white knight was gonna legislate his brethren's racist attitudes.

For my part, I've also been shaking the tree of Black apathy and advancing an Africentric paradigm that would culminate in a communal system similar to the villages I visited in the Motherland.

Many of us left our respective demonstrations to spend quality time with our children, teaching them about our African culture and the greatness that flowed through their veins.

We taught them that they were special, God's chosen and were provided with the unique strength and mental fortitude to overcome obstacles.

We stressed that the only way a

man can put his knee on your back is if you bend over or kneel before him.

Apparently, our cultural paradigm was not shared by the majority.

To be honest, there were times when I lost faith that we'd reach the symbolic valley beyond Martin Luther King's mountain top.

Seems like, at every turn, we lost ground either through divided forces, cultural confusion, or mainly when we allowed the missionaries and poverty pimps to lead our caravan.

Our 'chew-chew train' had trouble making it up the steep hill of racial empowerment because the wheels kept slipping on the rails of self-hatred (in the form of nigrityde (n-tude) and the false concepts of victimization.

We fell prey to a socioeconomic scam in which the conductors of the train enriched themselves by convincing us we were essentially inferior, couldn't care for ourselves, and needed assistance to live minimalist

existence until 1865. That day became known as 'Jubilee Sunday.' Last year, President Joe Biden signed the second Black initiated holiday in the history of this country. Let's strive to make this new Black holiday more than a day off to barbeque. Make certain that you tune into public television programing or one of the many educational cable and streaming channels with programs related to Juneteenth. Even better, attend the Juneteenth celebration Sunday along Martin Luther King Drive. Google Juneteenth Day and its importance and share what you learn with your families and friends much the same way you share the seven principles of Kwanzaa. Talk, reflect, and share oral stories of your family. What have grandparents shared about their lives, about their ancestry, about from whence they came. Learn about their struggles for freedom, the 'Great Migration' from the south to the north, the role of trains in transporting Blacks to the north in 'chicken cars,' train cars that smelled permanently (it seemed) of fried chicken because, due to Jim Crow laws that sep-

arated Black and White passengers. Learn the role of the 'Pullman Porters' in transporting news of jobs, better housing, and places where they could stay as they began new beginnings in the various cities of the north. The porter even carried copies of legendary Black newspapers like the Pittsburgh Courier and Chicago Defender throughout their travels so Black southerners could be informed of what was happening 'up north.' Find out who was the first relative to go to move 'up north,' the first to go to college...to graduate...to gain better employment. Learn who remained in the south and the many farms and acres that still remain in families from sharecropping days. Our history is RICH, it is PRODUCTIVE, IT IS RESILIENT! There is much to celebrate as families, as neighbors, as communities. We need not feel less than, for we have overcome so many injustices that continue to touch our lives in many ways today. But today we have new tools, new opportunities, new supporters who KNOW the challenges and are desirous of continuing to make the changes that ensure that CHANGE AND AN ATTITUDE OF 'I CAN

AND I AM SOMEBODY' catapults and grows and continues to inspire the next generation and the one afterward. Happy Juneteenth Day. Make it safe. Make it meaningful. Make it a day to discover and salute freedoms won and those we MUST JOINTLY WORK TO ENSURE FOR OUR CHILDREN AND THEIR CHILDREN. **** June 20 is also Father's Day. We hope wives, significant others and children will crown our fathers as the wonderful men, providers, protectors, guides, and supporters that they are; despite the grievous statistics that show the number of homes without fathers. Many families are blessed to have fathers who are not only in the home but are guiding their families as a good father must. BEYOND JUNETEENTH: Breaking the Chains to Access Capital and Achieve Real Freedom

Being black and walking away from a person who legally owned you became reality on June 17, 1865, when Texas became the last state to implement the Emancipation Proclamation. The day, now known as Juneteenth, has become one of celebration for black Americans.

It was a start. As black Americans, however, we continually must ask the question: “Are we truly emancipated?”

While important to celebrate a day that freed our ancestors from the physical bondages and the inhumane capacity of slave owners to treat them as less than human beings, we must also look to the day as a reminder we have yet to successfully free black community, from the vestiges of restraints, controls and power structures that bond us far beyond the physical realm of being enslaved.

Participating in capitalism through business ownership is one of them. Many people were then, and still remain reluctant to accept our access of all that our country offers. The quest for equity, fairness and impartiality –at the least from the federal government – has been attempted through years of court rulings and reforms. Still, equity in America, even after 157 years, is a work in progress.

• According to an analysis from the White House Council of Economic Advisers, differences in business ownership account for 20 percent of the wealth gap between average white and Black households. The analysis noted that people of color, women, and those

from rural areas are underrepresented in their share of total Federal procurement dollars, even relative to their low rates of ownership in the general economy.

Seeing that a whole government corrective action was needed, the Biden/Harris Administration instructed by executive action more than 90 federal agencies to scour their agencies for changes they could make to provide more equity in services and programs to the underserved – a group which includes black Americans and other communities disproportionately impacted by poverty and inequity over the years. In response, agencies released a combined total of 300 new actions to address barriers to equity in federal services.

The federal government procures 90% of its goods and services in America each year, and is the largest purchaser in the world, so access to the federal marketplace is an obvious key to economic equity.

The Biden/Harris Administration has set an agency goal of increasing federal spending to small, disadvantaged businesses by 50% by fiscal year 2025. Acting on that goal, the U.S. Small Business Administration made several changes to give disadvantaged small businesses more access to federal contracting dollars.

The SBA worked with federal agencies to set up measures so they could accurately track spending and publicly report progress. That awareness has already raised governmentwide spending with Small Disadvantaged Businesses to 11% this year, from 5% the previous year.

Additionally, the SBA has allocated more funding to resource partners who counsel and train small businesses to enter not only the contracting world but to start and grow their businesses. This funding added 24 new Women’s Business Centers in 2021, thus tripling of the number of centers located on the campuses of Historically Black Colleges and Universities and continues the expansion of largest WBC network in the history of the SBA. With these new additions, the complete listing of WBCs housed on the campuses of Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) now include:

1. Morgan State University, Baltimore (MD)
2. Benedict College, Columbia (SC)
3. Virginia Union University, Richmond (VA)
4. Jackson State University, Jackson (MS)
5. Alcorn State University, Lorman (MS)
6. Winston-Salem State University, Winston Salem State (NC)
7. Bennett College, Greensboro (NC)
8. Miles College, Fairfield (AL)
9. Bowie State University, Bowie (MD)
10. Savannah State University, Savannah (GA)

In an effort to increase the number of black Americans participating in the SBA 8(a) contracting program by 12,000 nationwide, the SBA is also increasing its outreach to the National Urban League, specific sororities and fraternities for black Americans, and business students at HBCUs to expand their knowledge about business ownership and federal contracting.

Being realists, we know these reforms will not work overnight to transform areas of poverty into wealthy enclaves or combat the many pockets in our nation where institutional racism or lending disparities still exist.

But if capitalism is to work to sustain our nation’s people, our federal government, first, and then our whole country needs reforms. Poverty knows no boundaries. Struggle is struggle – even in a country that boasts the greatest wealth on earth. And the federal

government alone cannot change that.

For capitalism to work - all of us must get engaged to individually and collectively provide solid financial and business learning and mentoring experiences to our children and build community ecosystems where the possibility of small businesses, wealth accumulation and a working capitalism can exist.

As a start, the federal government is on the right track on this issue. It may bring a higher tide to lift some boats, but we are all going to have to paddle much harder together if we are to achieve equity and all of America’s people can truly enjoy the freedoms promised by democracy and capitalism.

Right now, black Americans are still chained to systems of financial bondage. We must think beyond Juneteenth to continue to find ways to access capital, which brings real freedom.

lives.

Through that process, we were obligated to sacrifice our children to their gods of educracy in their reservation schools. Black men were castrated and replaced by an old white dude with a red, white, and blue top hat and long flowing beard.

Marriage, God, and Africentric values were outlawed and replaced with a revolving door cohabitation paradigm, drug dealers, and gangsta rap lyrics.

I'm not speaking from a high tower, as I was a single parent myself. Never missed a conference, took my son to the library, and saved for a decade to take him to Africa, a national reparations conference, and the Million Man March.

All my children are married and raising their children using the same template I was given. None of my grandchildren will pick up a card this Sunday that declares, 'Happy Father's Day, mom.'

As grandparents, we accept the role of advisor and fill in the gaps. We are strict, but fair and loving.

I was driving 75 mph on the expressway a couple of

years ago and stopped in the center lane of traffic to make my granddaughter get out and pick up a candy wrapper she threw out the window.

(Actually, it was on a one-way street, going 15 miles an hour. But you get my point. Cleanliness is next to Godliness my mother taught.)

The Black poverty rate remains high partly because most Black households have one 'breadwinner' versus two and earn less money because they are un-or under-educated.

I don't want to belabor the point, and it's important to note most single parents do, in fact, beat the odds. Some of our greatest leaders, half of our politicians, and a significant percentage of our entrepreneurs come from single-parent households.

But research also shows a majority of those brought up in single-parent households will encounter the criminal justice system, drop out of school or join the Kia Boys or some similarly regressive terrorist group.

The Kia Boys and Girls are products of their environ-

ments, but not victims of it.

They don't see a future, only immediate gratification and gold chains. They have little remorse for those they prey upon. Many, if not most, are void of values, morals, or a connection with God.

But they are anomalies. They are in the minority. And most will end up behind bars or six feet under.

Check that: Moments after their mothers cry and say they were good kids and their three infant children will miss them, they will be incinerated, a fitting end for those who murdered bystanders.

As a God-connected man, I hope He/She forgives them for their sins because I'll save my tears for the real victims.

And I'll pray daily to encounter other young, respectful, and 'home-trained' couples like Sid and I observed last week. Royal couples who are victors instead of victims.
