MPD: Overall decrease in crime, but high number of homicides/non-fatal shootings persist!

Though there's been a decrease in several crime categories, homicides and nonfatal shootings still persist at high rates according to statistics covering the first six months of 2022 released by the Milwaukee Police Department.

The statistics were unveiled during a Tuesday news conference held by MPD Chief Jeffery Norman and Mayor Cavalier Johnson. The statistics cover the period between January 1 to June 30.

The stats show an eight percent decrease in violent crimes and an eight percent decrease in property crimes. Auto thefts saw a decrease of four percent.

However, the city and the department still face a challenge with homicides and non-fatal shootings.

To get a better handle on the shootings, the MPD last week unveiled its 'Operation Summer Guardian' initiative which uses the department's 'Shot Spotter' technology to respond—in real time—to gun shots being fired, and getting police to those spots immediately.

"We still have lots of work to do with homicides and non-fatal shootings, but we are going in the right direction," Chief Norman

said during the news conference.

"We are still asking the community to help us. We're all in this together."

Mayor Johnson admitted he's still alarmed by the number of homicides in Milwaukee and is immediately notified when one occurs.

"There are too many people in this city who should not have guns in their hands," Johnson said. "We need better background checks. Every time a gun is transferred from person to person, there should be a background check."

Johnson added change can't come in this critical area without the aid from the state and/or federal government.

Norman blamed many of the shootings on poor conflict resolution. "People are using firearms to settle minor disputes," the chief said, adding a percentage of the shootings are also accidental, coming from the improper storage of firearms. This has led to several children being accidently shot the past few weeks.


The MPD chief noted that there has been an improvement in clearance rates for crimes, including a 55% clearance rate for homicides.

The clearance rate for robberies is 28%, auto theft clearance improved four percent. Crash data and hit-and-run incidents is also going

Norman credited the decrease in accidents to the work of the department's traffic safety unit. He also cited the collaboration between the MPD and community partners.

"The police cannot do this by themselves," the chief stated. "Since we started the towing of vehicles on May 1, there have been 52 tows so far. We rather not tow, but if you violate the law, that is an option for us."

Said the mayor: "There are reasons to be hopeful in the first six months of the year, but we still have lots of work to do. Reckless driving is going in the right direction. We need everyone in the game and stepping up. We all have a role to play."

If someone found my lynched and decapitated body lying under a Confederate flag with a KKK hood nearby, chances are you'd still be able to identify me.

Investigators would find an Africentric necklace where my neck should have been, probably lying on a t-shirt with some reference to the

You'll also discover a red, black, and green tattoo of Africa on one arm and my late son's name, with an ankh replacing the 'l' in Malik, on the

Those two tropes reflect the duality of my bond to the Motherland: I am a descendent of West Africa (as are most of us) and also have bloodlines to Kemet, known by its European name, Egypt.

Many folks can identify me today by my face or caricature for this column. I've heard dozens of folks say they recognize my voice from my years on the radio.

Two decades of television visibilty have imprinted my image in the minds of followers and friends.

Yet, many also ID me based on my adornments and my promotion of anything African, from clothing to ewelry. I can be identified by what I am, as well as who I am.

Throughout my adulthood, I've worn symbolic jewelry or clothing 'Signifyin' my nexus to the Mother-

I have a closet designated for my African clothing and a rack full of ball caps adorned with Africentric messages next to my kufis.

I also have a drawer full of African pendants, ranging from outlines of Africa to Kemetic jewelry, particularly Ankhs.

The tattoos on my arms appropriately 'signify' not only my acceptance of the duality of our American tribe's connection to the Motherland, but also the different paths all members of the Diaspora have been forced to take to complete our circle of family

West Africa was the deportation point from which our ancestors were deployed to the brutal and inhumane treatment they would receive as slaves in America, referred to by historians and culturalists as the Maafa (our holocaust).

It was not an accident that African slaves were stripped of their language, as tribal members were separated, so they could not bond. Any symbols holding clues to who they were, were destroyed.

As a result, generations of slaves didn't know their origins, their tribes, or their religion.

That strategy forced us to adopt all of Africa as our home. And while the West coast of Africa was home to most, it was also a launching pad for captured Africans from around the

That includes Kemet, for which we take special pride as it was the mecca completing the circle of culture, acquiring the knowledge that will truly set us free and empower our children.

Of late, there has been an overwhelming acceptance of Kemet as an adopted home.

Indeed, I have been excessively pleased with the explosion of Kemetic symbols in the last few years, for it suggests a new cultural awakening that bodes well for our ignorant and confused tribe.

That fact is represented not only among millennials but second-generation tribal members.

You now witness pendants and chains as well as body adornments.

A few months ago, I saw a brother with a tattoo of an Ankh on his face. Most recently, I observed a sister with twin ankhs on her bigger than big breasts. I stared not out of lust but recognition, I explained to her.

(I also assumed that if she had young children, she could feed them Kemetic brown milk.)

There's a boxing family of pugilists, led by Gary Russell, who proudly enter the ring wearing large ankhs on their trunks, complementing their tattoos.

Actor Wesley Snipes was wearing ankhs and other symbols of Kemet decades ago. He named his production company Amen Ra Films.

Snipes fully understands the significance of that title, the societal structure, and its religion. I wonder if those who wear an ankh can say the

While the Ankh has become popular among our African American tribe, it also threatens to undermine Black tradition, specifically, 'Western' Christianity.

Behind the cross-looking Ankh is the essence of Kemet Spirituality, universal harmony, and knowledge.

The Ankh symbolizes life--the female womb--from which all humanity originates.

Equally important, it is believed to be the cornerstone of African religion from which sprung Judaism and, ultimately, Christianity.

Our ancestors were the first to acknowledge monotheism---the belief in one god---while Europeans, including the Romans and Greeks, were falsely worshiping a variety and praying to rocks and rivers. Kemetic spirituality contains a

trinity, virgin birth, and 42 'commandments' (Negative Confessions), 10 of which sound eerily similar to those on Moses' tablet.

Moreover, like Jesus (Yeshua), Moses was raised in Kemet and studied that nation's religion.

They were Black, as were the early (continued on page 7)

I won't delve into the comparisons. However, Kemetic spirituality is one door the survivors of the Maafa must walk through to return to truth.

Suffice it to say, Christianity was not the religion of our West African ancestors, nor the POWs who were

brought to these and other shores. It was forced down our throats, along with Eurocentric values and mores and the culture of the slave

That's why most Black Americans see themselves through Eurocentric prisms, wearing their hair straightened (men and women), or wearing weaves and wigs and purchasing skin

Our slave ancestors saw the truth and 'Hue-manity' in Christianity. However, it was essential to integrate some of our ancestorial beliefs and discard the racist scriptures before we could call them our own.

But in the shadows has always been another spiritual connection, a link to West African religions, amid a strong relationship with the continent's northern kingdoms.

It would be unfair to suggest most proponents of Kemetic adornments have accepted them as part of their primary religion.

However, educated African Americans find 'faith' and substance in its tenets, particularly the principles of

My Christian pastor was wearing ankh earrings on the 4th.

The leader of the most powerful coalition of African American ministers in Milwaukee wears a large ankh pendant instead of a cross.

I asked him how his conservative congregation responds to his cultural statement, and he replied: "truth is

Inherent in that response is accepting a reality that may reshape the Black community in years to come.

I decided many years ago to display my love for the Motherland and express my ownership through presentations of items that reflected that

Early on, it was a political statement; expressing my pride and cul-

That evolved into an educational paradigm, prompting me to educate tribal members—young and old about its significance and our history.

I've been privileged to have mentors whose studies provide knowledge of both societies.

Teju has championed West African

culture, while Oshi has opened the door to my discovery of Kemet. Others met I along my journey have contributed. I have undergone the Ghanian

'Rites of Passage,' culminating in my name change to Kwaku Osei.

Two DNA tests revealed my lineage to Rameses III and my Kemetic

Every day for the last 30 years, I have worn something that links me to those realities. For me, it has never been a fad but, instead, a recognition.

I take no credit, but it seems as if millions have joined my journey.

Everywhere I turn these days, I see evidence of a similar realization:

African clothing, t-shirts, and tat-Sisters wearing colorful hair pieces

instead of European, straight-haired wigs and weaves. Brothers sporting kufis and powerful Africentric messages on t-shirts and jewelry. Most interestingly, the last couple

of years have witnessed a tsunami of Kemetic recognition. Ankhs are evervwhere.

I don't know if it falls within the category of a cult or if the young(er) brothers and sisters understand its

MULLEN

But the fact that there is an acceptance in the form of bodily adornments bodes well for our tribe.

Yet, I would be remiss not to also recognize what this movement posits: a challenge or conflict with Christianity and the Eurocentric

Like Kwanzaa, an African American holiday that binds and bonds us with our original culture, the principles of Maat can also serve us well.

Indeed, the Maat is to Christianity and Islam what Kwanzaa is to Christ-

While most of us haven't established a significant cultural connection, as members of the Diaspora and the Maat, we can, and must, claim Africa in its entirety as our own.

And as African Americans now embrace the Ankh as a symbol of life, they should also recognize it is a crucial component of Kemetic spirituality. This religion predates the bible by 2,000 years.

Kemet, which means 'Land of the Blacks,' was home to a religion many believe morphed into Judaism and ultimately Christianity.

I'm not going to delve deeply into this theory, but it is hard to escape the similarities between Judaism and Kemetic spirituality and the principles

My lifelong journey has taught me that there is a thread of truth in most religions, whether rooted in animism, based on tutelary deities, ancestorial worship, or spiritualism.

Thus, I study every day as I pay homage to Africa.

The more I learn about religion and our culture, the stronger my acknowledgment that the truth lies on the African continent, where life began and we began to seek its mean-

ident Joe Biden and Vice President Kamala Harris held a call with Brittney Griner's wife and assured her that the administration is doing all it can to bring home the 31-yearold WNBA star, who is being wrongfully detained in Rus-

In a readout provided to the press, Biden officials said the president and Harris reassured Cherelle Griner that they are working to secure Brittney's release – as well as other U.S. nationals wrongfully detained or held hostage in Russia and elsewhere – "as soon as possible."

President Biden also read to Cherelle a draft of the letter he plans to send to Brittney Griner on Wednesday. This comes two days after the Olympic athlete sent a letter to the president on the Fourth of July, urging him not to "forget about me."

During Tuesday's press briefing, White House Press Secretary Karine Jean-Pierre acknowledged that she was in the room when President Biden read Griner's letter, in which she said she voted for the first time in the 2020 presidential election for Biden. Speaking about the significance of Independence Day, she wrote, "freedom means something completely different to me this year."

Jean-Pierre told White House reporters that Griner's case "is very personal to him."

Griner has been detained in Russia for more than 4

months after she was arrested and charged for possession of cannabis oil while traveling through a Moscow airport. She is currently on trial and, if convicted, faces up to 10

Kassandra Frederique, executive director at Drug Policy Alliance, told the Grio that she thinks that "Brittney's situation is one of gross overcharging and it's really unfor-

She noted that the way state officials categorize drug cases greatly impacts the consequences an individual faces.

"When people want to acknowledge that something is for personal use versus when they want to claim someone is smuggling...is often used as a way to up charges and to lose sympathy for someone," said Frederique. "We as a society really despise people who use drugs, but we also really despise people who sell drugs."

dered to remain in Russian custody at least until Dec. 20.

In her letter to Biden, Griner said she missed her loved ones and expressed her fear that she may never see them again. "As I sit here in a Russian prison, alone with my thoughts and without the protection of my wife, family, friends, Olympic jersey, or any accomplishments, I'm terrified I might be here forever," she wrote.

Last Friday marked the start of Griner's criminal trial and some believe that the basketball player is being treated more harshly because of her race and sexual orientation.

Frederique told the Grio that "drug laws" across the globe disproportionately impact members of the Black and LGBTQ+ communities which are two groups that Griner identifies with.

"The drug war has always been a tool of anti-Black racism," said Frederique. "If you look at different countries and Black people are present, or whoever is perceived as the group of people that has the least amount of power, those people tend to experience drug war policies the most

In May, the State Department acknowledged that Griner is being wrongfully detained and tasked its Office of the Special Presidential Envoy for Hostage Affairs with handling her case. Following calls held between Cherelle Griner and Secretary of State Anthony Blinken and National Security Advisor Sullivan, Biden directed his national security team to remain in regular contact with Cherelle and Brittney's family to keep them updated on efforts to secure her release "as quickly as possible."

Frederique said that Brittney Griner's case highlights the importance for everyone to know the law of the land as it relates to drug use or possession.

"People have to know what the laws are and understand how to keep themselves safe if they're going to partake," she said. "But that doesn't guarantee that they will be OK. Which is Brittney's case. However, she also noted that you "take all the precau-

tions" and still be "targeted."

"I think part of it is how do we increase our agency and what are people doing to actually change the laws in this country and [across the world]," she added.


