## BLACK MATERNAL MENTAL HEALTH WEEK!

J U L Y 1 9 t o 2 5

**Moms, Caregivers and Advocates to Issue Unprecedented Call for Awareness, Action**

Black moms are at higher risk for perinatal mood and anxiety disorders than White moms, but are less likely to receive mental health treatment.

To call attention to these and other shameful disparities, Black Maternal Mental Health Week will be held July 19

through July 25.

The weeklong event, hosted by the Shades of Blue project and supported by MomsRising, includes an in-person training session, a two-day summit, a community awards brunch, and a walk and family fun day.

It will end with a State of Black Maternal Mental Health Roundtable discussion.

Structural racism, financial and cultural barriers, and a lack of representation in the mental health field limit Black women from seeking mental health care.

Black women are more likely to experience traumatic births

and the mental health consequences that follow, and high rates of postpartum suicide and overdose deaths contribute to the maternal mortality crisis.

Moms, caregivers, organizational leaders and advocates support H.Res.1226, sponsored by Rep. Lisa Blunt Rochester [D-DE-At Large].

This Congressional Resolution designates July 19 through July 25 as Black Maternal Mental Health Awareness Week. The Resolution is designed to:

## IT'S COMPLICATED:

*Understanding the Complexities of COVID, Motherhood, and Mental Health in the Black Community*

Creating life and starting or growing a family can bring pure joy to a woman's life. It can also be a source of anxiety and hidden fear.

In addition to the physical changes that occur during pregnancy and post-delivery, approximately 20% of Black women may experience mental health challenges.

Unfortunately, the rates worsened during the COVID-19 pandemic as Black communities, including preg-



nant women, have been disproportionately impacted by the disease.

The disparity has resurfaced as a pressing issue for both lawmakers and health care providers after multiple bills to combat the crisis were

introduced in Congress in 2021. Data also show that Black women continue to face a greater risk of childbirth complications than white women.

Regardless of factors such as life-

style and socioeconomic status, Black women have historically had higher rates of medical complications, including hypertension and hemorrhaging, poorer practitioner-patient advocacy and communication, and less postpartum mental and physical health care support.

These inequities put Black mothers at a higher risk for perinatal and postnatal mood and anxiety disorders (PMADs) such as depression, anxiety, obsessive compulsive disorder, and post-traumatic stress disorder.

It is estimated that Black mothers' risks for PMADs is twice that of the general population.

understanding around maternal mental health conditions and their disproportionate impact on Black birthing people and families.

Recognize the need for culturally congruent treatment for maternal mental health conditions.

Push for further research on maternal mental health treatment models that reduce racial and ethnic health disparities.

Encourage federal, state, and local governments and individuals across the country to support Black Maternal Mental Health Awareness Week.

"Addressing Black maternal mental health is mandatory, not optional," said Kay Matthews, Founder of the Shades of Blue Project.

"It is essential that we shine a light on the mental health challenges Black moms face and fight for change," said Tina Sherman,

"Senior Campaign Director for Maternal Justice at MomsRising. "Our country urgently needs programs and policies that will improve Black moms' mental health and address these shameful disparities."

All too often, the insufficient access to quality and culturally sensitive physical and mental health care discourages Black mothers from seeking appropriate prenatal care. There is a direct correlation between higher infant mortality and lower levels of postnatal care for both the mother and baby.

While bringing more awareness to maternal mental health needs has led to various national efforts to improve maternal health care, Black mothers disproportionately face disparities in accessing and receiving appropriate health services.

In the United States, Black women are three times more likely to die from childbirth, and Black infants are two times more likely to die before their first birthday.

## Available Resources

Efforts such as Black Maternal Health Awareness and organizations such as Shades of Blue, founders of Black Maternal Mental Health Week, have helped further the awareness of these issues.

In addition, health fairs in Black communities are critical for preventive care, such as the Stay Well Health Fairs that are part of the We Can Do This Public Education Campaign.

These events provide more accessible health screenings, in-person access to Black healthcare professionals, and COVID-19 testing, vaccinations, and boosters to Black communities, including moms.

Screenings and preventive care, especially for Black women entering motherhood, are valuable for overall health.

The Stay Well events are an innovative way to reach the Black community by creating a space for health access and equity where the need is greatest.

"I made the decision to get myself and my children both vaccinated and boosted to protect their health," said Josette Brown, a mom of two and panelist at the Stay Well Health Fair in Washington, D.C.

The Stay Well Health Fairs take place across the country,

and abroad, now find themselves without government contracts and supplies needed to stay in business; it means that the much anticipated need for vaccines will be delayed because the funding is not there to continue production.

We have demonstrated this by the amount of aid and relief already sent, and that which the American people collect and send daily.

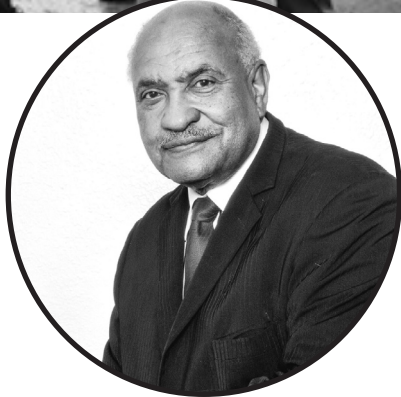
But while we help our friends and neighbors abroad, we must not neglect the needs here at home.

dangers if you get dazzled while on the road.

“So much of our safety when travelling from place to place in our vehicles comes from having optimum vision - so anything that inhibits this needs to be taken into account and addressed.

“We hope these tips can help motorists to be able to concentrate on enjoying the sun.”

Here are five StressFreeCar-Rental.com tips for driving safely in bright sunshine:

### Consider eyewear

Traditional sunglasses can give you a level of protection in the sunlight while driving, but at polarised glasses may be a better bet to try out as they can reduce the sun’s glare without darkening the wider surroundings.

### Importance of sun visors

### Full view at all times

It is a good idea to prepare for a long journey in unfamiliar territory by cleaning the car of clutter to ensure you have a good view out of the windscreen and along the dashboard.

It is also useful to give the windscreen and mirrors a clean to ensure there are no smears or dirt which could further impair vision on a bright day.

### Are repairs needed?

If your windscreen or windows have sustained cracks or scratches in the recent past, it may be worthwhile getting them repaired sooner rather than later.

Sun streaming onto these surfaces can be further distorted and cause further blind spots, becoming a safety risk to you, your passengers and other road users.


