

# History made in senate race with Barnes win; MKE Cnty residents elect first woman sheriff

# 389,890

**the number of votes Barnes received Tuesday in his first step to become the first African American U.S. Senator in Wisconsin history! He now goes toe-to-toe against incumbent GOP Sen. Ron Johnson in the November 8 general election.**



**H**istory was made Tuesday, August 9, when Wisconsin Lt. Gov. Mandela Barnes was declared the early winner of the Democratic primary for U.S. Senate by a landslide with more than 80% of the vote about 45 minutes after polls closed at 8 p.m.

The result was altogether expected, as the other three main contenders dropped out of the contest and backed him within five days of each other in late July.

Barnes becomes the first African American elected in Wisconsin to be the Democratic Senate nominee.

Barnes will square off against current two-term Senator Ron Johnson, which early polls have predicted to be an exceedingly close race.

The 35-year-old Milwaukee native emphasized his working-class upbringing in a pro-union, build-it-in-America campaign championing left-leaning priorities like ending the filibuster and partisan gerrymandering, protecting transgender youth and expanding voting rights. He is backed by, among others, Senators Elizabeth Warren of Massachusetts and Bernie Sanders of Vermont, and Congresswoman Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez of New York.

Johnson's role as an anti-woke culture warrior and Barnes' role as a young,



The 1960's serve as a pivotal period in the Civil Rights Movement. During Fellowship Open weekend, stirring images and a wide-range of themes will be visited in sessions and presentations for hundreds of Fellowship Open participants. Displays and dialogue will explore both struggle and triumph. From the vic-



Black progressive makes the contrasts obvious. For Democratic voters, the choice was easy, but the question was foremost about electability.

In Milwaukee County, history was made when Milwaukee County Chief Deputy Sheriff Denita Ball became the first woman elected to that office, replacing Sheriff Earnell Lucas, who did not seek reelection.

With no Republican on the ballot, Ball (45,897 votes-55.5%) has essentially been elected the next sheriff, defeating two other Sheriff's Office veterans, Thomas Beal (19,413, 23.5%), and Brian Barkow (16,829, 20.4%).

At around 10:40 p.m. Central Time, Decision Desk HQ called the governor primary for Tim Michels, an Army

veteran who co-owns Wisconsin's largest construction company and has never held public office. He bested Rebecca Kleefisch, who served eight years as lieutenant governor under former Republican Governor Scott Walker.

Michels will face current Governor Tony Evers in one of a set of closely watched and highly consequential midterm elections in the Badger State on Nov. 8.

Republican Tim Rogers will again take on incumbent U.S. Congresswoman Gwen Moore for the congressional fourth district seat. Rogers defeated Travis Clark. Moore was unopposed. On the state level, district 11 state Rep. Lakeshia Myers was unopposed, as was district 17 state Rep. Kalan Haywood, district 17 state Rep. Supreme Moore Omokunde, and 18 district state Rep. Evan Goyke.






## 22nd Annual Fellowship Open


## TLOD Hold First Event Post-COVID

Despite the progress America has made dealing with the issue of race, racism and race relations for the last half century, it is still regarded as the 'third rail' in the land that boasts equality, liberty, and justice for all.

Many people and institutions in this country still shy away from the subject; denying being racist even though their actions and words run counter to their claims.

Racism is the alleged reason a Black children's book author says her children's book, 'Coco's Courage Meeting the Dentist,' was rejected by the Wauwatosa Public Library.

But Wauwatosa's city attorney "vehemently

denies" the allegation. Black author Shon Lewis claims she was mistreated by Wauwatosa Library staff when she presented her children's book for consideration. More than a year later, there is no final resolution.

Lewis says her imagination of an inspired young Black girl named Coco came to life in her published children's book series. "That's it, and to show diversity of how children get along with other cultures and to support each other," Lewis said.

With two of her adult books already accepted into the Wauwatosa Library, Lewis says she was caught off guard when her children's book was denied. In an email, Lewis asked why. A staff member replied, "I would strongly recommend an editor."

"If I spelled a word in an 'urban way,' I was told the wording was awkward. Well, Black people word things a certain way, but it was still understandable and clear enough for a child to understand."

Lewis took her concerns to Wauwatosa's library

board. After a second review, her book was denied again. It cited more criteria, including the book's "tone."

"That's racist, because 'tone' of a book is what the purpose of the book is about, and who the character represents. Well, the character represents African American children," said Lewis. In covering the story for their newscast, a reporter for TMJ4 News reportedly went to the Wauwatosa Library to talk to the director and city hall to talk to the city attorney. No one was available for an on-camera interview.

Instead, TMJ4 received a statement from the city's communication manager saying, "We deny that the decision not to include her children's book was racially motivated."

Wauwatosa's communication manager also sent the news station 96 pages of correspondence between Lewis, city staff and the state's equal rights division. In it, the library's director e-mailed Lewis: "From a customer service standpoint I would agree that [staff member] could have done a better job in conveying this information to you in her second email... I would make any necessary adjustments regarding customer service."

Lewis' discrimination complaint with the Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development's Equal Rights Division last year is currently under appeal.

Her attorney sent a demand letter to the city last month, calling for a diverse library board.

# WHEN A GOOD DEED MIGHT GET YOU IN TROUBLE WITH THE 'PO-PO'!

I thought I had aged out of my prejudices toward police, but apparently, I was wrong.

Like most Black men, I am diffident, if not totally apprehensive, when confronted with the possibility of engaging Milwaukee's Finest.

Socially, it's not a problem. But in general, I try to avoid unnecessary scenarios for fear of it ending in unwelcomed and potentially explosive situations.

And that includes performing a civic duty.

For point of reference, our disingenuous history with Milwaukee's Finest has left a sour taste in the mouths of most Colored folks. In many cases, that taste has been slapped out, along with several teeth and hopes of positive community relations.

Obviously, I'm speaking about a minority of officers.

But there are also many racists---John Wayne wanna-a-bes---wearing badges who taint the department and present threats to Black folks, whether preachers, professionals, or (born-again) prostitutes.

Black men—including boys and aggressive women—are guilty of something, including being 'uppity' or spirited. Some cops of that ilk believe we are uncivilized savages in need of a zoo keeper.

With that in mind, imagine this scenario: I was driving through Germantown en route to a hardware store when I saw what appeared to be a wallet with most contents strewn on the street.

It was indeed a woman's purse; around it was dozens of credit cards and other personal items.

Without fully thinking through the possibilities, I started picking up the materials, occasionally forcing oncoming traffic to detour around me.

Grabbing all but a few business cards, I put the materials in the passenger's seat and sat there for a moment, thinking about my next steps.

After finishing my original errand, I decided to drop the materials off at a nearby police station.

After concluding my business, the paranoia kicked in again, prompting me to alter my plans. After consulting with my 'wonderfully and wickedly wise' wife (that's called acquiring brownie points), I decided to

return home with the thought of calling the police to retrieve the items.

I also considered putting the content into a mailbox since there was an ID in the purse. But given my paranoia, I quickly rejected that second option as my fingerprints were on the purse. And I didn't want to be accused of anything.

As I approached my house, I saw my neighbors--a retired White couple--helping my wife spread mulch in the front of the house. (Yeah, we live in a neighborhood where people maintain their property and take pride in their yards. You won't find litter on my block.)

I explained the scenario to the trio, concluding by asking for their recommendation.

After a brief discussion, the consensus was for me to take the materials to the police station versus delivering them to the owner, whose driver's license provided her address.

Why you ask? While there was no money in the purse (I wouldn't have taken it anyway), there could have been, and I didn't want to be accused if someone else had stolen the purse and threw it on the street.

That latter concern comes from the unfounded and insulting stereotype that all of us have 'sticky fingers,' borne out of being lazy and void of mores.

It was at this point that I suggested the neighbors take the purse, which provoked a look for which I felt compelled to explain.

Simply put, I explained, I am African American, and fear of police is in my DNA.

Not because we're cowardly, but because we have witnessed or heard of far too many cops taking out their frustrations and racist agendas on innocent or 'uppity' African Americans like me.

Obviously, many officers were honest and respectful. Still, the reality is they (Black people with criminal records) (excuse the pun) all looked alike, and thus you never knew which one was a threat (until you were called a nigger (n-word) or had your face shoved into the dirt for 'talking back.')

Even though that situation has changed---somewhat---a new breed of 'Trumpettes,' White Supremacists, and John Wayne clones have re-

placed the overtly racist. Today, the bad apples refer to you as 'sir' before taking off their masks.

And another class of officers is generally good people but fall prey to their fears and false perceptions about Black men. They are overly cautious and fall victim to prejudices and assumptions. All too frequently, they overreact, leading to confrontations in which we almost exclusively end up on the short end of the stick---make that bully club.

Blue and Black are like gasoline and matches, I explained to the White couple.

Sometimes innocent contact can ignite a fire in which someone is 'burned.' And I don't have to tell you who. It's generally the Black person.

For point of clarification, I respect and admire 'most' police. I understand their role, even if some of them don't. I applaud their courage and commitment.

I have several relatives who are cops, and I even served as a consultant for one recruitment class (albeit a supervisor didn't like what I said, so I was never invited back).

I have also recommended recruits and went out of my way to lobby for a White candidate I've known since (his) childhood.

But even that officer has acquired prejudices and stereotypes about Black folks he didn't have before joining the department. I only hope that he recognizes me if ever we meet in the line of duty.

Worse still is that I can understand why he has grown callous. Working at a central city station, he sees the worst side of Black life. Eventually, prejudices and confusion emerge. And that scenario is not restricted to White officers. Even Black officers begin to think in terms of 'those people.'

One of my nieces revealed, following Sunday House of Grace church services, her most recent experience with the 'po 'po. She said she was treated with disrespect and intimidation after being profiled and followed for a mile while driving through a suburban area.

When she dared to ask the officer for his name and badge number, he not only arrogantly refused but showed her his copy of the Fugitive Slave Act of 1850.

My grandson had a similar experience the same week, prompting my wife to quiz him about the rules of contact and survival provided by parents to Black boys to enhance their possibility of survival if confronted by 'bad' cops.

That we must teach our children how to respond to police speaks volumes about our fears for their safety

and the possibility that contact can lead to their death.

Unfortunately, George Floyd's execution revealed not only the existence of a cancer within the ranks of police, but the silence of their colleagues.

And it doesn't help that many politicians and police unions either hide their heads in the sand or seek to convince the public the men in blue are merely doing their jobs under stressful conditions and generally without public support.

But that latter claim comes with a caveat.

I should not have to think twice about doing my civic duty. Particularly since I pay unnecessarily high property taxes, partly because in Milwaukee, 43% of the budget goes to 'law enforcement.'

As one brother explained, many tribal members view themselves incarcerated in a maximum-security prison plantation, with the police as overseers. If the inmates don't terrorize and rape you, the overseers will.

That's an exaggeration rooted in truth.

It also explained why 96.7% of Black Americans under the age of 98 hold their breaths when they see a flashing red light behind them.

The dichotomous part of this scenario is rooted in my hesitancy---whether justifiable or not---to do what I was instructed to do as a Christian, citizen, and tribal member.

Like education, the criminal justice system only works when there is a partnership between the system and the citizenry. The fact that I traveled an emotional roller coaster ride speaks to an issue contributing to the record homicide, domestic violence, and terrorism paradigm that adversely impacts our lives.

Fortunately, as I left my house, I recalled a recent engagement with a Germantown police officer who was not only polite and respectful but went out of his way to accommodate. In fact, I emailed the G-town police chief to applaud the officer's conduct.

To my surprise, when I entered the G-town police station, I was sur-

prised to be met by a sister who was cordial and expressed gratitude for my good citizenship.

Maybe things are changing, at least in the suburbs like Germantown.

Lewis said, "Even if I had an Asian girl on here or a Latino girl, how are they going to feel as a book author safe regarding their decision about the book not being accepted, if ultimately the whole board is one race?"

For now, Lewis' Coco books are available at the Shorewood Library, on Amazon, Barnes & Noble and she hopes one day, the Wauwatosa Public Library.

"Give Coco a fair chance and let the children learn the importance of other cultures, because it's the new gener-

ation," said Lewis.

The Wauwatosa Public Library said they have a policy to guide librarians when they select books. Staff for the children's library decided the books did not meet the policy's criteria.

"The librarians' evaluation identified - among other factors - inaccurate information, repetitive wording, missing quotation marks, incorrect capitalizations, and verb tense changes," writes city spokesperson Eva Ennamorato.
