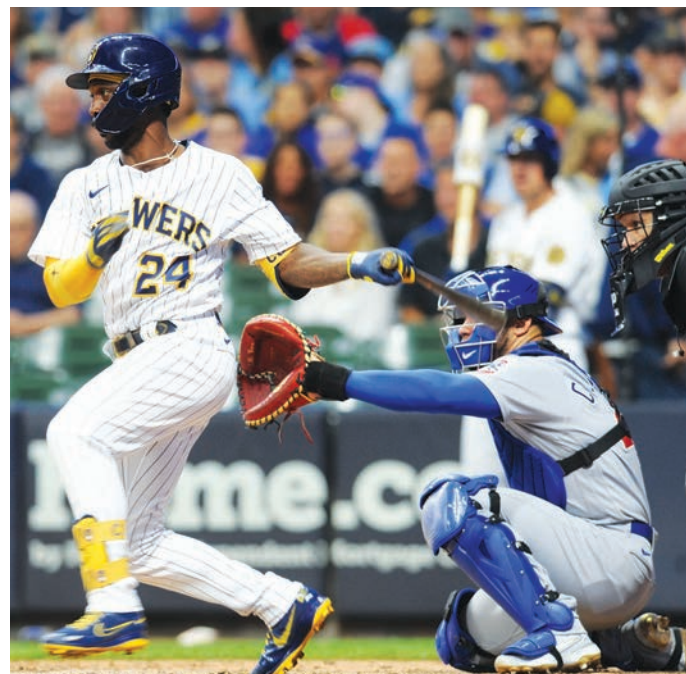
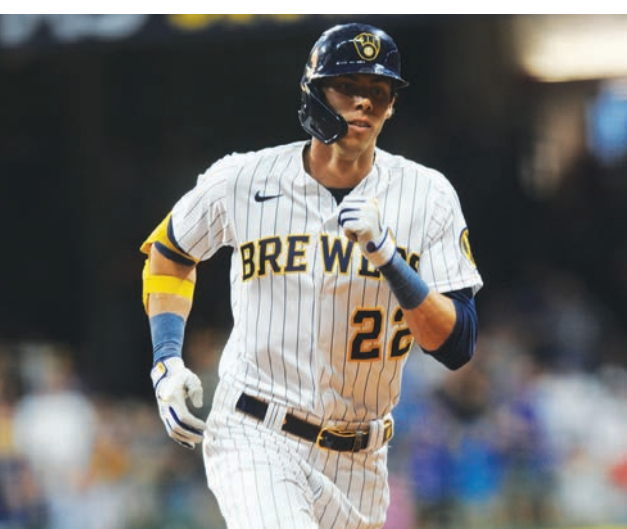
Pastors need to enjoy as they serve. Their bodies and minds need refueling too.

31.0% OF MILWAUKEE GEN Z ADULTS LIVE ON THEIR OWN, ABOVE U.S. AVERAGE

Gen Z is hitting adulthood at a difficult time. Defined as those born between 1997 and 2012, most Gen Zers today are firmly in early adulthood or in their teenage years.

Finding footing at this stage of life is challenging enough on its own.

But Gen Z has had to navigate this formative time with the backdrop of the COVID-19 pandemic, the pandemic's social and economic fallout, and, more recently, rising prices and the threat of a recession.

These factors could create lasting difficulties for members of Gen Z, which in turn could compound a trend in recent decades of young people delaying major life milestones.

Over time, young adults have increasingly prioritized educational attainment, career advancement, and financial security over other significant markers of adulthood like marriage, parenthood, and homeownership.

Gen Z's current social and economic realities could accelerate these trends.

Marriage has been one of the most prominent milestones to be delayed further into adulthood.

Over the last few decades, the typical age at which people marry has increased substantially.

For men, the estimated median age at first marriage in 1960 was 22.8, while women's

median age at first marriage was 20.3.

Today, those figures are 30.4

9th Annual The Epidemic and The Game Shines Light On Difficulties Human Trafficking Survivors Must Overcome

Saturday, Sept. 17 Seminar Informs and De-Stigmatizes Issues to Help Survivors

Hundreds of people ranging from social workers to first responders, lawyers, law enforcement officers and mental health therapists are expected to attend the ninth annual The Epidemic and The Game on Saturday, Sept. 17.

“Many human trafficking survivors face difficulties that are seldom talked about, keeping them from successfully changing their lives,” said Debbie Lassiter, D. Div., CEO and co-founder of Convergence Resource Center (CRC), which is sponsoring the program.

“Whether it be the grief of returning to a way of life they no longer are accustomed to, mental health struggles, financial burdens, or the

process of developing a new identity and healthier being, we’re here to help survivors overcome the Life.”

The three-hour event will include round table discussions along with presentations on the challenges of living after experiencing human trafficking.

The program begins at 9 a.m.at Cardinal Stritch University’s campus in Glendale and also will be live streamed online. Registration for The Epidemic and the Game is free and available on Convergence Resource Center’s website (<https://www.convergenceresource.org/events/the-epidemic-and-the-game-2022>).

Lassiter said the program’s theme, “Human Trafficking and Overcoming The Life After,” will feature survivors and their support team members who will talk about what Overcoming the Life is all about and how to be of assistance and aid to survivors making this change.

“I believe that my primary purpose is to be able to help the next woman in need,” said Sarah Demerath, a human trafficking survivor who is now a CRC facilitator, victims advocate and graduate of The Epidemic and The Game. “I have conquered many challenges and hardships in my life, including a 19-year battle with heroin addiction, homelessness, incarcerations and other traumas. I know how hard it is to ask for help and I want survivors to know we will walk beside them on this journey. They aren’t alone.”

Other CRC staff taking part in the program include Desirae Casarez and Dr. Michele Cohen. Casarez is a survivor and a CRC facilitator.

Cohen is a psychotherapist specializing in the treatment of complex and acute trauma, secondary traumatic stress, adjustment, anxiety and mood-related challenges, self-esteem, chronic and persistent mental health issues, and grief counseling.

housing, and in these places, members of Gen Z are more likely to be living on their own—defined here as those Gen Zers not living with a parent or grandparent.

Eleven states have more than 40% of adult Gen Zers living on their own, led by North Dakota (46%) and Wyoming (45.9%).

In contrast, young people are less likely to live on their own in the Northeast.

This includes Rhode Island and New Jersey, where less than a fifth of Gen Z adults have moved away from home.


At the metro level, most of the top locations where Gen Zers are living on their own are found in affordable parts of the country, but there are some exceptions.

Expensive, but economically prosperous, cities like Austin, Seattle, and Portland also have high shares of Gen Zers living on their own, as they attract young people with jobs in tech and creative fields.

The data used in this analysis is from the U.S. Census Bureau. To determine the locations with the most Gen Z adults already living on their own, researchers at Porch calculated the percentage of adult Gen Zers not living with a parent or grandparent. For the purpose of this analysis, adult Gen Zers are defined as those between 18 and 23 in the year 2020, the most recent data available.

In the event of a tie, the location with the greater total adult Gen Zers living on their own was ranked higher. To improve relevance, only metropolitan areas with at least 100,000 residents were included.

Additionally, metros were grouped into cohorts based on population size: small (100,000–349,999), midsize (350,000–999,999), and large (1,000,000 or more).
