The Survival of the Black Press

One-hundred and fifty-four years ago, a Black minister and the first Black man to graduate from an American college laid the foundation for what was to become the Black Press of America.

John Russwurm's and Samuel Cornish's first edition of Freedom's Journal carried a strong message on its front page that has since become the tenet of the Black Press. Said the Black pioneers:

"We wish to plead our own cause. Too long have others spoken for us. From the press and the pulpit we have suffered much by being incorrectly represented."

Traditionally, each March, members of the National Newspaper Publishers Association / Black Press of America meet to reflect upon the words and goals of Russwurm and Cornish. They also rededicate themselves to the challenges that lie ahead and analyze their individual and collective impact on the communities they serve.

Two items of conflicting divergence highlighted this year's conference. Readership of the Black Press, specifically among white supporters of the Black cause, climbed drastically during the past year. This reality was to be expected by most, as support for equal rights has historically coincided with conservative domination in national politics.

The second item on the agenda was also expected, although its impact was not padded by that fact. Advertising revenues, which had showed a substantial increase during the early years of the Carter Administration are expected to continue their downward trend along with a worsening economy.

These two pronouncements comprise the unending paradox which shadows the Black Press. Since Freedom's Journal, the very survival of the Black Press has oftentimes depended on factors outside of its control.

Yet during its tenure, the Black Press has built a solid foundation of specialized journalism and, despite financial setbacks, has, and will, survive.

A strong, and some say orchestrated, effort was made after the civil rights struggle of the 1960s to discredit the Black Press. White newspapers were quick to say that the resulting integration — what little there actually was — signaled an end to Cornish's and Russwurm's dream. Yet contrary to that assumption, which was nothing more than an apparently financially motivated effort, the Black Press tells a story of Black people to Black people — a story of Black life. The story of the Black experience and its uniqueness must be told in every ramification and only the Black Press can tell it.

Since the mid-1970s, the Black Press has become more urbanized in nature, in part because of its large college student readership. Yet, of late, it appears to be returning to its ethnic "roots" with a renewed thrust, a stronger voice than at any time in history. Moreover, the Black Press is renewing old friendships among labor unions and special interest coalitions as its voice is once again being called upon to serve as the vanguard for social change.

The editorial policies and directions of the Black Press historically have united the fragmented forces. Many, if not most, of the issues presented by the Black Press cross all racial and ethnic lines. The editorials address issues related to the "haves" versus the "have-nots," although presented from a Black perspective.

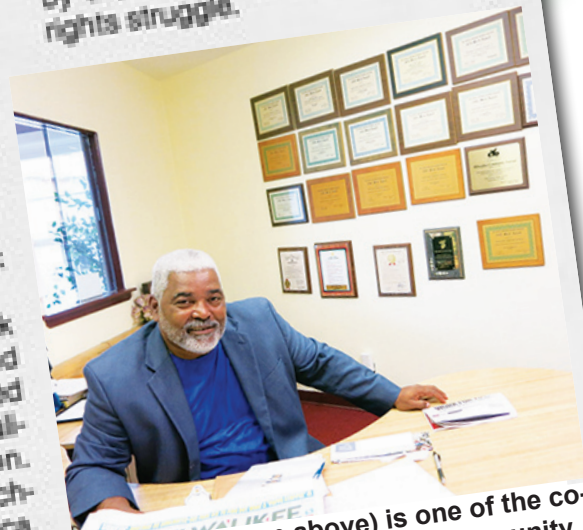
Moreover, members of the Black Press, particularly its editors and staff writers, again are being called upon to provide input into the coalition policymaking and direction. Considered by many as the watchdogs of social change in America, their expertise reflects their specialized occupations. It is often they who make the news as much as report it.

But that factor is not unusual, although it is downplayed. Unlike its major white counterpart, the role of the Black Press has historically exceeded that of information source. It resides just behind the Black educational institutions as a major educational source, and its functions over the years have widened to include social service agency, civil rights organization and even political liaison.

Locally, for example, a series of informational lunches sponsored by the Community Journal also has provided the backbone for the annual Community Pride EXPO, which has expanded its scope from providing an avenue to accentuate the positives of the central city to coordinating an international trade fair with 20 African and Central American nations.

The Milwaukee Courier used its communications networks to spearhead Martin Luther King Day in Milwaukee, and to solicit signatures as part of a national campaign to petition Congress to make his birthday a national holiday. And radio station WAWA now sponsors one of the largest expos in the Midwest.

Despite its impact or the size of its readership, the Black Press continues to be one of the strongest editorial mediums in the United States. If there is one criticism, it rests with the traditional emphasis to editorialize too much in its straight news accounts. Yet, because the overwhelming majority of Black papers in this nation are weeklies, and their major responsibility is to educate more than to inform, this factor is overshadowed by the newspaper's role in the civil rights struggle.

Like the mainstream (White) press, The Black Press of America faces many of the same challenges that threaten its survival. The main challenge: the digital age and smart phones, which makes getting news and information of all kinds instantaneous. Also at question is: exactly what type of news does Black Americans want to read, watch, or listen to, the traditional type of news that's been the bread and butter of print news organizations, or lighter 'infotainment' that stresses lifestyles, gossip, and entertainment. Mikel Holt's article shown at right that he wrote over 30 years ago for the Milwaukee Press Club's publication still has resonance, reminding it's readers in the media—and the Black community—that the Black Press is still a relevant, vital, and essential vehicle of communication, information, and knowledge.

SEEKING NEW TREATMENTS FOR PATIENTS WITH SICKLE CELL DISEASE

For patients suffering from sickle cell disease, pain can be a daily struggle. Life-saving work at the Blood Research Institute is improving patient outlooks and quality of life.

Joshua Field, M.D., of the Blood Research Institute (BRI) has made it his life's mission to better the lives of patients suffering from sickle cell disease (SCD), in which red blood cells are bent, or shaped like a sickle. This impacts the blood's ability to flow throughout the body, causing chronic pain.

It's estimated that 1 in 400 African Americans in the United States is affected by sickle cell disease. In a recent study, "Dyspareunia is associated with chronic pain in premenopausal women with sickle cell disease," a team of investigators, including Dr. Field, surveyed premenopausal women with sickle cell disease to determine whether chronic pain associated with the disease is also associated with an increased prevalence of dyspareunia (or pain during sexual intercourse). The team found that

dyspareunia is common in women with sickle cell disease, and even more common for women with sickle cell disease who also report chronic pain.

But Dr. Field's research goes even further than that. He first became interested in sickle cell disease during his training at Washington University in St. Louis, where he worked with foremost expert Michael DeBaun, M.D. Together, Drs. Field and DeBaun collaborated with University of Virginia investigators, whose expertise in interstitial lung disease (or lung scarring) coincided with Dr. DeBaun's interest in lung complications related to sickle cell disease.

What these investigators found was that fibrocytes, or cells in the blood that are associated with conditions like lung scarring and tumors, were increased in sickle cell disease patients. And in 2017, a study demonstrated that in sickle cell disease patients, the fibrocytes were associated with poor pulmonary function. That suggests that these fibrocytes are a biomarker in sickle cell patients, which means they can be used to identify patients who are likely to develop lung complications related to their disease.

According to Dr. Field, it's estimated that as many as 30% of sickle cell disease patients die as a result of lung complications. So, what next? Field and his team at the Blood Research Institute are contributing to new therapies and treatments surrounding sickle cell disease and pulmonary function. The better these investigators are able to understand which patients are most likely to develop lung complications, the easier it will be to discover new treatments and cures.

Currently, the only cure for sickle cell disease is a bone marrow transplant, which has been an option for very few adults, who are often too sick. Younger patients are generally considered better candidates; however, the procedure is still risky, and acute care (like regular blood transfusions) can prolong the patient's lifespan.

That means pain management is of utmost importance, Dr. Field says, especially for the 50% of adults with sickle cell disease who report having chronic pain. Historically, the go-to pain management tool has been opioids, but many physicians are trying to move away from or limit the use of those drugs. The problem, however, is that opioids work. This is a particular area of interest for Dr. Field, who says that the human brain is rewired, in a manner of speaking, in people with chronic pain. Is there a way to uncross those wires? What cures or therapies might help these patients? This is something the investigators at the Blood Research Institute are researching.

Can a Person with Sickle Cell Disease Live a Normal Life?

Newswise — New Brunswick, N.J., September 1, 2022 — People who have sickle cell disease (SCD), a genetic disorder that affects red blood cells, have reduced life expectancy and may face many challenges in their life. However, there are steps they can take to live the healthiest life possible despite this disease. Archana Sharma, DO, Pediatric Hematologist/Oncologist at Rutgers Cancer Institute of

New Jersey, the state's leading cancer center and only NCI-designated Comprehensive Cancer Center together with RWJBarnabas Health, shares more.

Sickle cell disease is an inherited disorder of the red blood cells. It involves a defect in the hemoglobin protein which is found inside of the red blood cells. Hemoglobin is responsible for bringing oxygen from the lungs to the rest

of the body. Normal red blood cells are shaped like a doughnut. They're round and flexible which allows them to travel freely through the blood vessels. In patients with sickle cell disease, the red blood cells are rigid and shaped like a sickle or banana which prevents free travel through the blood vessels, instead there is a tendency for the red blood cells to clump together and get stuck. This blockage prevents

oxygen from getting to where it needs to go which can lead to episodes of severe pain and tissue and organ damage.

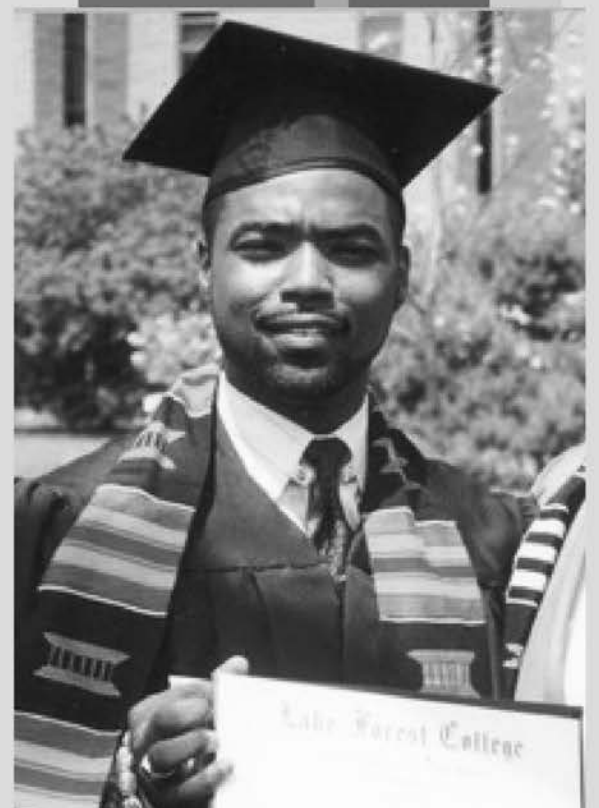
Because sickle cell disease is a chronic lifelong condition, patients and families may face many physical and psychosocial challenges throughout their lives. Depending on the severity of the disease, these challenges could include frequent disruptions in their daily lives. Some patients find

it difficult to maintain a full time job or to attend school on a regular basis. These patients are at a high risk for stroke and other cardiac and pulmonary problems as well as being high risk for infection. There is also the very real challenge that comes with learning to live with the stigma of having sickle cell disease, especially when it comes to pain management. Many people simply don't understand the disease and the extent of the pain that is involved with it.

People with sickle cell disease can live, active full lives. While a person with sickle cell disease won't have total control over how SCD affects their body, steps can be taken to manage pain. People with SCD can lower their chances of difficulties from the disease and enjoy many normal activities by getting regular checkups with their doctor and preventing infections by taking simple steps including frequent handwashing. It is also important to follow treatments prescribed by their doctor. Currently the only cure for sickle cell disease is a bone marrow transplant. However, there are effective therapies that can minimize symptoms and prolong life.

While pain episodes are most common in Sickle Cell Disease, it can also lead to irreversible organ damage and the need for a transplant.
