(continued on page 3) white woman whose family owns the shop. Several nights later, Bryant's irate husband, his half-brother and others barged into the Emmett's granduncle's house, abduct, mutilate and shoot the vulnerable boy dead.

News of the teen's disappearance and subsequent killing reaches Chicago. Mamie's worst fears turn into agony and grief. She's shocked into action, seeking the truth, accountability and a reckoning. Courageously she stands up to southern racism during her son's killers' trial: "Hate is like a virus in the blood of Mississippi."

Meticulously, with the refined brushstrokes of an artist, the wisdom of a shaman and the spirit of a fighter, Chukwu retells Mamie's history-making story. Feelings of sadness, anger and ultimately inspiration emerge in ways that will enlighten and move audiences. Ingeniously, as her illuminating bio/crime/drama confronts treacherous bigotry, the film becomes more and more riveting. Wisely, the violence surrounding Till's horrific death is kept off camera and never exploited.

The family life is endearing, the courtroom drama intense (a la To Kill a Mockingbird) and the smart strategies used to keep this tragedy in the public eye are on view. When Till-Mobley demands an open casket so the world will see what they did to her baby, her savvy becomes awe-inspiring. You feel the misery, but you also see an indomitable spirit put into action.

The footage is eye-catching, and the sounds pierce through the crises. Every color (art directors Carlton Lee Jr, Christopher Tandon),

thread (costume designer Marci Rodgers), set (production designer Curt Beech) and prop (Cassaundra Marie) works to reproduce the times and locations. The proceedings are captured in luminescent cinematography (Bobby Bukowski, The Messenger) and intensified by a pulsating score with evocative acapella voices (Abel Korzeniowski). All scenes and sequences are carefully assembled into an increasingly intense string of images (editor Ron Pantane).

The accomplished cast includes Frankie Faison as grandad, Sean Patrick Thomas as Mamie's future husband Gene Mobley and John Douglas Thompson in the pivotal role as the uncle who must live with haunting regrets. Goldberg, as Grandma Alma Carthan, takes a very understated approach to her characterization, making the matriarch even more believable. Jalyn Hall's interpretation of Emmett is so vibrant and likable it makes the teen's tragic death even more devastating.

Deadwyler's angst-filled and gutsy performance pulls you into Mamie's full range of emotions. Happy protective mother. Fearful parent. Enraged guardian. Fierce advocate. When Emmett's casket is taken off a train, she cries and moans in ways so primal it will touch

At a funeral home, when Mamie views her son's body, touches his mangled corpse and screams in pain it will break your heart. Deadwyler's display of sorrow is so deep and expressive it deserves an Oscar®

Sometimes the love between a mother and son is so strong it doesn't die, even after death. That's what audiences will see

That's what they will take away. A love and strength that endures.



C.J.'s Southern Seasonings:

The Secret Really is in the Bag

When starting a business, specifically as an African American, hearing from others what "you can't do" or what "you won't achieve" is not uncommon, and for Joan Anderson things were no different.

When Anderson and her husband first started C.J.'s Southern Seasonings, they were told several times that the business "wouldn't take off" and their seeming success was to be short lived and "wouldn't last."

But that clearly did not stop them, because now, 10 years later, the Ander-



sons are shipping out thousands of orders for the famous seasoning, and it can be found on the shelves of almost 200 grocery stores across the southeast United States.

C.J.'s Southern Seasonings originally started as a commercial mobile conces-

sion stand in San Antonio where they sold fried fish and seafood.

This is where customers were introduced to and fell in love with the secret seasoning.

It quickly became a crowd favorite, leading the concession stand to be found

at numerous locations across the city.

Despite the mobile concession stand's success, the Andersons relocated first to Tennessee after accepting a job offer and then to Mississippi, with the demand for their seasoning traveling along with them.

"People loved our seasoning," co-founder Joan Anderson said.

"I think it is the one thing that really set us apart from everyone else. Even years after leaving San Antonio, we were still getting calls asking for the concession stand's location or at least where to get some of our seasoning."

That is when the Andersons decided to launch their own website and start shipping out orders of their seasoning and fish fry. They started out packaging orders in their kitchen, but sales grew exponentially, and they had to hire copackers just to keep up. This is how the brand of C.J.'s Southern Seasonings got to where it is today.

"We never thought it would grow into a brand," Anderson said. "I thought it was just a fun hobby for us. Now, we have an entire customer base we like to call 'Secret Sharers.'"

This "hobby" has brought the Anderson's such unanticipated success, but their good ideas haven't run out

yet. They have several items planned for the upcoming year including a chicken seasoning and a line of meal-specific seasonings.

C.J.'s Southern Seasonings has also recently become one of the few commercial kitchens in Mississippi to be a certified manufacturer and processor of desserts. This allows them to offer their sweet potato and pecan pies in multiple retail outlets.

C.J.'s Southern Seasonings has grown into a brand the Andersons never expected, one with sales from every state in the United States, grocery store partners across the south, but as the business continues growing and changing, one thing that remains the same is the Anderson's gratefulness.

"We would not be anywhere without the support of so many friends and family," Anderson said. "I could not have done any of this without my husband of 36 years, our kids, our grandchildren and so many others who have helped us every day of this journey."

EXPANDING SKINCARE INTO TOTAL WELLNESS: MICROBIOLOGIST ERIN WHITE TAKES THERAPEUTICS TO SISTERHOOD

Erin White has entered a phase where life is seeming to come full circle.

Yes, post covid, post surgeries, post career challenges, and during her turn into the forties, White—a 40-year-old Louisiana microbiologist—is living in a stage of life when you realize the path you are on is purposeful.

White excelled in math and science at McKinley Middle Magnet and Baton Rouge Magnet High. She earned a master's degree in molecular biology and undergraduate degrees in microbiology and physics.

For years, she's researched and dissected microscopic skin cells, studied cell cycle regulation, cultivated topogenic bacteria, and probed cancer cells nearly three decades after her mother gave her a microscope.

"I still have that thing." White laughs. "That is where it all began."

The microscope that she received in elementary school became a harbinger for the work and purpose White carries today.

"Though my degrees are accomplishments, I only really ever mention onethe BS in microbiology. Had all gone to plan, I would have had a full BS in physics, not just a BA, and a doctorate in cell cycle regulation. Those two de-



out and weakening mental health. These failures continue to drive me to succeed, push harder, and never accept less than, again."

That desire is pushing White to use her aptitude for research and science to help others through her sootheURskin products at Thomas Therapeutics and her social enterprise Black Women's Wellness.

"I have realized over time that I am a natural leader,

wit. And, lastly, I am a good bit of a nerd," she said. "I love the feeling I get from solving problems. I actually get giddy."

White said she is most inspired by her maternal grandmother Bobbie June Simmons Thomas, the first Black teacher at Baker High School. "There were so many students that looked up to her. And I think that knowing this made her shoulders fall back and her head that much higher. She

knew the trail she was blazing and the footprint she would leave behind. The blood that runs through these veins is most definitely that of dominion," said White.

"I can only hope to make her proud," she said. "My body of work is beginning to show my lineage—not to say that any of my ancestors were widely-known leaders, I mean, neither am I. But they were leaders in their own right."

MICROBIOLOGIST ERIN WHITE TAKES THERAPEUTICS TO SISTERHOOD

(continued from page 4) tinctures— she is solving dermatological, beauty, and esteem problems for thousands who use Thomas Therapeutics.

It began when White returned home from college and noticed her younger sister's eczema hadn't cleared but had worsened. "She never really seemed to grow out of the childhood plagues of infection. She had eczema surrounding her eyes and inside her eyelids. It was inside her elbows, behind her knees, on every surface that experienced friction."

As a researcher, White

hypothesized. "There's got to be a natural way to clear this up. So, we started the search for a natural, steroid-, and antibiotic-free remedy. We scoured the pharmacies and pharmacy departments of our local area. Everything contained a steroid: cortisone or hydrocortisone. Upon seeking assistance in dermatologists' offices, we were loaded with topical steroid and antibiotic cream combinations or even oral medi-

She began researching natural ways to treat and heal dermatitis. The endproduct became the start of Thomas Therapeutics which was "not only moisturizing and hydrating but also anti-itch—allowing the skin to heal itself," she said.

cines of similar content.

"There are several ways to decrease inflammation naturally, to decrease itch naturally and give skin its integrity back and balance its moisture," she said.

She knew nature worked and botanical extract would stop inflammation. To that end, Thomas Therapeutics's line of products are blended to decrease the discomfort of irritated, dry skin. "They decrease inflammation and itch. They allow the skin to heal itself," she said.

With her microscope and research nearby, Whitewho is affectionately called Sensitive Skin Scientistsaid she is at home in the organized chaos of her innovations lab. "(It is) where I belong. I am a problem solver and that is where I solve them."

Even during the COVIDcrisis. White staved true to her focus. "While I am a soap maker, I did not jump to make hand sanitizers and other gimmicky products.

I felt like it was just feeding into the fearmongering and taking advantage of what little was known versus what we did not know about the virus at the time. As a direct result, I had very slow sales during the beginning of the pandemic."

"It gave me time to pause. It gave me time to reflect on where my business was going and whether I wanted

to continue to have a business at all." White said she learned to maintain discipline in all things and that feeling an emotion is a choice. "I am learning to take cues from my surroundings. I listen to my body. I listen to the Creator and creation. This has become an important practice for me simply because these are constants."

Then, White's mission expanded into Black Women's Wellness, a social network for women across the world.

Jozef Syndicate: We evolve, and life circumstances shape us. Was there an event that shifted your journey?

White: The entire COVID-19 experience has shifted my journey and changed my trajectory. Between 2019 and now, we have experienced a global pandemic on a scale never before seen. In the Fall of 2020, I'd become fed up with "Say Her Name" and "I Can't Breathe." I was tired of being locked away with my outlets to the outside world telling me that this was no safe space to be Black or especially, a Black woman. I participated in a virtual panel discussion on hair and skin health with the Urban League of Louisiana Young Professionals of New Orleans and was granted the ability to network online.

But I felt there was something more that had to be done. It was too much to endure alone in my office or alone in my home.

Feelings of rage, exhaustion, anger, and hurt were common to me. And I knew

White: In my personal journey, I have had to deal with feeling "less than." I was never liked as a childtoo dark to be a pretty or even a girl. I was a depressed child. Dark skin and even darker patches where eczema left its scars,

oozing plaques that had yet to heal. I even had eczema at the corners of my mouth, making it painful and unsightly (in my own opinion) to smile. My hair was frizzy and natural until maybe middle school.

I remember the hot combs, curling irons, and rollers that marked holidays, school picture days, and other special occasions. I hated my hair. I hated my skin. I didn't like myself. At every point of self-acceptance, there was a rebuttal from my father, but my mother and grandmother would build me up.

White: Black Women's Wellness began because I realized that my childhood was not an anomaly. We need safe spaces for these discussions. We tiptoe around white fragility, racism, and inferiority complexes.

We need spaces where explanations are neither required nor desired. We need spaces where Black women are beautiful in all of our shades, shapes, and

So, I am creating that space. Black Women's Wellness events evoke meaningful discussion, provide delicious healthy meals, and promote rest among a group that is so often overwhelmed, overextended, and overwrought.

Jozef Syndicate: What would you desire others to remember about you?

White: I would like to be remembered for my lineage and how I have made them proud. I would like to be remembered for the supportive roles I've played in the lives of friends and family.
