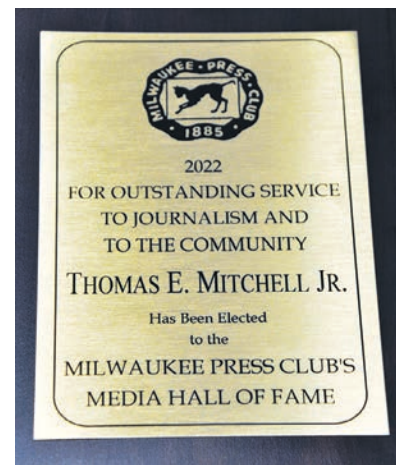

Milwaukee Community Journal Editor Thomas Mitchell, Jr. became the fourth MCJ staff member to be inducted into the Milwaukee Press Club's Media Hall of Fame for 2022.

The event was held recently at Potawatomi Hotel & Casino. Mitchell was one of three African American inductees out of seven total Milwaukee journalists inducted this year.

The other two Black journalists enshrined with Mitchell were Denise Callaway (WTMJ-TV, Milwaukee Public Schools, Greater Milwaukee Foundation, and Milwaukee PBS); and Liddie Collins (Milwaukee Courier, WNOV Radio, Milwaukee PBS).

The other inductees were: Joyce Garbaciak (WITI-TV, WISN 12 News); Jim Stingl (Beloit Daily News, Green Bay Press-Gazette, Milwaukee Journal Sentinel); Martin Hintz (deceased), Milwaukee Sentinel, Irish American Post, Shepherd Express; Meg Jones (deceased), Milwaukee Journal Sentinel.

The other MCJ staff members already in the hall of fame are the newspaper's publisher, Patricia O'Flynn Pattillo (class of 2015); Associate Publisher and former Editor Mikel Holt (class of 2017), and Photographer Harry Kemp (class of 2012 posthumously).

that it was for me. I'm single and I'm not really hungry because I know how to budget, so I didn't think it was for me."

Allen says he thinks many people are hungry because they don't know about FoodShare. He feels people who are older, single and on a fixed income don't know the qualifications and think it's for a family with children or people who care for kids. He believes it's important to reach out to people and ask them if they need help.

Allen's friend told him to visit the Hunger Task Force's Robles FoodShare Resource Center.

There Allen sat with one of the FoodShare Advocates, who answered all of his questions and then walked him through his application and submitted it online. "I was retired and wondered if I was eligible," said Allen. "When I went to the center, I

got help with FoodShare and also received information that helped me get a Senior Farmers Market Voucher and box of food to take home that day."

FoodShare has helped Allen manage his budget better. With food prices on the rise, increases to rent and the cost of medicines, FoodShare has helped him feel comfortable and not worry about his other expenses.

"FoodShare helps me save money. I can also buy better foods," said Allen. "I'm trying to get better with my nutrition, I'm not getting any younger, so I have to be careful with what I buy. FoodShare helps me buy healthy foods."

Allen feels that people should reach out to family and friends and spread the word about FoodShare. "Now that I have FoodShare, I reach out to others in my

ELECTION WATCH 2022 Q&A

with Rev. Greg Lewis of Pastors United and "Souls to the Polls"

Part three of three

MCJ: Reverend, why has 'Souls-to-the-Polls Milwaukee' become 'Souls-to-the-Polls Wisconsin'?

Rev. Lewis: That change is important because we've got to get White voters (throughout the state) to become courageous again because what's needed in Milwaukee is also needed in White communities of Appleton, Green Bay and Waukesha, where people want to vote for what is right, for what is fair. They're afraid to gather because these conservative entities are threatening to them.

They're afraid to organize because people are threatening their lives literally and their family's lives. That's why we're now in Green Bay, in Appleton, Waukesha, Ozaukee County, Beloit, Racine, Kenosha and Milwaukee.

We're in these places because we have to organize all these folks into believing that they can win.

For example, we went to Green Bay and man, it was a mess. Those conservative folks were threatening the progressives, who were afraid to even have us there. So I said: "listen, you know, if you don't want to say anything, I'll come here (Green Bay) and talk about what we ('Souls-to-the-Polls') believe is the right thing to do."

They said: "well, when you deliver all your messages, they're coming from 'Souls-to-the-Polls Milwaukee.'" I told them that we can fix that. Which is why we're now 'Souls-to-the-Polls Wisconsin.' I mean, I can go to Green Bay and I can talk about Wisconsin.

I don't have to talk about Milwaukee. In Green Bay, they didn't have enough days for early voting, and they didn't have Sunday voting. We ('Souls-to-the-Polls') told the progressives to take their concerns about voting to their Common Council and make them adopt a measure to have early voting sites (at least 70 sites).

In Green Bay, the only early voting site was at city hall. Unfortunately, they didn't get more sites, but the council did approve—unanimously—to having more days to vote early and vote on Sunday.

You see, all people need to do is be organized. It was one of the reasons we've decided to become 'Souls-to-the-Polls Wisconsin.'

I believe we have to have White voters who have become discouraged by the state of the vote in Wisconsin and the nation to join Black voters.

We've recently become partners with 'The Lincoln Project' (a conservative think-tank organization that became one of former President Trump's main nemesis during his four years in office). That's a strange relationship.

But we both want the same things: fair government, fair elections, and ending all the lies and destruction that Trump and his 'Trumpers' have done and are doing to American democracy.

'The Lincoln Project' is White and 'Souls-to-the-Polls' is Black. But this is my country too! Right? We (Black Americans) built this country, fought in all its wars. So, I can talk about America because it's my country too.

So we ('Souls-to-the-Polls' and 'The Lincoln Project') have partnered to stop all the foolishness that's going on with the MAGA movement, and get folks in place who will look out for our interests.

MCJ: So, reverend, what can be done in Milwaukee and Wisconsin to make voting easier November 8?

Rev. Lewis: I don't know

what we can do as a fix. They (conservatives) have the courts, the legislature and legislation. They have all those things fixed (to their advantage). We just have to give the people as much information as possible on how, where, and who to vote for. They can't stop you from voting. But we have to make sure that people understand that they have to vote early (if possible).

Also, voters have to send in their absentee ballots in on time, because if they're not dropped off at their polling place by 8 p.m. November eight, their ballot won't be counted.

And, we've got to vote on Sunday, October 30. We call it 'The Midtown Meet-Up.'

Right now, we have the most lively canvassing campaign going on and it's huge. And, you know, canvassing is knocking on doors, talking to people, giving them information, telling them that there's a vote coming.

We're trying to reach over 200,000 folks who have not voted in the last two elections; to get them to come back into the process.

If someone misses two consecutive national elections, their name is taken off the registration roll. We have to urge these people to register again, especially if they've moved; we have to make sure they change their address. If their polling place has changed, then we help them to make sure they find where their new polling place is.

We've also been working to get more young people involved. We're working with local colleges and high schools to make these banners. It's part of a contest we have going to get them involved.

We're going to put all of the banners on buildings and churches around Milwaukee, as many as we can. We did this

in the last election. We did about 125 church banners during the last election.

Plus, we're going to have a music event on October 28. It's called, 'Hip-Hop the Vote.' The music event is for 18 to 25 year olds. We have to start establishing relationships with young people.

Somebody has to carry on after I and other activists leave this earth. We have to get them involved in the process. Their numbers are huge. We haven't been very successful (with attracting younger voters). No body has.

That's because nobody is engaging them, asking what they want. So now we are asking them what they want. And we have to help them understand that this (politics and elections) is not checkers. It's chess.

As for older voters, those 45-years-of-age and up will vote. People 30 to 45-years-of-age are starting to vote because they believe in the importance of a better future for their children and themselves.

I believe if we increase the number of voters in this mid-term election by two percent, things will work out just fine.

The last day to register to vote is October 19. After that, you can't register for 20 days before or 20 days after an election.

Early voting starts October 25. It ends November 5th. There's only one Sunday to vote early, November 30.

Shocking report shows MKE has 5th highest homicide rate in nation!

A shocking new report reveals Milwaukee has the fifth-highest homicide rate in the country.

The Wallet Hub report, released Wednesday morning, comes several months after it was announced that Milwaukee saw the fourth-largest increase in homicides in the U.S.

Thus far this year, there have been 184 murders in Milwaukee, 23 more than last year at this time.

Last year's rate set a record that will be exceeded in 2022.

Local data also shows that 84% of the homicide victims have been African American. The highest murder age group was between 18 and 29. The female rate did not include 12-year-old Olivia Schultz, who was murdered last week on 27th and Rohr. Her mother was also shot but survived.

According to the Wallet Hub report, only Kansas City, Detroit, St. Louis, and New Orleans have higher murder rates than Milwaukee.

Los Angeles (22) and New York (39) have four million and 18 million populations, respectively. Milwaukee's population is 592,650. That population disparity is consistent with the report's conclusion that the smaller the number, the higher the increase in the homicide rate in that city.

There was an almost even split in homicide increases in cities run by Democrats and Republicans. Rising crime nationally has become among the top issues of the fall elections.

J. Richard Broughton, associate dean of faculty research at the University of Detroit Mercy, said there is no simple explanation for the homicide increase: it is a complicated problem.

"Some believe it is a result of pandemic-related stress and anxiety, perhaps stemming from things like unemployment or tension in relationships," he said.

"Others have pointed to a rise in police officer retirement resulting in few officers on the streets. Still, others point to firearm and gun access.

"Although firearms do not account for every homicide they account for a substantial percentage of them, and firearm purchases rose substantially during the pandemic.

Broughton, who analyzed the latest report, cited that gang-related violence and cultural factors "may play a role, particularly those connected to the public view of authority in the country, which only makes this problem more challenging to address.

Distrust and disrespect for institutions can breed contempt for the rule of law and legitimate claims of authority.

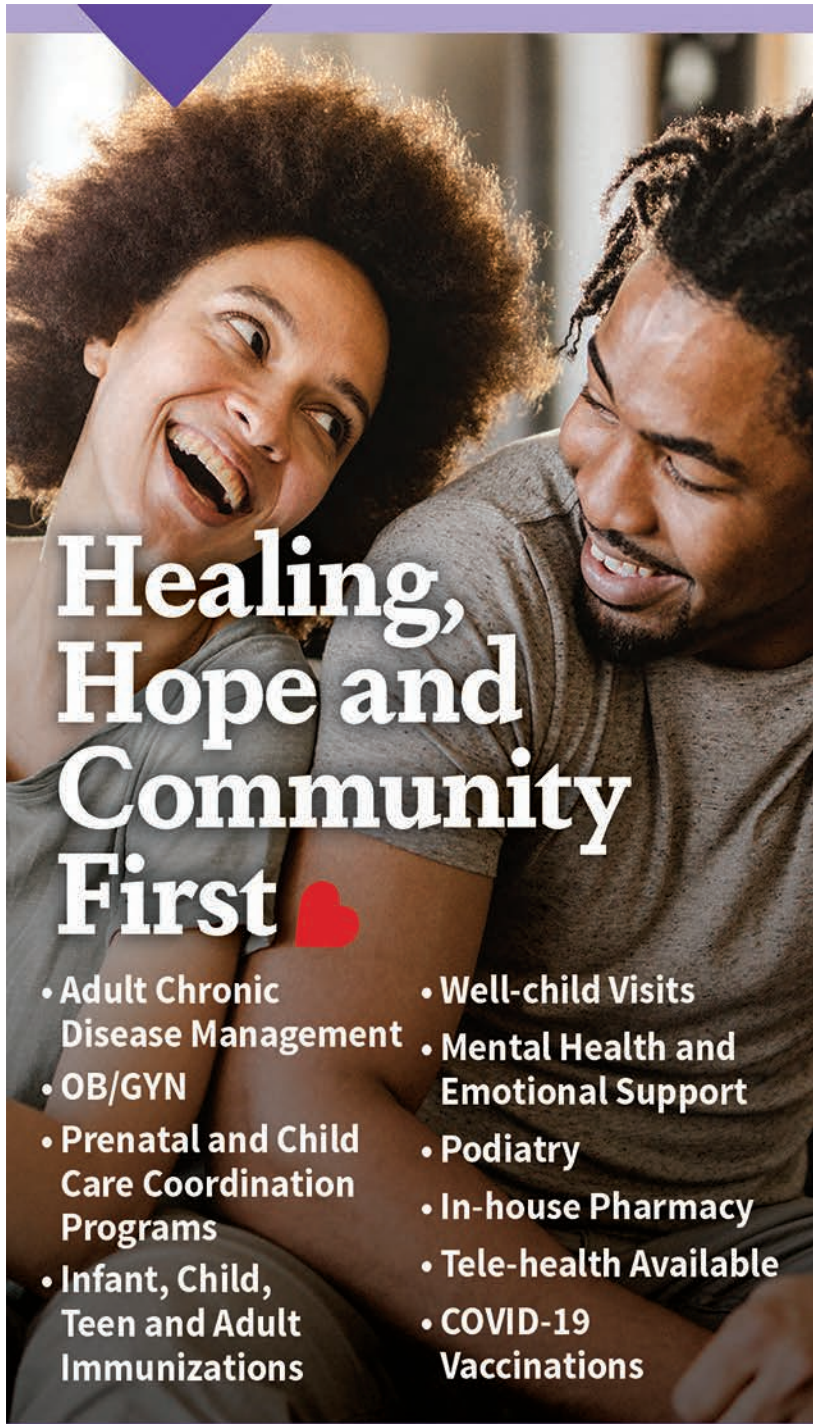
Ex-GOP Voters Blast Ron Johnson After Campaign Hires Lawyer Who Tried to Hand Over Fake Electors on January 6

MADISON— After NBC News reported yesterday that Ron Johnson’s campaign is currently retaining an attorney who tried to overturn the 2020 election results, two former Republican voters and current constituents of Johnson joined Mandela Barnes for Wisconsin in slamming Johnson for his role in the insurrection.

On a press call today, Ashland city councilman Eric Lindell and Peter Sherrill of Kolberg—both former Republican voters who have left the GOP—blasted Ron Johnson for hiring the lawyer who attempted to get “fake electors” to former Vice President Mike Pence on January 6th and called Johnson out for repeatedly downplaying the violence during the attack on the U.S. Capitol that injured 140 law enforcement officers.

“Seeing the way Ron Johnson has conducted himself, especially when it comes to the Jan 6th insurrection, is a perfect example of how extreme, out of touch, and frankly dangerous today’s Wisconsin GOP has become,” said Eric Lindell. “Despite what he might say, Ron Johnson is complicit in the efforts to overturn the will of Wisconsin voters like me—and that’s disqualifying. [...] As a Wisconsinite, as someone who proudly voted Republican, and as an elected official myself, I simply cannot trust Ron Johnson to uphold the U.S. Constitution and defend our democracy.”

“I’m deeply disappointed that Wisconsin Senator Ron Johnson played a key role in trying to overturn not only the will of Wisconsin voters but of the United States. On that day, [Johnson] was complicit in the attempts to deliver a slate of fake electors to Vice President Mike Pence,” said Peter Sherrill. “Mandela Barnes is an honest and integrity-driven man who will defend the constitution and support our nation. He stands up for the voters of Wisconsin, and I believe he will be a marvelous U.S. senator.”
