new state report on education confirms the abysmal news reported last month from a national analysis showing Milwaukee is host to the widest racial academic achievement gap in the country.

Is the state of education in Wisconsin on life support?

National, state education report cards shows badger state faired poorly!

The state Department of Public Instruction (DPI) annual 'report card' revealed while the state overall did better since the height of the pandemic, that was not the case for Milwaukee, where nearly 89% of the students are Black and Hispanic.

In Milwaukee, the DPI report showed only 56.8% of students are on track for graduation. And if the performance of students in specialty and chargter schools are excluded, that figure would probably be closer to half that percentage.

At North Division high school, for example, the DPI report showed zero percentage proficency in reading and math, with 28% on track for graduation.

Overall, the DPI report showed only 26% of students 'met expectations.' The report noted Milwaukee was worse than Detroit in the area of math skills. Only one in 10 students are at grade level in core subjects (reading, writing, and math).

Test results for most poor students in MPS are three years behind the

grade level

According to the report card produced by the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP), only 16% of African American third-eighth grade students "met expectations" in basic subjects, with most of them either from middle-class families, or attending specialty public schools.

Though Wisconsin's superintendent of public instruction, Jill Underly, touted that the state's elementary school students 'bucked national trends in the 'National Report Card' release," scores in the badger state fell by every measure since the last time children took the test in 2019, according to an article by Patrick McIlheran for badgerinstitue.org.

He noted that in the 2019 results-before the pandemic lockdowns-among Wisconsin fourth graders, for example, only 66% of children tested as "above basic."

"above basic."

According to the NAEP, that means 34% of Wisconsin's fourth graders could not "determine the relevant meaning of familiar words using context



A shockingly distressful national report recently confirmed Black Milwaukee students are on the short end of the worst educational achievement gap in the United States. As such, they are destined for life journeys paved with poverty, illiteracy, criminality, or worse.

So, pucker up, hold your breath and close your eyes. Much more is at stake than the fear of smearing your lipstick or bruising your ego.

And make sure to produce a loud smacking sound when you kiss, as other potential 'saviors' might hear you.

before it's too late.

Those who may be insulted by my suggestion to pucker up should understand I offer that insulting remedy because I sadly realize African American parents and leaders will not storm the halls of the school board as Whites, Jews, Asians, or Martians would do if they learned their respective tribes were facing a similar educational tragedy.

And since there is no apparent alternative-no white knight, missionary, Democrat or self-anointed Black leader or civil rights organization-coming to the rescue, we are left to continue praying (without works) and hope for divine intervention.

"To put it bluntly, this is the worst paradigm I've seen covering education in four decades. If our children sink any more profoundly into this 'failure hole,' they will need to learn Chinese."

My desperation comes after analyzing a stack of reports on the status of Black education in Milwaukee, culminating with the most distressing news I had heard in decades since the U.S. Supreme Court ruled African Americans were second-class citizens.

To put it bluntly, this is the worst paradigm I've seen covering education in four decades. If our children sink any more profoundly into this 'failure hole,' they will need to learn Chinese.

Actually, that's appropriate, given the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) revealed only 16% of African American 3-

within the same sentence or paragraph when reading literary text." Now-in 2022-it's 37%.

While 24% of the state's eighth graders before the pandemic were unable to "solve real-world problems involving integers or fractions" or "find the distance between points," now 30% cannot.

MPS was fourth or fifth worst among 25 large urban districts on both reading and math scores among fourth

Wisconsin's statewide gap between Blacks and White students' performance in both reading and math for eighth and fourth graders remained the second largest in the nation behind the District of Columbia.

This gap is probably due to the fact the state does a better job teaching White children. The report card revealed Wisconsin is among the worst states when it comes to teaching Black children.

About 48% of all Black students in Wisconsin's traditional district schools are in MPS. Just over half of the students in MPS are Black. Wisconsin also has the worst ra-

cial gap as it relates to the number of children living in single parent families. According to the badgerinstitute.org article, of the 26 states for which the Annie E. Casey Foundation offers figures for Black families, the highest percentage of children in single parent families is in Wisconsin: 79% in 2019.

By contrast, 23% of White children in the state were living in single parent families, the 21st lowest

Consequently, the gap between Black and White children in Wisconsin, at 56 percentage points, was larger than in any other state.

According to Eloise Anderson, a former Wisconsin Secretary for Families and Children and a Badger Institute visiting fellow, evidence abounds that children living in single parent families face longer odds in

Another contributing factor in Wisconsin's and MPS' abysmal test scores was the the COVID pandemic. Community Journal Associate Publisher and columnist Mikel Holt revealed in this week's 'Signifyin' article on the state education 'report card,' that the pandemic provided the 'perfect storm' for Black underachievement.

He noted statistics focusing on the impact of the pandemic on Milwaukee education "revealed the unnecessarily long virtual paradigm influenced by the teachers' union upon the Milwaukee school board increased the 18 month educational gap for poor Black students to three years.

"In other words, the average Black eighth grade student entering high school was reading at a fifth grade level this year!"

8th graders 'met expectations' (meaning they were at grade level) in basic subjects, and most of them were either middle-class or lucky enough to attend 'select' specialty government schools.

The report noted that Milwaukee leads only Detroit for the worst math skills, and only one in 10 are at grade level in core subjects. ONE IN TEN!

Most poor students' test results indicate they are, on average, three years behind grade level.

I won't confuse you with all the data, but suffice it to say the wall of educational apartheid in Milwaukee has reached the heavens.

Actually, the few who are vocally agitated about the prosperity of our children and the fate of our village should not have been as traumatized as much as we are because the year before the 'pandemic' (as some call it), our local children were near the bottom in educational achievement among America's 19,495 incorporated cities in the U.S.

Now we are dead last!

The COVID-19 pandemic introduced the perfect storm. Statistics reveal the unnecessarily long virtual paradigm influenced by the teachers union upon the Milwaukee school board increased the 18-month educational gap for poor Black students to three

In other words, the average Black eighth-grade student entering high school was reading at a fifth-grade level this year!

In case you don't understand the ramifications of that paradigm, let me spell it out in Ebonics (which is the only language many of our children are destined to know):

Unless there is an unprecedented effort to reverse this tragedy, we are witnessing another generation of lost children and possibly any hopes for communal normalcy this century.

Which is precisely how the poverty pimps and the powers-that-be' locally and nationally want it.

And in case you can't visualize that new perdition, ook around. Crime, terrorism, systemic poverty, and neo-slavery. Apathy borne of ignorance. Frustration abided by an inability to qualify for family-support-

Tears formed from existence in dysfunctional fam-

Undetermined stomach or chest pains are tolerated out of ignorance or lack of access to medical care.

We live in a community with the highest Black male unemployment rate in the country, and it's not because of a lack of jobs, but instead, a lack of qualifications and drug usage, consumed to block out their realities.

Track all of these social ills back to education. Or ack thereof.

It represents an apocalyptic movie. But it is real, and our children are the zombies.

And, making matters worse, the reason my swell-

ing brain is close to explosion is that few people apparently give a damn!

The NAEP report didn't spark a single press conference or 'news' release from any politician with ties to Milwaukee, Black or White, much less a call for

The Milwaukee School Board uttered not a single syllable, including an apology, given that they were foretold of this damning predicament and responded by giving themselves a raise.

In fact, board members initially considered increasing their part-time salaries to \$70,000 a year!!! Only one board member---Aisha Carr-- voted against it and has been relegated to the booth in the corner, in the dark, by herself, for her unwillingness to conform to the disingenuous and racist status quo.

Not an utterance from any local government politicians to what some consider the most significant challenge to Black Milwaukeeans since the racist U.S. Supreme Court decision in Plessy.

Not surprisingly, there was similar silence from state elected officials, even though they are constitutionally bound to provide a quality education to everyone---even if they don't attend 'government

Remarkably, and despite our being in the majority, we don't have a single local organization (NAACP, MICAH, or PETA) willing or interested in confronting the governor—who contributed to this problem as superintendent of DPI—mayor, county executive, or dog catchers about this socioeconomic genocide. Maybe if we framed it as educational abortion, Democrats would respond, but given that it's Black chil-

I have talked with several state politicians, and while several expressed concern, they divulged frustration in the possibility of enacting policies to change the status quo, assuming they could come up with any plan.

All of which fuels my anxiety and fear for our children and village?

A half-century ago, Black parents didn't wait on organizations or politicians to lead the charge.

My mother, for example, was among those parents who chained themselves to bulldozers to stop the construction of a new westside 'government' school

that would be reserved only for White students.

Parents, children, and activists demonstrated under the flag of 'integration' to add seasoning to the desegregation process. They later incorporated to fight the MPS desegregation scam as the 'Coalition for Two Way Busing.'

A proposal to create a separate Black school district, conceived in former MPS Superintendent Howard Fuller's basement, followed the outcry the 'Coalition to Save North Division' made. That latter campaign forced the MPS board to rescind plans to exclude neighborhood (Black) students from attending the new school, long demanded by Black activ-

Ironically, today, North Division's state-of-the-art facility, created to serve 1,500 and constructed with (then) state of the art medical and dental labs, welding and carpentry facilities, and an Olympic size pool, has less than 350 students, with only a dozen or so meeting basic proficiency standards.

Obviously, put some blame for this tragedy on the weak shoulders of far too many Black parents. Today we can't get five of them to show up for a board meeting, or a baker's dozen to question the superintendent or board about why their children are not performing like their White counterparts.

Conversely, I don't think the Black middle class is motivated today to take on the system because they are sending their children to private and suburban

Unlike my generation, which felt an obligation to our tribe, most middle-class Black folks today seem to believe a contribution to the NAACP or food to the Hunger Task Force is their payment for those who gave all to pave the path for them.

Black professionals instead contribute to various college scholarships, ignoring the overwhelming majority of those on the bottom, for whom a college degree would change their lives, but will never get a This is why I am at wit's end, as illuminated by

comments I made recently during an interview with a representative of the National Black Journalist Association a few days ago. He was shocked by the stats I provided and taken

aback when I expressed a pessimistic view that we can reverse this tragedy in my lifetime.

I've spent my entire career throwing rocks, bottles, and food stamps at the educational castle wall. Given the political reaction, I sometimes feel like I've been spitting into a strong wind (more like a hurricane).

My head is ready to explode, and no one offers an aspirin. I am close to giving up hope for most of our children trapped on this side of the wall.

A handful of individuals and groups are taking heed, doing things to save a few. Most represent the old guard who is not blinded by rhetoric or paid by special interests who profit from the status quo.

Fuller is hoping to open more seats at his school and is fighting to increase funding for private schools participating in the choice program, which are receiving half of the state funding as MPS, even though they have better graduation and college acceptance

I'm a member of the Call to Action, which is looking to restructure North Division.

But when the president of the teacher's union and the North Alumni Association says failing students are 'doing well,' or as a North teacher declares, "poor Black children can't learn," you can understand how far we have to go.

I won't get into whether this new plantation paradigm is a byproduct of a conspiracy orchestrated by special interest that benefits from Black dysfunction-

As Black failure increases, billions of dollars flow from Democratic and Republican legislators to fuel the poverty and prison industries instead of addressing the problem.

Possibly the conspiracy is rooted in the knowledge that new technology and robotics have reduced the number of well-paying jobs. Thus the families of the privileged, including the Black middle class, benefit from the exclusion of applicants.

Actually, I hope so, as one suggested alternate theory is that Black children are intellectually inferior, and this is the best they can do.

According to the Bell Curve and other racist theorists, our brains are smaller, and we have no cultural foundation to stand upon.

Or maybe Dr. Ben Carson was correct, and slavery was the best thing to happen to us because it introduced us to Christianity (one of the slave ships was named Jesus) and menial jobs. The bigots and politicians outlawed teaching Negroes to read because it was a useless gesture.

Take it any way you want, but the end result is that we're all on the ocean, some in-cruise ships, others on private yachts, but the majority on sinking rafts.

I'm at the point where I don't care who throws out the life vests. And if they want me to kiss their ring, or butts, as a condition of saving our children, I'm ready to pucker up.




When a medical condition kept Nanette from working full time, she knew her family would need to rely on the support of the local food pantry and soup kitchen and to apply for FoodShare benefits. "We were used to taking care of ourselves and helping other people, not being the ones who needed help," Nanette recalls.

Unsure how to locate resources and navigate the FoodShare benefit system, Nanette called 211 and visited Robles, Hunger Task Force's FoodShare Resource Center on Mitchell Street. "When I first started accepting help, I did not know anything about the system," Nanette recalls. "I was so glad I walked in and someone was there to help because I would not have been able to do it on my own. It was tough."

Nanette continues to use the resources she and her family need to get back on their feet. With rising food prices and heating bills chipping away at families' food budgets, FoodShare has helped Nanette budget for other basic needs for the family. "FoodShare helped us to be able to provide clothing for the kids and school supplies and you know all the things that they needed," Nanette said. "We didn't have to worry about buying food. We could pay our bills."

With the holiday season approaching, family gatherings and a shared meal are at the forefront in most households. Nanette shares, "If I didn't have FoodShare and the occasional help from the pantry, the holidays would be meager. We wouldn't have much. With the economy how it is now, it's a blessing to be able to provide a healthy meal for your family." Nanette is grateful for the work of Hunger Task Force, its pantry network and FoodShare Advocates.

Department of Labor initiative finds violations in 80% of care industry investigations; recovers \$28.6M for nearly 25K workers, mostly women

Assesses \$1.3M in penalties in 1,600 investigations after initiative's 1st year

WASHINGTON - The U.S. ered by investigators related to Department of Labor recently announced that an ongoing nationwide effort by its Wage and Hour Division focused on improving compliance by residential care, nursing facilities, home health services and other care-focused industry employers has made significant progress in protecting workers' rights and protections.

Since its 2021 launch, the initiative has completed more than 1,600 investigations and identified violations in 80 percent of its

These investigations recovered more than \$28.6 million in back wages and damages for nearly 25,000 workers, and led to assessments of nearly \$1.3 million in civil monetary penalties for employers who willfully violated federal law.

Its reviews of residential care facilities, nursing facilities and home health providers found the most common violations discov-

failures to pay overtime or federal minimum wages or the misclassification of employees as independent contractors.

The initiative found violations often hurt women of color – particularly in the Black, African American, Hispanic and Asian, including Filipina, communities – who are often employed as home care aides, certified nursing aides and licensed practical nurses.

"In the U.S., women make up nearly 80 percent of the people employed in healthcare and social assistance, and most are women of color, notably Black women.

"These dedicated professionals work long hours to provide compassionate care to people in need," said Wage and Hour Division Principal Deputy Administrator Jessica Looman.

"Yet too many find themselves working for employers who deprive them of their full wages and benefits they've earned for their workers owed wages database.

hard work. We are determined to make sure these workers' rights are respected and protected."

In addition to recovering back wages for the affected workers. the division's effort includes outreach programs to educate workers and employers about their respective rights and responsibilities under federal law, and how to report and avoid violations of federal law.

As part of the effort, the division hosted a webinar on federal protections for care industry workers on Thursday, Nov. 17.

LA elects US Rep KAREN BASS mayor, first Black woman in post!

U.S. Rep. Karen Bass defeated developer Rick Caruso Wednesday to become the next mayor of Los Angeles, as voters elevated the first Black woman to hold the post as City Hall contends with multiple scandals that have shaken trust in government, an out-of-control homeless crisis and rising crime rates.

With 70% of the vote tallied, Bass had amassed an insurmountable lead of nearly 47,000 votes.

Bass — a Democrat who was on President-elect Joe Biden's short list for vice president — overcame more than \$100 million in spending by the billionaire Caruso's campaign while arguing that she would be a coalition builder who could heal a troubled city of nearly 4 million

The election tested whether voters in the heavily Democratic city were willing to turn away from their liberal tendencies and embrace an approach that would place a strong emphasis on public safety.

Caruso, a former Republican who became a Democrats shortly before entering the race, had represented a turn to the political right. He argued that Bass and other longtime politicians were part of the problem who led LA into multiple crises. He promised to expand the police department to deal with rising crime rates and quickly get ubiquitous homeless encampments off the streets.


Bass, a former state Assembly leader, had the advantage of being a lifelong Democrat in a city where Republicans are almost invisible. She was backed by Biden, Vice President Kamala Harris and the Democratic establishment.

The election had historical dimensions, as she will become the first woman and second Black person to hold the job, after former Mayor Tom Bradley. She takes office next month as City Council faces a racism scandal that led to the resignation of its former president and calls for the resignation of two more members. More than 40,000 people are homeless, and there is widespread anxiety over crime that has ranged from daytime robberies on city sidewalks to smash-and-grab thefts at luxury stores.

The winner replaces beleaguered Democrat Eric Garcetti, who will conclude two bumpy terms with his nomination to become U.S. ambassador to India stalled in the Senate — apparently over sexual misconduct allegations against a former top Garcetti adviser.

The race was shaped in large part by Caruso's lavish spending — and his unavoidable advertising. City records show his campaign expenses have topped \$100 million so far, most of it financed with his own money.

Bass, with just a small fraction of that amount at her disposal, had said "it's not the power of the money, it's the power of the people."

If we find that you do have a genetic variant that may increase your risk, you should confirm your All of Us results with a clinical DNA test. We can offer you that test at no cost. Then, you and your doctor or health care provider can decide if you should make changes to your health care.

If your DNA results show you may have a higher genetic risk for developing a health condition, it does not mean that you will definitely get it in your lifetime. It also does not mean that you have it now. It means that you have a higher chance of getting a certain health condition than the average person. Similarly, if you do not have genetic variants in the genes we will look at, you may still develop a serious health condition in the future.

Sen. Raphael Warnock has earned reelection in Georgia

Just as you can't judge a book by its cover, you can't judge a political candidate by his or her color.

While both U.S. Senate candidates competing in the Dec. 6 runoff election in Georgia — Democratic Sen. Raphael Warnock and Republican and former football player Herschel Walker — are Black, they have little else in common.

Warnock received 49.4 percent of the vote in the Nov. 8 midterm election, while Walker received 48.5 percent. A Libertarian candidate received 2.1%. Georgia law requires a runoff election between the top two finishers if no candidate reaches the 50% threshold.

Since joining the Senate in January 2021 after winning a special runoff election for an unexpired term, Warnock has built an impressive record and deserves election to a full sixyear term.

Warnock has worked to strengthen our economy and create jobs, advance voting rights and defend our democracy, defend women's reproductive rights, expand educational opportunities, make health care more affordable and accessible, reduce crime and promote criminal justice reform, invest in improving infrastructure, combat dangerous climate change, protect LGBTQ+ rights and support immigration reform.

On top of this, Warnock has an inspiring life story and a solid-gold résumé. He is one of 12 children, grew up in public housing, graduated from HBCU Morehouse College and earned two master's degrees and a Ph.D. at Union Theological Seminary.

For more than 16 years, Warnock has served as senior pastor at Ebe-

nezer Baptist Church in Atlanta, where the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr. preached. The senator earlier served as a

pastor in churches in New York City and Baltimore.
In addition to his work

in the ministry, Warnock has a long record of public service, fighting for racial justice and working to improve the lives of the people of Georgia. Walker has no such record.

Walker has lied about his academic record and business record. He has been accused of violent behavior and threatening his ex-wife's life. He has been accused by two former girlfriends of pressuring them to get abortions and paying for the procedures — despite his stated opposition as a candidate to abortion rights. He denies many of the allegations against him.

Alarmingly, Walker has repeatedly shown that he lacks even a basic understanding of how government operates and the issues that come before a senator.

Former President Donald Trump remains a strong supporter of Walker. In announcing Tuesday night that he is running for the 2024 Republican presidential nomination, the defeated and twice-impeached former president urged Georgians to "get out and vote for Herschel Walker."

Trump and other Republicans back Walker because they consider him to be a reliable supporter to carry out Trump policies and had hoped he would help them capture majority control of the Senate.

However, Democrats retained their Senate majority in the midterm elections, capturing 50 seats in the 100-member chamber, with Vice President Kamala Harris able to cast tie-breaking votes. That margin is too close for comfort. They need Warnock to join their ranks.

If Warnock is reelected, he will play an important role in helping Democrats pass bills to improve the lives of Georgians and all Americans. Walker would have far less ability to help pass legislation as a member of the Republican minority.

At this point, it's unrealistic to think many voters who supported

Warnock in the first round of voting will vote for Walker in the runoff, or that many Walker voters will cast ballots for Warnock. So voter turnout will be the key to victory on Dec. 6.

Trump recruited Walker and helped him get the Republican Senate nomination because Walker embraced Trump's false claim that he was reelected president in 2020 and because Trump cynically believed Walker would attract the support of Black voters who would otherwise back Warnock.

But Black voters can look beyond skin color and fame on the gridiron. According to exit polling, Warnock captured 90 percent of the Black vote, along with 58 percent of the Latino vote and 59 percent of the Asian American vote in his Senate race. Walker won 70 percent of the white vote.

About 33 percent of eligible voters in Georgia are Black — the third highest percentage in the nation, following 46 percent in the District of Columbia and 35 percent in Mississippi. Warnock needs as many Black votes as possible because we have to expect Walker will again capture the majority of white votes.

There's no doubt that if there is heavy white voter turnout and low Black voter turnout in the runoff, Walker will become the next senator from Georgia. Black voters must not sit out the election and let that happen.

Warnock will provide outstanding representation in Washington for all Georgians 365 days a year for the next six years if he is reelected. He needs voters to mail in their votes or turn out on one day at polling places to give him that opportunity.

I understand that millions of Americans are tired of political campaigns, endless ads, and voting again and again. With the holiday season coming up, most of us are eager to take a break and focus on faith, family, friends, food and football. Voting is not exactly a holiday tradition.

But Georgia voters can't afford to sit out the runoff election. Too much is at stake. I ask all Georgians to cast ballots for Warnock one more time not just because he is my fellow Democrat, not just because he is my fellow Black American, but because he is the most qualified person to represent Georgia and serve America in the Senate.
