HBCU ATHLETES CREATE PIZZA EMPIRE TO HELP UNDERSERVED COMMUNITIES

As featured on the New York Times, Good Morning America, USA Today and Forbes, the famed Black-owned gourmet pizza chain, Slim + Husky's have now expanded to deliver nationally to take America by storm with their hip-hop-inspired pizzas.

The three best friends share the mission to empower communities while

using pizza as their vehicle to engage, offering quality food, employment opportunities, and community events as the company expands across the nation.

Slim & Husky's was ranked #5 out of 101 in The Daily Meal's 101 Best Pizzas in America.

The three Tennessee State University grads and football players (Clint Gray – CMO, Derrick Moore-Chief Development Officer & EJ Reed – CEO) started Slim + Husky's to serve unique pies and provide jobs to their neighborhood in North Nashville.

Now, they have expanded locations across the country and offer build-your-own pizzas, take-out options, catering services, and national delivery.

This includes opening the first Black-owned restaurant to open on Broadway in Nashville.

Their motto, "Pizza. Art. Music" sums up their founding beliefs to create change and opportunities within underserved communities, while embracing the music culture.

The owners consider their biggest accomplishments opening the flagship Slim & Husky's restaurant in their North Nashville neighborhood, the ability to provide a substantial number of jobs, and the ability to live out their dream while providing a real impact on their community

When they aren't perfecting their product, Clint, Derrick & EJ are hosting community events and participating in speaking engagements at local schools, nonprofits, small businesses, and organizations. From hosting events to support local artists to honoring area teachers, they strive to recognize and promote positivity wherever they go.

City establishes Bronzeville development incentive zone

The Common Council on Tuesday, November 22 adopted file #220772 – an ordinance to establish a development incentive zone known as the Bronzeville Cultural and Entertainment District on land located generally on the north and south sides of W. North Ave., at and west of N. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Dr. and east of Interstate 43, in the 6th Aldermanic District. The file was sponsored by area Alderwoman Milele A. Coggs.

The ordinance establishes a development incentive zone for the Bronzeville Cultural and


Entertainment District and approves the boundary of the overlay, performance standards for new development in the overlay, as well as permitted and prohibited uses to ensure development within the overlay is consistent with the goals for the Bronzeville Cultural and Entertainment District. Desired land use goals include: developments that support the vision of boosting Bronzeville as an arts, cultural, and entertainment destination; expanded mix of uses such as retail, restaurants, and entertainment spaces; and multi-family mixed-use development to support businesses.

"Bronzeville has received much attention and notoriety within the last year, and the creation of this development incentive zone ensures we can continue this positive momentum as we make Bronzeville one of the best cultural and entertainment destinations around," said Alderwoman Coggs. "I want to thank the staff who have spent time on this project, as well as all of the residents and area stakeholders who have provided their input along the way."

CDC Awards More Than \$3 Billion to Improve U.S. Public Health Workforce and Infrastructure

Funds will build up public health in all communities to promote and protect health

The CDC recently awarded \$3.2 billion to help state, local, and territorial jurisdictions across the United States strengthen their public health workforce and infrastructure.

This first-of-its-kind funding provides awards directly to state, local, and territorial health departments to provide the people, services, and systems needed to promote and protect health in U.S. communities.

Everyone in the United States lives in a jurisdiction that will receive funding under this new

grant.

"State, local, and territorial health departments are the heart of the U.S. public health system, and the COVID-19 pandemic severely stressed these agencies, which were already weakened by neglect and underinvestment," said CDC Director Rochelle Walensky, M.D., M.P.H.

"This grant gives these agencies critical funding and flexibility to build and reinforce the nation's public health workforce and infrastructure, and protect the populations they serve.

We are meeting them where they are and trusting them to know what works best for their communities."

The \$3.2 billion includes \$3 billion from the American Rescue Plan Act for jurisdictions to recruit, retain, and train their workforce, including critical frontline public health workers such as epidemiologists, contact tracers, laboratory scientists, community health workers, and data analysts.

The funding also includes \$140 million from a new appropriation for jurisdictions to strengthen and revitalize their public health infrastructure.

Lastly, national partners will be awarded \$65 million to provide training, evaluation, and other technical assistance to jurisdictions as they work to strengthen the services they provide and rebuild their workforce to help protect every American community.

In crafting this grant, CDC's core focus was on listening to jurisdictions and partners to ensure the funding was tailored to meet their actual

This grant helps to address urgent and ongoing public health needs in communities that are economically or socially marginalized, rural communities, and communities with people from racial and ethnic minority groups.

The grant is also a critical new tool for CDC to provide direct support to public health agencies and deliver future resources for modernizing data systems and meeting the fundamental public health needs of American communities.

Stronger infrastructure allows public health to ensure food and water is safe, detect and track diseases, stop outbreaks, provide child and maternal healthcare, and monitor data. As we look to the future, continued investments will strengthen our national public health workforce and infrastructure, supporting a public health system that is prepared to respond to any future health threat.

APPLICATIONS NOW BEING ACCEPTED FOR EARLY CHILDHOOD WORKFORCE STIPEND PROGRAM

Recently the Early Childhood Workforce Stipend Program, developed by the Milwaukee Early Childhood Education Coalition and facilitated by the Wisconsin Early Childhood Association, officially launched.

The effort will provide eligible early childhood educators in Milwaukee with up to \$1,500 over three installments, and is funded with American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) dollars from the City of Milwaukee.

Alderwoman Marina Dimitrijevic, who led the effort for early childhood education funding to be included in the City's ARPA process, can't wait to see the impact this program will make. "As a mother I cannot think of a better investment of our ARPA funds to rebuild post-pandemic.

This money will help mostly women caregivers succeed, stabilize childcare in the city, and most importantly ensure that our children can thrive," she said.

"I want to thank my colleagues for supporting this new initiative and investment, and believing we can do better in this space."

To be eligible for the stipend program applicants must meet all eligibility requirements. Those eligible will receive a \$1,500 stipend in three installments: the first installment, in the amount of \$500, upon application and being found eligible; the second installment, in the amount of \$500, four months later if eligibility continues; and the third installment, in the amount of \$500, four months later if eligibility continues.

Daria Hall, Milwaukee Succeeds Early Childhood Education Director and co-lead of the Milwaukee Early Childhood Education Coalition, believes the stipend

program will make a profound impact locally.

"Milwaukee's early educators prepare our city's youngest learners for success in K12 education and beyond, and ensure that the parents of young children can participate in the workforce.


But due to a broken business model early education programs can't afford to pay these educators, almost all of whom are women and most of whom are Black or Brown, nearly what they deserve," she said. "This wage stipend is a step toward righting that wrong and ensuring we have a stable, well-compensated early education workforce.

On behalf of the MKE ECE Coalition, we thank Alderwoman Dimitrijevic for championing this vital investment, and we honor the early educators whose stories and expertise made this investment possible."

Milwaukee's favorite holiday musical with soul is back and better than ever. Black Arts MKE's production of Black Nativity by Langston Hughes, directed by Dimonte Henning, will take place at Marcus Center's Wilson Theater at Vogel Hall from December 8-11, 2022.

This year's production features:

All-new choreography by Christopher DeAngelo Gilbert and adding professional dancers Dos Feurtado and Ella Lakey to the cast

New musical arrangements by Antoine Reynolds Sr. that combine gospel with sounds from the entire African diaspora, including rock and roll, hip hop,

Spoken word pieces performed by popular poet Cedric Dale Hoard at the start of each act highlighting the journey of Joseph and Mary and the Black experience in Milwaukee

Set in Milwaukee rather than Bethlehem, this joyous and hopeful re-telling of Hughes' original 1961 play incorporates poetry, music, and dance from the African diaspora with an all-black, Milwaukee area-based cast.

"The message is love. Love for ourselves, our neighbor, and our culture. If you come this year, you'll see that on full display through the joyful and healing power of Milwaukee's Black art community," said Dimonte Henning. "I'm not going to lie, you may cry some cathartic tears, but you'll also be dancing and singing in the aisles."

The 2022 version of Black Nativity by Langston Hughes is sure to be an exhilarating and uplifting experience for everyone that attends. That is due, in part, to the environment created by Black Arts MKE. Black actors and creators participating in their productions attest to the welcoming, family-like atmosphere that allows for authentic artistic expres-

"Through my first time performing in Black Nativity, a different part of myself came out," said Terynn Erby-Walker, actress and Golda Meir High School student, "I never really let my 'Black self' out completely before. Black Arts MKE helped me feel comfortable in myself. They're like family. I can be unapologetically Black! It's a very empowering experience."


