STATEMENT BY DR. CALVIN MACKIE, FOUNDER AND PRESIDENT OF STEM GLOBAL ACTION: STEM PROFESSIONALS SAVED NFL PLAYER DAMAR HAMLIN. IS IT TIME THE NFL COMMIT MORE TO STEM EDUCATION?

NEW ORLEANS – "It was a stunning scene. A week ago, Damar Hamlin lay motionless on the football field.

His Buffalo Bills teammates and players from the rival Cincinnati Bengals, some of the most powerful and conditioned athletes in the world, kneeled, helpless to assist their fallen brother.

"They waited for STEM to save him.

"Yes, it was those with Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) skills and

talents that came to the rescue. The physically impressive athletes were bystanders.

"It was the trainers and physicians who saved Hamlin on the field, now at the hospital it is the heart specialists, nurses and physician assistants who remarkably have him on a recovery course. He even Facetimed with his teammates.

"Millions of people watched Hamlin, the Bills and the Bengals play football on television. Another 65,515 people each paid hundreds of dollars to be at

Paycor Stadium in Cincinnati, watching the game live. YouTube just paid \$2 billion for the right to broadcast NFL out of market games, while the league collects billions more from the major TV networks and product sponsors.

"The point is that the NFL generates billions in revenue, but do the league office and owners appreciate the role that

STEM not only played in saving Hamlin's life, but in treating, preparing and protecting players on every team so they can suit up each week and entertain millions?

"Perhaps it's time that the NFL paid more attention to STEM. Right now, STEM has a problem.

"STEM professionals are overwhelmingly White and male. Studies demonstrate that educational and societal barriers contribute to the disproportionate number of Blacks, Hispanics and women studying STEM and working in STEM careers.

"The NFL can help overcome these obstacles, creating more pathways for women and students of color to have careers in STEM.

"Two weeks ago, an extraordinary event transpired inside the Caesars Superdome in New Orleans. Just before kickoff of the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl, more than 2,000 parents and K-12 students attended our STEM NOLA STEM FEST, where parents and children learned about STEM, and participated in hands-on STEM activities.

"This was a landmark moment - STEM education connected directly with a popular college football bowl game. Just days before Christmas, parents and children left their homes to engage in STEM activities - op-

erating robots, building operable automobiles and drones, observing the dissection of a sheep heart, riding a hovercraft, and much more.

"This was a huge, tradeshow-like environment that featured more than 60 stations where kids and parents engaged in STEM activities. STEM NOLA is an affiliate of STEM Global Action, which organizes STEM FESTS in communities around the country. Since October, we have hosted STEM FESTS in Alexandria, VA, Mobile, AL, Bridgeport, CT, and other locations. We introduce parents and children to the value of STEM, often bringing STEM activities into under-resourced communities. Valuable opportunities are created for children to have STEM role models. Children, parents, and communities deserve to have these opportunities so we can position girls and students of color in future STEM-based workplaces.

"Imagine the possibilities that can come from STEM FEST events at NFL games or during NFL team sponsored events in their cities? There is no better way to honor what STEM professionals did for Hamlin and his family. The NFL can join with others in the public, private and nonprofit sectors committing to advancing STEM education. STEM FEST events are a proven method of providing girls and children of color opportunities to learn more about STEM and place them in a pipeline to quality jobs in STEM careers."

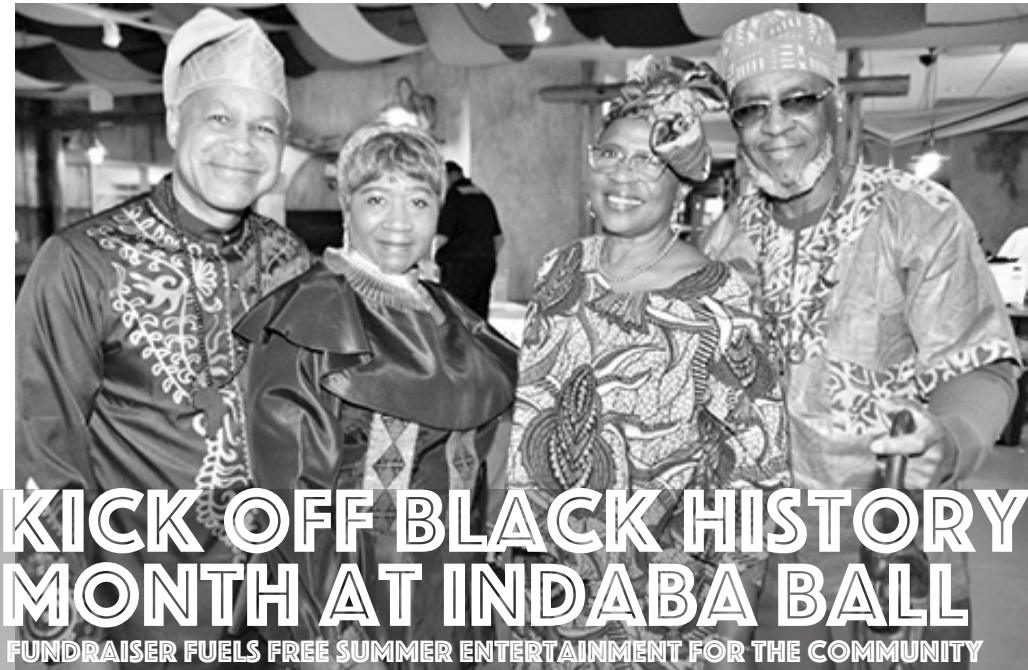

KICK OFF BLACK HISTORY MONTH AT INDABA BALL

FUNDRAISER FUELS FREE SUMMER ENTERTAINMENT FOR THE COMMUNITY

Registrations are moving briskly for the fourth annual Indaba African Ball, on Saturday, Feb. 4, at St. Ann Center's Bucyrus Campus, 2450 W. North Ave.

Gloria Miller, special events director for St. Ann Center for Intergenerational Care, noted that registrations are ahead of pace for previous years.

She urged those interested to register soon to avoid disappointment, as space is limited for the event.

"The Indaba African Ball has rapidly become Milwaukee's favorite way to kick off Black History Month," Miller said, adding that people know the ball fuels free weekly entertainment in the neighborhood at the Indaba Band Shell, on the Bucyrus Campus grounds, all summer long.

"Money raised at the ball provides stipends for local artists performing. Our 2023 summer lineup will be announced at this year's ball."

The event begins at 5:30 p.m., when guests, most attending in African-inspired attire, gather in the two-story

atrium for an evening of live music, dancing, African and Caribbean-style hors d'oeuvres by Events by Day, plus a unique fashion show starring the attendees.

This year, the powerhouse combo of Christopher's Project featuring Joe Jordan will perform, as will the Milwaukee Youth Symphony Orchestra's Steel Pan Ensemble. Selected local history makers will be honored.

Also featured will be sales of hand-made jewelry by Sr. Edna Lonergan, St. Ann Center president; a 360-degree photo booth by Blueprint of Fun; and a marketplace vendor selling African clothing and decorative items. Miller said organizers are planning several surprises this year, as well.

MINORITY LEADER HAKEEM JEFFRIES SETS HOUSE ON FIRE WITH EMPOWERING ALPHABET-BASED SPEECH

Hakeem Jeffries (D-NY) set the House on fire recently with a mic-dropping speech that took the alphabet to another level.

Shortly after Kevin McCarthy finally gained enough votes for House Speaker after the 15th try, the Democratic Minority Leader wanted to peacefully but passionately transfer power before taking his seat.

Taking his time at the dais, Jeffries praised former House speaker, Nancy Pelosi, who made history as the first female speaker in U.S. history, from 2007 to 2011 and again in 2019, calling her "a no-nonsense negotiator."

With a 15-minute speech, Jeffries wanted to detail the differences between the battling political parties.

"I want to make clear that we extend and intend to try to find common ground whenever and wherever possible on behalf of the American people," The Insider reported.

"Not as Democrats, not as Republicans, not as Independents, but as Americans".

Then, cleverly from A to Z, the Brooklyn native told House colleagues exactly how Democrats would do that. He took viewers back to school with references

like "American values over autocracy, benevolence over bigotry", and "the Constitution over the cult."

Then he got a little messy, taking the GOP to task with "maturity over Mar-a-Lago" – a slight at Donald Trump – "quality of life issues over QAnon," and most importantly, "reason over racism."

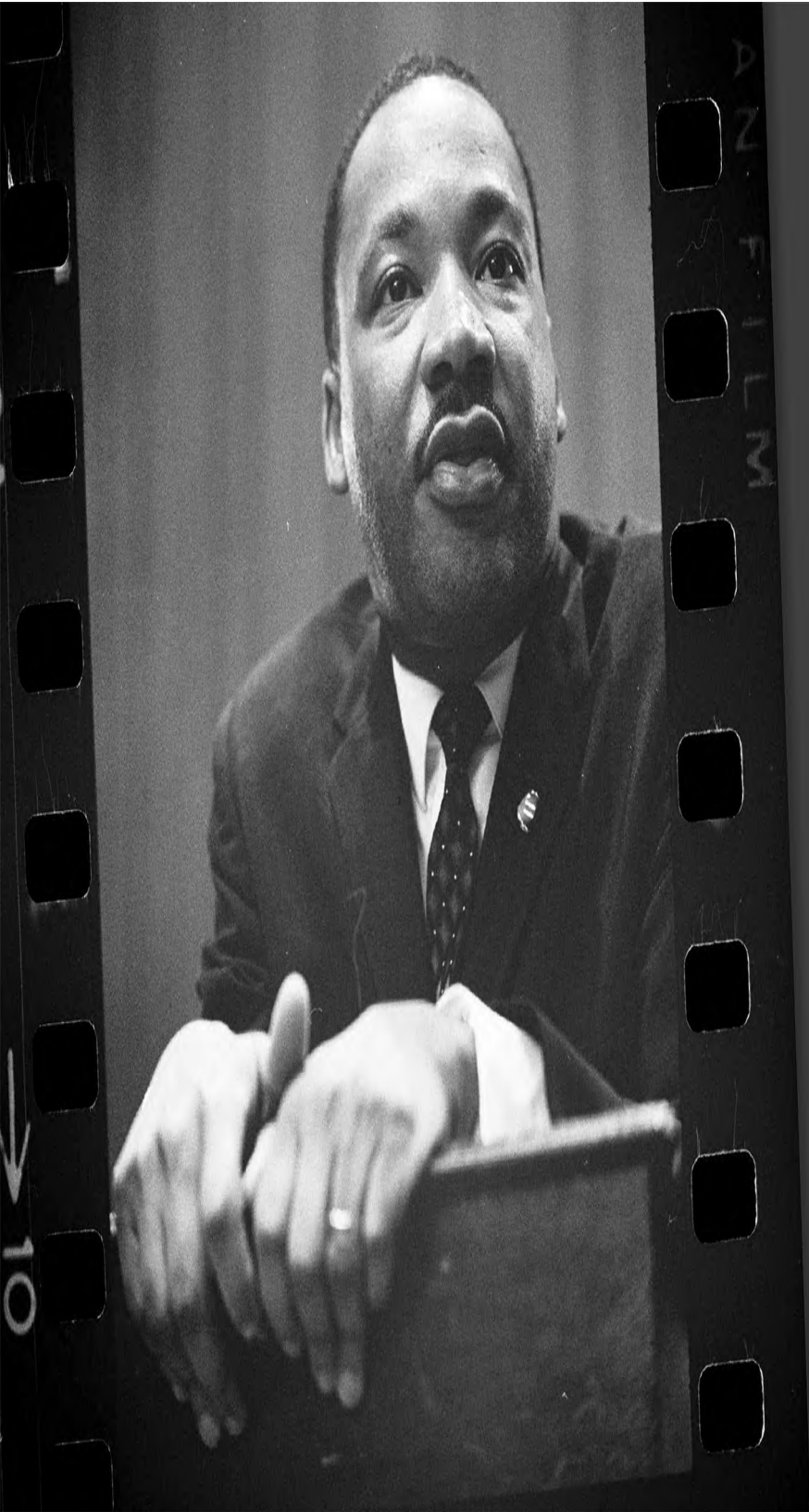
Having everyone questioning their vocabulary capabilities, the New York 8th District representative closed with "zealous representation over zero-sum confrontation," before making a vow on behalf of fellow Democrats to "always do the right thing by the American people," as reported by CNN.

His speech was met with thunderous applause across the floor.

Jeffries definitely set the tone for McCarthy, who was slated to make his speech after. However, the newly-elected House Speaker's speech was the exact opposite.

The California representative thanked former president Donald J. Trump before addressing Jeffries saying, "There will be times we will agree and many times we will differ."

"I promise that our debates will be passionate, but never personal," he added.

BLACK DOCTOR DEBUNKS COVID-19 MYTHS ON TIKTOK TO REACH BLACK AMERICANS

A growing number of Black doctors are using social media to reach vaccine-wary members of their communities.

Dr. Kristamarie Collman, a family medicine physician

in Orlando, is one of them.

A TikTok sensation, Dr. Collman has reached more than 500,000 people with trendy videos, in which she pokes holes in common misconceptions about the

COVID-19 vaccine.

"I felt as though it was my responsibility as a physician to make sure that I was spreading correct information, especially on social media," Dr. Collman said in

a recent interview. "I want people to know that as a Black woman, as a Black physician, that I hear them, and I understand their hesitancy. I understand their concerns."

Black Americans are more likely than whites to report poor interactions with their physicians.

These personal experiences — rather than wrongs of the past — tend to heighten their distrust of the health care system and lead to skepticism about COVID vaccines.

One in 275 Black Americans have died of COVID. Compared to other racial and ethnic groups in the U.S., Black Americans have been contracting COVID, becoming severely ill, and dying at a higher rate.

"We can't control a lot of things, but we can control our decision to get the vaccine," Dr. Collman said.

Her commitment to trusted, science-based information on COVID vaccines has landed her in

Bustle, NBC, Popsugar, NPR, and Women's Health Magazine.

Dr. Collman also has a blog called "The Glow Up" and wrote a book titled, "Glow Up Your Life: The Rx for Looking and Feeling Good from the Inside Out."

Health care heroes like Dr. Collman and others are helping to bridge the gap for Black communities nationwide.

Washington Park Bridge Replacement Project Moves Forward

Deteriorating Bridges Spanning Washington Park Lagoon will be replaced in late 2023

Recently, a second public information meeting was held at the Washington Park Senior Center to review progress and the preferred design for the Washington Park bridge replacement project.

A 2016 Milwaukee County Parks report recommended replacement, and construction is planned for late summer/early fall 2023.

District 15 County Supervisor Peter Burgelis made the following statement:

"This project is just one example of how Milwaukee County prioritizes its County Parks and improves the County's qual-

ity of life" said Supervisor Burgelis. "Multiple stakeholders including neighbors, visitors, bikers, neighborhood groups, Washington Park Senior Center, Urban Ecology Center, Wednesday Concert Series, and the reestablished Friends of Washington Park will all benefit from this investment.

Funding from Milwaukee County's 2023 capital budget for project WP069501 Washington Park Bridge replacement is \$1,254,698.

These new stamped concrete bridges will have a 100-year lifespan and will be an updated focal

point and landmark for many generations of park users to come."

Milwaukee County Parks Executive Director Guy Smith stated:

"We at Parks are very excited about the progress of the Washington Park Bridge Project.

When completed this will not only strengthen the community but also improve the aesthetics of the park," said Guy Smith.

"Additionally, it will increase the safety and connectivity of the community by providing a long-term solution."

According to a Power Point presentation by the

Parks department, the existing bridges, which were constructed in 1938, have suffered "significant" deterioration of the stone and concrete.

The current bridges fail to meet code and ADA standards due to railing heights and slope grades.

Public comment is now open on the parks capital project website at mke-countyparks.org/washington-park-bridges and will remain open until January 23rd.

Construction funding was approved as part of the 2023 Milwaukee County capital budget.
