Milwaukee state lawmaker responds to Urban Milwaukee article alleging "Double Dipping!"

MADISON— Rep. LaKeshia Myers (D-Milwaukee), in response to a recent Urban Milwaukee article questioning her employment as a legislator and educator, released the following statement:

"I am disappointed, but not surprised, at the shoddy reporting of Bruce Murphy.

"Rather than facts, Murphy trades in speculation, innuendo, and politically motivated attacks. It's unfortunate to see the pseudo media weaponized in this way.

"Murphy characterizes the fact that I work two jobs as "double dipping" and deceptive. Millions of Americans, and hundreds of legislators, who are currently working two or more jobs in order to make ends meet, would likely disagree.

"I am employed in two public sector positions, as an educator and legislator. A cursory review of my "Statement of Economic Interests" clearly provides that information.

He is also an MCW Cancer Center Research Scholar Endowed Chair and the inaugural Associate Director of Community Outreach & Engagement for MCW's Cancer Center.

In addition to being the Founding Director of his Men's Health Inequities Research Lab since 2014, Dr. Rogers is also an Associate Member of the University of Michigan-Mixed Methods Program.

His career has permitted him to study, partner with, and/or be a vociferous advocate for various underserved and socially vulnerable groups including community-dwelling older adult, African American, homeless, Somali, adolescent and young adult, Hispanic, rural, Indigenous, and sexual minority populations.

Dr. Rogers is committed to dismantling systems of oppression to ensure equitable health for all. His transdisciplinary training in applied mathematics & statistics, health education, public health administration & policy, community-based participatory research, and cancer-related health disparities, provide a unique perspective for translating research findings into prevention methods among government agencies, policy makers, private health care organizations, and communities.

As a behavioral scientist and master certified health education specialist, Dr. Charles R. Rogers currently serves as an Associate Professor of Epidemiology & Social Sciences in the Institute for Health & Equity at the Medical College of Wisconsin (MCW).

Dr. Rogers' capabilities and potential have been recognized locally and nationally by the receipt of several competitive scholarships, grant awards, and fellowships aimed at strengthening his knowledge and skills for a life-long career in health equity research.

For instance, since 2018, Dr. Rogers has been awarded over \$3.3M from the National Cancer Institute, the Research Foundation of the American Society of Colon and Rectal Surgeons, Exact Sciences, the Medical College of Wisconsin, Five For The Fight, and the V Foundation for Cancer Research for his community-engaged, mixed-methods research aiming to

eradicate inequalities in both colorectal cancer (CRC) screening completion among African American men and early-onset CRC among individuals younger than the previously recommended CRC screening age of 50.

For more than 20 years, Dr. Rogers has shared his knowledge as a leader of the cancer health disparities workforce across North America, Jamaica, East Africa, Japan, and via numerous outlets including newspapers, minority health fairs, national conferences, peer-reviewed publications, community dialogue sessions, National Public Radio interviews, and TV appearances, among several other efforts.

Since African American men have died from CRC at the highest rates of any racial/ethnic group in the U.S. for more than 25 years, Dr. Rogers founded the Colorectal Cancer Equity Foundation in March 2021 focused on removing obstacles to CRC equity among African American men and other underrepresented populations by increasing awareness of CRC—a preventable, beatable, and treatable disease no one has to die from.

Complementary to his President role with the Foundation, Dr. Rogers' research agenda has contributed to translational solutions that address the complex underpinnings of inequities in men's health, with a primary

focus on CRC awareness and prevention among African American men for more than 10 years.

In addition to being a thought leader in the CRC space, his research foci also include cancer health disparities, behavioral & community-based implementation science, mixed methods,

and survey methodology.

Additionally, he is the Founder and CEO of Rogers Solutions Group: a premium consulting firm committed to providing clients with community-oriented, data-driven, and equity-centric solutions.

Since Dr. Rogers is passionate about paying it forward, he has

also received a number of honors acknowledging his servant leadership (e.g., 100 Most Influential Black Alumni at NC State University, 40 Under 40 Leader in Minority Health for 2021 by the National Minority Quality Forum).



Priorities USA Supports Wisconsin Alliance for Retired Americans' Legal Intervention in Defense of Mobile Voting Truck

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Priorities USA recently announced its support for the Wisconsin Alliance for Retired Americans' intervention in Brown v. Wisconsin Elections Commission to protect the use of a mobile voting vehicle

in Racine, Wisconsin.

In the initial lawsuit, filed by the Wisconsin Institute for Law & Liberty, the Plaintiff argues that state law prohibits the City of Racine from utilizing a mobile voting vehicle to offer early voting—

which is called in-person absentee voting in Wisconsin— at various locations throughout the City.

The City made this option available to voters during the primary and general elections in 2022, and thousands of voters took advantage of it.

If granted intervention the Wisconsin Alliance will argue that Wisconsin law allows mobile voting, and that the governing law was amended specifically to allow cities to offer multiple in-person absentee voting locations.

Hundreds of thousands of Wisconsin voters depend on in-person absentee voting to participate in the state's elections.

If the court rules in favor of the Plaintiff, the number of in-person absentee voting locations in Racine and throughout Wisconsin could drop significantly, limiting access to the vote.

EXCLUSIVE: Pressley and Booker reintroduce baby bonds bill, attempt to close racial wealth gap

U.S. Rep. Ayanna Pressley (D-MA) and Senator Cory Booker (D-N.J.) are reintroducing legislation that would establish federal baby bonds in an effort to close the racial wealth gap, the Grio exclusively reports.

Pressley and Booker on Wednesday will introduce the American Opportunity Accounts Act, which would create a federally funded savings account for every American child. The two Democrats say they hope the bill will make “economic opportunity a birthright.”

“The racial wealth gap in America is the result of generations of precise and intentional policy violence, so we must be as intentional and as precise about advancing policies that address it head-on,” Pressley said in a statement.

“Baby Bonds are one of the most effective tools we have for closing the racial wealth gap and breaking

the cycles of poverty and trauma that have prevented Black and brown folks from thriving in this country,” her statement continued.

Booker first introduced the American Opportunity Accounts Act in 2019 during the 116th Congress. He reintroduced it with Pressley in 2021 in the 117th Congress. In both sessions, legislators never voted on the bill and only referred it to House committees.

If congressional leaders pass the bill this time and President Joe Biden signs it into law, the federal legislation would authorize the secretary of the Department of Treasury to transfer \$1,000 into an account for every individual born after Dec. 31, 2023.

Depending on a family’s income, the American Opportunity accounts would receive up to an additional \$2,000 a year and accrue interest until the individual is 18 years old. Accounts for minors in a family of four that earns less than \$25,000 a year could accrue as much as \$46,215, according to the congressional offices.

At age 18, account holders can use the funds for eligible “wealth-building activities.” A “qualified expense”

includes purchasing a home, funding higher education or investing in “financial assets or personal capital that provides long-term gains,” according to the bill.

The offices of Pressley and Booker explain other expenses that qualify include investing in a small business and saving for retirement.

“Americans today are having a harder time accessing homeownership, higher education, and a secure retirement than their parents did just a generation before them,” Booker said in a statement provided to the Grio.

“This is due in part to our upside-down tax code, which is great at preserving and building wealth for corporations and wealthy families, but fails Americans who are barely getting by and are unable to afford long-term investments to get ahead,” the statement continued. “Baby Bonds” would fix our broken tax code by providing every American child with startup capital for their life.”

According to a 2020 report from the Brookings Institution, the racial wealth gap widened over decades and the COVID-19 pandemic only

exacerbated the inequity. The public policy research firm cited data that, as of 2019, the median white household held nearly eight times the wealth of a Black household.

Andre Perry, a senior fellow at Brookings Institution, affirmed that policies like Pressley and Booker’s federal baby bonds bill could help address America’s racial wealth gap.

“Wealth divides in this country necessitate the need for a revised social safety net as well as different ways to build wealth in this country,” Perry said in a written statement. “Providing baby bonds based on income will help those who are not born into wealth to purchase a home, go to college or start a business without going into debilitating debt.”

While federal baby bonds would benefit all Americans, it would especially improve the economic conditions for Black and brown children. According to data published by Kaiser Family Foundation, Black and Latino households hold poverty rates of 21.7% and 17.6%, respectively, which is disproportionately higher than white households at 9.5%.

State and local legislators have introduced baby bonds in their jurisdictions, and the District of Columbia implemented the investment program last year. Lawmakers in Connecticut passed a bill to create a baby bond fund, but, reportedly, the governor’s office is stalling it. Other states that have proposed or flirted with the idea of a version of baby bonds include Washington, California, New Jersey, Massachusetts and Wisconsin.

In response to the growing movement, Pressley said, “It is no surprise that this idea has gained traction in states across the country.” She added: “Black lives and Black wealth matter, which is why Congress must pass our bill without delay.”

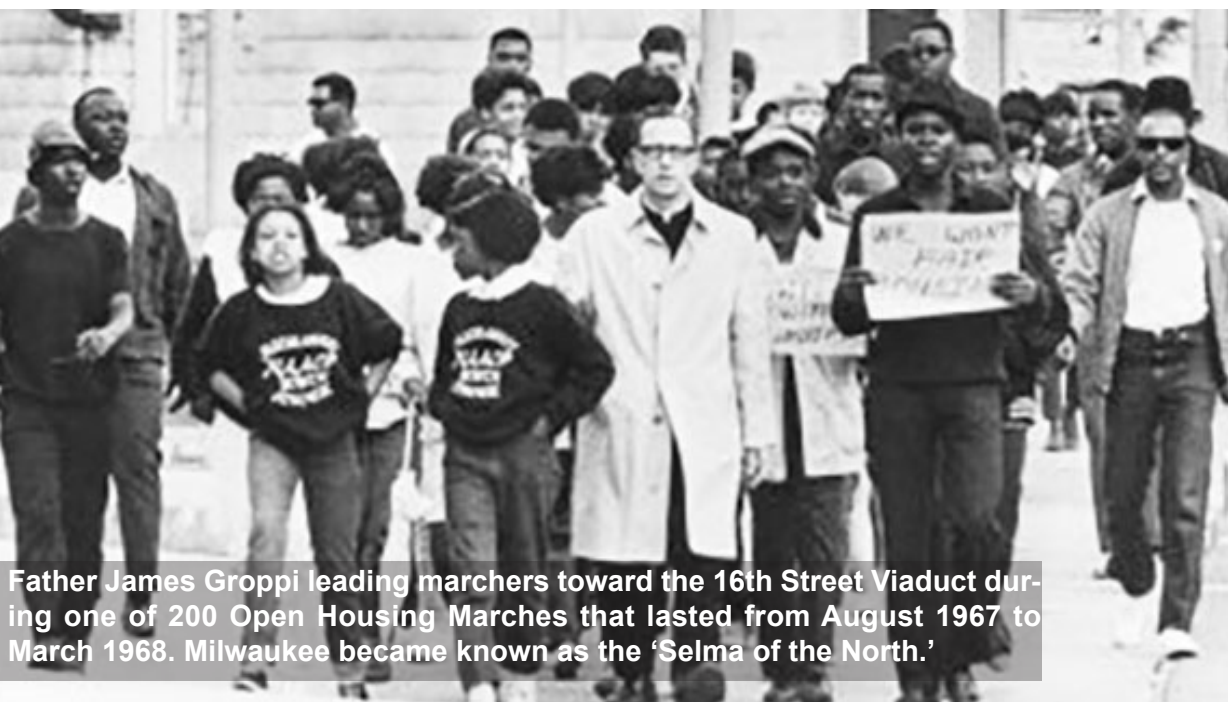

'Tosa resolution 'eliminating' racial housing covenants weak symbolism, does little to eliminate pain of MKE's racist past or present!

I took last week's Wauwatosa Common Council's resolution on 'eliminating' racial housing covenants with a grain of salt. Or, maybe cayenne pepper is a more appropriate spice.

That's not solely because the gesture is symbolic--at best--but more so in announcing the resolution, Wauwatosa Mayor Dennis McBride used a pejorative term that is itself seeped in a racist innuendo.

Following the suburban council's unanimous resolution to advise the state legislature to 'proscribe' a previously outlawed 'redlining scheme,' McBride lamented, 'this is a vestige of a very bad and 'dark' time in this city's (history).'

'Dark' time? As in the 'darker the berry, the sweeter the juice?' Or 'dark' as in being synonymous with evil, an anti-Black code.

Was Mayor Mickey B pouring gasoline on a racist prejudice that has been smoldering since they took our ancestors out of the 'dark hold' of the slave ships and into the 'light' of apartheid?

Then again, am I being overly sensitive?

Given my well-oiled sardonic and paranoid persona, am I being prickly, sticky, or ticky?

After all, I am among that ever-dwindling contingency of Black victims of oppression who still believes 'nigger' (n-word) and bitch (b-word) are negative epithets.

Obviously, I haven't kept up with the changing norms. So, excuse me if I can't form my lips to spit out those denigrating terms of endearment.

Yep, I admit to being 'old-fashioned.'

I also continue to read my holy books right side up, put my people before partisan politics, and have yet to buy into the new norm that posits you can exorcise the cancer of racism by wishing it away or electing a Democrat who questions your 'hue-manity.'

Even with my reading glasses, I still can't focus on the missionary belief that taking down a statue of a Confederate State's hero will eliminate racism and dismantle systemic bias. Or you can use a political enema to flush out America's evil past by tying it to 'Critical Race Theory,' which is the new catch-all phrase for racists and bigoted wannabes.

Yeah, add some 'cayenne' or Jamaican 'Slap Yo Mama' hot sauce to the council's fruit salad resolution, because their resolution is akin to the Milwaukee Common Council passing a resolution to approve the

late Vel Phillip's 1967 Open Housing ordinance after the fact.

Speaking of Vel, it was her repeatedly rejected Milwaukee Open Housing ordinance that provided my entry into the civil rights battleground.

In fact, it was while marching across the 16th Street (now James Groppi bridge) viaduct that I lost my (civil rights) virginity.

Indeed, images of that defining page of my life journey came to mind as I read about the Wauwatosa feel-good resolution.

The racist housing covenants maintained by most suburban communities paled in comparison to the legal barriers maintained by the Milwaukee Common Council.

Sandwiched between the fight to 'desegregate' the Milwaukee Public Schools and police and fire departments, the Open Housing Marches—200 days between August 1967 to March 1968—put our city on the same map as Selma, Montgomery, and Chicago.

And even though my parents, relatives, and neighbors earned their purple heart medals fighting to remove other bricks from the apartheid wall, the Open Housing Marches opened my eyes to the insidious and un-Christian nature of the cancer laden beasts.

I've since earned a busload of purple hearts from hundreds of battles, witnessing up close and personal the drool-coated rants of racist roaches too young to spell hatred that is permanently etched on my soul.

Not by coincidence, we never won that local battle, settling instead to avail ourselves of a national victory with the Civil Rights legislation of President Lyndon B. Johnson in 1968. John F. Kennedy gets the credit, but it was actually the foul-mouthed Johnson—noted for holding interviews while sitting on the toilet and frequently using the n-word (nigger). The marches ended not because the council members had a change of heart or finally read the New Testament's advocacy of loving your fellow man (and woman).

Since this is Negro History Month (what Black History Month was once called), allow me a minute or two to reveal a tainted chapter of

history (or His-story) they don't teach in public/government schools.

While many of today's youth find it hard to believe, Negroes were not allowed to live north of Keefe Avenue or south of Vliet until I was called upon to defend other people's freedom 10,000 miles away.

My first foray into the 'people's army' occurred by accident (or fate).

My grandmother lived across the Street from St. Boniface's Catholic Church on 11th and Clarke. From her porch, I observed hundreds of brothers and sisters entering the church on a weekday afternoon, sparking curiosity and hunger (Kohl's foods donated fruit to the marchers).

Only minutes later, I learned the church was the replacement headquarters for the Open Housing marches, organized by the NAACP Youth Council and its Commandoes, in support of Phillip's ordinance.

The church was used because months earlier, the local branch of the KKK supposedly bombed our Freedom House HQ (although some believe the firebombing was orchestrated by police).

The marchers would typically travel from that northside location to the southside, despite orders from the mayor to discontinue the protests. The marches were side-tracked on several occasions because police would break up the demonstrators. Several times, they pelted us with tear gas and clubs to facilitate Democrat Mayor Henry Maier's order for the field slaves to stay on the plantation.

Unlike today's confused and disorganized community, Negroes and Coloreds of that era eagerly walked into the dragon's mouth of our own initiative. While Father Groppi gets the credit, he was just a figurehead and prop for the cameras, as it was assumed having an ordained White cleric getting bet down would propel our quest to the

national court of public opinion.

Even though it's been a lifetime, I still vividly recall the day I received my first purple heart.

We had just crossed the Mason-Dixon line (the viaduct) when we were confronted by an army of racist roaches, many of whom were bigots in training of my age or younger.

Until then, our greatest fear was being caught by the bigots in blue who threatened to arrest (if we were lucky) any of us who ventured

to improving the city's infrastructure and level of efficiency in order to build a flourishing environment for future generations.

Clark was elected to the Milwaukee County Republican executive board in 2012, and he immediately utilized his position to advocate and push for the \$250 million needed for the new Bucks Arena (Fiserv Forum) that was granted in 2015 by former Wisconsin Gov. Scott Walker.

From the Wisconsin Prison System to a former U.S. Congressional candidate, Travis Clark is Black History!

Black History Month recognizes Travis Clark for his contributions and advancements he has made for Milwaukee and its future generations.

Although born in Georgia, Clark is a Milwaukee native at heart. Moving to the city when he was just four-years-old, Travis spent his childhood growing up in Milwaukee's low-income areas.

He attended Milwaukee Public Schools and spent his adolescent years on the city's southside. Abandoned by his father, he lacked guidance and support in difficult conditions.

Subjected to the hardships of his environment, Clark fell prey to the streets, where he had a series of altercations with law enforcement during his adolescent years.

While serving a five-year prison sentence, a fellow inmate studying law discovered a constitutional violation of Clark's fifth amendment right to double jeopardy.

Through a writ of habeas corpus, the Wisconsin Appellate Court ordered Travis to be resentenced and released in 2002.

A resilient man with a good heart, Clark had zero interest in letting his

future reflect his past.

In the early years after his release, Clark joined a labor union at Briggs and Stratton where he worked full-time, dedicated to providing financial stability for his children and their mother. Focused and determined to achieve the high potential he always possessed, Travis established his own entertainment marketing agency in 2007.

Thriving, he collaborated with numerous celebrities and athletes, progressing, and advancing their careers. In the years that followed, Travis worked with the elites of the music industry; high profile black artists such as Lil Wayne, Young Jeezy, Kanye West, T.I., and Ludacris, to name a few.

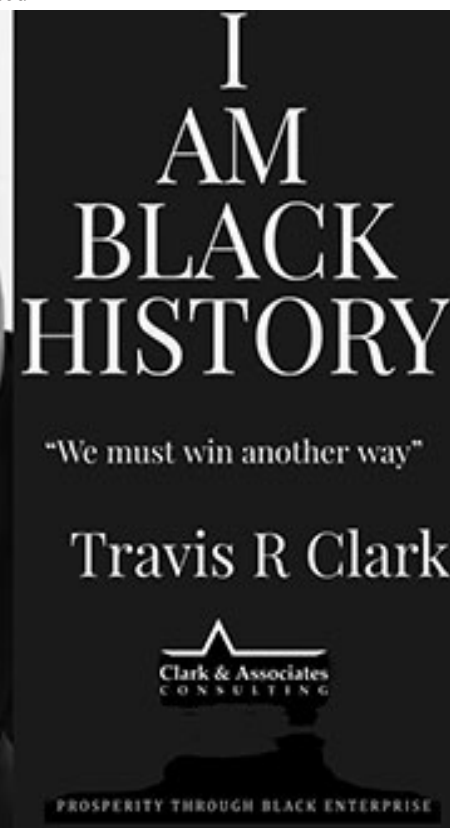
He collaborated with the likes of Keyshia Cole, and Rick Ross to orchestrate their Milwaukee performances. In 2008, Clark joined the Republican Party to learn more about the party a majority of African Americans once belonged to, but have largely abandoned.

Years of disagreements and unfulfilled promises have left our nation deeply divided, a phenomenon detrimental to our societal prosperity, one that Clark is committed to reforming.

Proudly representing the Republican Party, Clark is a man of all people and feeling betrayed by the

broken policies of Milwaukee political and government officials, Clark aims to be a representation of everything he felt he was denied access to while growing up.

He wants to see Milwaukee, his people, and his community flourish through new and revised policies. Aspiring to be a mentor for the youth who shared similar difficulties in their childhood, Travis is committed

**Notice of Spring Primary and Special Aldermanic Primary
and Sample Ballot
February 21, 2023**

OFFICE OF THE MILWAUKEE COUNTY ELECTION COMMISSION

TO THE VOTERS OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKEE:

Notice is hereby given of a spring primary and special aldermanic primary election to be held in the City of Milwaukee on February 21, 2023, at which the officers named below shall be nominated. The names of the candidates for each office, whose nominations have been certified to or filed in this office, are given under the title of the office, each in its proper column, in the sample ballot below.

Information to Voters

Upon entering the polling place and before being permitted to vote, a voter shall:

- state their name and address
- show an acceptable form of photo identification*
- sign the poll book**

***If a voter does not have acceptable photo identification, the voter may obtain a free photo ID for voting from the Division of Motor Vehicles.**

****If the voter is unable to sign the poll book due to disability, a poll worker may write the word “exempt.”**

If a voter is not registered to vote, they may register to vote at the polling place serving their residence if the voter provides proof of residence.

Where ballots are distributed to voters, the initials of two inspectors must appear on the ballot.

Upon being permitted to vote, the voter shall enter a voting booth or go to a machine and cast their ballot. The vote should not be cast in any manner other than specified here. Sample ballots or other materials to assist the voter in marking their ballot may be taken into the booth and copied. The sample ballot shall not be shown to anyone so as to reveal how the ballot is marked.

A voter who is a parent or guardian may be accompanied by the voter's minor child or minor ward.

An election official may inform the voter of the proper manner for casting a vote but the official may not advise or indicate a particular voting choice.

Assistance for Voting

A voter may select an individual to assist in casting their vote if the voter declares to the presiding official that they are unable to read, have difficulty reading, writing, or understanding English, or that due to disability are unable to cast their ballot. The selected individual rendering assistance may not be the voter's employer or an agent of that employer or an officer or agent of a labor organization which represents the voter.

Where Optical Scan Voting is Used

The voter shall fill in the oval next to the name of the candidate of their choice for each office for which he or she intends to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall write in the name of the person of their choice in the space provided for a write-in vote and fill in the oval next to the write-in line.

When using an *electronic ballot marking device* (“ExpressVote”) to mark an **optical scan ballot**, the voter shall touch the screen or use the tactile pad to select the name

of the candidate of his or her choice for each office for which he or she intends to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall type in the name of the person of his or her choice in the space provided for a write-in vote.

After Voting the Ballot

After an official **optical scan ballot** is marked, it may be inserted in the security sleeve, so the marks do not show. The voter shall insert the ballot in the voting device and discard the sleeve or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit. The voter shall leave the polling place promptly.

Spoiling Ballots

If a voter spoils an **optical scan** ballot, they shall return it to an election official who shall issue another ballot in its place, but not more than three ballots shall be issued to any one voter. If the ballot has not been initialed by two inspectors or is defective in any other way, the voter shall return it to the election official, who shall issue a proper ballot in its place.

off the sidewalk.

Before leaving the church, we were advised not to stray, as the penalty would be akin to being caught by slave catchers who would treat us like they would a run-away with a white woman in Georgia before--or after--the un-Civil war.

Fortunately, the Commandoes were successful in keeping us on track.

Though it was a half-century ago, I still vividly recall the look of hatred on the faces of the Southsiders, including children who hurled racist epithets and cowardly profanities along with bottles and stones, one of which left a permanent scar on my head.

But that wound did not cut as deep as the permanent scars inflicted by their hatred of me just because God has graced me with melanin and a place in heaven---which my late mother once explained will not be a crowded destination.

Interestingly, the events of that day, along with the visible and invisible scars, were recorded 30 years later by WTMJ reporter

Sherie Preston, who wrote her master's thesis in the blood of the victims.

Sherie interviewed me and a Southsider who was among the adolescent roaches who blocked our path.

I have a copy of her thesis in my safe, next to my guns---just in case.

It is prized not only because it is an essential page of history, but it also reveals the mindset of juveniles who today be clothed in a police uniform or a priest's robes.

Asked if he continued to harbor prejudices and would block our paths today, his response shocked Sheree: yes, he is still a racist, and if need be, would do whatever necessary to keep the 'darkies' contained in our north-side jungle.

That makes sense if, for no other reason than a half-century after Johnson's landmark civil rights legislation, Milwaukee is still among the most segregated cities in North America.

We have yet to make progress.

Today, it is not unusual to see a Black face leaving a suburban home without cleaning supplies.

According to the 2020 U.S. census, we are no longer America's most segregated city. We are now second to last.

Wow! Another century or two, and who knows...

This takes me to my second thought after reading the 'His-story' resolution by the Wauwatosa (un)Common Council.

Instead of a symbolic resolution, Wauwatosa and Milwaukee would benefit if they put up a marker at 60th and North Avenue declaring: 'racist roaches' no longer wanted.'

And holding up the sign, Mayor McBride could place giant cans of Raid, sitting on a platform of cayenne pepper.

Hotep.

has allowed him to witness the unjust implementation of the criminal justice system, a perspective most politicians do not have.

"You cannot understand justice reform if you don't understand injustice," Clark said during a phone interview. His experience working on behalf of Briggs and Stratton's labor union has instilled an appreciation and understanding of the value of simply having a 'job.'

Clark's experience in the entertainment industry and labor relations showcased his ability to effectively communicate and work with a wide variety of individuals, something that will hold him in good standing working with city government leaders. Clark is currently working with with Milwaukee's political leaders who target entertainment businesses centered on the hip-hop culture.

Clark's immanent concerns in his 2022 Congressional Campaign in-

cluded justice reform, immigration, abortion, and free speech, in addition to advancing overall opportunities and prosperity for Americans.

The ideas and dreams Clark has for Milwaukee are ever advancing as he intends to continue his involvement in politics.

Clark lost the August primary election in 2022, receiving 30% of the Republican primary votes.

However, losing did not deter Clark. On November 5, 2022, Clark, and Torrence Hatch (aka, Lil' Boosie, who voted for the first time in the Atlanta Georgia 2020 election), held a 'Get Out and Vote,' rally. Clark said the rally wasn't held to support a particular candidate, but to simply get individuals to vote and get involved in the political process.

The Wisconsin Alliance has 1,700 members in Racine and tens of thousands of members across the state whose voting rights are directly threatened by this case.

The potential loss of many in-person absentee voting locations will also exacerbate the damage done by the Wisconsin Supreme Court's decision last year prohibiting the use of ballot drop boxes in the state.

"This lawsuit is nothing more than a blatant attempt to make it even more difficult for older voters in Wisconsin to cast a ballot," said Marlene Ott, President of the Wisconsin Alliance for Retired Americans. "Older voters are among the groups most likely to use in-person absentee voting and should be able to do so in their communities. The members of the Wisconsin Alliance will fight any attempts to create unnecessary burdens that restrict our ability to exercise our Constitutional right to vote."

"Wisconsin voters deserve to have free and fair access to the ballot which is achieved through innovative initiatives like mobile voting vehicles," said Aneesa McMillan, Deputy Executive Director of Priorities USA.
