Patricia
O'Flynn PattilloMCJ publisher honored by
city for Black History Month!

The city of Milwaukee posted this salute to Black history maker and Milwaukee Community Journal Publisher Patricia O'Flynn Pattillo. She is one of 28 Black trailblazers being honored by the city during its '28 Days of Black History.'

Pattillo is the founder, CEO, and publisher of the Milwaukee Community Journal, the largest African-American newspaper in Wisconsin since 1976. In 1987 she became the first female president of the National Newspaper Publishers Association-Black Press of America.

After losing her 29-year-old son Terence to an asthma attack in 1991, she set up the Dr. Terence N. Thomas Scholarship Fund, which has provided more than \$1 million in stipends to low-income students and students of color in Milwaukee. In 2015 she was inducted into the Milwaukee Press Club's Wisconsin Media Hall of Fame.

Eating better and the new year goes hand in hand, so to help you get in gear I am going to help you restock your fridge. My motto is "If it is in the house, I am going to eat it," so I try to buy healthier choices for the home and eat the delicious, salty, carb filled stuff while I am on the go so I eat less of it.

Valentine's Day is special in Milwaukee and everywhere — especially for people in love!

Ahh, Valentine's Day. How do we love thee? Let me count the ways. That is, people in love, falling in love or thinking about love. February 14 — like the state of Virginia — is for lovers. Always was. Always will be.

Memories of this singular day — observed for St. Valentine and dedicated to choosing or complimenting sweethearts —

are special to me and millions of others who agree that love makes the world go round. Of all our holidays and annual celebrations, perhaps none mixes fun and sentiment quite as well.

Everywhere you look on February 14, there are hearts and flowers and sweetness. Colorful cards and kisses are exchanged and love is in the air. Indeed, in a life chock-full of romance, candle-light dinners, scenic rendezvous and all manner of exciting romantic interludes, Valentine's Day retains a unique place in my heart of hearts.

For example, my late Milwaukee father and mother — Sanford and Juanita Carter — were married on Valentine's Day in 1934. But I really didn't grasp the significance of this wonderful confluence of dates

until their Silver Wedding Anniversary in 1959. And what a day it was.

Surrounded by a large number of their many friends in our home at 1817 N. 1st St., love was everywhere as my parents were presented with countless gifts of silver — including hundreds of silver dollars.

Decorative red valentine hearts and cupids of all sizes were strewn throughout the big house, many festooned with silver dollars. It was happier and more joyous than any Christmas I'd ever known.

Perhaps my best memory of that occasion was listening starry-eyed as Mr. Carter — a great baseball player in the Negro Leagues — regaled the well-wishers with some of his exploits, including when he hit a triple off legendary Leroy

"Satchel" Paige in Bismarck, North Dakota, in 1935. And then hearing some old-timers insisting that "Sandy Carter would have made the major leagues" if he'd come along a decade later.

For my folks' Golden Anniversary, on Valentine's Day in 1984, there was a huge celebration in the Grand Ballroom of the Marriott Inn in Brookfield, joined by some 300 well-wishers. Many of the same guests who'd gathered 25 years earlier came again. Lifting music was provided by Mantee Ellis, along with a stirring vocal by Veo Brazil.

In attendance were Mrs. Neil Moody — my mother's sister and widow of Calvin C. Moody; family attorney Ted Crockett and his wife, Pat, and dear friends Susie Feaster, Jim Fields, Ernestine O'Bee and William Stark.

Other notable Milwaukeeans there included Circuit Judge Clarence Parrish and his wife, Mildred; Sixth District Alderman Marlene Johnson and her husband, Ben; former Mayor Frank P. Zeidler and his wife, Agnes; retired police detective Felmers O. Chaney, later to head the local NAACP; Mr. and Mrs. John Givens, Mr. and Mrs. Reuben Harpole; activist George F. Sanders, and Father Matthew Gottschalk, parish priest of Saint Francis and Saint Elizabeth Catholic churches.

As soon as the party ended, my wife, Janice, and I, took my folks — still in love at 72 and 73 — to Hawaii, for a vacation to

end all vacations. And there's nothing like Valentine's Day, or a wedding, in that paradise.

Over the years, a number of people I know have been very fortunate to find love with a special man or woman, and keep it through thick and thin. Then there are some, like me who found love with the woman of my dreams, lost it, and found it again. Perhaps we are even more fortunate.

When true love appears, it's usually because the time is right. Indeed, a man or a woman may be floundering — seeking direction and wondering what it will take to love and be loved.

And then, out of nowhere it happens, and your heart soars. You find the love of your life. It's happened to me, and I will be forever grateful.

Finally, Valentine's is the birthday of late civil rights activist, Julian Bond — born February 14, 1940. Who can forget when a youthful Bond burst upon the scene in the turbulent 1960s. As a Georgia state senator, he led a successful insurgent delegation to the 1968 Democratic convention in Chicago and was the first Black person nominated for Vice President. A serious, loving man I remember on Valentine's Day.

Those were the days, my Milwaukee friends, we thought they'd never end. Happy Valentine's Day to all.

Congresswoman Gwen Moore offers tax filing resources

Dear friend,

As you may know, tax season is upon us once again. While filing your taxes may seem overwhelming, there are many resources to help smooth the process, including those mentioned in this newsletter. I also wanted to highlight some changes that you should look out for while preparing to file for tax year 2022.

I am very pleased to announce that legislation I voted for means that the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) was able to hire thousands of workers to answer your questions and provide

other support. So far in the first two weeks of this year's filing season, the agency has been able to answer 88.6 percent of calls, up exponentially from the previous filing season.

In Milwaukee and across the country, there are taxpayer assistance centers where you can access free tax filing help if you qualify. Many centers can provide services to Spanish-speaking residents and don't require an appointment. Find locations in Wisconsin's Fourth here.

Many low- to moderate-income workers and families are eligible to claim the

Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC), which can reduce the tax owed or result in a refund. For help determining if you qualify for the EITC, you can use the EITC Assistant. You may also want to use this IRS tool to help you determine if a person qualifies you for the Child Tax Credit (CTC) or the Credit for Other Dependents. If you're eligible, don't miss out on these opportunities to save or get back hundreds or thousands of dollars.

If you have claimed these valuable tax credits previously, keep in mind that

Black people die 2x more often by gun violence, report finds

The gun violence crisis is harming Black Americans at historically high levels

Black people die by gunshot two times more often than white people despite occurrences of gun violence trending downward slightly, according to a recent study from a nonprofit that researches the health crisis.

A new report by The Giffords Law Center to Prevent Gun Violence shared its evaluation of data exclusively with theGrio. The center reviewed statis-

tics from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and data from an organization that tracks police shootings.

Their report highlights racial disparities with gun violence. Among those findings: Gun homicides for Black Americans jumped 61% from 2018 to 2021.

The firearm suicide rate for Black people increased 44% in the same time period.

In 2022, Philadelphia set a homicide record for the third consecutive year. One in every

67 Black men from ages 18 to 24 died or suffered injuries from a gun last year in the city, according to the Giffords analysis.

"I've lived in [Philadelphia] my whole life, I've never seen

the city like this," Anthony Lemon, a city resident who lost three friends to gun violence last year says.

One in 50 young Black men died or got injured from a firearm in Rochester, New York, last year, the report states. In Cincinnati, Ohio, it was one in 44. "Gun violence takes an extreme toll on Black communities.

"We see disparities in public health all the time, but with gun violence the homicide rate for Black Americans just outpaces the homicide rate for white Americans," Kelly Drane, the research director at the Giffords Law Center says.

Each year, close to 12,400 Black people die from gun violence, the report says. A record-shattering 15,548 Black people were killed by guns in 2021, according to Giffords.

For Black men ages 15 to 44, homicide is the leading cause of death and guns account for 86% of the homicides in the Black community.

The disparity is more pronounced for children. In 2020, guns became the leading cause of death for all children. It had already been the leading cause of death for Black children since 2006, the Giffords memo states.

In 2021, Black kids were 13 times more likely to be killed by

a gun than white children.

The suicide numbers stood out to Drane and other researchers. While a majority of gun suicides in the U.S. involve white people, from 2018 to 2021 gun suicide rates increased by 4% for white people but 44% for Black people, according to the Giffords report.

"The way that suicide is often presented doesn't capture the fact that many Black Americans are dying by suicide each year," Drane says.

Police shooting numbers are less reliable because of holes in how the data is collected. With stats from Mapping Police Violence, a datatool that has been collecting information on police shootings and killings since 2013, Giffords found that one in four victims of fatal police shootings are Black.

No other ethnic group experiences a higher rate of fatal police shootings than Black people.

Lemon shares a sentiment that experts and community leaders stress about addressing this problem.

"We got to get these neighborhoods right. The police, the schools, healthcare. All of it has to get better," Lemon says. "We shouldn't be okay with this."

there have been a few changes to certain tax credits this year, returning to pre-pandemic levels. Changes include amounts for the CTC, EITC and Child and Dependent Care Credit.

Those who got \$3,600 per dependent for the 2021 tax year for the CTC will, if eligible, get \$2,000 for the 2022 tax year.

For the EITC, eligible taxpayers with no children who received roughly \$1,500 for the 2021 tax year will now get \$560 for the 2022 tax year.

The Child and Dependent Care Credit returns to a maximum of \$2,100 for the 2022 tax year instead of \$8,000 for the 2021 tax year.

Other notable things to look out for when filing your taxes this year include:

More people may be eligible for the Premium Tax Credit, a refundable credit that helps eligible individuals and families cover the premiums for their health insurance purchased through the Health Insurance Marketplace. For tax year 2022, taxpayers may still qualify for temporarily expanded eligibility for the premium tax credit.

Eligibility rules changed to claim a tax credit for clean vehicles. Review the changes to qualify for a Clean Vehicle Credit.
