





MCJ publisher honored by city for Black History Month!

The city of Milwaukee posted this salue to Black history maker and Milwaukee Community Journal Publisher Patricia O'Flynn Pattillo. She is one of 28 Black trailblazers being honored by the city during its '28 Days of Black History.'

Pattillo is the founder, CEO, and publisher of the Milwaukee Community Journal, the largest African-American newspaper in Wisconsin since 1976. In 1987 she became the first female president of the National Newspaper Publishers Association-Black Press of America.

After losing her 29-year-old son Terence to an asthma attack in 1991, she set up the Dr. Terence N. Thomas Scholarship Fund, which has provided more than \$1 million in stipends to low-income students and students of color in Milwaukee. In 2015 she was inducted into the Milwaukee Press Club's Wisconsin Media Hall of Fame.

Refrigerator Restock ideas

Cheese, yes please! When you get hangry, eat a slice of cheese on a cracker with some pepperoni and you won't regret it, lol. Cheese is good on everything from sandwiches, in salad and just by itself. Make sure to stock several varieties since they last long in the fridge.

Ahh, Valentine's Day. How do we love thee? Let me count the ways. That is, people in love, falling in love or thinking about love. February 14 — like the state of Virginia — is for lovers. Always was. Always will be.

Memories of this singular day observed for St. Valentine and dedicated to choosing or complimenting sweethearts –

are special to me and millions of others who agree that love makes the world go round. Of all our holidays and annual celebrations, perhaps none mixes fun and sentiment quite

Everywhere you look on February 14, there are hearts and flowers and sweetness. Colorful cards and kisses are exchanged and love is in the air. Indeed, in a life chock-full of romance, candle-light dinners, scenic rendezvous and all manner of exciting romantic interludes, Valentine's Day retains a unique place in my heart of hearts.

For example, my late Milwaukee father and mother — Sanford and Juanita Carter were married on Valentine's Day in 1934. But I really didn't grasp the significance of this wonderful confluence of dates until their Silver Wedding Anniversary in 1959. And what a day it was.

Surrounded by a large number of their many friends in our home at 1817 N. 1st St., love was everywhere as my parents were presented with countless gifts of silver - including hundreds of silver dol-

Decorative red valentine hearts and cupids of all sizes were strewn throughout the big house, many festooned with silver dollars. It was happier and more joyous than any Christmas I'd ever known.

Perhaps my best memory of that occasion was listening starry-eyed as Mr. Carter - a great baseball player in the Negro Leagues — regaled the well-wishers with some of his exploits, including when he hit a triple off legendary Leroy

"Satchel" Paige in Bismarck, North Dakota, in 1935. And then hearing some old-timers insisting that "Sandy Carter would have made the major leagues" if he'd come along a decade later.

For my folks' Golden Anniversary, on Valentine's Day in 1984, there was a huge celebration in the Grand Ballroom of the Marriott Inn in Brookfield, joined by some 300 wellwishers. Many of the same guests who'd gathered 25 years earlier came again. Lilting music was provided by Mantee Ellis, along with a stirring vocal by Veo Brazil.

In attendance were Mrs. Neil Moody - my mother's sister and widow of Calvin C. Moody; family attorney Ted Crockett and his wife, Pat, and dear friends Susie Feaster, Jim Fields, Ernestine O'Bee and William Stark.

Other notable Milwaukeeans there included Circuit Judge Clarence Parrish and his wife, Mildred; Sixth District Alderman Marlene Johnson and her husband, Ben; former Mayor Frank P. Zeidler and his wife, Agnes; retired police detective Felmers O. Chaney, later to head the local NAACP; Mr. and Mrs. John Givens, Mr. and Mrs. Reuben Harpole; activist George F. Sanders, and Father Matthew Gottschalk, parish priest of Saint Francis and Saint Elizabeth Catholic churches.

As soon as the party ended, my wife, Janice, and I, took my folks — still in love at 72 and 73 to Hawaii, for a vacation to

end all vacations. And there's nothing like Valentine's Day, or a wedding, in that paradise.

Over the years, a number of people I know have been very fortunate to find love with a special man or woman, and keep it through thick and thin. Then there are some, like me who found love with the woman of my dreams, lost it, and found it again. Perhaps we are even more fortunate.

When true love appears, it's usually because the time is right. Indeed, a man or a woman may be floundering seeking direction and wondering what it will take to love and be loved.

And then, out of nowhere it happens, and your heart soars. You find the love of your life. It's happened to me, and I will be forever grateful.

Finally, Valentine's is the birthday of late civil rights activist, Julian Bond — born February 14,1940. Who can forget when a youthful Bond burst upon the scene in the turbulent 1960s. As a Georgia state senator, he led a successful insurgent delegation to the 1968 Democratic convention in Chicago and was the first Black person nominated for Vice President. Those were the days, my Milwaukee friends, we thought they'd never end. Happy Valentine's Day to all. Milwaukee native Richard G.

Dear friend,

As you may know, tax season is upon us once again. While filing your taxes may seem overwhelming, there are many resources to help smooth the process, including those mentioned in this newsletter. I also wanted to highlight some changes that you should look out for while preparing to file for tax year 2022.

I am very pleased to announce that legislation I voted for means that the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) was able to hire thousands of workers to answer your questions and provide

other support. So far in the first two weeks of this year's filing season, the agency has been able to answer 88.6 percent of calls, up exponentially from the previous filing season.

In Milwaukee and across the country, there are taxpayer assistance centers where you can access free tax filing help if you qualify. Many centers can provide services to Spanish-speaking residents and don't require an appointment. Find locations in Wisconsin's Fourth here.

Many low- to moderateincome workers and families are eligible to claim the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC), which can reduce the tax owed or result in a refund. For help determining if you qualify for the EITC, you can use the EITC Assistant. You may also want to use this IRS tool to help you determine if a person qualifies you for the Child Tax Credit (CTC) or the Credit for Other Dependents. If you're eligible, don't miss out on these opportunities to save or get back hundreds or thousands of dollars.

If you have claimed these valuable tax credits previously, keep in mind that



Black people die 2x more often by gun violence, report finds

The gun violence crisis is harming Black Americans at historically high levels

Black people die by gunshot two times more often than white people despite occurrences of gun violence trending downward slightly, according to a recent study from a nonprofit that researches the health crisis.

A new report by The Giffords Law Center to Prevent Gun Violence shared its evaluation of data exclusively with the Grio.

The center reviewed statis-

tics from the Centers for Disganization that tracks police shootings.

Their report highlights racial disparities with gun violence. Among those findings: Gun homicides for Black Americans jumped 61% from 2018 to 2021.

The firearm suicide rate for Black people increased 44% in the same time period.

In 2022, Philadelphia set a homicide record for the third consecutive year. One in every

67 Black men from ages 18 to ease Control and Prevention 24 died or suffered injuries (CDC) and data from an or- from a gun last year in the city, according to the Giffords anal-

"I've lived in [Philadelphia] my whole life, I've never seen the city like this," Anthony Lemon, a city resident who lost three friends to gun violence last year says.

One in 50 young Black men died or got injured from a firearm in Rochester, New York, last year, the report states. In Cincinnati, Ohio, it was one in 44. "Gun violence takes an extreme toll on Black communities.

"We see disparities in public health all the time, but with gun violence the homicide rate for Black Americans just outpaces the homicide rate for white Americans," Kelly Drane, the research director at the Giffords Law Center says.

Each year, close to 12,400 Black people die from gun violence, the report says. A record-shattering 15,548 Black people were killed by guns in 2021, according to Giffords.

For Black men ages 15 to 44, homicide is the leading cause of death and guns account for 86% of the homicides in the Black community.

The disparity is more pronounced for children. In 2020, guns became the leading cause of death for all children. It had already been the leading cause of death for Black children since 2006, the Giffords memo states.

In 2021, Black kids were 13 times more likely to be killed by

The suicide numbers stood out to Drane and other researchers. While a majority of gun suicides in the U.S. involve white people, from 2018 to 2021 gun suicide rates increased by 4% for white people but 44% for Black people, according to the Giffords report.

"The way that suicide is often presented doesn't capture the fact that many Black Americans are dying by suicide each year," Drane says.

Police shooting numbers are less reliable because of holes in how the data is collected. With stats from Mapping Police Violence, a datatool that has been collecting information on police shootings and killings since 2013, Giffords found that one in four victims of fatal police shootings are Black.

No other ethnic group experiences a higher rate of fatal police shootings than Black people.

Lemon shares a sentiment that experts and community leaders stress about addressing this problem.

"We got to get these neighborhoods right. The police, the schools, healthcare. All of it has to get better," Lemon says. "We shouldn't be okay with

there have been a few changes to certain tax credits this year, returning to pre-pandemic levels. Changes include amounts for the CTC, EITC and Child and Dependent Care Credit.

Those who got \$3,600 per dependent for the 2021 tax year for the CTC will, if eligible, get \$2,000 for the 2022

For the EITC, eligible taxpayers with no children who received roughly \$1,500 for the 2021 tax year will now get \$560 for the 2022 tax year.

The Child and Dependent Care Credit returns to a maximum of \$2,100 for the 2022 tax year instead of \$8,000 for the 2021 tax year.

Other notable things to look out for when filing your taxes this year include:

More people may be eligible for the Premium Tax Credit, a refundable credit that helps eligible individuals and families cover the premiums for their health insurance purchased through the Health Insurance Marketplace. For tax year 2022, taxpayers may still qualify for temporarily expanded eligibility for the premium tax credit.

Eligibility rules changed to claim a tax credit for clean vehicles. Review the changes to qualify for a Clean Vehicle Credit.

How credit scores are evolving to improve access to credit

Advocates say it's a positive that ratings agencies have started making it easier for consumers to prove that they'll be able to pay back money they borrow.

NEW YORK (AP) — A low credit score can hurt your ability to take out a loan, secure a good interest rate, or increase the spending limit on your credit card.

Some reasons for a low score are out of your control — such as unexpected medical debt or a lack of credit history.

Credit rating agencies are working to improve access to credit by giving people more time to pay medical bills before the debt appears in reports, and by removing other debt completely. They're also making it easier to count rent, utility payments, and other recurring bills — a boon for those who need credit the most.

Here's what to know:

WHAT IS A CREDIT SCORE AND WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

Put simply, a credit score is a formula that lenders use to decide how likely you are to pay back a loan. If you're considered a risky bet, you will pay more to borrow or may not be able to borrow at all.

The factors that go into calculating your score are complicated, and advocates say it's a positive that ratings agencies have started making it easier for consumers to prove that they'll be able to pay back money they borrow. It's especially important for so-called "thin file" consumers — those with a lack of extensive credit history, who are often younger or lower income.

"I do see that efforts are being made in order to equalize the credit score," said Rosalyn Glenn, a financial advisor at Prudential who focuses on expanding financial access. "For instance, adding rental payments to credit reports, because there is a segment of the population that rents and does not own. That's exciting — because the score can give them an opportunity for better rates on things like insurance and loans. I do believe progress is being made there."

After conducting industry research during the pandemic, the three most-used credit

WHAT'S HAPPENING WITH MEDICAL DEBT?

rating agencies found that consumers with medical expenses were just as likely to

be creditworthy as those without.

Effective July of last year, paid medical collection debt is no longer included on consumer credit reports, and the time period before unpaid medical collection debt appears is now a year, up from six months. That gives people more time to work with insurance and healthcare providers to pay off the debt.

In the first half of 2023, Equifax, Experian and TransUnion will also remove medical collection debt under \$500 from credit reports.

When Jonnathan Alvarado, 25, was in a car accident this past year, he knew health expenses wouldn't be the only hit to his finances. A landscaping contractor in Plainfield, New Jersey, who prides himself on careful financial behavior, Alvarado faced knee surgery at the beginning of his busiest work season, which hurt his productivity.

Alvarado said he only realized in retrospect the consequences for his access to credit. Even after insurance, Alvarado still owed in the vicinity of \$1,200, which he took several months to pay off. During that time, his credit score dropped to 680, still considered good, but lower than it had been. When he finished paying the debt, it jumped to 775, the highest it had ever been.

It was only when Alvarado looked into what caused the decline and rebound that he learned the lingering medical debt had been responsible.

"A difference of almost a hundred points," Alvarado said. "I would have paid it off sooner, if I had known."

David Anthony, 43, who drives a service truck in Baltimore, only learned that medical debt was dragging his credit down when an employer pointed out the high interest rate he was paying on an auto loan. After looking into his score, Anthony disputed certain medical bills, some of which had been paid, eventually bringing his score up from the 500s to above 700.

"I got a great loan on the cars that I have now," he said. "That first car — it was a 17 percent interest rate. That's what raised the red flag to my employer."

Anthony is now down to a single-digit interest loan.

HOW ELSE CAN I INCREASE MY CREDIT SCORE?

Although consumers have long been able to add rent and utility bill payments to their credit files, the bureaus have made these additions easier and less costly in recent years.

Experian, for example, has an option for consumers to opt into a service, "Experian Boost," that counts these kinds of payments without charging a fee. (In some other cases, companies may charge the renter or landlord for the trouble of filing the additional information in credit reports, since it isn't automatically included as a matter of course. Those who use the program often see an increase in their scores.

"You're making a payment once a month for a service you receive — very much
like getting a loan," said Rod Griffin, financial health advocate at Experian. "What
we found in our research was that those kinds of pieces of information do indicate
that a person may be a better credit risk than their report might show if they have
very little credit."

For people with thin credit files or scores below 680, Experian sees an average increase in the neighborhood of 19 points, according to Griffin. Others might see their scores increase 12 or 13 points. About two-thirds of people see an improvement in their scores, but the tool helps even those who don't build a longer credit history, Griffin said.

To use the tool, you give Experian permission to capture your monthly payment history and bank information — whether that's a cellphone plan, water bill, streaming service subscription, or rent.

For Brandon Reese, 41, a financial planner in Dallas, Texas, it made sense for him to help his 20-year-old daughter, a nursing student in San Antonia, opt in.

"When she first opened a line of credit, her score dropped," he said. "But with this, we were able to get it about 15 percent higher."

Reese said he also advises his retired clients to use the programs.

"For older people, they have low credit scores, too, because they've paid everything off," he said. "So their credit goes down. But now — Verizon, AT&T. Hulu, the Disney bundle, Netflix, your gas bill — fintech companies can justify those as payment histories."

Tech companies that provide similar services to Experian Boost, either at low or no cost, have proliferated.

"That is now one of the number one things we encourage people to do," said Silvio Tavares, CEO of VantageScore, another provider of national consumer credit scores. Like FICO, VantageScore uses the credit reports compiled by Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion to calculate a rating of credit-worthiness using its own algorithm. "If you're engaging in credit-worthy behavior — like paying rent and utilities on time, you want to include that."

HOW DO I OPT IN?

To include alternative credit information on your report, you have several options. One is to opt-in to ExperianBoost or Ultra FICO by going to the companies' websites and granting permission for them to access your checking, savings, or money market accounts. This will allow the credit bureau or scoring company to analyze your spending, saving, and consistent payment histories. While other financial tech platforms provide similar services, these two options do not charge fees.
