There is much more to add to the book, such as Black leadership in the political spectrum of Milwaukee, Milwaukee County and the State of Wisconsin. Pick up your copy and share your family info for inclusion in the new book already being drafted.

Let us acknowledge the importance of FOOD in Black History and specifically in Milwaukee Black History. The culture of spices, cooking over an open fire, as in BBQ, the creative use of leftovers, the fish from the streams, plants from home gardens and open fields such as greens and mushrooms and berries are the basics of Black cuisine.

We, like other cultures, used what was close in our environment. Plantains, bananas, coconut, coffee and rice are African treasures, yet universally as seen during enslavement in slave cabins, the meals of their masters and in our homes today.

The ability to create is the foundation of southern cooking and those historical high notes permeate our holidays, birthdays and whatever special days on the family calendar, just as they were on Southern plantations, and in fine cooking nationally and abroad today. Our unique style is internationally sought.

In Milwaukee we have been courted and swooned over some of the best home-cooking this side of Chicago. Milwaukee old-timers may recall Black legacy dine-in and take-out/fast-food eating establish-

ments such as 'Speed Queen,' 'Mr. Perkin's Family Restaurant,' 'Charlene's New Orleans Style Cooking,' Henrys and Charity Church at 'Church's Kitchen.' Later there was 'Ponderosa' and 'Demonds,' 'Sam's,' and 'Coffee Makes You Black.' And let's not forget 'Q F& H Family Restaurant.'

This month, Mrs. Josephine Hicks, the owner and proprietor of QF&H and a legend in serving comfort food in Black Milwaukee, will be celebrating her 90th birthday. I bet I have omitted some other local spots and their claim to fame (like 'The Bungalow'—Oooops!).

It's not intentional. We ask that you bring to our attention other local Black eating establishments we forgot to list above and we'll make sure to highlight them in future articles.

We love to brag out our bests....and we still think Milwaukee has acres of diamonds in its own back yard...so let us celebrate!

Mrs. Hicks ran her QF&H Restaurant until 2006 at the same Dr. Martin Luther King Drive location for over 30-plus years. She was known for the long list of area pastors who loved her cooking and used her dining room for their meetings and to fellowship with Black members of their respective flocks.

The 13th annual Girls' Day @ City Hall event is seeking to expose girls (middle school and high school aged) to possible careers in public service and elected office, and this year's Girls' Day will take place on Thursday, March 23 from 9 a.m. – 2 p.m.

Students will engage in stimulating discussions that both empower them to become future leaders, and introduce them to a career path in public service.

The event is sponsored by the City of Milwaukee and Alderwoman Milele A. Coggs. Girls' Day is co-sponsored by Alderwoman Marina Dimitrijevic and Alderwoman JoCasta Zamarripa.

The event will allow attendees to meet a number of local leaders and participate in a panel discussion about public service led by women in the field.

Teens Grow Greens offers new-and-improved summer and fall internships for Milwaukee high school students

Teens Grow Greens is offering new and improved summer and fall internship opportunities for Milwaukee high school students. Interested teens can apply online now for one or both paid internships. The summer internship, called Leading For Justice: Food Sovereignty & Urban Gardening, will give teens background on food justice in Milwaukee and a chance to be part of the change at a community garden and local farm. The fall internship, called Leading Through Creativity: Developing Your Own Business, will give teens hands-on experience in product ideation and design, business model creation, and

product pitching, culminating in a November pitch night extravaganza with over \$2,000 in prizes.

All high school students are encouraged to apply, whether they attend public, charter, private, independent, or online school.

Summer internship highlights include seed-to-table experiences in gardening and cooking at Westlawn Gardens Community Garden on the northside and at The Cottonwood School on the southside; leadership projects that will see teens collaborating on improving fresh food distribution, health education for Afghan refugee families, and zine creation on environmental justice issues; and field trips to Sweet Water Foundation in Chicago and Beulah Family Homestead in Elkhorn. Fall internship highlights include teams receiving \$100 in seed money for research and development; weekly guest speakers and mentorship sessions with local entrepreneurs; field trips to local businesses

and creative spaces; and table and stage pitching at the annual fundraising event The Perennial.

Both internships provide much-desired life and career skills training through hands-on

Lori Lightfoot blames Chicago election loss on racism, gender issues

Lightfoot finished Tuesday with only 16.4 percent of the vote, trailing Cook County Commissioner Brandon Johnson and Paul Vallas, former chief of Chicago Public Schools.

Tuesday's failure of Lori Lightfoot to make it to the Chicago mayoral race runoff, which she attributes to racism and female inequality, has changed the Windy City political landscape.

get,” Lightfoot said in an article in The New Yorker Saturday, The Post reported. “Certain folks, frankly, don't support us in leadership roles.”

Lightfoot finished Tuesday's election with only 16.4 percent of the vote, trailing Cook County Commissioner Brandon Johnson and former Chicago Public Schools chief Paul Vallas.

In analyzing how she went from “political rock star to rock bottom,” The Chicago Tribune claimed Lightfoot campaigned in 2019 by arguing crime was too high, saying she wanted Chicago to be the “safest big city in the country.”

However, crime reportedly skyrocketed on her watch. More than 800 homicides were committed in Chicago in 2021, the most in a quarter-century. The number decreased by 14 percent last year, but the homicide rate stayed

nearly 40 percent higher than in 2019.

The city also reportedly experienced over 20,000 theft incidents in 2022, nearly twice as many as the previous year.

Police say that compared to 2022, crime rates have soared in the first three weeks of this year by 61 percent.

Diana DeJacimo, who was robbed at gunpoint in December in the posh Lincoln Park area, bid Lightfoot farewell. She said Wednesday the only way to resolve the city's issues is through a change of government.

For DeJacimo, the city's crime surge was a key factor at the polls.

“We have two very different approaches now of the two guys that are having the runoff,” DeJacimo said, The Post reported. She said one is police protection and supporting the police, while the other is more about defunding the police and self-rule.

“So we'll see how it turns out,” she added, “but I'm glad the city spoke out and said no more Lori Lightfoot.”

Chicago's next mayor will be chosen in a runoff poll on April 4 between Vallas, who received 35 percent of the vote, and Johnson, who garnered 20.2 percent.

Nevertheless, Lightfoot declared that being mayor of Chicago was “the honor of a lifetime,” and she urged mayors across the U.S. not to be afraid to be bold.

“Regardless of tonight's outcome,” Lightfoot said Tuesday, according to The Post, “we fought the right fights, and we put this city on a better path.”

MICHAEL B. JORDAN RECEIVES WALK OF FAME STAR



Congratulations are in order for Michael B. Jordan, who on Wednesday received one of the highest honors in show business: a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame.

As theGrio previously reported, Jordan's star on the famed strip was first announced by The Hollywood Walk of Fame selection panel in 2021, in a list of celebrities including Byron Allen and the late rapper Nipsey Hussle. Frequent collaborator and friend director Ryan Coogler and his current “Creed III” co-star Jonathan Majors joined Jordan at the ceremony.

The ceremony comes during a busy time for Jordan, as his directorial debut “Creed III” opens in theaters this weekend and is already enjoying rave reviews from critics.

“This is probably one of the most unforgettable weeks I've had,” he shared at the ceremony. “I'm extremely humbled and grateful to be here ... I know it's not a small achievement.

It's not lost on me how special this moment is and what this represents to our community, so from the bottom of my heart, I want to say thank you.”

Coogler, who has worked with Jordan since his first feature film, “Fruitvale Station,” broke down their history of working together at the ceremony. He recalled his first meeting with Jordan at a Starbucks by Universal Studios when he thought of Jordan as the lead for “Fruitvale Station.”

What followed was an impressive run of films together, including the first “Creed” film and of course, “Black Panther.” He said that watching Jordan “blossom into the phenomenal global icon that he is” has become “a ride of a lifetime.”

Majors gushed with admiration for Jordan during his speech, recalling long days shooting “Creed III” and how the actor continues to rise above and meet his immense demands. “Today, brother, you go from man to god,” he said.

“You sit among Olympians. I honor you, I love you and we are all so proud to call you our son, our brother, but chiefly, I am extremely honored to call you my friend. No man on the planet I know deserves it more. I love you to the moon and back.”

Jordan also shared a reel on his official Instagram page of the event. The video, which has “Blood, Sweat & Tears” (with Bas & Black Sherif feat. Kel-P) from the “Creed III” soundtrack dubbed over it, focuses on Jordan's brand new star before zooming out and showing the actor himself standing over it.



BULLDOG IN THE DOGHOUSE! Jalen Carter, top NFL prospect, posts bond in fatal crash

Georgia defensive tackle Jalen Carter turned himself in to Athens police Wednesday night and was released 16 minutes later after posting a combined bond of \$4,000 on charges of reckless driving and racing in relation to a fatal crash that killed a teammate and team staffer.

According to Athens-Clarke County jail records, Carter turned himself in at 11:33 p.m. and was released at 11:49 p.m. Carter posted bond of \$2,500 on the racing charge and \$1,500 on the reckless driving charge.

Carter, projected as one of the top players in next month's NFL draft, left the NFL scouting combine in Indianapolis on Wednesday after being informed of the arrest warrant issued in conjunction with the Jan. 15 crash that killed teammate Devin Willock and a recruiting staff member.

The arrest warrant alleges Carter was racing his 2021 Jeep Trackhawk against

the 2021 Ford Expedition driven by the recruiting staffer, 24-year-old Chandler LeCroy, which led to the wreck. LeCroy also was killed in the crash.

Carter issued a statement on his Twitter account on Wednesday saying he expects to be “fully exonerated.”

Carter said he intends “to make certain that the complete and accurate truth is presented. There is no question in my mind that when all of the facts are known that I will be fully exonerated of any criminal wrongdoing.”

The crash occurred just hours after the Bulldogs celebrated their second straight national championship with a parade and ceremony.

According to the allegations in the arrest warrant, LeCroy and Carter were operating their vehicles “in a manner consistent with racing” after leaving downtown Athens at about 2:30 a.m.

The warrant says evidence shows the vehicles switched lanes, drove in the center turn lane, drove in opposite lanes, overtook other motorists and drove at high rates of speed “in an apparent attempt to outdistance each other.”

Antoine Davis is on the verge of breaking a scoring record once considered untouchable — and, in some ways, remains so.

Detroit Mercy’s star guard needs just 26 points to surpass Pete Maravich as the NCAA’s career scoring leader. Davis, who leads the nation with a 28.4 points per game average, can break “Pistol” Pete’s revered 53-year-old mark Thursday night in a Horizon League tournament game against top-seeded Youngstown State.

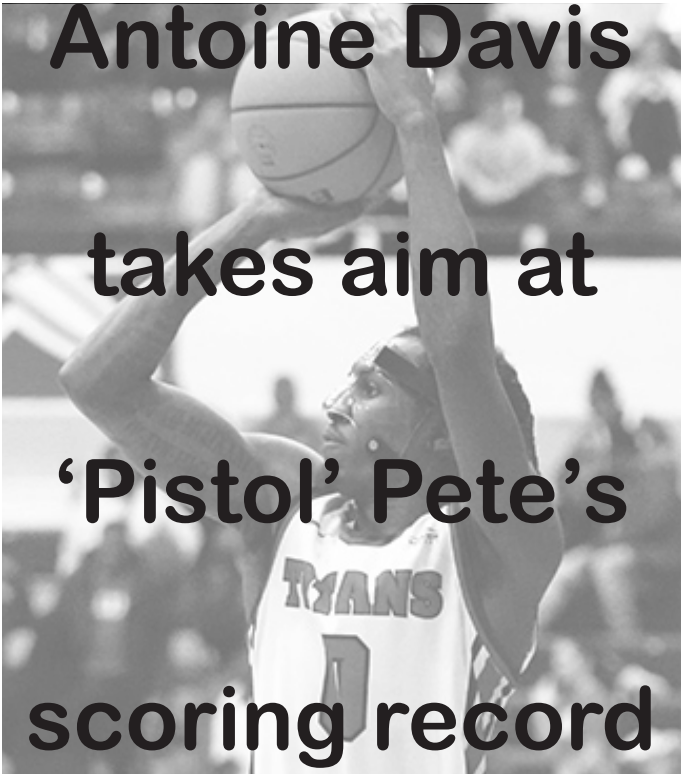
Davis scored 38 on Tuesday night in a win over Purdue Fort Wayne to advance the eight-seeded Titans and close in on the mark that Maravich set as an All-American for LSU from 1967-70.

Just weeks after LeBron James went past Kareem Abdul-Jabbar as the NBA’s career scoring leader, Davis has a chance to top Maravich, the Hall of Famer his father had him study while learning to play as a kid.

A gifted shooter and scorer, the smooth 6-foot-1 Davis will have his work cut out to break the record against the Penguins, who held him to 15 points on Jan. 29 at Youngstown State. He also dropped 32 on them in the first meeting this season.

Davis already holds several NCAA records, including consecutive games in double figures (143), 3-pointers (584) and he’s seven 3s away from Stephen Curry’s record of 162 in a season.

If he’s able to overtake Maravich and make history, the



new scoring record will belong to Davis as well. However, this one might need an asterisk — or two.

Davis has scored 3,642 points in 142 games while it
