### MPS board director blasts colleagues for rejecting proposal to study district's abysmal national standing in education

The Milwaukee School Board surprisingly rejected a proposal Thursday that would support a feasibility study leading to a new school model to reverse the district's standing as the worse district in the country for Black children.

The proposal, introduced by Director Aisha Carr, had been approved by the board's student achievement committee days before.

But during a meeting that drew the largest Black audience in recent memory, all but two directors rejected the proposal, which may be long remembered not only because of subject matter but a verbal exchange between Carr and the head of the teachers union.

One observer said the verbal confrontation reminded him of a similar exchange between union president Amy Mitzialko and former Director Michael Bonds which ended with Bonds telling her "to go to hell."

Carr has floated the proposal since last year. It would call for a study to be conducted free of charge by Harvard University, with the aim of closing the academic achievement gap between Black and White students.

Last fall, a National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) report revealed Milwaukee public schools system was the worse in the nation for Black children.

A state Department of Public Instruction annual report card provided a further indictment of MPS, showing less than 14% of Black students were proficient in reading and half of that percentage in math.

The Carr proposal would analyze existing paradigms with the specific goal of improving reading and math proficiency rates.

The toxic exchanges between Mitzialko and Carr shocked many in attendance, prompting one report to lament the union president was disrespectful, having verbally attacked Director Carr in an "enraged, volatile manner, yelling fallacies and inaccurate information to evoke fear and discourage support of the proposal."

Carr said in a statement following the meeting, "the failures of Black children and Black communities are profitable! This study was my attempt to righteously serve my constituents and send a message to people throughout the city, letting them know that I stand with them and share their disappointment too."

"It was also my attempt to bring innovative changes to the district given the urgent need for more improved academic and social outcomes. I am appalled that my colleagues voted against this proposal instead of accepting my offer to collaborate and engage in this work collectively."

"Shame on Directors Ericka Siemsen, Marva Herndon, Megan O'Halloran, Jilly Gokalgandhi, and board President Bob Peterson for ignoring the voices and cries of Black students, teachers, and families."

She declared that the vote against the resolution and the quick exit from the stage of board members "to avoid public accountability is reflective of the harsh and prevalent realities of institutional racism, and the void of equity and equality in a (district) that serves an (overwhelmingly minority student population)."

"I also urge taxpayers to ignore the racist and slanderous tactics of Amy Mitzialko because anyone or any entity who will fight so hard to maintain the social and academic failures of Black students and teachers doesn't deserve the right to represent any body of people, especially our most vulnerable population -- children."

"This is a 'Call-To-Action' to every concerned community member who cares about the sustainability of our public schools, children, teachers, families, and communities. Those who are sick and tired of being sick and tired and demand urgent change in our public education system must show up, demand immediate changes, and elect a board of leaders accountable to children and not politics."

Director Carr will host a citywide town hall meeting at Washington High School on Monday, April 3, at 5:30 PM. The public is invited to learn about her MPS 'Call-to-Action'.

program.

“We have an ‘artist-first’ mentality in that we always ask and pay artists their standard fee for their time.

“This allows artists to pour into the people more freely while being compensated for their time,” said Salat.

At least two instructional designers on staff with Arts @ Large regularly visit schools that have artists placed there in residencies.

They support classroom teachers and artists with curriculum design and other arts integration strategies.

A.I.R Academy, an Artists In Residents free Summer Camp, was created for third through eighth graders. It is a five-week, interdisciplinary, youth-focused program.

A.I.R Academy has the capacity for 40 students each session. Students attend the camp from 9:30

a.m. to 12:30 p.m. and work with lead artists developing and honing their interests in various artistic disciplines.

This year’s Arts @ Large Arts summer camp centers will collaborate with a professional musician and his team to provide in depth experiences in different art forms.

Participants will explore how a variety of art forms can serve as a bridge between conflict and resolution.

The Arts @ Large program provides an opportunity to encourage self-respect, respect of differences, and how art can be a tool for social responsibility, while also providing skills and processes that help peacefully manage conflicts and create innovative solutions to social challenges.

“We encourage all students to find creativity in whatever they aspire to do—whether it is in science, history, or English. Through creativity you can see the beauty in the world around us,” said Salat.

# These four school board candidates have what it takes to turn around the dismal and failing paradigm of the city's public schools!

*"I freed a thousand slaves. I could have freed a thousand more if only they knew they were slaves." ---Harriet Tubman.*

I've been thinking of that oracular quote from America's foremost abolitionist a lot lately, its prophetic assumption becoming all the more relevant the closer we get to the April 4th Milwaukee school board elections.

There has been a century of debate over whether the quote was authentic and whether it was rooted in the slaves' fear of being recaptured, or of the unknown realities of freedom.

What wasn't in dispute was the intrinsic message that their decision to remain on the plantation guaranteed shorter life spans in the most hideous form of slavery known to mankind, and that of their children.

I see a foreboding link between the disingenuous reality Tubman faced 150 years ago and what modern day abolitionists encounter in our attempt to free our children from the plantation politics of today.

Don't get me wrong. I am not suggesting---as some have---that the 'government' educational paradigm (MPS) is a plantation, and our children are slaves (at least not in a literal sense).

I am, however, positing that most of our 'Field Negro Offspring' find themselves 'trapped' in failing government

schools under modern-day overseers whose primary role is to maintain a status quo that dooms our 'seeds' to second-class citizenship.

Add to that the additional 'chains' of psychological, cultural, and economic bondage, and you have the ingredients of modern-day slavery.

Moreover, as implied in the Tubman quote, most parents share partial blame for that sinfully sinister template because they are either ignorant of their role in the educational process, unwilling or unable to fill the educational void, or dupped into believing, as the bible suggests, they were destined to be slaves, a paradigm sanctioned by God.

Equally ridiculous is the belief by many parents that their children's failure is a result of their ineptitude or inability to conceptualize basic concepts, like reading and adding and color recognition, which the parents should have taught long before leaving their children at the bus stop for kindergarten.

Through my lens, those in that latter group will find an excuse not to vote in next week's school board elections, even though it holds the promise and possibility of 'providing the slaves with passports to freedom.'

To put it bluntly, the MPS board--and not necessarily the teachers--has failed our children. Under the mandate of the MTEA, the board has rejected dozens of reform proposals and has consistently ignored appeals to reallocate resources from failed programming to 21st century models.

The most telling insult was the silence by the board to a national educational research revelation last fall that Milwaukee hosts the widest academic achievement in the country.

Amid that shocking news and reports, the board's response was to give themselves unprecedented raises.

Only Director Aisha Carr voted against the salary bonus. She was also the ONLY director to offer any meaningful proposal to address the district's failures.

Her most recent proposal was rejected last Thursday. It called for a feasibility study of existing programs to be conducted by Harvard University...free of charge.

The proposal also addressed teacher complaints about in-service, as well as a restructuring of the school week to address mental health crisis.

But the board rejected the proposal at the insistence of the MTEA president, who also attacked Carr for questioning the failed status quo.

The sorry state of affairs did not happen overnight. In fact, dissatisfaction with the direction of MPS has been going on for decades, in part because few Black leaders,

particularly members of the 'Negrocracy,' have been willing to stand up to the union. And for good reason, to do so often results in attacks, or charges they are somehow dupes of the far right, or seek to destroy MPS.

One more vital point to consider as you approach the election: As goes MPS, so goes Milwaukee.

A city's economic and cultural vitality are often determined by the quality of education offered its citizenry. In Milwaukee's case, we are on life support as more people leave for greener pastures or utilize alternative options (i.e: the suburbs).

Not only has the business community turned its back on MPS because of its failed model, but the Democratic Party has worked with the union to lock the gate instead of working to appease dissatisfied customers.

It is no coincidence that Milwaukee has moved from being the 13th largest city in the country when the school desegregation order was issued, to 31st yesterday.

Moreover, MPS's share of the eligible student population is currently 53%. It cannot sustain itself if that percentage drops to 50%.

But this isn't a story with a sad ending. Or at least, it doesn't have to be.

Several board members have seen the writing on the wall and will not seek reelection.

Simultaneously, four uniquely qualified Black candidates have emerged who are capable and willing to take on the status quo and elevate MPS to a status where people will make MPS their first choice.

From my 40 years of observations, critiques, and investigative stories, I feel qualified to suggest a 'slate' of candidates who can move us toward our goal of 'educational excellence for everyone.'

While there is no official slate, the community, our children, and this city will best be served by electing the following:

**District 2: Write-in Pam Holmes.** A retired police officer with an impressive resume of community activism, Holmes was 'forced' to remove her mentally stressed daughter from a MPS specialty because the district ignored her cries for help. She wants to make sure others are not similarly harmed.

Most recently, Holmes is in a leadership position with the Call-to-Action coalition, which is organizing around a renaissance of North Divisions (declared by the Department of Public Instruction to be the worst school in the entire state).

Because the election commission excluded Holmes from ballot status for questionable reasons, she is forced to take on the challenge of a write-in candidacy.

Holmes brings much experience and invaluable law enforcement and mental health expertise.

**District 3: Darryl Jackson** is a successful entrepreneur whose decision to run is predicated on his commitment to making education the passport to success for low income African American students, as it once was.

Like Holmes, he brings unique expertise to the board that would benefit our children significantly.

**District 1:** If this race was held in the suburbs or progressive cities where parents and politicians understand the value of education and, equally important, are invested partners, **Dr. Shandowlyon Hendricks Reaves** would be the overwhelming favorite over incumbent Marva Herndon.

Although both women are African American, Herndon has stood against reforms and, in fact, has stated she is opposed to Black children in failing schools being provided the option to attend independent charters.

Last week, she voted against Carr's study, claiming she hasn't had time to discuss the measure with constituents. Given that the proposal was originally introduced a full year ago, Herndon's excuse raised more than a few eyebrows. But not the brows of followers of board politics who have observed Herndon's record of support for union mandates even when they hinder Black students.

Hendricks Reaves is a former state superintendent candidate whose academic resume is more extensive than any board director, or candidate. She brings a wealth of expertise to the table and innovative proposals.

**The citywide race** is by far the most intriguing and significant. A former board director, **Jeff Spence** is running against a hand-picked successor to board president Bob Peterson, Missy Zombor.

It speaks volumes that Harris is reportedly supporting his previous opponent, acknowledging that Spence was on the right path during his tenure.

In fact, as president of the state NAACP, Harris has gone so far as to suggest a lawsuit to sue the district for failing to educate Black children.

There is no mistake about Zombor's allegiance. She is a former MTEA communications director and Peterson's successor as editor of Rethinking Schools, a publication that puts the blame for educational failure on bad parenting, poverty, and low wages (even though MPS teachers have the 13th best salaries and benefits in the country).

Spence brings unprecedented experience to the board and innovation proposals that will save money and close the achievement gap.

He proposes selling unneeded and unoccupied buildings, adding seats to the board for the mayor and county executive, and consolidating small schools.

North Division, for example, has a current student enrollment of about 300, although the facility was built for 1,500. There are dozens of larger schools with student enrollments of under 300.

Spence's proposal to add local government seats to the board is no brainer given the impact of MPS on local government.


Like no other political race before or since the 1976 school desegregation settlement, next week's election holds the potential of knocking down the walls of educational apartheid that have hindered African American children, and destined thousands to poverty, imprisonment and dysfunctional lives.

The elections will test Malcolm X's declaration that you are either part of the problem or part of the solution.

It will also answer the question of whether today's Black 'slaves' are content with remaining as slaves on the plantation, or finally getting our 40 acres and a SUV.

TO THE VOTERS OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKEE:

Notice is hereby given of a spring election to be held in the City of Milwaukee on April 4, 2023, at which the officers named below shall be nominated. The names of the candidates for each office, whose nominations have been certified to or filed in this office, are given under the title of the office, each in its proper column, together with the questions submitted to a vote, for a referendum, if any, in the sample ballot below.

Information to Voters

Upon entering the polling place and before being permitted to vote, a voter shall:

- state their name and address
- show an acceptable form of photo identification\*
- sign the poll book\*\*

**\*If a voter does not have acceptable photo identification, the voter may obtain a free photo ID for voting from the Division of Motor Vehicles.**

**\*\*If the voter is unable to sign the poll book due to disability, a poll worker may write the word “exempt.”**

If a voter is not registered to vote, they may register to vote at the polling place serving their residence if the voter provides proof of residence.

Where ballots are distributed to voters, the initials of two inspectors must appear on the ballot.

Upon being permitted to vote, the voter shall enter a voting booth or go to a machine and cast their ballot. The vote should not be cast in any manner other than specified here. Sample ballots or other materials to assist the voter in marking their ballot may be taken into the booth and copied. The sample ballot shall not be shown to anyone so as to reveal how the ballot is marked.

A voter who is a parent or guardian may be accompanied by the voter's minor child or minor ward.

An election official may inform the voter of the proper manner for casting a vote but the official may not advise or indicate a particular voting choice.

Assistance for Voting

A voter may select an individual to assist in casting their vote if the voter declares to the presiding official that they are unable to read, have difficulty reading, writing, or understanding English, or that due to disability are unable to cast their ballot. The selected individual rendering assistance may not be the voter's employer or an agent of that employer or an officer or agent of a labor organization which represents the voter.

Where Optical Scan Voting is Used

The voter shall fill in the oval next to the name of the candidate of their choice for each office for which they intend to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall write in the name of the person of their choice in the space provided for a write-in vote and fill in the oval next to the write-in line. On referendum questions, the voter shall fill in the oval next to “yes” if in favor of the question, or the voter shall fill in the oval next to “no” if opposed to the question.

When using an *electronic ballot marking device (“ExpressVote”)* to mark an **optical scan ballot**, the voter shall touch the screen or use the tactile pad to select the name of the candidate of his or her choice for each office for which he or she intends to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall type in the name of the person of his or her choice in the space provided for a write-in vote. On referendum questions, the voter shall touch the screen or use the tactile pad to select “yes” if in favor of the question, or the voter shall touch the screen or use the tactile pad to select “no” if opposed to the question.

After Voting the Ballot

After an official **optical scan ballot** is marked, it shall be inserted in the security sleeve, so the marks do not show. The voter may insert the ballot in the voting device and discard the sleeve or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit. The voter shall leave the polling place promptly.

Spoiling Ballots

If a voter spoils an **optical scan ballot**, they shall return it to an election official who shall issue another ballot in its place, but not more than three ballots shall be issued to any one voter. If the ballot has not been initialed by two inspectors or is defective in any other way, the voter shall return it to the election official who shall issue a proper ballot in its place.

A “yes” vote informs the County that you are in favor of repealing Wisconsin Statute 940.04, which bans abortion at any stage of pregnancy without exception for rape, incest, or health of the patient, and allowing legal access to abortion care.

A “no” vote informs the County that you are opposed to repealing Wisconsin Statute 940.04, which bans abortion at any stage of pregnancy without exception for rape, incest, or health of the patient, and allowing legal access to abortion care.

APRIL 4, 2023

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that at an election to be held in the several towns, villages, wards, and election districts of the State of Wisconsin, on Tuesday, April 4, 2023, the following questions will be submitted to a vote of the people pursuant to law:

2023 ENROLLED JOINT RESOLUTION 2

*To amend* section 8 (2) of article I of the constitution; relating to: conditions for release prior to conviction, including the imposition of bail (second consideration).

Whereas, the 2021 legislature in regular session considered a proposed amendment to the constitution in 2021 Assembly Joint Resolution 107, which became 2021 Enrolled Joint Resolution 6, and agreed to it by a majority of the members elected to each of the two houses, which proposed amendment reads as follows:

**SECTION 1.** Section 8 (2) of article I of the constitution is amended to read:

[ Article I] Section 8 (2) All persons, before conviction, shall be eligible for release under reasonable conditions designed to assure their appearance in court, protect members of the community from serious bodily harm as defined by the legislature by law, or prevent the intimidation of witnesses. Monetary conditions of release may be imposed at or after the initial appearance only upon a finding that there is a reasonable basis to believe that the conditions are necessary to assure appearance in court, or if the person is accused of a violent crime as defined by the legislature by law, only upon a finding that there is a reasonable basis to believe that the conditions are necessary based on the totality of the circumstances, taking into account whether the accused has a previous conviction for a violent crime as defined by the legislature by law, the probability that the accused will fail to appear in court, the need to protect members of the community from serious harm as defined by the legislature by law, the need to prevent the intimidation of witnesses, and the potential affirmative defenses of the accused. The legislature may authorize, by law, courts to revoke a person's release for a violation of a condition of release.

*Now, therefore, be it resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That* the foregoing proposed amendment to the constitution is agreed to by the 2023 legislature; and, be it further

*Resolved, That* the foregoing proposed amendment to the constitution be submitted to a vote of the people at the election to be held on the first Tuesday of April, 2023; and, be it further

*Resolved, That* the question concerning ratification of the foregoing proposed amendment to the constitution be stated on the ballot as follows:

**QUESTION 1: "Conditions of release before conviction.** Shall section 8 (2) of article I of the constitution be amended to allow a court to impose on an accused person being released before conviction conditions that are designed to protect the community from serious harm?"

**QUESTION 2: "Cash bail before conviction.** Shall section 8 (2) of article I of the constitution be amended to allow a court to impose cash bail on a person accused of a violent crime based on the totality of the circumstances, including the accused's previous convictions for a violent crime, the probability that the accused will fail to appear, the need to protect the community from serious harm and prevent witness intimidation, and potential affirmative defenses?"

EXPLANATION

1. Explanatory statement regarding Question 1:

Under the current Wisconsin Constitution, courts may impose reasonable conditions on the release of a criminal defendant before trial for three purposes: (1) to secure the defendant’s appearance in court; (2) to protect the community from “serious bodily harm;” and (3) to prevent intimidation of witnesses. Wis. Const. art. I, § 8(2).

Question 1 would change the language of the second factor from “serious bodily harm” to “serious harm as defined by the legislature by law.” The question would thus change the type of harm to the community that a court could seek to protect against. Because the term “serious harm” would be defined by the legislature by law, what it means could evolve over time depending on legislative enactments.

A “yes” vote on Question 1 would vote to amend Wis. Const. art. I, § 8(2) to allow a circuit court to impose release conditions based on the purpose of avoiding “serious harm as defined by the legislature” rather than “serious bodily harm.”

A “no” vote on Question 1 would vote not to amend Wis. Const. art. I, § 8(2) to change the term “serious bodily harm” as a factor for determining the conditions of a defendant’s pretrial release.

2. Explanatory statement regarding Question 2:

Question 2 would also change the language of Wis. Const. art. I, § 8(2), but in a different way from Question 1. Question 2 addresses the circuit court’s ability to impose the specific condition of monetary bail.

Currently, the Wisconsin Constitution allows a court to impose a monetary bail requirement only if the court finds a reasonable basis to believe that bail is necessary in order to secure the defendant’s appearance in court. Wis. Const. art. I, § 8(2).

Question 2 would expand the factors a circuit court may consider in imposing monetary bail. In cases where a defendant is accused of a “violent crime as defined by the legislature by law,” Question 2 would allow a court to impose monetary bail based on circumstances in addition to securing the defendant’s appearance in court, including accounting for a previous conviction for a violent crime, the need to protect the community from serious harm, preventing witness intimidation, and potential affirmative defenses the defendant might assert.

A “yes” vote on Question 2 would vote to amend Wis. Const. art. I, § 8(2) in cases where the defendant is accused of a violent crime to allow a court to utilize monetary bail for additional reasons in addition to securing the defendant’s appearance in court, including accounting for a previous conviction for a violent crime, the need to protect the community from serious harm, preventing witness intimidation, and accounting for the defendant’s affirmative defenses. Because the term “violent crime” would be defined by the legislature by law, what it means could evolve over time depending on legislative enactments.

A “no” vote on Question 2 would vote not to amend Wis. Const. art. I, § 8(2) to expand the factors a court considers in imposing monetary bail.

2023 ENROLLED JOINT RESOLUTION

*Relating to:* providing for an advisory referendum on the question of requiring able-bodied, childless adults to look for work in order to receive taxpayer-funded welfare benefits.

*Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That* the following question be submitted, for advisory purposes only, to the voters of this state at the spring election to be held in April 2023:

"Shall able-bodied, childless adults be required to look for work in order to receive taxpayer-funded welfare benefits?"

EXPLANATION

Explanatory statement regarding Question 3, the advisory question:

This is an advisory referendum and would not change Wisconsin law. Wisconsin and federal law currently define various programs available to those with financial need based on criteria such as age, familial status, and disability, among other criteria. Most of those programs are limited to children, families with children, pregnant women, disabled persons, or those 65 or older, who Wisconsin law does not consider “able-bodied” for public assistance purposes. See, e.g., Wis. Stat. § 49.79(1)(am) (defining age limits for “able-bodied” under food stamp program).

Two programs currently available to “able-bodied, childless adults” are Wisconsin’s BadgerCare Plus medical assistance program and the FoodShare program, also known as SNAP or food stamps. However, those programs are subject to certain federal requirements and restrictions that either would be inconsistent with the requirement about which the referendum asks or, in some cases, already include such a requirement.

BadgerCare Plus’s medical assistance program is subject to federal Medicaid restrictions, and federal law does not allow for work-based requirements for such programs absent a federal waiver. See 42 U.S.C. § 1396a(a)(10)(A). Currently, there is no federal waiver in force that would allow Wisconsin to impose work requirements on this program. Wisconsin’s FoodShare statute contains requirements that able-bodied, childless adults be employed or participate in an employment and training program, see Wis. Stat. § 49.79(9), but that requirement has been suspended by the federal government in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

A “yes” vote on Question 3, the advisory referendum, would make no change to Wisconsin law.

A “no” vote on Question 3, the advisory referendum, also would make no change to Wisconsin law.
