The City of Milwaukee's new Municipal Port Director officially took office on Thursday during a swearing-in ceremony at City Hall. Mayor Cavalier Johnson appointed Jackie Q. Carter in January, and the Milwaukee Common Council confirmed her appointment earlier in February.

In this position, Carter will direct commercial and recreational operations at Port Milwaukee, oversee a staff of twenty people, and administer Foreign Trade Zone No. 41. Carter is the first woman, and the first person of color, to serve as Director of Port Milwaukee.

A lifelong resident of Milwaukee, Carter has worked in the local non-profit and public sector for more than 20 years.

She most recently served as the Finance & Administration Officer for Port Milwaukee, where she provided oversight of all Port business operations, including its financial, human resource, and administrative functions.

She has been integral in helping to shape the department's strategic planning and grant funding efforts.

Carter earned a Master of Business Administration with an emphasis in Public Administration from Concordia University.

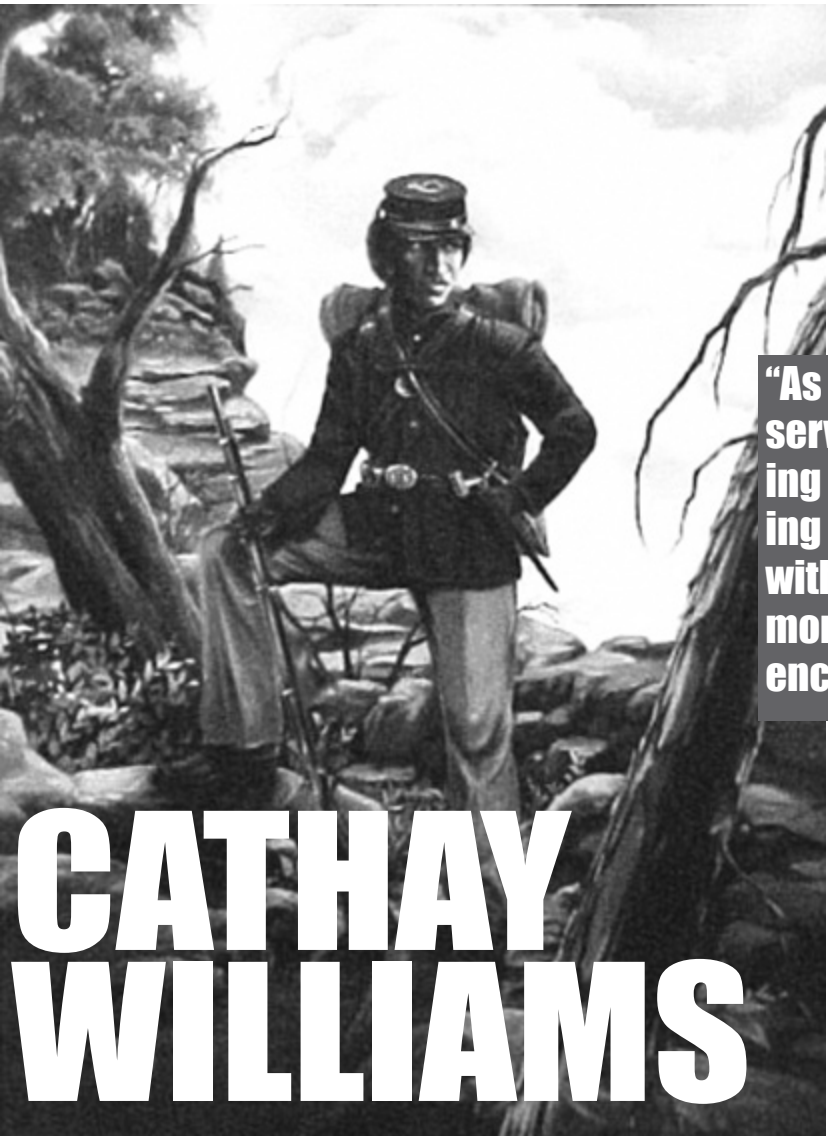
She holds a Bachelor of Arts from Alverno College, with a double major in Business & Management and Professional Communication.

She is a wife, mother, and minister who plays an integral role in reshaping the spiritual and socio-economic legacy of her family and community.

CATHAY WILLIAMS

The Only Known Female Buffalo Soldier

Cathay Williams knew that she couldn't volunteer to serve as a regular soldier in the U.S. military.

But knowing didn't stop her. The young girl who had once labored as a house slave on the Johnson Plantation in Jefferson City, Missouri devised a plan to enlist in the U.S. Regular Army: she would register under the pseudonym William Cathay.

As contraband, or a captured slave, Williams served as an army cook and a washerwoman, traveling with the infantry all over the country while serving under General Philip Sheridan.

This experience with the military didn't satisfy Williams; she wanted more. Military service held the lure of independence for a young, unmarried former slave.

On Nov. 15, 1866, the 17-year-old, born to an enslaved mother and a free father in Independence, Missouri in 1844,

later be known as the Buffalo Soldiers.

This excerpt, dated Jan. 2, 1876, was pulled from an interview with the St. Louis Daily Times: "The regiment I joined wore the Zouave uniform and only two persons, a cousin and a particular friend, members of the regiment, knew that I was a woman.

They never 'blowed' on me. They were partly the cause of my joining the army.

Another reason was I wanted to make my own living and not be dependent on relations or friends.

"Soon after I joined the army, I was taken with the smallpox and was sick at a hospital across the river from St. Louis, but as soon as I got well, I joined my company in New Mexico.

"The post surgeon found out I was a woman and I got my discharge. The men all wanted to get rid of me after they found out I was a woman. Some of them acted real bad to me."

Williams was discharged honorably by her commanding officer, Captain Charles E. Clarke, on Oct. 14, 1868.

After leaving the army, Williams moved to Pueblo, Colorado, where she again worked as a cook and washerwoman.

She was married for a short time and bore no children.

There are no official records of her death, however, it is estimated that she passed away sometime around 1893.

What Asian American Oscar Victories Mean for All of Us

After the Oscars, when Asian Americans were everywhere on the winners list, from actors, writers, directors, but also makeup artists, and not just in “Everything Everywhere All at Once,” but also in movies like “The Whale,” I turn to the Oakland playwright Ishmael Reed who must be wondering will Asian Americans now go for the Whiteness Prize?

(I consider Asian American to be a generic term, indicating people of Asian descent either living or working not necessarily indicative of their citizenship status.)

I’m in New York as an actor in “The Conductor,” the latest Reed production now off-Broadway.

I play a brown-skinned Tucker Carlson-type on a faux Fox, and very conservative news network.

That’s how good an actor I am!

As an Asian American sometime-actor, I’m gratified to see Asian American creatives take their historic star turn at the Oscars.

Asians have won the Academy Award for best supporting actor before, but never has there been a best actor/actress winner until the Malaysia-born, Hollywood-based Michelle Yeoh last weekend.

There’s something about being a “first.” A “never before.” But what’s next?

And that’s where Reed’s play got me thinking.

In Reed’s “The Conductor,” Blacks start a new underground railroad to help Indian Americans — not American Indians, but those from the continent of India — escape a wave of xenophobia that is forcing them to flee to Canada.

The main character, columnist Warren Chipp is Reed’s alter ego. When a conservative Indian seeks refuge and asks Chipp why the liberal Chipp is being so nice to him, Chipp reveals his grasp of irony.

“Minorities make alliances with us (Blacks) until their admission to the white club is accepted. This happened to the Jews, the Japanese, the Irish, the Italians and now you guys (Asian Indians).”

It’s just one of the provocative asides in the play, but the historical examples are there.

Says Chipp/Reed: “These groups come running to us when the white man decides to sic mobs on them because of some geopolitical conflict or culture war. Begging us to hide them and save them.

And then, when they get an ‘all-clear’ sign, they return to auditioning for whiteness again. Lining up and trampling over each other, asking white people to ‘choose me!’ Some of them even change their names to go Anglo.”

Reed says it’s the root of “Afro-Pessimism.”

What’s that?

It’s a term by Frank Wilderson, as Reed explains, that means Blacks can’t depend upon Blacks’ “junior allies.” Wilderson calls B.S. on intersectionality and says that Blacks “must go it alone.”

After rehearsals and the first four performances, the passages from the play haunt me.

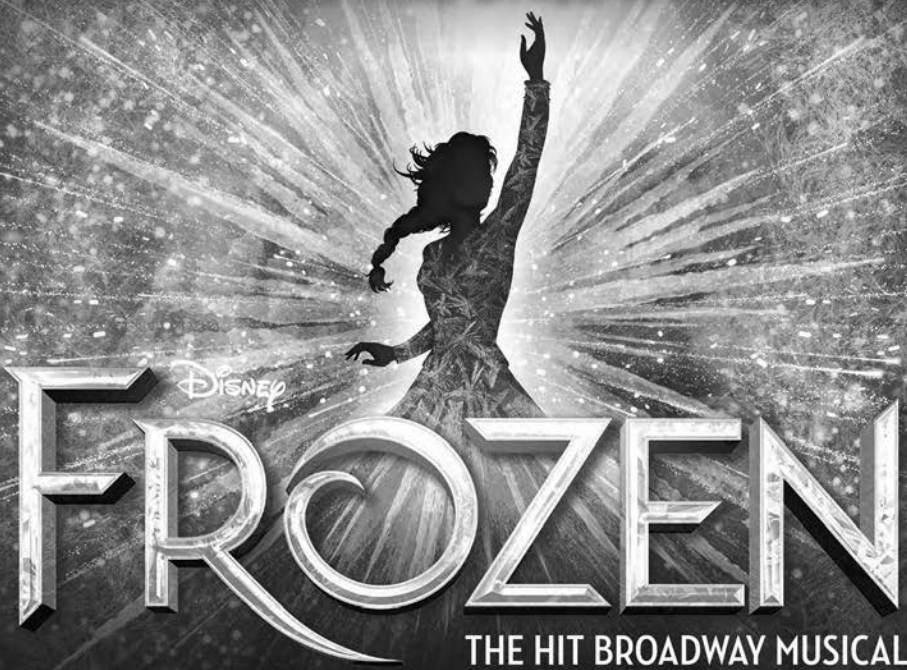

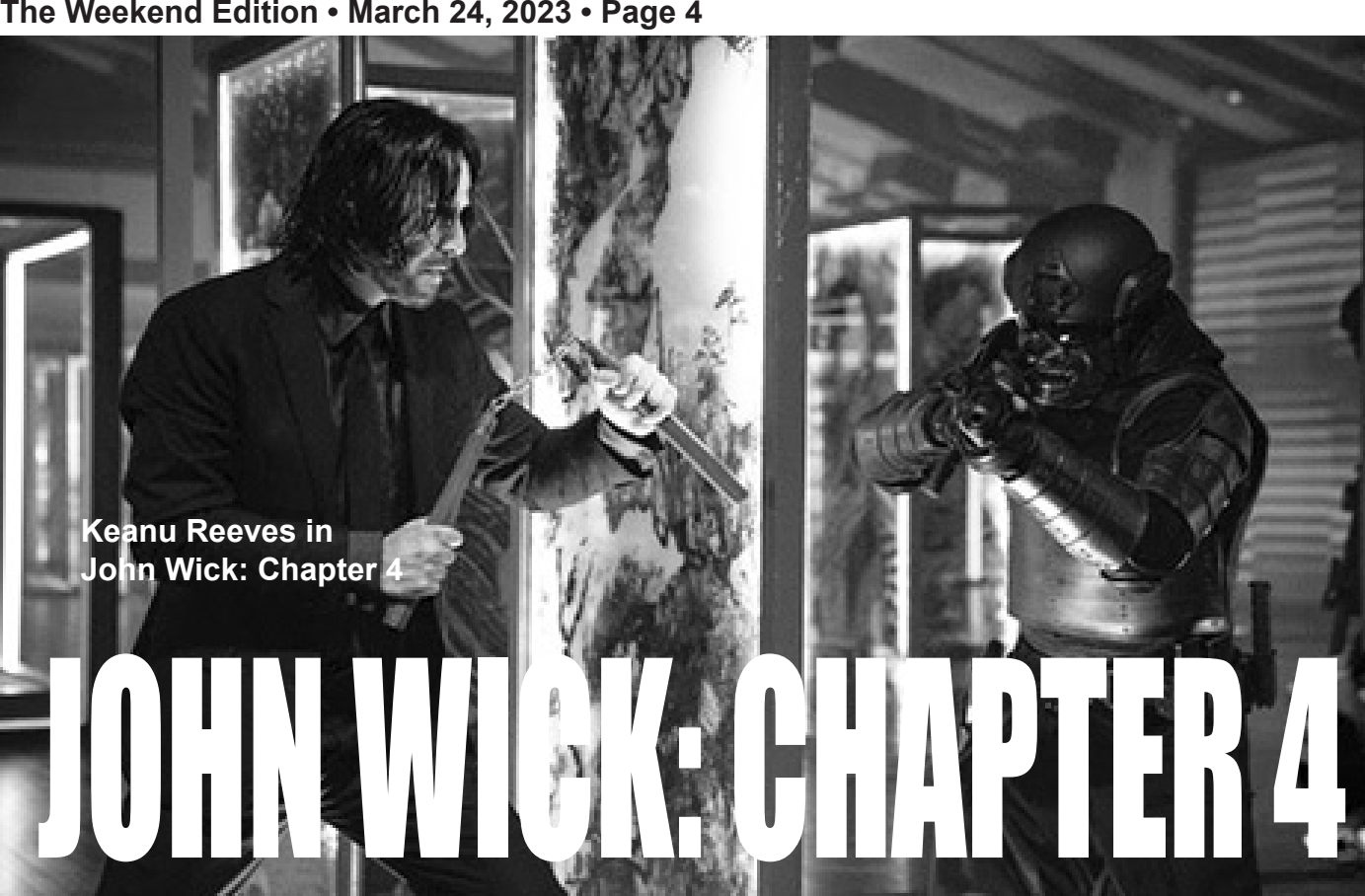

John Wick: Chapter 4

JOHN WICK: CHAPTER 4

Artistic, balletic and acrobatic violence separates the John Wick franchise from other action/crime/thrillers. That ritual continues as the hitman's hitman discovers friends can be foes and foes can be friends.

John Wick (Keanu Reeves) is a badass, hired killer. He works under the mandates of a clandestine council, "The High Table."

The group of 12 crime lords reigns over the underworld's most ruthless paid killers. Wick is at odds with the governing body, shunning protocols and ignoring ultimatums.

This time he's gone too far. The Table has put a bounty on his head. Assassins can make millions murdering him.

Old friends aid and hide him. The Bowery King (Laurence Fishburne), head of a covert intelligence network, gives him tips.

The proprietor (Ian McShane) and concierge (Lance Reddick) of the New York Continental Hotel, a lair and safe haven for assassins, protect him.

Wick seeks refuge with his old ally Shimazu (Hiroyuki Sanada, Bullet Train) at his Osaka Continental Hotel, against the man's daughter's (Rina Sawayama) better judgement. Even Wick's fellow hatchet man Caine (Donnie Yen, Ip Man) hunts him. Caine: "You're going to die." Wick: "Maybe not."

That betrayal was coerced by The Table's relentlessly evil emissary Marquis (Bill Skarsgård), who continuously ups the bounty—\$18M to \$40M. He'll kill anyone who gets in his way.

Seconds into this chapter people are killed. Mi-

notes into the movie ingeniously choreographed fight scenes portend what's to come. The script by Shay Hatten and Michael Finch adds complication on top of complication. Murders on murders. Bullets fly non-stop. Fist fights don't end until someone is pummeled to death.

Normally this kind of non-stop savagery would become unbearably repulsive. But as directed by Chad Stahelski, who helmed previous Wick chapters and was a stuntman, the visuals are so heady, the tumbles, punches, flips and gunfights so over the top viewers will sit in amazement laughing nervously. They expect no less from this series, and this episode delivers in the most

imaginative ways.

The settings range from New York, Jordan and Japan to Berlin and Paris. The geographic scope is so vast it competes with the international locations in Mission Impossible and James Bond films.

That global flair should entice American, Euro-

pean, Middle East and especially Asian markets where Yen and Sanada are superstars.

Sequences in an airplane hangar-sized Berlin disco where patrons dance wildly as a gun/fist fight erupts are electric. Overhead shots when Wick battles adversaries through rooms in a building catch the eye. Car chases, guns blazing and auto crashes on streets around the Arc de Triomphe are mind blowing. But the astonishing carnage truly crescendos during the bloodbath on the 200+ steps leading up to the Sacré-Coeur Basilica.

That's the wow moment. The money shot. That's when the direction, photography, stunts and acting show off and hit nirvana.

The emotional struggles between the characters run deep. When the betrayals between friends and colleagues look like they will be the centerpiece, the script throws a curve ball. A duel is proposed, with strict rules: "Failure to meet at sunrise will result in execution."

This Burr-Hamilton plot device threads all the chaos together and herds it into one and provided an extra momentum that will reenergize audiences and take their minds off the film's 2h 49m length (editor Nathan Orloff).

The evocative settings are interesting to watch because the interiors and exteriors (production design Kevin Kavanaugh, The Dark Knight Rises) are magnificent, the palette of colors flourish (art directors Emil Birk, Gilles Boillot, Karim Kheir) and the characters parade around in slick, tailored bullet-proof suits (Paco Delgado, Les Misérables).

The cinematography (Dan Lausten, The Shape of Water) meticulously frames everything.

Each actor stands out but also blends in, creating a twisted group dynamic that brands the film. Reeves, Yen and Sanada are obvious superstars. Shamier Anderson (Dear White People) as the mysterious Tracker, an ambivalent interloper with a trusty German Shepherd, adds a humanizing factor to the mayhem. Sawayama, as Shimazu's daughter Akira, is mesmerizing in a fight scene where she mounts a behemoth assassin, knives in hands, stabbing him as he climbs steps until she pierces his neck delivering the coup de grâce.

JWC4 is an elaborately choreographed, gorgeously crafted slaughter fest. A blood-thirsty spectacle. A circus of scoundrels fighting to the

death in the most gracefully violent ways.

Especially last Sunday. When the Asian Americans were preparing for their Oscar turn, I was off-Broadway living Reed’s play.

Is the Model Minority now back to auditioning for whiteness again?

I hope not. I get what Reed’s saying in his play. But I see the Oscar victory as a win for not just Asian Americans but all BIPOC communities in all their unique narratives.

AAPJ stories have a kind of heat now. An independent film about a family with a laundromat dealing with the IRS and the multiverse where people have hotdogs as fingers puts us in a whole new ballgame.

We aren’t so weird after all. We’re of immigrant descent, sure. We’re different, yes.

But we’re of the modern world and our stories deal in universal truths.

People flocked to “Everything Everywhere All at Once,” which gave it some cache as an indie project that was making money.

Not like “Top Gun” money, but enough to satisfy Hollywood accountants.

Once it caught the attention of the Academy looking for diversity, the film was simply recognized for its off-beat ingenuity and its creative weirdness.

I was having lunch in New York’s Chinatown with a lawyer friend of mine, a Chinese American immigrant and also a triple Harvard (College, Law School, and MBA) graduate.

My friend surprised me when he said he couldn’t understand the hype about “Everything, Everywhere...”

He called it unwatchable. He liked the movie “Tar.”

I told him maybe it was generational. Just goes to show you that not everyone, not even Asian Americans are on board with “Everything, Everywhere...”

But the huge victory on Sunday makes the film like a Golden Spike in Hollywood.

The track is finally connected and open for AAPJ creatives bound for glory.

“Everything, Everywhere...” has put everyone in the equation on notice.

“We have stories to tell that sell, and that people want to see.

Stories that win Oscars. I see the phenomenon as a rising Asian American film lifts all boats.

And with AAPJ at just over 6% of the population, I don’t buy the “Afro-Pessimism” idea in his play.

We can’t go it alone. We don’t have the numbers. We need each other.

Like anything worthwhile, it’s going to have to be done

together.
