

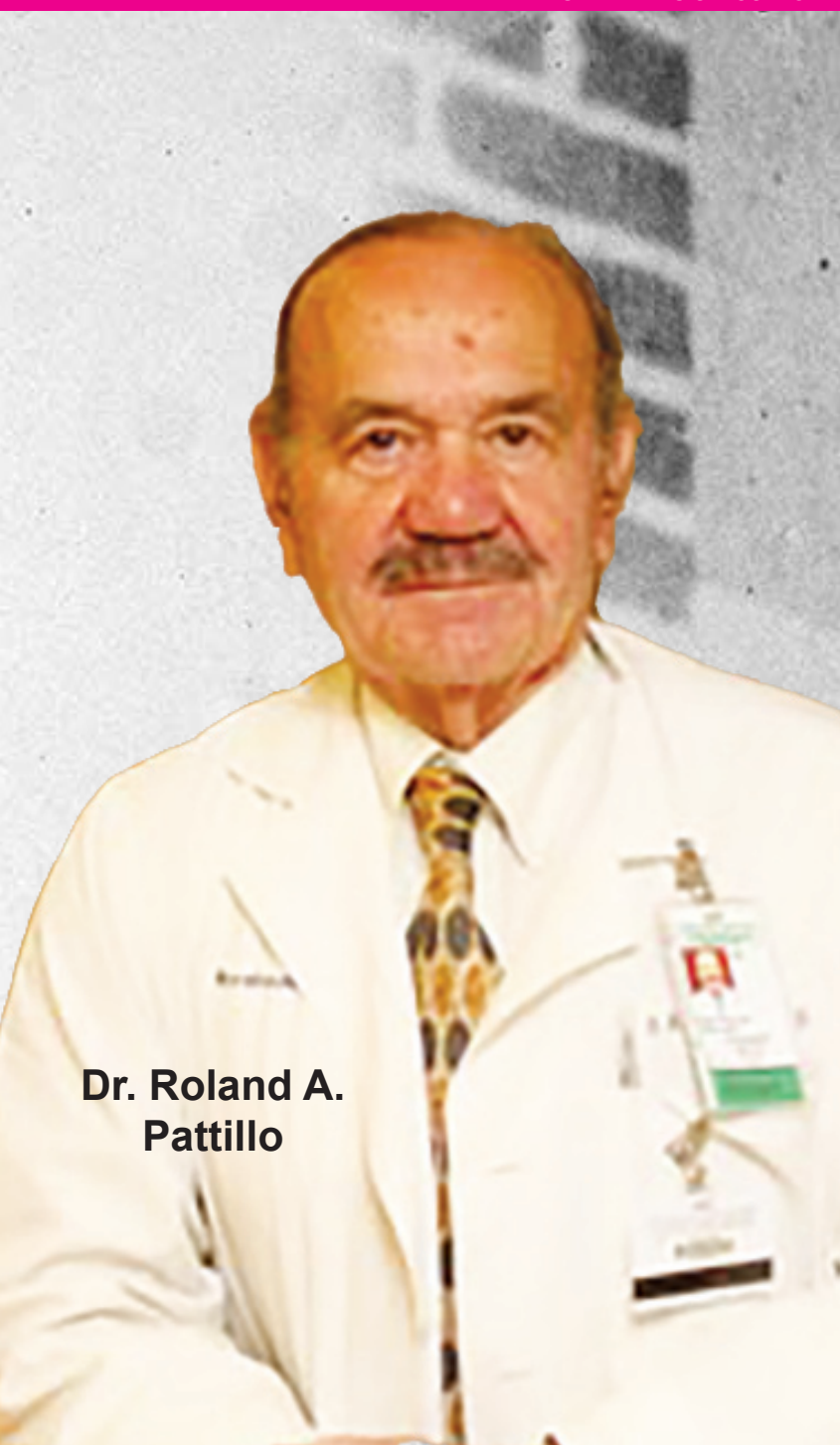
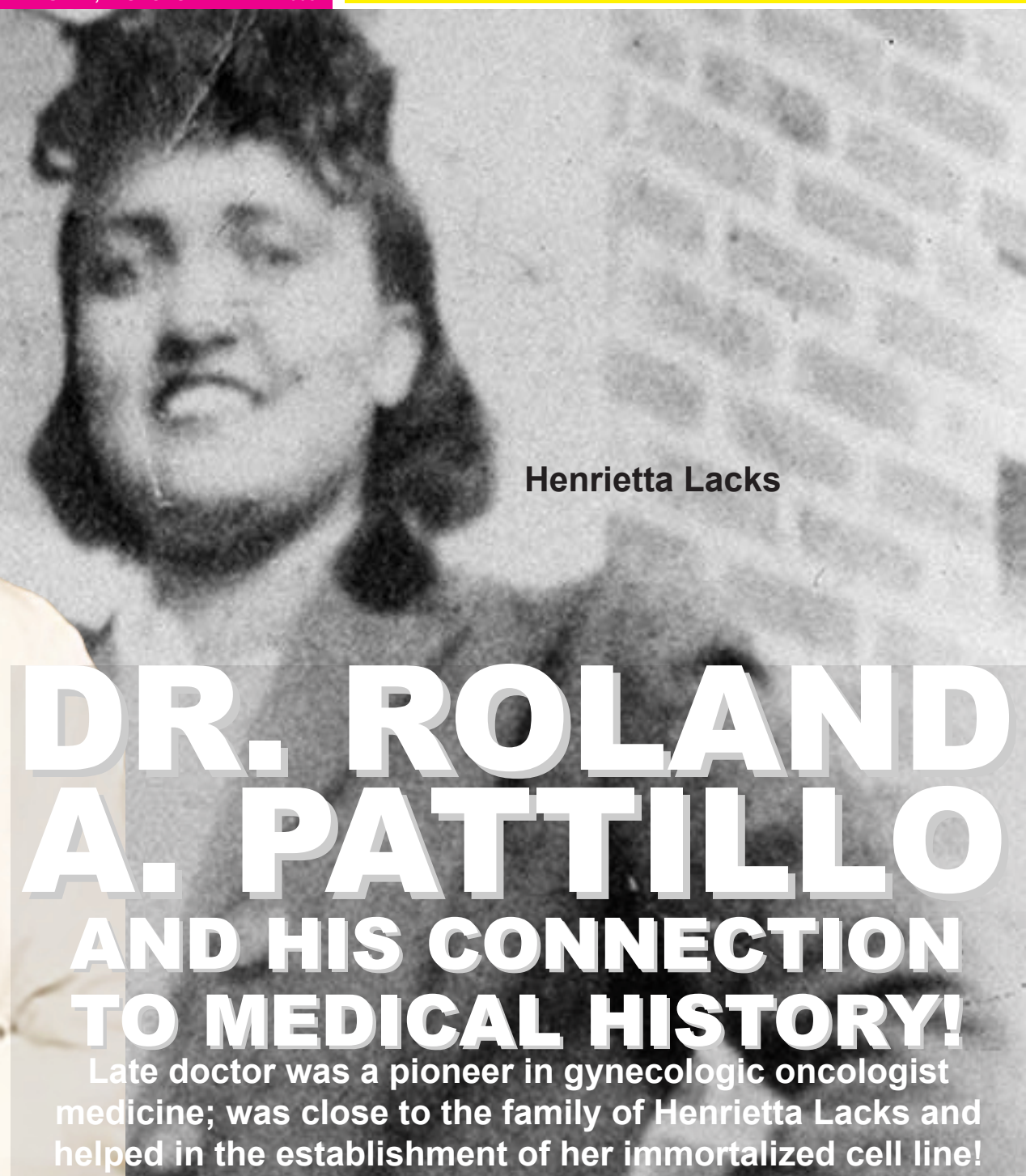

Henrietta Lacks

DR. ROLAND
A. PATTILLO
AND HIS CONNECTION
TO MEDICAL HISTORY!

Late doctor was a pioneer in gynecologic oncologist medicine; was close to the family of Henrietta Lacks and helped in the establishment of her immortalized cell line!

Dr. Roland A. Pattillo, a noted gynecologic oncologist, professor, researcher, and author who passed away recently, was a strong force in women's health for five decades. Dr. Pattillo was the first African American faculty member at Marquette University School of Medicine (which later became MCW).

Dr. Pattillo, served on the MCW Obstetrics and Gynecology faculty from 1968 to 1995, received MCW's Distinguished Service Award in 1994 and an Honorary Degree in 2018.

Dr. Pattillo was an expert on gynecologic and trophoblastic (placental) cancers and stem cell research, and he led a team of physicians who successfully cultivated cervical tissue cells outside the body to develop a vaccine for the Human Papilloma Virus (HPV).

Dr. Pattillo's research and clinical studies focused on in-vitro cell models that possessed characteristic biomarkers that were then used in multiple experimental designs for assessment of endocrine function, chemotherapy, radiation therapy sensitivity and differentiation.

His research culminated in the first identification of the trophoblast stem cell and establishment of the first human hormone synthesizing cell system maintained in continuous cultivation.

Dr. Pattillo shared all the cell systems he established with scientists worldwide, and one, the ovarian system, was used to develop a new treatment for ovarian cancer. He authored the first stem cell publication in 1968. In total, he has authored more than 100 peer-reviewed journal publications, one book and several book chapters.

Dr. Pattillo trained as a fellow with George Gey, MD, at The Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine. In 1951, Dr. Gey established the first immortalized cell line (HeLa) which is chronicled in the best-selling book and movie, 'The immortal life of Henrietta Lacks.'

His work with Dr. Gey led him to develop an enduring close relationship with the Lacks family. Dr. Pattillo purchased a headstone for Henrietta's previously unmarked grave, served as a champion for the family, and later in his career, while at Morehouse School of Medicine, launched a women's health conference in Henrietta's honor.

During his time at MCW, Dr. Pattillo served one year as acting chair of obstetrics and gynecology and four years as vice-chair.

In 1995, he was named emeritus professor of obstetrics and gynecology.

He then moved to Morehouse College of Medicine in Atlanta, where he eventually was promoted to chair of the department of obstetrics and gynecology.

Dr. Pattillo has been honored with the Medallion of the International Trophoblast Society, the Leonard Tow Humanism in Medicine Award and the Pioneer Award from the National Institute of Health for Frontiers in Stem Cell Research.

He was one of the founders of Milwaukee's Cream City Medical Society.

Pattillo attended Xavier University in New Orleans, earned his MD from St. Louis University and completed his residency in obstetrics and gynecology at MCW. He also

completed a gynecologic oncology fellowship at Johns Hopkins.

Dr. Pattillo is survived by his beloved wife of 27 years, Patricia O'Flynn Pattillo; sister, Carolyn Pattillo Davis; children Catherine Pattillo Jefferson (David), Patrick Pattillo, Sheri Pattillo Johnson, Mary Pattillo; bonus sibling Todd 'Speech' Thomas; grandchildren Daniel Pattillo (Rachel), Carolos Arriaga (Vicki), Camille and David Michael Jefferson, Vann III and Benjamin Johnson, Jahi and Zoe Renee Thomas; and many nieces, nephews, cousins and relatives.

African Americans of that era steadfastly instilled in their children the importance of education, that it was the 'roadmap' that unflinchingly pointed the way to success in whatever you did!

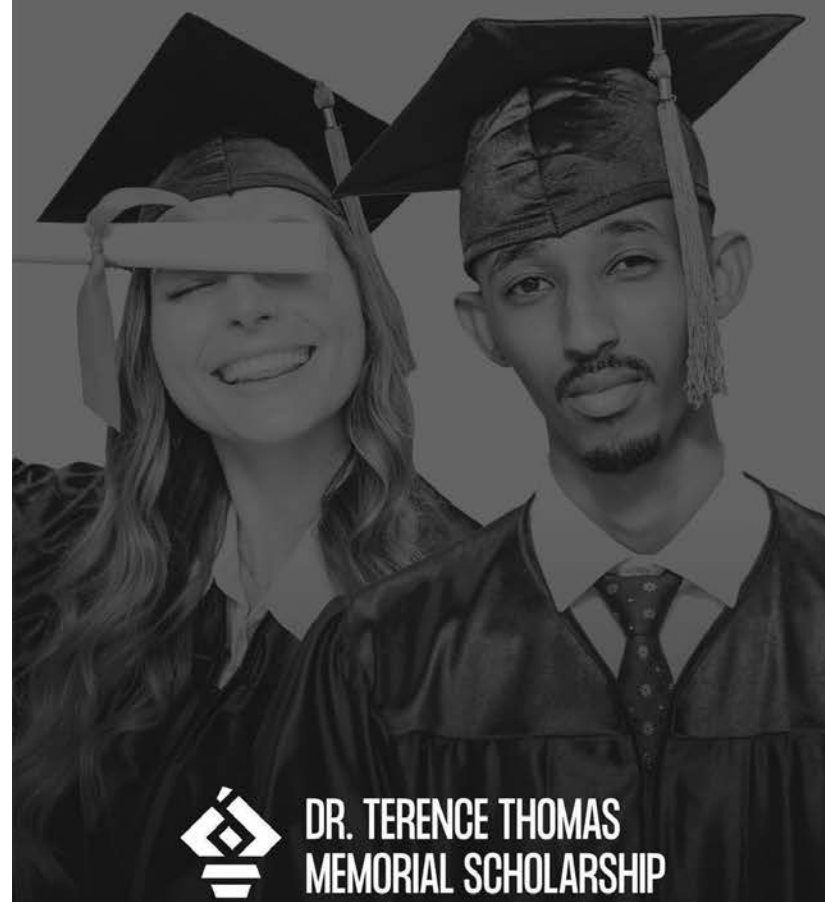

When I encountered a word I had trouble pronouncing, she would have me break down the word into syllables, pronouncing each one.

For instance the word, ‘intelligence’: ‘in-tel-li-gence.’ I would then say the word again whole.

I was using the ‘old-fashioned’ method of word pronunciation called ‘phonics.’ And it worked...every time!

She wasn’t going to rely on her fellow teachers to do right by me as it relates to my education and—more importantly—my ability to read. Same for my sister and brother.

MOM was going to do (and did) her utmost to make sure we were ready for the world. And the weapons of choice to take on that world was BOOKS and READING!

She equipped us well, espe-

cially me. I credit her for my love of books and reading, which led to my love of writing and use it to pursue a career (journalism).

Though she was retired from teaching and counseling, she kept on teaching, especially as it related to me, my sister and brother later in our lives. A devout Christian woman—and evangelist—she shared her steadfast faith in God with anyone who would listen or who she felt would benefit knowing her own spiritual walk.

She was also a Sunday school teacher at St. Mark AME Church (and Mt. Zion Baptist Church, the first church she joined when she moved to Milwaukee in 1958).

Her focus was small children and preparing them to be a christian young adult or adult.

Like with me and my siblings with reading, she was preparing them for the world—from a spiritual standpoint—so they would be ready to tackle the pitfalls and valleys they will surely encounter.

I will miss my ‘First Teacher’...my mom! I will miss her smile, her laugh, her fussiness, her diligence as it relates to order, her politeness, chivalry, kindness, intelligence, and her teachings.

She is now reunited with my pop, Thomas, Sr., teaching the angels...probably what they already know...but teaching them nonetheless!

Son Kenneth’s remembrances:

My mom, Christine Mitchell, was a loving mother. BUT, she was tough; a disciplinarian who didn’t play around.

When she said no to something you wanted—or wanted to do— that was it. It was “NO!”...end of story.

And she could give you “the look.” You, know...the “momma look.” Whatever you were doing that you shouldn’t be doing and she gave you “the look,” you had better stop what you were doing and go some place and sit down.

And mom wasn’t afraid to discipline other parents children in public (try doing that today and see what happens).

When my sister, brother and I were growing up we never...NEVER...acted out in public (you better not, unless you wanted the “momma look!”).

In church, in stores, at restaurants we were perfect little angels! No yelling, no excessive talking, no running around, and NO backtalk! She expected us to behave and act like Christine Mitchell’s children; even if dad wasn’t with us! You had better behave!...and we did.

Mom was also a good cook. She taught me a lot about cooking by simply allowing me to watch her work her magic. Dad (who also was a good cook), taught me barbequing, but mom taught me the kitchen basics.

Her specialty was potato salad. I’d watch her make it from scratch with mayonnaise, mustard, dill weed, green peppers, celery, boiled diced potatoes (of course), and boiled eggs. She would sprinkle the top with paprika when she was done. It was perfect every time.

Most kids wouldn’t like the idea of attending the same school (especially a high school) where their mom or dad

taught. Me? I liked it! There were perks to being a student whose parent taught at the same school he or she attended. Especially if you had a parent who was the head of the guidance department like mom was.

Sometimes she would give me a lift to and from school. Mom was also able to get my schedule changed and work release papers approved rather quickly so I could get out of school early to work. What took other students weeks took me only a few days, if that! Thanks mom!

Mom—and dad—also attended most of my high school football games, cheering me on whenever I made a tackle (I played linebacker).

At home we would entertain ourselves by watching television or laughing at a joke or what one of us did during the course of the day while at the dinner table (all five us; usually around six or six-thirty p.m.).

We’d also listen to music on the stereo taking turns dancing with mom or watching mom and dad dance; laughing and joking about how ‘ancient’ the folks music was or defending our music choices to them.

Sometimes my mom’s sister and daughter would come over. While mom and ‘Aunt Ernie’ (short for Ernestine) talked...and gossiped, Thomas, Carla my cousin Myra and I would watch television or listen to music, laughing and joking with each other.

Looking back, I realize I was blessed to have Christine Mitchell for a mother. There’s an old saying: Mothers raise their daughters but love their sons. My mom, Christine, both raised and loved us, all three (four when you count Myra-she was like a second sister) of us!

Rest in peace mom! I love you and I’m going to miss you!

- Careers in Urban Forestry & Code Enforcement

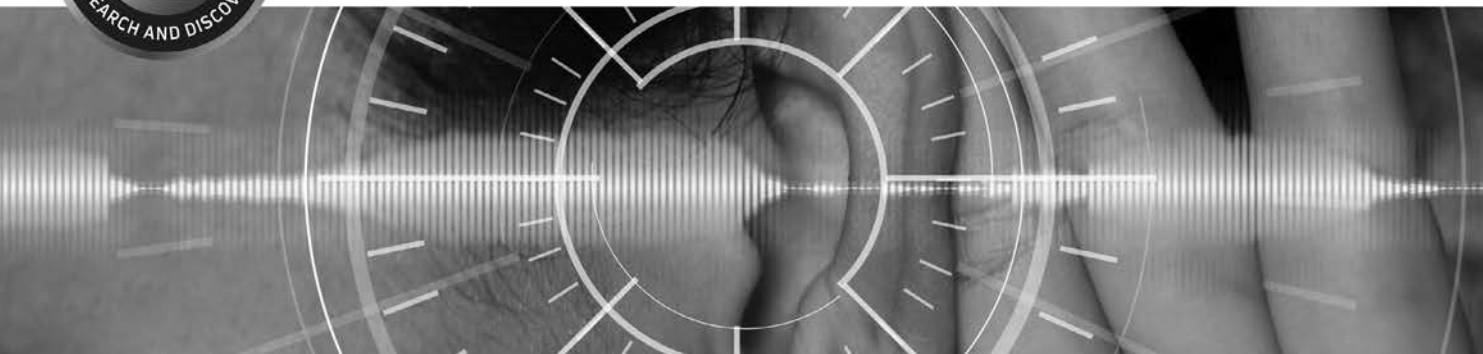
The Career Fair is sponsored by Pete's Fruit Market and attendees can take home fresh fruit for free.
