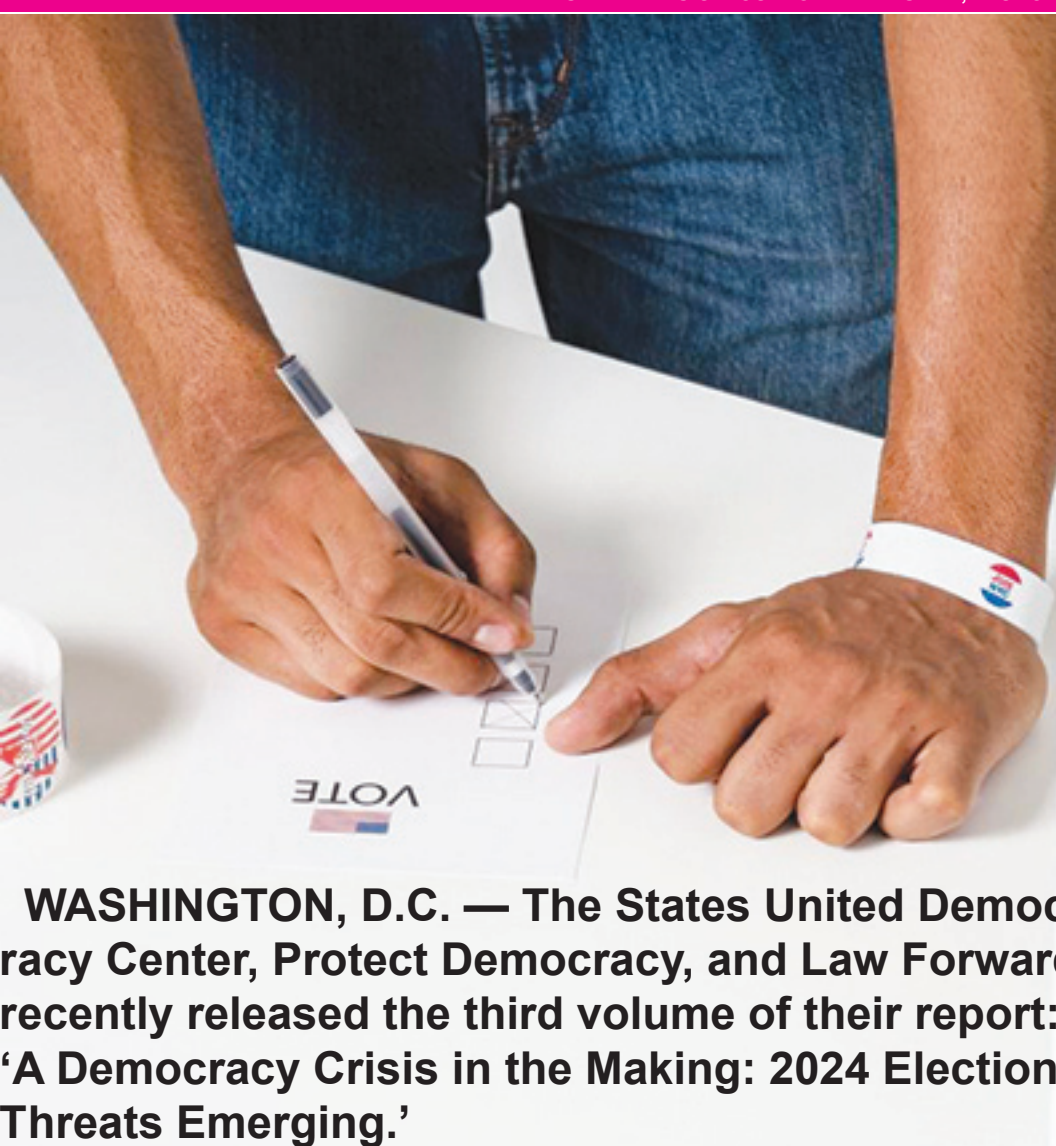

Review of the movie,

FLAMIN' HOT!



WASHINGTON, D.C. — The States United Democracy Center, Protect Democracy, and Law Forward recently released the third volume of their report: 'A Democracy Crisis in the Making: 2024 Election Threats Emerging.'

The report provides a detailed analysis of the nationwide trend of state legislatures considering laws that increase the risk of election subversion and its potential impact on election administration in the 2024 election.

The report identifies 185 bills in 38 states that would make it easier to manipulate an election, with 15 of them becoming law as of May 3 of this year.

This is on top of nearly 400 election subversion bills identified in previous reports that were introduced in 2021 and 2022, with 56 of those becoming law in 26 states.

While the 2022 midterm election results materially lowered the overall risk of election subversion in 2024, state legislatures continue to propose legislation that is designed to introduce chaos, delays, and confusion in our elections.

While the vast majority of these proposals have yet to become law, they keep baseless conspiracies about our elections alive and continue to undermine voter confidence in our election system.

In analyzing 2023 so far—and looking forward to what we could see in 2024—the report highlights some notable legislative activity this cycle:

The risk of an election subversion hasn't passed—it's just

evolved. State legislators are introducing these bills at approximately the same rate they have over the last two years. As of this past May, there have been 185 related bills introduced in 38 states, with 15 of them becoming law so far.

A new legislative trend has emerged with bills that would require a whole new election under certain conditions, but are based on flimsy grounds.

"STATE LEGISLATURES ARE DOUBLING DOWN ON PREVIOUS ELECTION SUBVERSION TRENDS, AND EVEN COMING UP WITH NEW WAYS TO INTERFERE WITH NON-PARTISAN ELECTION ADMINISTRATION. THEIR AIM IS TO CREATE THE CONDITIONS FOR PARTISAN POLITICIANS TO TRY TO DECLARE THEIR PREFERRED RESULTS, ORDER NEW ELECTIONS, OR OTHERWISE CAST DOUBT ON THE RESULTS."

These bills have been introduced in Texas and Arizona. Legislatures are also doubling down on previous trends with bills banning alternative sources of funding for election offices and requiring mandatory hand counts.

There are bipartisan efforts to prevent election subversion, too. In 27 states, legislation has been introduced and, in some cases, passed by members of both parties that proactively safeguard elections.

This includes providing enhanced protections for election workers and countering elec-

tion disinformation.

"Most Americans don't think about elections until they're headed to the polls. But states are making decisions right now that will determine how elections are run in 2024 and long after that," said Victoria Bassetti, Senior Adviser at the States United Democracy Center.

"What we're seeing right now is the threat of election subver-

sion quietly and creatively evolving. The packaging is slick, laced with terms like 'forensic audits' or nostalgic calls for 'hand counts'.

But what's inside is dangerous—and only creates more doubt and confusion. These proposals put our free, fair, and elections at risk."

"The threat of election subversion is still very much with us," said Rachel Homer, Counsel with Protect Democracy.

"State legislatures are doubling down on previous election subversion trends, and even coming up with new ways to in-

terfere with non-partisan election administration.

"Their aim is to create the conditions for partisan politicians to try to declare their preferred results, order new elections, or otherwise cast doubt on the results.

"We must remain vigilant and safeguard our elections from manipulation—because the decisions being made by statehouses across the country now

In America, we value our freedoms, and the will of the voters.

There are still legislative actors trying to pass policies meant to subvert future elections and allow them to ignore the will of the voters.

Together, we can resist their efforts, in 2024 and beyond."

in Flamin’ Hot



FLAMIN’ HOT

If tenacity was a superpower Richard Montañez would be in the Justice League inspiring people, all over the land. His indomitable spirit is the heart of this thoroughly entertaining and very amusing biofilm.

Montañez’s book, A Boy, A Burrito and A Cookie: from Janitor to Executive, is the source material for this compelling look at a guy who rose from a blue-collar worker in a Southern California Frito-Lay plant to vice president of multicultural sales & community promotions for PepsiCo. His story is a blueprint for the American dream. It’s also his personal version of events. Frito-Lay released a statement that is a bit more ambiguous: “We value Richard’s many contributions to our company, especially his insights into Hispanic consumers, but we do not credit the creation of Flamin’ Hot Cheetos or any Flamin’ Hot products to him.” So those who view this inspiring movie be forewarned—the truth of the matter might not be in every frame.

As written by screenwriters Lewis Colick and Linda Yvette Chávez and developed and directed by actress/director Eva Longoria, the narrative spins this tale: Born in the late 1950s to a family of Mexican immigrants in Cucamonga Valley, between L.A. and San Bernadino, Richard Montañez (Jesse Garcia, Quinceañera) marries his high school sweetheart Judy (Annie Gonzalez, Gentefied). He hangs out with the wrong crowd and doesn’t have a high school diploma. Prospects for living the good life are slim and with his dad Nacho (Emilio Rivera, Sons of Anarchy) constantly demeaning him, Rich has confidence issues.

He leans on his friend Tony (Bobby Soto) to get him a job at a Frito-Lay factory in Rancho Cucamonga, and that kickstarts his career. First day

on the job he’s the most inquisitive janitor they ever had. His superiors and colleagues try to dissuade him, but the man is unstoppable. He cozies up to Clarence (Dennis Haysbert, TV’s 24), an engineer, who mentors him. Rich’s curiosity, drive and determination make him question why Frito-Lay products don’t include outreach to the Latino community or the kind of seasonings they love: “They’re looking for themselves on those shelves.”

That fated day when PepsiCo CEO Roger Enrico (Tony Shalhoub, Monk) tells his employees to “think like a CEO” becomes that catalyst for his full-on entrepreneurial drive. Rich, Judy and his sons (Brice Gonzalez and Hunter Jones) experiment with sauces and flavors, homing in on Flamin’ Hot, a burn-your-mouth, great tasting coating that gives Cheetos and other F-L products bang. He breaks ranks, contacts Enrico, pitches his idea and the rest is history. Or at least Montañez’s history.

Wisely the script throws hurdles, challenges, setbacks and advisories in Ritchie’s path. Add in the father who never showed affection, and this sympathetic protagonist will have viewers rooting for him like he was a sports hero. Members of the Chicano community, who have faced similar circumstances and headwinds, will relate to his plight and spunk. Audiences in general will tear up as Montañez blossoms into a leader. A Norma Rae. A warrior for the working class. Add in an engaging plotline, vibrant characters, consequential relationships, mentorships and friendships and what’s on view becomes more and more compelling.

A less talented director would have taken a straightforward approach. But Longoria turns her creative juices up into overdrive. Garcia’s

voice, as Montañez, provides voiceover narration in English, Spanish and street language. The cast is animated. Funny scenes, and there are many, counterbalance the corporate drama, tortured father/son dynamics, thug life and smoochy romance. When Frito-Lay upper management is at a company meeting, Rich reimagines it with the executives acting like gangbangers. It’s funny, clever and shows that the film is not taking itself too seriously.

The love between Rich and Judy triumphs because Garcia and Gonzalez flesh out the characters. Haysbert has a quiet, stoic presence. Matt Walsh (Veep) as the obstructionist boss is a buzz kill—in the best way. When Clarence and Rich support each other, it’s very touching. The perfectly cast film (casting director Carla Hool) is augmented by an outstanding tech crew. Elaine Montalvo’s costumes, Cabot McMullen and Brandon Mendez’s production design, Federico Cantini’s cinematog-

raphy and Kayla Emter and Liza D Espinas’ editing contribute to the film’s success. And Marcel Zarvos (Fences) rousing musical score fills in any cracks.

This vibrant David versus corporate Goliath parable is worth retelling. Even if it’s not

the absolute truth. Why? Because it can inspire and empower people all over the land.

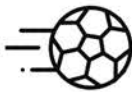

This sold out event has attracted over 1,000 attendees.

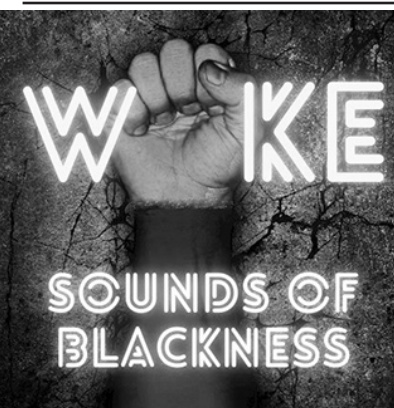

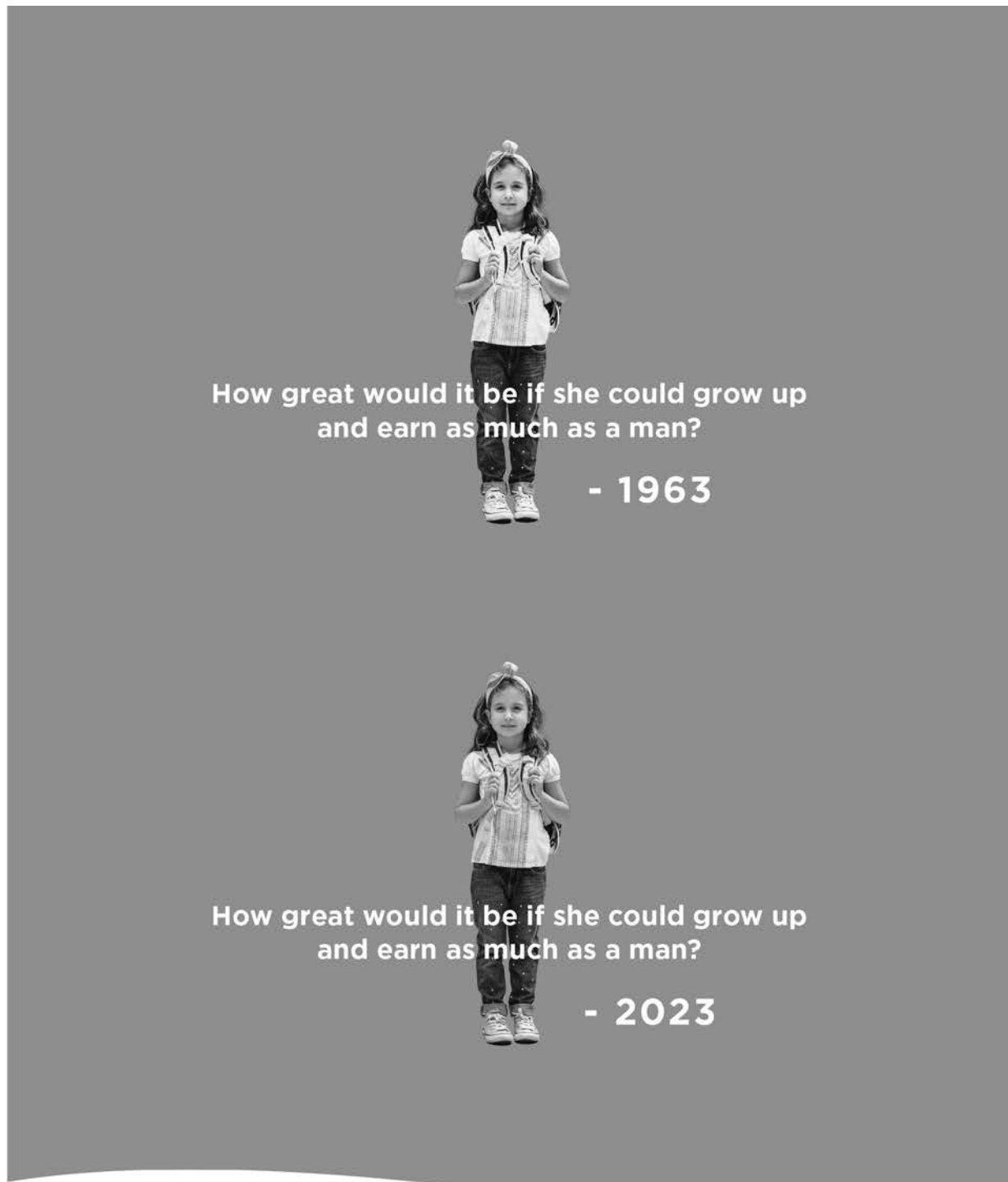

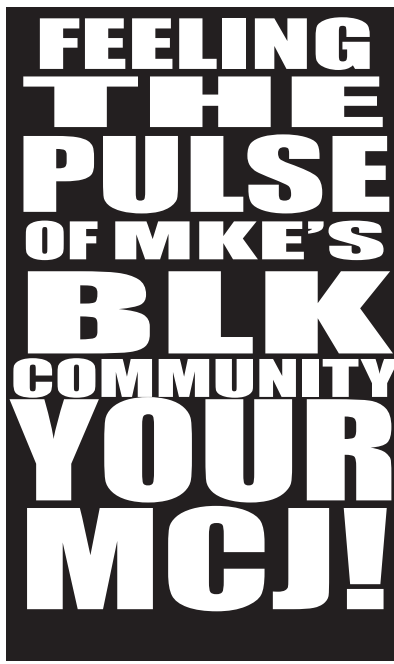

Public Notification of Completion of a National Traumatic Brain Injury Study Performed in Milwaukee County

A research study on the effect of Tranexamic Acid (TXA) versus Placebo on 6-Month Functional Neurologic Outcome in Patients with Moderate or Severe Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) has been completed in Milwaukee County.

About the research

This study was performed by the Resuscitation Outcomes Consortium (ROC) – a col-
laboration of 10 U.S. and Canadian sites that perform emergency research. A total of
1063 patients were enrolled in the TBI study. Milwaukee County was one of the ROC
sites where Milwaukee County Emergency Medical Services and the Medical College of
Wisconsin performed this research.

Of the 1063 patients enrolled nationwide, 105 patients were enrolled in Milwaukee
County between September 2015 and February 2017. 79 patients (75.2%) were male
and 26 (24.8%) were female. 59 patients (56.2%) were White, 35 (33.3%) were Black or
African American, 3 (2.9%) were Asian, and 8 (7.6%) were other or unreported race. 12
patients (11.4%) were Hispanic.

Study Results

The study found that among patients with moderate to severe TBI, out-of-hospital TXA
administration within 2 hours of injury compared with placebo did not significantly improve
6-month neurologic outcome as measured by the Glasgow Outcome Scale – Extended
(GOS-E).

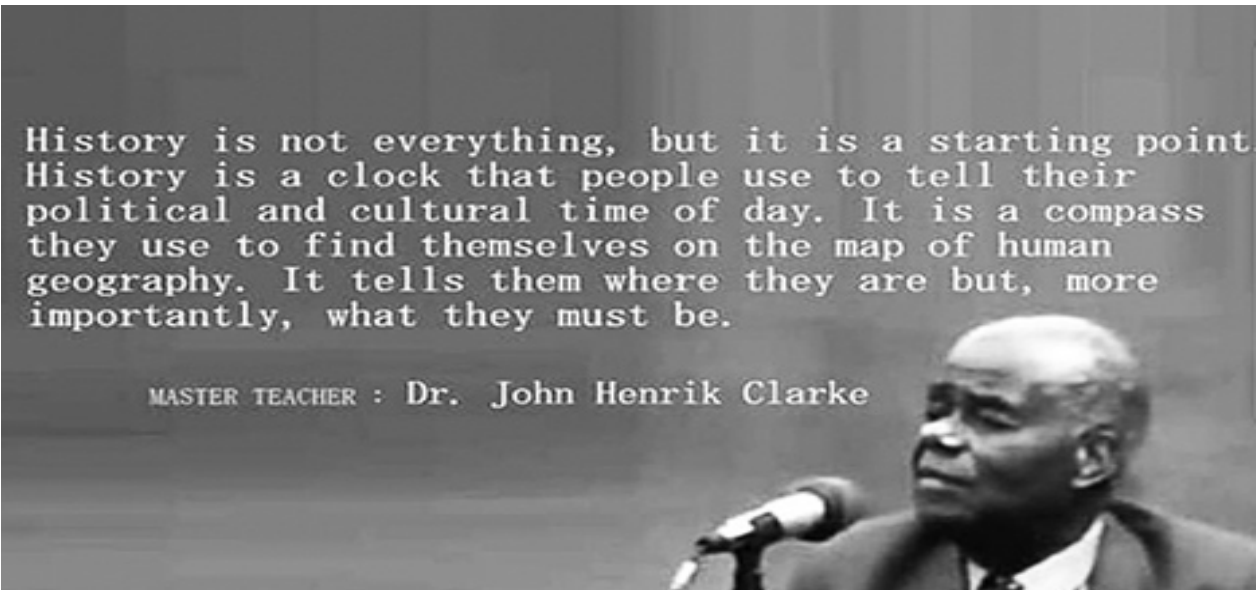

Public Notification of Completion of a National Out-of-Hospital Cardiac Arrest Research Study in Milwaukee County

A research study on the effect of an initial airway management strategy using laryngeal tube insertion (LTI), compared with endotracheal intubation (ETI), on survival among adults with out-of-hospital cardiac arrest (OHCA) has been completed in Milwaukee County.

About the research

This study was performed by the Resuscitation Outcomes Consortium (ROC) – a collaboration of 10 U.S. and Canadian sites that perform emergency research. A total of 1063 patients were enrolled in the TBI study. Milwaukee County was one of the ROC sites where Milwaukee County Emergency Medical Services and the Medical College of Wisconsin performed this research.

Of the 3004 patients enrolled nationwide, 875 patients were enrolled in Milwaukee County between October 2016 and November 2017. 542 patients (61.9%) were male and 333 (38.1%) were female. 452 patients (51.7%) were White, 276 (31.5%) were Black or African American, 11 (1.3%) were Asian, and 136 (15.5%) were other or unreported race. 52 patients (5.9%) were Hispanic.

Study Results

The study found that among patients with OHCA, a strategy of initial LTI was associated with significantly greater 72-hour survival compared with a strategy of initial ETI. These findings suggest that LTI may be considered as an initial airway management strategy in patients with out-of-hospital cardiac arrest, but limitations of the pragmatic design, practice setting, and ETI performance characteristics suggest that further research is warranted.
