

City of Milwaukee Health Department Urges Residents to Get Vaccinated this Flu Season

At this time each year, as the temperature begins to drop and Milwaukee residents head indoors, influenza (flu) and other respiratory illnesses begin to rise. While it's difficult to pinpoint the exact timing of peak flu cases each year, what we do know is that the virus typically circulates heavily in fall and winter months. To protect yourself and your family against the flu, the City of Milwaukee Health Department strongly encourages everyone six months and older to get their flu vaccine this fall.

During the 2022/2023 flu season, 38% of Milwaukee County residents received their flu shot. The immunization goal, set by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Healthy People 2023 initiative, is to increase the flu vaccination rate to 70% nationwide. To reach this goal, the City of Milwaukee Health Department provides residents with free flu shots, available without an appointment or proof of insurance, at the Northwest Health Center (7630 W. Mill Road), and Southside Health Center (1639 S. 23rd Street).

Additionally, starting this Saturday, October 7, the City of Milwaukee Health Department will hold COVID-19 and flu vaccine drive-thru clinics at the Southside Health Center and Northwest Health Center. The flu shot will be free and available to everyone 6 months and older, however, the 2023/2024 COVID-19 vaccine is only available to eligible individuals, including children (18 and younger) with

BadgerCare/Medicaid or uninsured, and adults (19 and older) who are uninsured. Children with private insurance and adults with private or public insurance are able to access COVID-19 vaccines through pharmacies and healthcare providers.

The drive-thru clinics will be open every Saturday during October from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. The full schedule is available at milwaukee.gov/Covid-Vax.

"In many cases, catching the flu can wipe out your energy levels, leaving you feeling drained, achy, and uncomfortable. It can also interfere with work, school, and time with friends and family. But for others, it can be very serious and potentially fatal," said Milwaukee Health Commissioner Mike Totoraitis. "Getting your annual flu shot is the best way to stay healthy and protect yourself and those around you."

Prevention is key to protecting ourselves against the flu this season. Recent studies show that getting vaccinated reduces the risk of flu illness by 40-60% among the overall population. While some people who get a flu vaccine still get sick, vaccination can make their illness less severe, reducing overall hospitalization rates and intensive care unit (ICU) admissions during hospitalizations.

The flu vaccine not only keeps you healthy, but it protects those around you, which is especially important for people at higher risk for serious complications, including:

Pregnant people

- Young children
- People 65 years and older, especially those living in group settings
- People with certain medical conditions, such as asthma or heart disease

In addition to getting the flu vaccine, it's important to keep yourself, your family, and others around you healthy by taking a few steps:

- Regularly cover your coughs and sneezes.
 - Wash your hands often.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Clean surfaces that may be contaminated with flu vi-

These everyday actions can help reduce your chances of getting sick and prevent the spread of germs to others if you are sick.

While flu and COVID-19 are both contagious respiratory illnesses, they are caused by two different viruses and require two different vaccines. Flu and COVID-19 vaccines are recommended for everyone 6 months and older. Both vaccines are safe, effective, and able to be administered at the same time. Save time by getting the flu shot and the 2023/2024 COVID-19 vaccine together.

In addition to the Milwaukee Health Department Clinics, many other pharmacies, healthcare providers, and local health departments also have flu shots and COVID-19 vaccines. Visit vaccines.gov, HealthyMKE.com, or contact your local health department to find an immunization clinic near you.



Is your name unusual or hard to pronounce? Resist the urge to change it. Here's why.

Originally from Tanzania, I was given the name Emil Kassamali Salehmohamed Remtulla at birth. When I emigrated to Canada in my 20s, I shortened my last name to conform.

Although this change made my name easier for people to pronounce, in shortening it, I lost an important part of my identity and heritage.

In the small Muslim town where I was born, everyone in my community could identify who my family was because my middle names were those of my father and grandfather. Remtullah, an Arabic name, means Grace of God (Rhemet-Allah).

Yet the shortened version evokes little more than the acronym REM (Rapid Eye Movement).

My first name, Emil, was given to me to remember a German who had saved my father from drowning when he was a child. No one knew how to pronounce the name.

Instead, they called me Milo (Meelo instead of Mylo) from Gerber's powdered baby formula, and my resemblance to the face displayed on its tins. Luckily, I decided to keep the name Emil.

My father also changed his name — not once, but twice. At birth he was called Kassamali Salehmohamed Remtulla, in accordance with tradition.

During his mischievous school days, when he became a cricket hero within the community, he was nicknamed Kassare (KASsamali SAlehmohamed REmtulla), which became his name from then on.

Eventually he moved to Calgary and changed his be-

loved Kassare to Remy. To honor him, I purchased the license plate KASSARE. Even in Calgary, Canada — a universe away from Africa elderly East Indians from Tanzania would stop me and ask after my car's namesake.

Looking back, I wish we had resisted the urge to adapt and westernize by changing and shortening our given names. So much history, culture, tradition and identity is packed into each of their syllables. A Tanzanian village. Ismaili muslim customs and beliefs. A near-fatal childhood accident. And the Grace of God.

To all those considering a name change, I suggest:

Consider why your name was chosen for you in the first place.

Names are not random selections. They often carry the weight of generations of tradition, family history, and cultural pride. They can represent stories of perseverance, love, hardships overcome, and more.

Look for instance at the story of my first name, Emil, having been given to me to honor a German man who had saved my father from drowning as a child. Every time someone calls me by my

I am reminded of this heroic act. Changing my name would be like erasing a chapter from my family's history book.

If your name has a story with meaning to you, think about what would you lose by taking that away.

What history and traditions — family or cultural — does your name reflect?

In certain cultures, names

are handed down through generations, acting as a link to ancestors and a bridge to the future. They can signify certain rites of passage, familial roles, or historic events. My original last name, Remtullah, encapsulated a beautiful message — the Grace of God. Altering it changed not just how it sounded, but also the deep-rooted spiritual and

How would you feel about removing any such symbolism that your name carries?

cultural significance it held.

Ask yourself what, aside from cultural blending, you stand gain from changing your name?

Will you find it easier to integrate socially? Will you encounter fewer mispronunciations when speaking with strangers? Or is there something else? Sometimes, the allure of fitting in can make the decision seem straightforward.

But what is the true cost? When I emigrated, I felt the pressure to "blend in", to make things easier for others at the expense of my own identity.

It's essential to evaluate whether the perceived benefits of a name change truly outweigh the loss of the unique essence and stories your original name holds.

Think about the rich experiences and exchanges that sharing your name with strangers can bring.

Names have the power to start conversations and forge connections. Sharing a unique or culturally significant name often prompts questions, allowing you to share stories, educate others, and deepen mutual understanding. In my case, my license plate, "KASSARE", sparked curiosity, allowing me to reminisce about my father's legacy and connect with others from Tanzania, even in a distant land like Canada. Our names can be bridges that connect diverse cultures, fostering respect and understanding.

Embracing our authentic names can be a powerful statement, not only for our sense of identity but also for future generations who will carry these names and the rich histories they encom-

Weekend Edition • October 6, 2023 • Page 3 pride; it's about preserving and cherishing the beautiful tapestry of cultures that make up our global community and being authentic ourselves.

Today, I'm proud to say that my younger son has switched back to the last name Remtullah.

And fortunately, more people now, including immigrants, are sticking to their original names than when I first came to North America decades ago.

Locals who might struggle to pronounce an unfamiliar name also have become more open to learning how.

Still, there's a lot of progress yet to be made. Be part of it!

KILLERS OF THE FLOWER MOON

Why in the 21st century is anyone making a film about the Native American experience from a white man's perspective? What is there to gain? Just great artistry that overshadows indigenous people.

Author David Grann based his novel Killers of the Flower Moon on information he gathered from FBI reports and archival materials. His mix of fact and fiction centers around the Osage "Reign of Terror" in early 1920s Oklahoma.

A tragedy that happened around the time of the Tulsa race massacre of 1921, when white racists, envious of Black wealth, terrorized and burned down neighborhoods.

Similarly, Osage tribe members have become rich from the oil on their lands. Thirty million dollars (\$400M in today's money) comes their way, making them the wealthiest people per capita in the world.

The mineral rights to their re-

servation are put in a federally managed trust, they receive royalties doled out by guardians. White men pray on them, marrying their women for their wealth. Scoundrels to the left. Scoundrels to the right.

The gold digging is heinous, the charlatans devious. Even worse, some truly sociopathic types marry and murder tribal members for financial gain. This is that story.

Not largely told from the standpoint of the Native American themselves, but from that of the perpetrators.

The novel highlighted the government's investigation. Now this film veers away from the Osage too, making them supporting characters in their own story.

A long-winded initial scene sets up the film's two main characters. Ernest Burkhart (Leonardo Di-Caprio) is poor as a church mouse when he reconnects with this uncle, William "King" Hale (Robert DeNiro). That rich cattle

rancher is a local kingpin in the town of Fairfax, in the county of Osage, Oklahoma.

Ernest becomes a car service driver to make money and one day he picks up a beautiful and rich Native American woman, Mollie (Lily Gladstone, Fancy Dance).

The two flirt. She's cautious at first. Pity she wasn't more vigilant, because when she opens the door to the henhouse, the fox comes in for the kill. Mollie: "Coyote likes money."

Members of the Osage tribe are being murdered in mysterious and sometimes brutal ways. Tribunals gather and assess the problems. Says Paul Red Eagle (Everett Walker): "When this money start comin," we should a known it came with something else."

Local law enforcement is inept, only carrying the bodies away. Mollie's family members start to meet the same fate, and she's nervous for the ones that are still

alive.

She should be, the killers lurk close. King acts concerned and pretends to be a friend of the Osage people.

He knows more than he's saying. There's no blood on his hands. Hard to trace anything back to him. When will people get wise?

Rarely in a good murder mystery does the storyline peg the killers right from the jump. This adaptation, written by Eric Roth (Dune) and director Martin Scorsese, does.

Viewers watch the scheming and slayings from the eyes of the culprits. Yes, there are scenes with Mollie and other Osage members showing their concern, going to the authorities for help and even to Washington DC.

But too much of what's on view does not involve them, the protagonists, solving their own problem, which is a standard rule in good screenwriting. This is a duBureau of Investigation (BOI) Agent Tom White (Jesse Plemons, The Power of the Dog) is sent by J. Edgar Hoover on what will be the bureau's first major homicide investigation.

Tom: "I was, uh, sent down from Washington D.C., to see about these murders." Ernest: "See what about 'em." Tom: "See who's doin' it."

Within the confines of the script's follow-the-devils structure, Scorsese proves that he is still a master storyteller—in the epic feature film format.

Though, many viewers, whose butts will grow numb from sitting for 3h 26 m, may wish his expertise was with mini-series or series, more appropriate formats. Regardless, the visuals are stunning.

The director and cinematographer Rodrigo Prieto (The Irishman) are artists. The angles, composition, interior and exterior lighting, and saturated colors are



bious creative choice at best. A gamble.

As audiences watch the gruesome killings they'll wonder, when will this stop? When will the Osagers grab a gun and kill the perpetrators who decimate their people?

Will they have satisfaction? Watching killing after killing becomes repulsive then macabre. Finally, when the calvary shows up, it's the white saviors.

visually stunning.

Scorsese is particularly adept at the movement within crowd scenes, from the extras to the leads.

He gives the entire cast, top to bottom, room to emote, exchange thoughts and express feelings from fear to rage.

The technical aspects fluctuate down and up. Jack Fisk's (The Revenant) production design is


