**We Must Work Together to
Support HBCUs' Sustainability

Not too long ago, the U.S. Department of Education sent all colleges and universities across the nation a notice, reminding them that they need to comply with the newly updated cybersecurity regulations published by the Federal Trade Commission (FTC).

The regulations – which include specifications such as implementing critical controls for information security programs, maintaining oversight of service providers, and designating an individual to oversee a school's cybersecurity infrastructure – came in response to an uptick in

ransomware attacks on schools around the United States.

While these regulations are certainly warranted in an age where personal data is becoming increasingly vulnerable to cyber-criminals, the penalties for failing to comply with the regulations – especially the withholding of federal needs-based funding under Title IV – pose an existential threat to schools operating under tight budgets.

Take Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), which have throughout their existence struggled to find the substantial funding that many state and private predominantly white institutions (PWIs) of higher education enjoy and who are already steeling themselves to deal with an expected surge of applicants following the Su-

preme Court's regressive decision to effectively end Affirmative Action admission programs.

The loss of Title IV funding would drastically affect around 80% of the student bodies at HBCUs and would have a consequential negative impact on the future of these vital institutions of higher education.

Endowments at HBCUs pale in comparison to those at the U.S.'s top ranked colleges and universities, with the overall endowments at all the country's HBCUs accounting for less than a tenth of Harvard's.

The gap in funding between PWIs and HBCUs isn't just because of smaller endowments, it's also because state lawmakers keep funds off HBCU campuses – in North Carolina,

Lead water pipes in the US accounted for 2.17 million years of life lost

MADISON, Wis., - As U.S. governments continue to grapple with how to address the millions of lead water pipes still in service, new research from the La Follette School of Public Affairs at UW-Madison is the first to connect lead pipe installation in the early 20th century to reductions in the American lifespan.

Lead pipe installation during this period of massive public works reduced longevity in areas that used the hazardous material by an average of 2.7 months for those whose exposure began in utero.

All told, using lead pipes in water systems may have accounted for 2.17 million years lost across the US.

Co-authored by the La Fol-

lette School's Jason Fletcher, the working paper adds to the large scientific literature on the negative effects of human exposure to lead. While researchers have long established a link between early life exposure and effects such as delayed cognitive development, this study's innovative research design allowed it to demonstrate lead's negative effect on longevity for the first time.

"We all know that exposure to lead is terrible for humans, especially at young ages," Fletcher says. "This study shows us that lead exposure not only makes our lives worse, but it also makes our lives shorter. This insight comes at an important time as the EPA discusses new rules to elimi-

nate lead pipes across the country, where more than 15 million people are still using service lines with lead in them."

Fletcher and his co-author, Hamid Noghanibehambari from Austin Peay State University and an affiliate of UW-Madison's Center for Demography of Health and Aging, used Social Security Administration death records from 1975-2005 that were linked to the 1940 US census. They identified counties of birth and cross-referenced the data with reports on water system construction for 761 cities across the US.

Because some cities or counties used lead pipes while others used different materials during the water system boom of the early 20th century, Fletcher and Noghanibehambari were able to compare the old-age longevity of individuals who were exposed to lead pipes with those who were not.

In addition to an overall reduction of 2.7 months on average, the study also found that the effects of lead pipes were three and a half times larger for nonwhites and two times larger for Americans from low socioeconomic statuses.

"As is often the case, these negative effects have not been equally distributed," Fletcher says. "People of color and people of little means who sought opportunity in large cities have been disproportionately affected by lead, and this continues to be the case in cities like Chicago and Milwaukee."

The study also found that these lead cities displayed lower educational attainments and early adulthood occupational incomes, which likely contributed to earlier deaths.

As an additional layer of analysis, it used World War II enlistment data and found reductions in height, an important predictor of overall health later in life.

This new paper is part of a larger research agenda that connects early life conditions and mortality.

Fletcher was recently awarded the prestigious 2023 Guggenheim Fellowship to further this research.

for example, legislators awarded N.C. State an extra \$79 million for research while N.C. A&T – the nation's largest HBCU – was given only \$9.5 million.

When it comes to access to technology, HBCUs also face an uphill battle with 82% of HBCUs being located in so-called "broadband deserts."

Despite their struggles with funding, and the fact that these schools constitute only 3 percent of four-year colleges in the country, HBCU graduates account for 80 percent of all Black judges, 50 percent of Black lawyers, 50 percent of Black doctors, 40 percent of Black members of Congress, and our country's current vice president.

HBCUs truly know how to do more with less, but they cannot be saddled with costly regulations that pose an existential crisis to their ability operate and be given no help to deflect some of the costs. Fortunately, however, there are businesses and individuals who see the importance of HBCUs to the Black community and are willing to lend their hands – and their dollars – to support them.

The Student Freedom Initiative (SFI), a non-profit chaired by philanthropist and entrepreneur Robert F. Smith and funded by major tech companies like Cisco, has raised millions of dollars to help HBUs comply with the Education Department's mandates.

Cisco alone donated \$150 million to the SFI with \$100 million allocated to bringing HBCU cybersecurity system upgrades and \$50 million going to establish an endowment to offer alternative student loans.

With \$89 million already distributed to 42 HBCUs across the nation, the initiative has already saved around \$1.5 billion in needs-based funding to these colleges and universities and is making strong inroads to helping these institutions meet the new cybersecurity regulations, but more is required if all HBCUs are to be saved.

Given the empowering impact HBCUs have on the nation's Black community and the future promise of a more inclusive America, it is imperative that more companies support the work the Student Freedom Initiative is doing to ensure these vital higher education schools can continue to educate and inspire future generations.

As Vice President Harris said, "What you learn at an HBCU is you do not have to fit into somebody's limited perspective on what it means to be young, gifted and Black."



GOING TO VOTE, GOING TO CHURCH? IN ALABAMA, DON'T RELY ON PUBLIC TRANSIT

ALABAMA IS AMONG JUST A HANDFUL OF STATES WHERE PUBLIC TRANSIT IS PAID FOR NOT BY THE STATE BUT CITIES AND COUNTIES, ACCORDING TO THEIR ABILITY AND WILLINGNESS TO PAY FOR IT.

When it comes to supporting public transit services, Alabama is near dead last among states, creating serious barriers for Alabamians just trying to get to work or to school, to church or to vote.

For people with disabilities, the situation can be life-threatening. That was the message at a recent press briefing hosted by the Alabama chapter of the League of Women Voters and the Alabama Disability Rights Coalition. "The road builders got their hooks into the money and kept every single bit of it," said Dev Wakeley with the non-profit advocacy group Alabama Arise. "It's deplorable and shameful. We've been dealing with the stark societal consequences of it ever since."

Wakeley was among a panel of speakers that included State assemblyman Neil Rafferty, along with community activists and would-be transit customers – including some who cannot drive – all of whom described how Alabama's substandard public transportation system affects their lives and what might make things better.

"Bound to fail"

According to Rafferty, most states use gasoline tax money to pay for their public transit systems. All of Alabama's neighboring states do. But in "the Heart of Dixie," an early 1950s amendment to the state constitution put those funds off-limits for that purpose.

So public transit in Alabama is paid for not by the state government but cities and counties, according to their ability and willingness to pay for it.

"We all need public transportation," said John Northrop of Alabama Coalition for Transit, "It's how I got through college." Birmingham buses carried him to and from Birmingham Southern College and his part-time jobs downtown when he didn't yet have a car.

But in Alabama, "Not enough people have had positive experiences with public transit, and don't understand the benefits," he said.

"When you have such a patchwork system in the state, it's bound to fail," Rafferty concurred. "People can't rely on it."

Few transit options for disabled Alabamians

Percy Garrett, currently on the legislative committee for the National Federation of the Blind, spent 22 years as an active-duty Marine, going around the world on land, air and sea, he said.

After offering a "semper fi" to Rafferty, he related his experiences since losing his eyesight the year after retiring.

"Now I'm stuck in Alabama as a caged Marine," he said. "I'm homebound. ... My goal is to do something about it."

But for now, he said, he can't get to legislative sessions in Montgomery. And "in the last election," he said, he called Houston County Transit to go vote, "and they said they couldn't do it. I had to call Uber, had to pay a massive amount of money just to go vote."

In 2018, Rafferty said, Alabama created a Public Transportation Trust Fund to support the state's transportation systems. But there's still no money in the fund.

So, he said, Alabama seems to have two paths forward: Fund the

trust fund or amend the state constitution.

"We're being held in captivity since 1952," said Barbara Manuel, who is vision-impaired. She described an array of seemingly arbitrary obstacles she had to overcome to get even the minimal transportation services available.

Some of her neighbors, she said, can't even get to important medical appointments.

"Legislators, we are asking you to please, please, hear our voices. I would go even further and ask you to place your (car) keys in your desk drawer for one week, and try to access public transportation.

"Then you would be able to see some of the issues that we face

The Milwaukee Academy of Science (MAS), an independent charter school founded in 2000, is expanding to a second campus that will enroll four-year-old kindergarteners through fifth-graders beginning in August 2024, Chief Executive Officer Anthony McHenry announced Thursday.

Responding to demand from parents and the community for additional capacity, McHenry said the second MAS campus will serve up to 600 additional scholars and be located in a recently vacated school building at 1441 N. 24th St.

MAS recently added 250 middle and high school students on its main campus due to increased enrollment and retention in the elementary grades.

Despite that expansion, applications to the school continued to skyrocket, leaving approximately 1,600 students on the waiting list as recently as last year.

"Families deserve a high-quality education for their children, and today represents a significant opportunity for us to answer that call," McHenry said.

"In addition, these students will eventually transition to our high school, which we believe will enhance Milwaukee's workforce.

"Our students will graduate to pursue postsecondary education and then select careers in high-demand STEM fields."

Said MAS Board Chairman Bill Reitman: "I am more energized than ever for what is on the horizon as we advance

MAS' strategic goals of making a positive impact on the lives of our scholars and their families and in the community."

The 24th Street campus will be renovated before opening, and it will replicate the original campus' STEM focus, approach to learning, parent engagement strategy, curriculum, culture and overall design. In its first year, it will serve K4 to fifth grade. It will eventually grow to serve K4-8th grade. At that time, the MAS school district will serve a total of 2,000 students.

"The 24th Street campus will be renovated before opening, and it will replicate the original campus' STEM focus, approach to learning, parent engagement strategy, curriculum, culture and overall design. In its first year, it will serve K4 to fifth grade. It will eventually grow to serve K4-8th grade."

MAS has had waitlists for every grade level for the past four years and currently enrolls 1,400 kindergarten through 12th-graders from 31 Milwaukee ZIP codes. During this time, MAS has met or exceeded expectations on state report cards, and for the past nine years MAS has had 100 percent senior graduation and college acceptance rates for its students. It graduated its largest class of students – 72 – in 2023.

"As a parent of a current seventh-grader, I am proud to see the growth of our school," said Sharonda Williams, who serves as a parent representative on MAS' board of directors. "I feel connected to this campus expansion space because my siblings and daughter attended school there, and

I believe it's a needed investment in our city's children."

"What we know for certain is that far too many of Milwaukee's Black young people do not have access to opportunities to learn in safe, loving environments. The Milwaukee Academy of Science offers a rigorous curriculum, a strong community and a fun learning environment where our scholars not only persevere, but thrive," McHenry said.

Applications for fall 2024 student enrollment on MAS' second campus will open Feb. 1, 2024. Employment opportu-

here in the state of Alabama."

"We can't solve everything overnight," she said, "but at the same time, a level of civility and dignity is due to anyone."

For the 32% of Alabamians whose disabilities make driving themselves impossible, reliable transit services would be a God-send.

Private vs public transportation

Lawyer Laurence Povinelli and his wife, both legally blind, moved to Huntsville, Alabama's largest city, from nearby Madison. They were working at the Army's Redstone Arsenal, which is located between the two and employs 39,000 people, but there was no paratransit service available in Madison.

"We had to set up our own private driver network through connections," he said. "Unfortunately, most people do not have access to such resources."

Where public transit of any sort is available, he and others said, using can be overwhelmingly difficult due to limited hours, range and service interruptions or, especially in the case of paratransit services, having to make reservations days in advance.

Those things make it hard to keep a job, or even get hired. Jill Rossitor, of the National Federation of the Blind, Alabama was deemed legally blind at age 18 and has never driven a car, depending instead on friends, other drivers, or her now-grown children. She counts herself as very fortunate.

"The things that make life important are not just going to the store and to work," she said. But for her, "just to take my children to a park was an impossibility." So were after-school activities, such as football, cheer, or dance, she said, and when it comes to going to church on Sundays, there's no hope of getting there via public transportation, even now. None of the services her community has run on Sunday mornings.

For some situations, people will suggest she use "ride-sharing" options such as Uber or Lyft, she said. But a trip that would cost her \$3 on the bus is \$33 that way.

"It's not worth it. I would just take a personal day. But how many of those do you get?"

Infrastructure Law

Alabama is one of just three U.S. states that doesn't fund public transit, but doing so would be a solid investment, Wakely said.

Although six of Alabama's seven representatives in the U.S. Congress, and both senators opposed the 2022 Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, it nonetheless provided more than \$76 million for transit projects across the state, including \$11 million for Birmingham and \$4 million for Montgomery.

Getting elected officials to approve anything that looks like a new tax, Wakely admitted, "is a heavy lift," so a general fund appropriation might be the way to go.

But, however they do it, he said, "the return is HUGE."

More federal funds are available to match state allocations dollar-for-dollar for staffing needs, for instance, and when it comes to "capital outlays" – things like buying new buses – the match is 4-1. Some of those federal dollars, if the state reaches out for them, might never leave Alabama. New Flyer's Anniston facility is one of the largest electric bus factories in the United States. Already, in 2019, Huntsville's Alabama A&M University successfully electrified its campus bus system.
