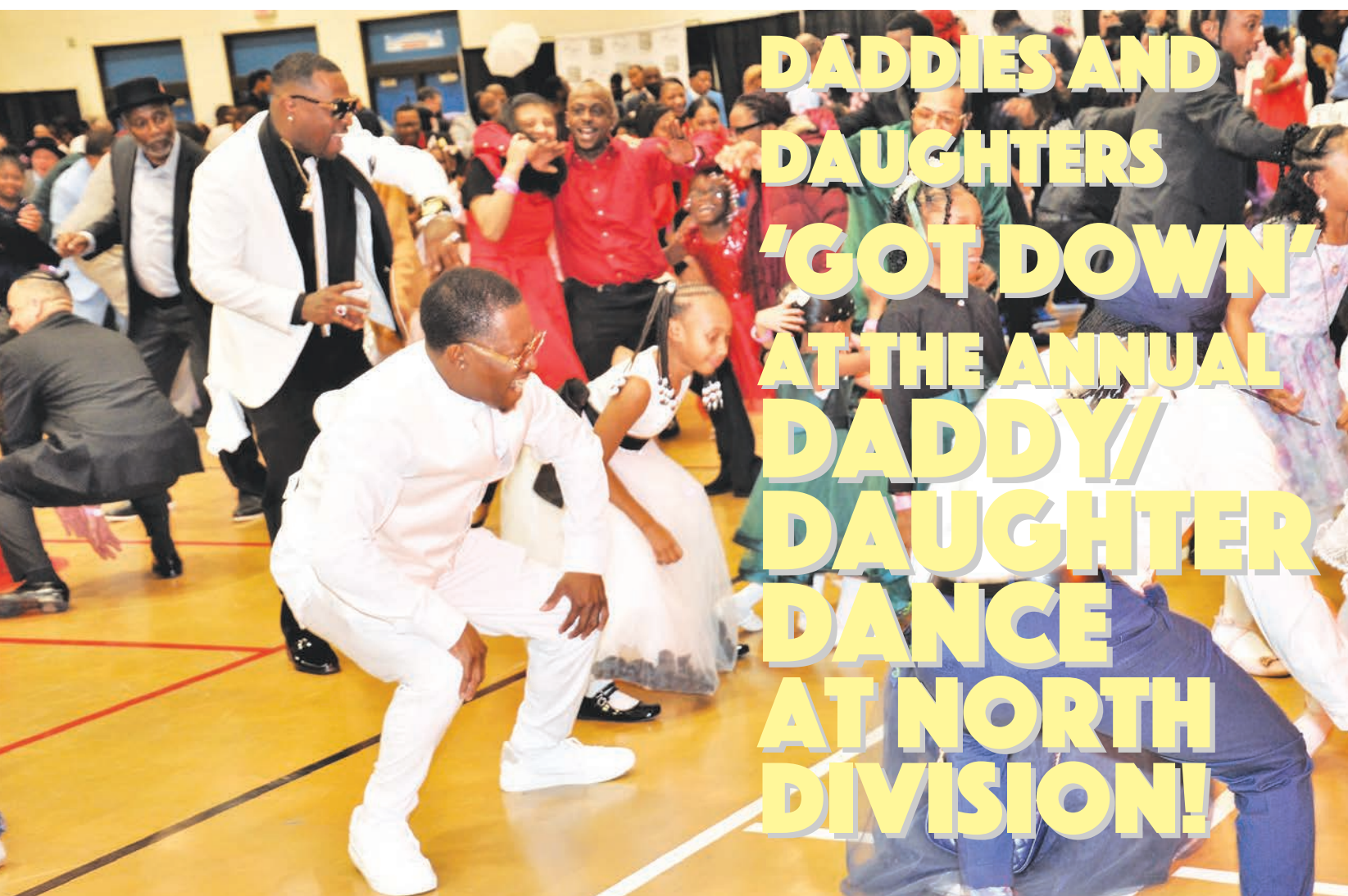

Fani Willis' testimony evokes long-standing frustrations for Black women leaders

Fulton County District Attorney Fani Willis is used to prosecuting high-profile, challenging cases.

But as she parried questions about her own personal conduct from the witness stand against the legal teams for defendants her office has accused

of election interference, many Black women recognized a dispiriting scene.

"It absolutely feels familiar. There is no secret that the common sentiment among Black women in posi-

tions of power (is that they) must over-perform to be seen as equals to their counterparts," said Jessica T. Ornsby, a family litigation attorney in the Washington, D.C., area.

"Here, Ms. Willis is being scrutinized for things that are not directly related to her job performance, in ways we see other Black women regularly picked apart," Ornsby said.

Willis testified during an extraor-

inary hearing that could result in her office being removed from the state's election interference case against former President Donald Trump. She was questioned Thurs-

day about her relationship with the attorney leading her office's prosecution, Nathan Wade.

Willis and Wade have acknowledged they had a "personal relationship" but have denied any improper

conduct. Regardless of the legal merits of the claim by Trump and his co-defendants that Willis' conduct was im-

proper, relationships between coworkers are often prohibited or must be disclosed in many workplaces, including at major private law firms.

Willis has faced criticism from many legal experts otherwise supportive of the case due to her relationship with Wade.

Still, few people who find themselves in such circumstances have the most intimate details of their lives aired so publicly.

In interviews with The Associated Press, many Black women leaders expressed frustration and disappointment that public attention had turned from the merits of the criminal case to the personal conduct of the Black woman overseeing the prosecution.

For them, the court challenge to Willis echoes familiar experiences of tests of their authority, competence and character.

"I love that she stood up for herself, but I hate the fact that she had to," said Melanie Campbell, president and CEO of the National Coalition on Black Civic Participation.

She said that when she saw video of the testimony she felt: "Why are you all treating her like SHE'S on trial?"

"Black women feel like we're

under attack. And that's a fact," Campbell said.

Willis, who has a reputation as an incisive trial attorney, was visibly

testified. "These people are on trial for trying to steal an election in 2020. I'm not on trial, no matter how hard you try to put me on trial."

upset when she took the stand Thursday to reject allegations that she improperly profited from the prosecution because of the relationship.

"It is a lie," the district attorney said of allegations in court filings.

"You've been intrusive into people's personal lives. You're confused. You think I'm on trial," Willis

For many Black women, the inquiries into Willis' romantic and financial life were rife with tropes and accusations often unfairly levied at Black women.

Keir Bradford-Grey, a partner at the law firm Montgomery McCracken in Philadelphia, found the questions about Willis' personal life "disgusting."

She also said the episode had disturbing implications for Black women in leadership roles: "I can't imagine a world where we have to continue to be treated like this as we seek leadership roles, and we do them well."

LaTosha Brown, co-founder of voting rights group Black Voters Matter, despaired of the fact that Willis was having to answer questions about "whether she has money, whether she has cash or not and why she has cash, who she sleeps with, who is she flying on an airplane

diverted attention away from the allegations against Trump.

He has been indicted four times in the last year, accused in Georgia and Washington, D.C., of plotting to overturn his 2020 election loss to Democrat Joe Biden, in Florida of hoarding classified documents, and in Manhattan of falsifying business records related to hush money paid to porn actor Stormy Daniels on his behalf. Trump has railed against individual prosecutors, judges and the legal system as a whole. But he reserves special, often coded rhetoric

"So, what is this really about?" Brown added. "When white power, particularly white men, are being held to account ... the first thing to do is to disqualify the people that are holding them accountable," especially when those people are Black women.

Scrutiny of Willis' personal life has

for his attacks on women and people of color.

"Donald Trump knows that he can make an easy target for his base out of a Black woman," said Brittany Packnett Cunningham, a racial equality activist and podcast host. "What we should recognize is that across many indictments, this particular attack to disqualify through her per-

sonal activities is uniquely pointed.

"Of all the prosecutions that he has endured, this is not the approach he has taken. But he took that in particular with a Black woman."

The testimony from Willis also reminded many of similar public questioning of Black women's leadership, including the recent ouster of former Harvard University President Claudine Gay and the confirmation hearings for Supreme Court Justice Ketanji Brown Jackson.

"Images from the court proceedings also reflect many of our day-to-day experiences: defending ourselves against a sea of individuals who do not share our background and harbor biases both implicit and explicit," Ormsby said.

On Friday, Willis' team did not call her back to the stand. While the court weighs whether she will be disqualified from the criminal case, it remains largely in limbo.

"We're not talking about the things that actually matter, which include, but are not limited to bringing this country at least a tiny step back from the brink of fascism.

"No, instead we're evaluating a Black woman's looks, character and professionalism when all she did was do her job," Cunningham said.

"The standards by which they are judged, with their actions scrutinized at every turn, just seem to be a little different, not a little, a lot different than what I see of our male counterparts," Bradford-Grey said.

"I wish there would be a day that women stand together and say we want the same bar of treatment that men get."

Honoring Black History month by closing the Black homeownership gap

Historically, Milwaukee’s Black neighborhoods have struggled to gain access to homeownership.

Housing discrimination is rooted in a long history of racist policies.

Policies like redlining meant Black Milwaukeeans were denied access to equal loans and housing opportunities.

Banks refused to lend in predominantly Black neighborhoods, leading to a lack of investment opportunities, further infrastructure, and a decline in housing stock.

While White borrowers were receiving financial assistance in buying homes, Black borrowers with even higher incomes were denied mortgages.

While the Fair Housing Act was enacted in 1968, there continues to be discrimination in lending today.

According to this study, Black families are 1.8 times more likely to be denied a loan (2019 HMDA data), even when they have the exact same debt-to-income ratio as their White counterparts.

Impact Today

“In a study by the Joint Center for Housing Studies of Harvard University, the racial homeownership gap is most striking for Black households. At 41.7 percent, Black households have the lowest homeownership rate nationally—30.0 percentage points lower than White households.”

Milwaukee’s legacy of redlining and housing inequality has had profound implications.

A 2020 study by the Center for Economic Development at the University of Milwaukee, found Milwaukee ranked 49th among the nation’s 50 largest metros for Black homeownership.

While we know that closing the persistent gap between Black and white homeownership in Milwaukee and beyond will require serious change at an institutional level, Acts Housing is dedicated and focused on increasing Black homeownership.

Here’s How:

- Acts Power Pack Workshops: education cohorts for families with the most barriers
- Individual Development Account (IDA): Access and matching/incentive funds

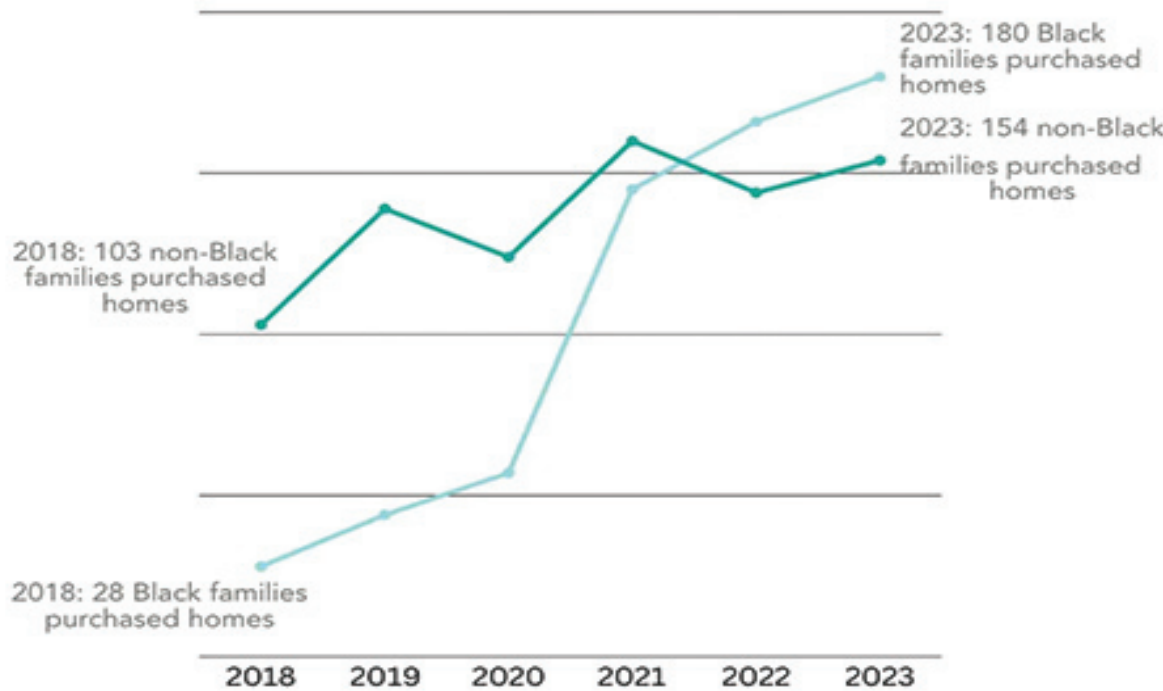
- Down payment assistance grants: DPA helped families already working with Acts repair their credit and attain a mortgage loan.

Closing the Gap

Five years ago, with Acts support, Black families made up ~20% of families purchasing homes for owner-occupancy. In 2023, Black families made up 54% of homebuyers.

In 2023, \$28.5 million was invested in the community through home purchase, rehab, and down payment grant funds, and 230 kids were in stable housing.

Acts Housing is not stopping here. We’re committed to continuing our work in closing the Black homeownership gap and supporting Black families in achieving stable housing and generational financial stability.

The difference between true history and 'his-story'!

It wouldn't be Black History Month without my fulfilling my mission to clarify the difference between true history and 'his-story.'

As a history chef, I attempt to remove poison mushrooms from 'his' recipe and add truth to the mixture fed to a hungry—albeit culpable and looks beyond the garnish.

My reform recipe removes harmful and unhealthy ingredients, including distortions, half-truths, alternate facts and outright lies---and replaces them with healthy alternatives like collard greens and smoked red beans and rice—cleansing the colon and fueling muscle growth.

Some of those falsehoods have been ingrained for so long that they are part of our sub-conscience.

As such, 'his-story' contributes to our generational ignorance and dysfunctionality. It also impedes our sociocultural and economic independence and foundational growth.

'His-story' has provided the plaster for a deceptive cultural mask, one in which we view ourselves as second-class, inferior beings, content to be impoverished and dependent on political entities for our survival.

Intermingled in my historical 'corrections' are lesser-known historical events intentionally excluded from the massa's books, government (public) school curriculums, and political policies.

For example, you could include in the category the disingenuous invention that in 1976 Federal Court John Reynolds responded to Milwaukee's system of educational apartheid with an 'integration' plan.

In fact, that lie was perpetrated by every local newspaper --save for this one.

But the truth is Reynold could not order forced or voluntary 'integration' as the concept is a nonsensical oxymoron.

Simply put, the legal response to segregation is desegregation, not integration.

The same is true of the schools in the South that were forced to accept Black students after the 1954 court order.

From that perspective, Judge Reynold's decision failed to achieve the intended goal, as evidenced by the fact that today, the Milwaukee Public Schools (MPS) are more segregated than they were in 1976, and the academic

achievement gap is much wider.

A list of 'his-torical' falsehoods that occupy my stated goals' starts with the near-universal acceptance of 1619 as the initial arrival of African slaves to these colonial (not American) shores.

As ridiculous as it seems, I have been castigated, beat up, and even peed upon for disputing that lie.

When I first wrote about the actual date (1526), a White

government (MPS) school teacher accused me of doing a disservice to the 'po Negro chilins.'

Most recently, a representative of one of the 1619 projects responded to a message I sent that 'too much was at stake' to correct the historical mistake.

By that, she meant millions of grant dollars and souvenir products---tee-shirts, conferences, and books---would be compromised with the truth.

For the record, it is questionable if those Africans who were brought to Jamestown in 1619 on a ship appropriately named the 'White Lion' (as in lying) were 'slaves' until they arrived and were purchased as chattel.

The Africans were originally from the kingdom of Ndongo, incorporated as Angola, one of the few African nations that fought against enslavement.

Nonetheless, Portuguese slave traders captured an undisclosed number of Angolans.

They forced them to trek hundreds of miles to the coast to board the San Juan Bautista, one of three dozen Portuguese

and Spanish slave ships engaged in human trafficking.

In a disingenuous religious act that would resonate for centuries, the captive Angolans were sprinkled with 'holy' water by a Christian priest before being boarded on the San Juan Bautista.

I can only assume that the purpose of 'blessing' was to seek their god's approval.

The ship embarked with over 300 Africans on board, half of whom died during the middle passage.

Many succumbed to disease from being trapped and packed like sardines in the lower compartments, forced to urinate and defecate on each other. Others were thrown overboard when food ran low.

(A side note: In the 1990s, Milwaukee scientist Clarence Grimm conducted a study showing those captives who survived did so because their physical makeup allowed them to endure the humid conditions of the ship. The result was hypertension in their descendants, including myself.)

When the San Juan Bautista approached Mexico in the summer of 1619, it was attacked by two English pirate ships, the White Lion and the Treasurer.

The crews seized and di-

Allow me to be more specific: The first African slaves arrived in Winyah Bay (South Carolina) on August 9, 1526, as part of a Spanish expedition.

Lucas Vázquez de Ayllón brought 600 settlers to start a San Miguel de Gualdape colony.

Records say the company included an undisclosed number of enslaved Africans.

The land was given to the colonialists by royal Spanish charter, meaning someone 3,000 miles away claimed the land despite the presence of its Native inhabitants.

That thief backfired as the colony didn't survive, and some believe it was because the Native Americans turned on them—as they should.

(Another point of reference: It is known that Spanish explorers took over Portuguese lands in the Caribbeans, including their 'stock'—slaves.

One of the lieutenants under Juan Ponce de Leon was a free African conquistador, Juan Garrido, in 1511.)

Several 'accounts' of what happened to liberate the land from the invaders. Each ends with the African slaves freeing themselves.

One reason this 'history' is obscured is that in Europe, if not America, it represents the first 'successful slave rebellion.'

By all accounts, de Ayllón died shortly after Christening his settlement in San Miguel de Gualdape on September 29, 1526. His second in command, Captain Francisco Gomez, assumed leadership.

The captain hoped to reinforce the settlement despite Native American attacks and a shortage of food, which was impaired because the Indians (as they were called) saw through their forked tongues and kept them isolated.

Taking advantage of dissension among the conflicted settlers, the African slaves rebelled and 'treated the settlers as they had been treated.'

Another narrative suggests the Natives attacked, freeing the slaves who joined them in cleansing the earth of the plague of colonialization.

Some Africans married into the Indian tribe. Others moved southward, establishing their own community called Obama Ville...

Actually, only the last sentence in that narrative is made up. Either way, score one for the Africans and zero for the racists.

As I noted, this history has been lost, stolen, or strayed for several reasons.

What can't be confused is that our history and that of the bigots who used stolen labor—in the most inhumane slave system known to mankind—didn't start in 1619.

There can also be no doubt that millions of African souls are lying on the Atlantic Ocean floor due to the Middle Passages.

Nor that from 1526 until two years after the Civil War (figure that out), 12.5 million African Slaves were brought to North America. My estimate is about 3.2 million are still in slavery—if not physically then mentally.

My top ten lies and distortions of his-story will be published in this week's WEEKEND edition.

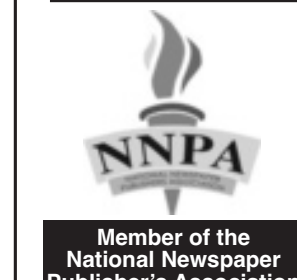

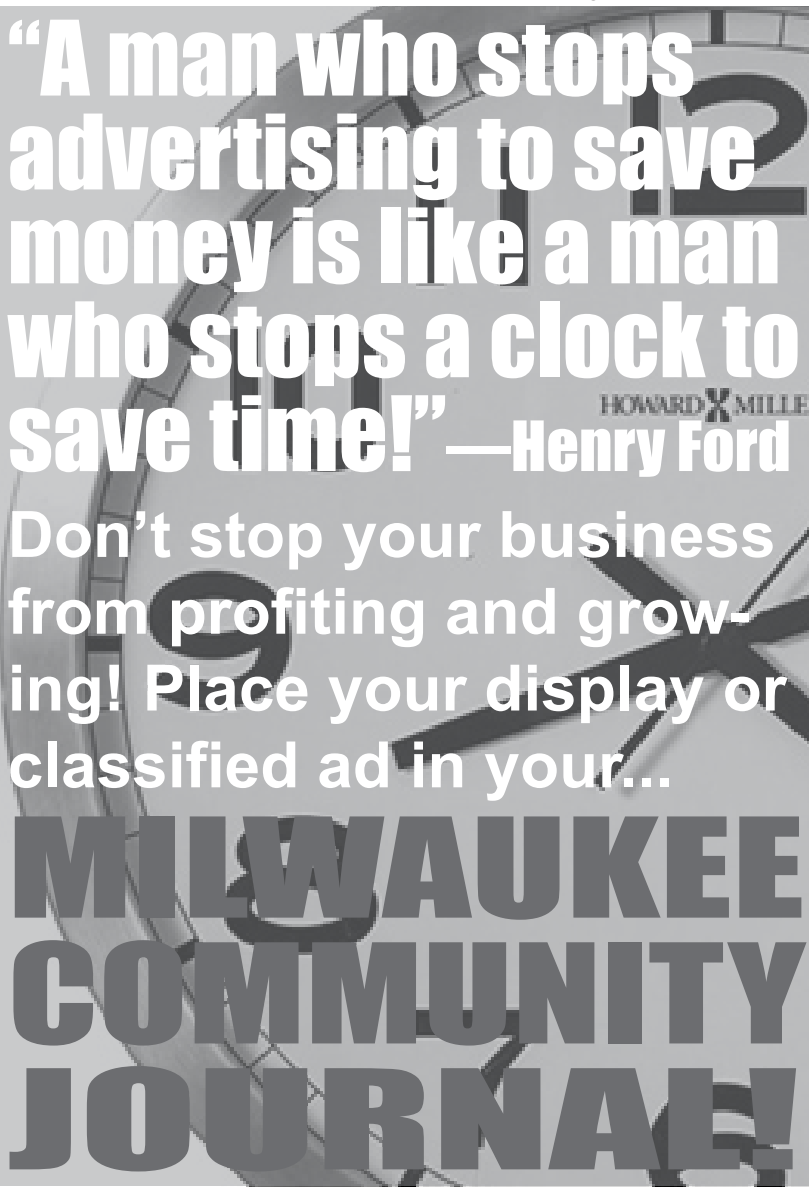
