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What's the Cost of U.S. Student Debt?

As nearly 45 million Americans and counting owe over \$1.7 trillion in student debt, what's the future of college affordability?

Though the Biden administration has made historic strides in passing student loan forgiveness initiatives, ongoing lawsuits by Republican-majority states and a possible change of White House leadership this election year

threatens their survival.

Meanwhile, the lifting of pandemic-era freezes to federal student loan payment forces borrowers nationwide to choose once again between greater debt or affording basic needs — underscoring the importance of forgiveness programs.

At an Ethnic Media Services briefing, student loan experts and a borrower who got over \$100,000 in student loans forgiven explained what forgiveness programs have been launched and expanded under the Biden administration, which have been cut, and what's next for student loans.

Student debt relief under Biden

The Biden administration has approached debt relief in two ways: through broad relief, by approving "upwards of \$153 billion in stu- (continued on page 3)

dent loan forgiveness for around 4.3 million borrowers," and through targeted relief, by reforming existing programs, said student loan lawyer and author Adam Minsky.

Efforts to provide relief have met with staunch political opposition, however.

The administration's first attempt would have forgiven up to \$20,000 in federal student loan debt for millions of borrowers per the Heroes Act of 2003, which let the Education Department enact waive federal loan program regulations "in response to economic harm caused by a national emergency — in this case, the pandemic," Minsky said.

Adam Minsky, student loan lawyer and author, explains Biden's latest plan to provide student-loan debt relief, including the five pathways for borrowers to get relief.

This was challenged by a coalition of Republican-majority states led by Nebraska and Missouri, and was struck down by the conservative-majority Supreme Court last June on the grounds that mass debt forgiveness was not expressly mentioned in the act.

The administration's current, second attempt at broad relief involves a separate legal authority — the Higher Education Act, "which does expressly allow for the waiver or cancellation of student loan debt, although it's only been used in limited circumstances to date," explained Minsky. "The program could go live for borrowers as early as the fall, but most people expect this will be challenged in court as well, though it stands a stronger chance of surviving a legal challenge."

Other, targeted initiatives include the IDR Account Adjustment giving forgiveness credit to borrowers unable to pay income-driven loan plans in 20 or 25 years; the Public Service Loan Forgiveness (PSLF) program providing forgiveness in as little as 10 years to borrowers who work for non-profit or government organizations; and the Save Plan, exempting borrowers earning below a certain income for payment and shortening the forgiveness timeline for some earning above it.

Many of these initiatives have also met with opposition. For instance, the Save Plan, in which at least eight million borrowers have enrolled, "is subject to two new, separate lawsuits brought by 18 Republican states, including some of those that blocked Biden's first mass debt relief plan," said Minsky.

"A common criticism is that these programs are unfair to people who have already paid their debt," he added.

"But people saved for retirement on their own all their lives before Social Security came around, and we still implemented it. You could argue it was unfair to them, but we still generally think the measure was positive."

The landscape for borrowers

"We're seeing significant government actions to address the student debt crisis,

Many of these programs are not ensured by law. They're dependent on who is in the White House — so the stakes are very high for future students, and for those who have debt now."

The impact of student debt and relief

For borrowers with snowballing interest, debt relief can be the difference between retiring at all and working for

retired mental health social worker.

"I spoke English, I was a citizen, and I couldn't find a good job. Finally, I went to school for professional mental health counseling — I always loved helping people."

Virginia Brown, a mental health counselor and social worker, explains how she was eventually able to get her student loan forgiven. Brown re-

to go to Orlando Rollins, a private college," she continued. "People said 'You're going to get into all this debt,' but it was the only choice."

"Afterward I had two, three jobs at a time working in non-profit social service, but interest grew the debt beyond \$100,000 even as I was paying.

Day-to-day, I had to choose between paying up to \$900 a month on a loan or the power bill, and I couldn't afford moving closer to my family in Jersey City, where I am now," she said.

"I found out I was able to get my debt forgiven in 10 years through the PSLF program, by transferring my loan from private to federal and continuing to work in non-profits," Brown explained.

"In mid-2021 I got an email saying it was forgiven, and I couldn't believe it. I sent it to my son wondering if I was dreaming."

"I had jobs that I liked, providing an important social service to the community, but due to student loans I was stuck geographically and professionally," she added.

"Without that relief, I wouldn't have been able to retire or live close to my family. Debt forgiveness is life-changing."

but the effect of this is that borrowers are confused about whether or not they will be receiving forgiveness, what the parameters are, who is eligible, and what the consequences are for non-payment," said Michele Shepard Zampini, Senior Director of College Affordability at The Institute for College Access and Success.

Michele Shepard Zampini, TICAS Senior Director of College Affordability, discusses profit motives in the student loan industry, and explains why we need to examine the role of colleges in student debt and the student loan industry.

In a decisive election year, tens of millions of borrowers are also transitioning from the unprecedented pandemic payment clause — which, through March 2020 through fall 2023, exempted federal student loan payment and interest accrual — back into payment.

For many of these borrowers, "monthly payments are too high for them to afford. Basic living expenses like rent, food, child care, health care, or transportation are competing with loan bills," Zampini explained.

While 92% to 93% of outstanding student debt is federal, many of those with non-federal, private or state loans "are not eligible for these relief initiatives at all."

"If Biden is reelected, I think the administration will continue to try and expand these initiatives," she continued. "If it changes, we've heard the platform from the other side: not to invest in these student aid programs, or even overturn them."

The city License Division is now accepting applications for vendors looking to operate in the Capitol Drive Density-Limited Zone, Alderman Lamont Westmoreland said recently. A density-limited zone is an

area for food peddler vehicle operation by permit only.

The maximum number of food peddler vehicles allowed in this zone is determined for the specified area based upon density and traffic safety, as determined by the Common Council in consultation with the Department of Public Works and the Milwaukee Police Department.

For months, Alderman Westmoreland has been working to address traffic safety and cleanliness issues connected to parked vehicle vendors along the impacted stretch of W. Capitol – located within the 5th Aldermanic District (this in addition to his effort to keep the vendors'

trucks distanced from parking in front of brick and mortar food establishments to reduce business disruption).

He said the new zone offers excellent opportunities for vendors to do business in the 5th District.

"The new density-limited zone addresses parking issues, obstructed vision for motorists, and cleanliness issues, and I strongly encourage vendors to apply today to do business along this key stretch of West Capitol Drive," Alderman Westmoreland said.

The attached map shows the

affected street segments of the Capitol Drive Density-Limited Zone (along W. Capitol Dr. from N. 76th St. west to the city limits at Mayfair Rd.).

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Biden world reacts to Morehouse backlash, signals president may address concerns in speech

EXCLUSIVE: "What he has been doing and will continue to do leading up to the speech is listening very closely to all the concerns raised and making sure that he addresses them," Stephen Benjamin, senior adviser to President Biden, told theGrio. **By GERREN KEITH GAYNOR**

After some backlash to last week's announcement that President Joe Biden will deliver the commencement address at Morehouse College, officials from within the president's orbit tell theGrio the president hears those concerns loud and clear, and may even address them in his upcoming speech later this month.

"What he has been doing and will continue to do leading up to the speech is listening very closely to all the concerns raised and making sure that he addresses them either in the speech or separate and apart from that," said Stephen Benjamin, senior adviser to President Biden and director of the White House Office of Public Engagement. He added, "The war is obviously a significant issue of discussion ... all around the country. Probably most vividly on college campuses right now."

Since Morehouse President David A. Thomas announced President Biden as the keynote speaker for the all-male college's 140th commencement on May 19, a number of students, faculty and alumni expressed opposition as a result of the Biden administration's policy to support Israel's military operation in Gaza against Hamas, a U.S.-designated terrorist group, resulting in the deaths of more than 34,000 Palestinians.

Outraged over the war and Biden's role in it were expressed in a campus town hall between Morehouse students and President Thomas, as well as a letter circulated amongst Morehouse alumni that called the invitation to the president a "moral disaster and an embarrassment to the college."

Cedric Richmond, national co-chair of the Biden-Harris campaign and a Morehouse alumnus, told theGrio that he is "proud" of the Morehouse student body for "being engaged" and "caring about human life."

"The president is also concerned about civilian casualties, Palestinian people and their safety," added Richmond, who noted that the president has "criticized" Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's handling of the ground operation in Gaza and "committed significant resources" to Palestinians in Gaza.

The former Biden White House senior adviser said the president would "continue his efforts" for "long-lasting peace and a two-state solution" between Israel and Palestine.

Despite actions by the Biden administration and campaign to lead to a peace solution in the Middle East, some alumni see the president's visit as a direct conflict with the legacy of Morehouse's most illuminating alumnus: Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

"Dr. King was famous not only for his leadership in the Civil Rights Movement but for risking his reputation [and] relationships to speak up against the Vietnam War near the end of his life," said Edward Mitchell, a Morehouse graduate and national deputy director at the Council on American-Islamic Relations (CAIR). "That legacy of speaking out against an unjust war is what college kids around the country are living out right now."

Mitchell, who signed the aforementioned letter circulated amongst Morehouse alumni, said that while he understands why the college would normally welcome the president of the United States to deliver a commencement speech, the timing is "terrible."

"When I was at Morehouse, there's no way they would have invited George W. Bush to speak in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina, or at the height of the Iraq War," he explained. "So why is it acceptable?"

Mitchell said the Biden administra-

tion is "living in an alternate reality if they think that they can speak" at Morehouse and "not face serious blowback from young Black men who overwhelmingly oppose the ongoing genocide in Gaza."

He said until Biden stops "enabling an unjust, genocidal war," Morehouse is "not the place for him to be," adding, "His presence is really distracting from what should be a celebration focused on students and their parents without the specter of protests or disruptions."

Though it's unclear whether students or graduates themselves will protest the president's visit when he comes to the campus, Mitchell told theGrio, "Students should decide on their own how they want to respond to this and what they feel is appropriate."

He added, "I know students are angry and frustrated and they may decide that speaking out is more important than having a peaceful ceremony, that is totally up to them to decide."

Controversy aside, Benjamin and Richmond, the two most prominent Black men advising Biden inside the White House and on the campaign trail, say the president chose to participate in Morehouse's graduation ceremony to honor the HBCU's rich history of producing Black male leaders.

"When a president accepts to speak at a school, he is acknowledging the value of the school, the worth of the students, and in Morehouse's case, the impact and legacy that the school has had on this country's history," said Richmond, a former U.S. congressman from New Orleans, Louisiana.

"Whether it's by being a school teacher, or an engineer, or lawyer, or a doctor, or going on as the Secretary of Homeland Security like Jeh Johnson. We, at the school, produce people who change communities and change the world."

When President Biden delivers his remarks on the Morehouse campus in the heart of Atlanta, he will become

the second sitting U.S. president to do so. The first was President Barack Obama, the nation's first Black commander-in-chief, whom Biden served as his vice president.

"I think that it raises Morehouse's profile once again," Richmond said of President Biden's upcoming visit.

Though some critics have dismissed the president's Morehouse commencement speech as a campaign stop to shore up Black voters in a battleground state, Biden officials pushed back against the suggestion. Instead, they argue that the president has an authentic relationship with the campus and an understanding of its legacy.

"He considers Dr. King his personal hero ... and has his bust on display with only a handful of others in the Oval Office," said Benjamin, who also noted that "several" Morehouse grads work in the White House executive office, including in the West Wing. He added, "He considers the connection with Morehouse real."

Richmond, who recalled talking

about Morehouse with Biden during his 2020 campaign, said the Biden-Harris administration holds a "reverence" for Morehouse and the greater Atlanta University Center, which includes Spelman College, Clark Atlanta University and Morris Brown. Richmond said that is why the president delivered one of "his most important speeches on civil rights and voting rights" on the campus in 2022 and Vice President Kamala Harris included Morehouse on her "Fight for Our Freedoms" tour last year.

The Biden campaign official said the president sees the commencement speech as an opportunity to remind the 2024 graduates of "all the things that he has been able to accomplish specifically for the Black community," because "[they] were engaged" in the last presidential election.

"It's more about making sure that they understand the impact that they have had, that they will have, that we need them to have," Richmond noted, "and not necessarily in a political context, but in a community, country-type context."

Benjamin said President Biden's upcoming speech to the hundreds of Black male graduates will be about centering the students and their families.

"When the president comes to speak, it's meant to be a memory for a lifetime," he said. "My sense is that he'll speak to those things that unite us, more so than those things that divide us."

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
