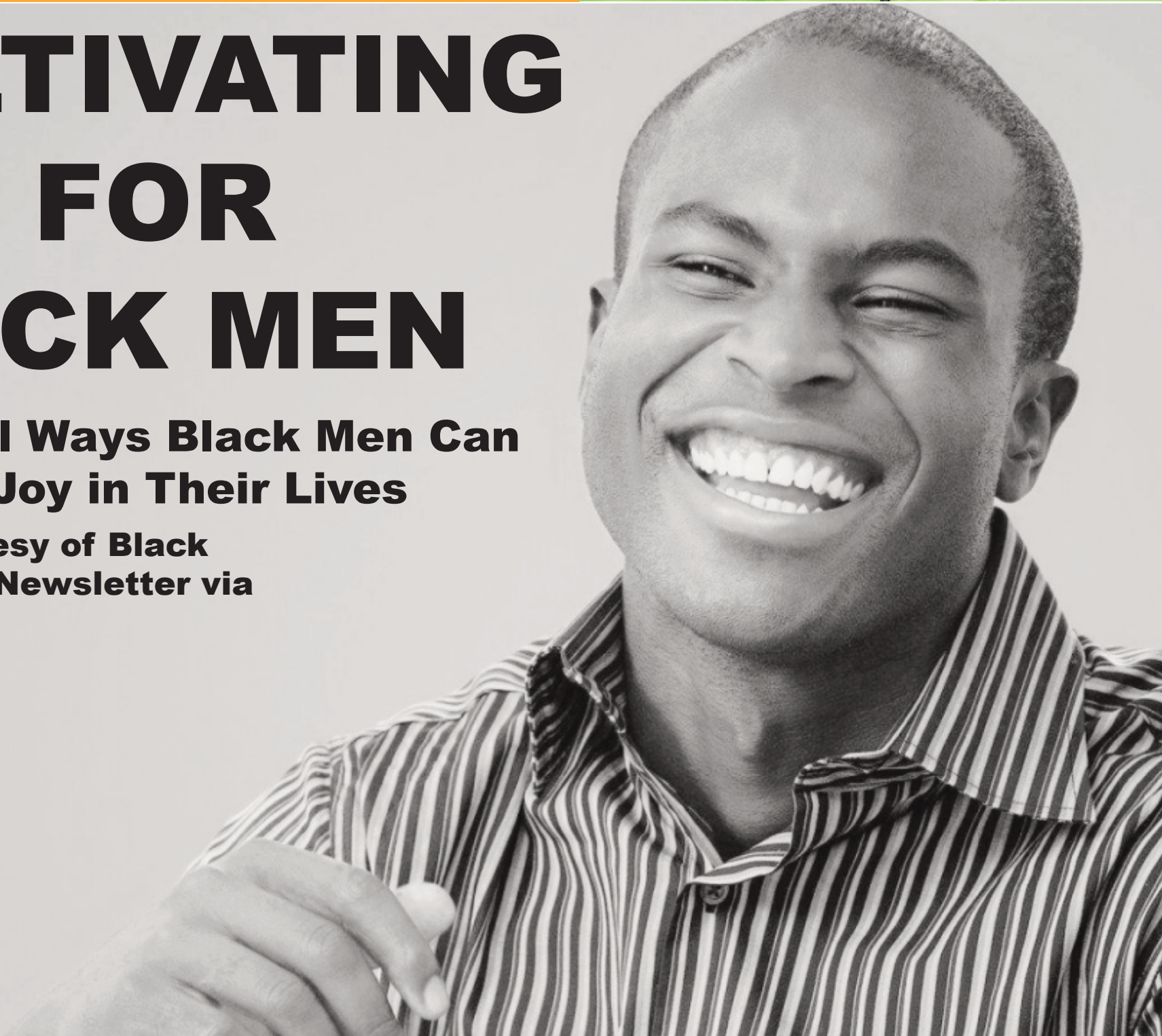

# Milwaukee Non-Binary Star Opposite Oscar-Winning Actor in "EMPEROR OF OCEAN PARK"

Non-binary, genderfluid, pan-sexual actor, filmmaker, and conservationist Paulina Lule (Pow-lee-nah Loolay) is a Ugandan-American actor and filmmaker.

They were born and currently reside in Milwaukee, Wisconsin and are set to star opposite Academy Award "Best Actor" winner Forest Whitaker in the MGM+ upcoming series "Emperor of Ocean Park" from the executive producers of the Emmy and SAG Award-winning series "Shameless," which premieres on Sunday, July 14th. Based on the best-selling novel by Stephen Carter, "Emperor of Ocean Park"

follows 'Talcott Garland' (Grantham Coleman "The Americans"), whose tranquil existence is upended by the death of his father 'Judge Oliver Garland (Forest Whitaker). His sister 'Mariah Garland' (Tiffany Mack "Jessica Jones"), a former journalist and ardent conspiracy theorist, questions the manner of his death and thinks he was the victim of foul play. Paulina Lule plays Tal's wife 'Kimmer Garland', a high-powered lawyer on the verge of being appointed a federal judgeship who sometimes neglects the feelings of those around her, including her husband, and who becomes a suspect in Mariah's twisted conspiracy. The series will feature 10 episodes and premieres on

MGM+ on Sunday, July 14th. Paulina's acting training began at the Joanne Baron/DW Brown Studio in Santa Monica, CA where they completed a 2-year Meisner Technique Conservatory program. They then auditioned for and were accepted into the inaugural class of the Los Angeles branch of the award-winning Identity School of Acting. Since then, they have appeared in several television shows including recurring roles on Marvel's "Agents of S.H.I.E.L.D", Netflix's "LOVE", NBC's "The Good Place" ABC's "Scandal", "For the People", and "General Hospital". They have also appeared in the festival hit feature film HONEY BOY opposite Shia LaBeouf and Noah Jupe. Paulina also studied film directing and screenwriting (continued on page 3)

# House of History Launches Website Celebrating and Centering Black LGBTQ+ Voices

Racial bias in the LGBTQ+ community, and homophobia and transphobia in the Black community has left Black queer and trans people out of history.

Their stories missed or dismissed. Pages of history lost forever. The House of History seeks to change that, and to connect people to Black

LGBTQ+ history in creative and compelling ways.

With funding from the National Endowment for the Humanities and the Greater Milwaukee Foundation, the House of History has interviewed over 20 Black LGBTQ+ elders, produced over 30 videos (with a feature-length



documentary in the works), commissioned artwork from five young BIPOC artists, and touched the hearts of all who have been part of the project.

Their website brings together these dozens of people and their contributions in a remarkably intimate way.

Visitors to the website are immediately greeted by house mother Janice Toy, who

wears a sequined rainbow dress and sits in an elegant high-backed chair. The chair appears in the House of History logo too, inviting us to pull up a seat and be regaled by stories from Janice and the other Black LGBTQ+ elders she introduces us to.

“Welcome to the House of History,” Janice says in the first video of the website’s introduction. Through text and additional videos, Janice’s personality shines through as she goes on to explain her role as mother of the House of History, how the project came to be, and why it is so important.

Under the “Stories” section of the website, you encounter an array of illustrated portraits with names. Janice is there to tell you about each person behind the picture, like looking through an old family photo album. But first, upon se-

at the Academy for Creative Media at University of Hawaii-Manoa and received a Master of Fine arts from Chapman University in Orange County, CA.

Their films have played at several festivals such as the Austin Film Festival, Pan African Film Festival, and Milwaukee Film Festival as well as winning awards at the Bronze Lens Film Festival and Women in Film.

As a filmmaker, they prefer to focus on thought provoking projects that delve into topics subjects such as race and identity.

They are currently working on a project that hits home personally with ties to their brother who sadly passed away in 2022 due to gun violence.

The film, which takes tones from the horror/zombie genre infused with BOYZ N THE HOOD street drama, focuses on the Sherman Park area of Milwaukee – one of the most highest condensed populations of formally incarcerated people in the US.

The film will focus on inmates being released from prison as they navigate their new reality on the outside, only to be met with a zombie apocalypse virus threatening to destroy them.

The virus is a metaphor for racism and the challenges that most incarcerated people face once returning to the free world outside of prisons.

When they are not acting or creating new projects through film, they are focused on building up their local Milwaukee community through conservationism, spending the entirety of 2023 working with the non-profit Zoological Society of Milwaukee and the Milwaukee County Zoo in arts education programming.

They ran the Kohl’s Wild Theater Program which provides theatre for children centered around wildlife conservation and teaching audiences how to show empathy for and protect wildlife species around the world.

They have also worked with the non-profit Milwaukee Film teaching filmmaking, screenwriting and acting to local up-and-coming filmmakers in their Focus Finder accelerator lab.

lecting a portrait, you see what the person looks like in real life as a video appears.

This is a condensed 4-minute version of their full oral history interview, edited to help you quickly connect with the Black LGBTQ+ elder and learn fascinating things of significance to them personally and historically.

The accompanying biographical text is a bold departure from the norm, with Janice describing the person in the first-person. Her recollections are interspersed with commentary, reminding us how personal and enjoyable history can be.

The House of History website, an experiential historical collection, beautifully demonstrates what we've all been missing and why we need more Black LGBTQ+ history.

"I wish there had been a place for me to go as a young gay man struggling with my identity, to see all the diverse and amazing people who came before me and learn from their challenges and triumphs," says Chris Allen, President/CEO of Diverse & Resilient and one of the featured Black LGBTQ+ elders.

"Participating in the House of History project has been an incredibly rewarding experience. Being a part of documenting and sharing the history of Milwaukee's Black LGBTQ community has been profoundly meaningful. Realizing that there are so many individuals seen as elders and icons in our community with unique stories to tell underscores the importance of preserving this information for generations to come."

Nateya Taylor, creative director for the House of History, says, "I feel like I was gifted a wealth of wisdom that I can take with me as a guide as I grow as a Black queer person."

She hopes other younger people like herself will gain the same wisdom from the project and "feel confident in knowing they can live their lives by their own terms and be who they want to be." She hopes that younger

people "feel inspired to create spaces and events centering Black LGBTQ+ folks, continuing the legacy of our elders, who created spaces that are unfortunately no longer open in Milwaukee, like Black gay bars."

The House of History appeals to and creates allies as well. "I appreciated the need for this work," says project director Dr. Brice D. Smith, a white trans man, "but I had no idea it would impact me the way it has. I've been rewired. Hearing these stories and connecting with those who shared them changes a person. For me, I see racial disparity more and racial difference less. What a gift this project is, and what a blessing to have been part of it." When asked what the website means to her, Janice Toy says, "This is a major step forward to not only be honored for my work and accomplishments in the community.

But also a way I can help preserve the legacy of the many Black elder LGBTQ members, and the up-and-coming, soon-to-be elders." She adds, "Once you click that link, you open the doors to Big Brothers and Big Sisters, and you even get a bonus for free: me, the House Mother! Now everyone loves free."
