I had the opportunity to hold space with a couple fathers as they reflected on their fatherhood journey. I hope you enjoy reading about how their life experiences fortified their fatherhood.

Most of us have experienced "show-n-tell" during our formative years. Show-n-tell was a fun way to share and celebrate our perceptions of a particular experience with our peers.

Prior to meeting with the fathers, I asked them to be prepared to share a show-n-tell item that reminded them of their children.

**Robert Holloway: Father of two sons and two daughters.**

**So, Robert, share your show-n-tell item?**

Robert held up a mirror and replied, "I brought a mirror. This reminds me of my children because my children reflect how I am doing as a father and how my wife is doing as a mother."

Robert paused briefly, "It can be very burdensome some-

times. I am always thinking, is this the best decision to make if I am thinking five, ten years ahead about my children? There is always that pressure there. Family is a big thing for me.

has transitioned. They are looking at me, relying on me to bring this family in a particular direction."

Robert went on to share how his family are survivors of the Tulsa race riots.

He spoke at length about the businesses his family owned and how his family survived. He said, "My Great Grand-

father gathered the children and hid them.

My Father's Father was in the wagon that my Great Grandfather hid on somebody's land outside of town. Since then, my Father was born.

Then I was born. Those are the things that come to my mind when I think of family. I have a responsibility to these

children."

**Richard Thomas – Father of one son and one daughter. So, Richard, what show-n-tell item did you bring?**

Richard said, "Baby Grogu from Star Wars. Baby Grogu had a lot of power. He was a force and sensitive being. Baby Grogu is from the same species as Yoda of the original Star Wars. When my son was born, I dressed him in a Baby Grogu outfit for his first pictures.

When my daughter was born, a lot of my nights were spent watching old episodes of Star Wars the Clone Wars.

# The Real History of Juneteenth and the Reason It's a Federal Holiday! (Hint: "Freedom Day" Has Nothing to do With Freedom)



The premise for the Juneteenth holiday is to celebrate the date enslaved people in Texas found out they were free.

On June 19, 1865, seventy-one days after the Civil War ended, Major General Gordon Granger rolled into Galveston, TX, with his army and announced that slavery was over.

His announcement wasn't

based on the South losing the war but the Emancipation Proclamation, which freed Texas enslaved people, provided they made their way to a free state or territory.

Granger was really telling the slaves that Abraham Lincoln had freed them two and a half years earlier.

Juneteenth is being promoted as "Freedom Day." But there's a hitch: nobody was freed on Freedom Day; enslaved people were literally told to go back to their plantations and hope to extract wages from their former enslavers.

Don't come to the army bases

or seek help from the government. Slaves were told to proceed quietly, the 1865 equivalent of "shut up and dribble."

"The people of Texas are informed that, in accordance with a proclamation from the Executive of the United States, all slaves are free. This involves an absolute equality of personal rights and rights of property between former masters and slaves, and the connection heretofore existing between them becomes that between employer and hired labor. The freedmen are advised to remain quietly at their present homes and work

for wages. They are informed that they will not be allowed to collect at military posts and that they will not be supported in idleness either there or elsewhere."

— Major General Gordon Granger, General Order №3

The more accurate description of Juneteenth 1865 was the day they were officially informed of an old proclamation, but to get back to work, and not call us, we'll call you.

The state of Texas went on to institute Black Codes, which, re-invented slavery. Here are three examples from the Texas Black Codes. (continued on page 5)

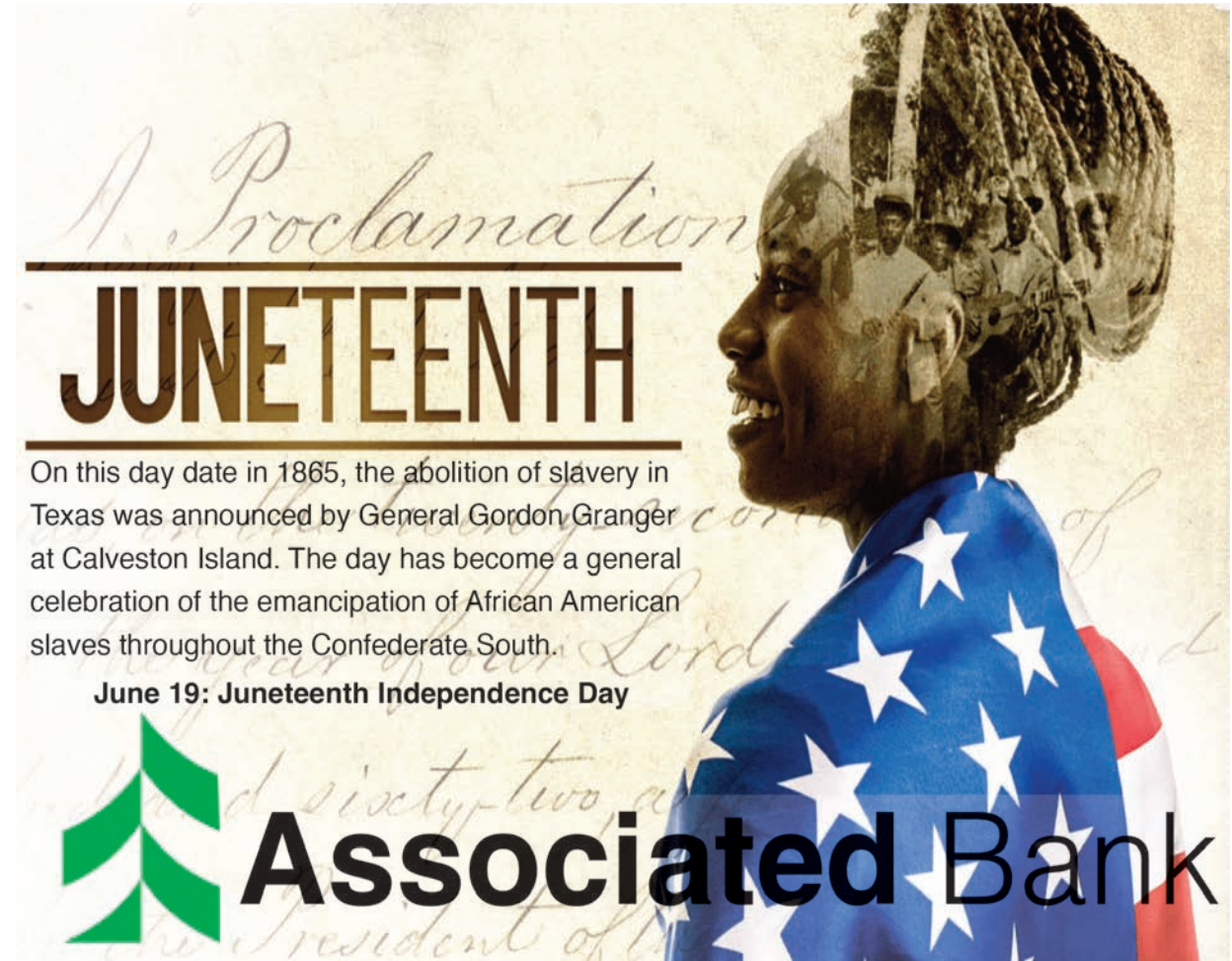

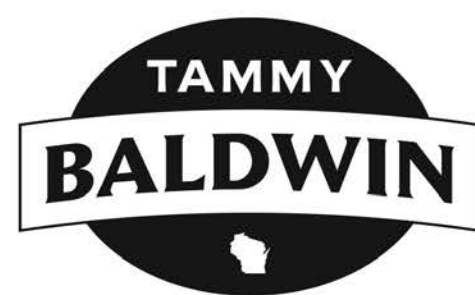
## Happy Juneteenth!

# MILWAUKEE: A City in need of a Rebirth!



Milwaukee's Black corporate board of directors has much work to do if recent reports on negative social indicators are any indication of MKE's quality of life.

By corporate ownership, I'm speaking to Black electoral leadership: Black mayor, county executive, city aldermen, board of supervisors, sheriff, police chief, and dog catcher. Start with addressing recent reports confirming Milwaukee as being the worst city for Black families, infant mortality, and quality of life. Now add a report from WalletHub revealing Wisconsin ranks 162 out of 181 as the worst city for families in general---which means it's worse for Black Milwaukeeans. On the heels of that report comes 'Racial Equality in Social and Civic Engagement in Wisconsin.' On a national scale, Wisconsin ranks 48th in the share of single-parent households, 45th in the adult population on parole, and 35th in voter turnout. We are 165 out of 182 for

the worst place to raise a family. It doesn't take a brain surgeon to recognize that those rankings indicate a city in need of a rebirth. Not enough to convince you? UWM research reveals Milwaukee has the highest poverty, Black male unemployment, and educational deficits in the state. Add in 25% home ownership, the worst infant mortality rate, and single-parent households (73%) a key indicator for poverty, high school dropout, and disproportionate criminality. Moreover, Milwaukee ranks 86th for the least diverse cities in America. "Based on what I have read, there is a positive relationship between diversity and economic growth in cities," explained Tony Brown, Distinguished professor at Rice University, located on the traditional, ancestral, and unceded terri-

ories of the Karankawa People. "Based on what I have read," Brown explained, "there is a positive relationship between diversity and economic growth in cities." Unfortunately, Milwaukee is majority Black, prompting our rating among the least diverse. The recent tsunami that hit the public school system has added to Milwaukee's social negativity. Milwaukee's Black leaders--corporate leadership--have much work to do. No wonder many believe it's an insurmountable mountain. True enough, but Mayor Caviler Johnson envisions a city population of one million, or double the current population. The reality is that negative social indicators and the loss of factories in the 1970s started a destructive narrative that moved MKE from the 13th largest city in the nation to the 31st. Granted, Milwaukee is a beautiful, industrious, and relatively safe place to live. If you're White. It is unique enough to have hosted the Democratic National Convention and, next month, the Republican Confab. However, while the outer shell may be beautiful, the patient also has various internal illnesses. There is much work to be done. And it will only start when there is a consensus strategy borne of a county/city collaboration, a Black unity caucus across the various legislative bodies, and a citizen's council of Black leadership—assuming there are enough bodies to fill a hip pocket. They must put egos aside, reject special interests, and prioritize the needs of the people—the community, the city—over personal interests. I hope to see that day, for the alternative is a continued decline, and the possibility is that we will be the next Gary, IN.

## New activist group to pursue recall of five MKE Public School board directors

A frustrated group of parents, concerned citizens and community activists have formed an organization which announced Wednesday a recall of four Milwaukee Public Schools board directors, including the board's president, Marvin Herndon. The group, under the banner of Recall MPS School Board Recall Collaborative, announced their recall at a city hall press conference. The recall comes on the heels of the district superintendent Keith Posely's resignation following charges he allegedly committed maleficence and neglect, specifically related to his failure to meet state mandated fiscal responsibilities, which has resulted in the district losing over 16 million dollars in school aid. The board was aware, having been warned by the state department of Public Instruction's issuance of a strongly worded letter a full year earlier. Neither the superintendent nor the board took action.

Several board members acknowledged ignorance of the situation, further angering a hostile crowd who filled the MPS auditorium last week during which Posely resigned. The recall comes on the heels of a federal suit for the district's suspension and expulsion practices, and what some call a racially motivated removal of mental health specialists from 53206 predominantly Black schools. Additionally, board members have been under fire for their apparent apathy toward the educational achievement gap, which has widened during the last decade. Two years ago it was revealed MPS hosted the worst reading proficiency rates for Black fourth and eighth graders in the country. The district's fiscal problems come on the heels of a quarter billion referendum, passed last month. Had the fiscal concerns been made public, it is obvious the referendum would not have been passed. The four board members targeted in the recall are District 1 director Marva Herndon, Second District director Erika Siemsen, First District director Jilly Gokalgandhi, who is also vice pres-

**(continued from front page)** thought and then continued, "A lot of people say that Star Wars is the reality that we live in, and Star Trek is the reality that we aspire to be. I want my children to have an infinity for Star Wars. I want my children to explore space, to be in the Navy or astronauts, to think about and aspire for something beyond the sky." **What's your Fatherhood Superpower?** Robert chuckles a bit and says, "You know, I actually change invisible after 7PM until everybody wakes up." Robert continues in a matter-of-fact tone, "Introspect! First thing that comes to mind is that any human being without a level of introspect will keep making the same mistakes and will never change." I followed up with, "How do you share your superpower with your children?" Robert shared that he reads stories to his children that have morals and lessons such as African Fables or books about animals. Books that make them reflect on the character's behavior in the story. Robert further explained, "The idea being that it sticks. The next day, if they have a problem or situation they go, "Hmmm," and remember that story. They begin to practice introspection." Richard responded by shar-

ing, "I like to garden! I guess it's my instant gratification of fatherhood. Instead of nurturing something for 18 years I can manipulate and nurture something in 18 days and see it flourish." Interrupted by his laughter, Richard continues, "It's become my space of solitude outside of the house. It gives me the ability to teach my children how to practice patience by watching something grow from seed and see the fruits of your labor flourish. It ain't no overnight thing! Just like we have steps that we take for a seed to germinate into a plant we need to give children that opportunity to be nurtured, to be poured into so they feel like all their needs are met. Black children are notoriously seen as adults before they have fully grown into adults. My children are bi-racial and sometimes I find myself having to remind my wife they are still children." **Any last thoughts you want to share with our readers?** Maybe share how your community, tribe, or friends supported you or can support you? Robert shared, "Fatherhood is where you find your wealth as a man. It's where you put everything you think you know to the test." **Define wealth for us, Robert?**

"In referencing it right now, I am not speaking about money. I am speaking about the wealth of children. "Whatever strength we accumulate right now, we can't take it with us. "We find that our legacy can only be carried through our children. I think that is where we can find our power as fathers." Richard ended by sharing: "My mother did a good job of being a caretaker for our son when we weren't so comfortable with childcare or couldn't afford what would be equivalent to our expectations. "My wife's parents have contributed support so that our son can now be in one of the best early childhood centers. "When my son was born, I had a manager graciously advocate for the 8 weeks of parenting time off that was only given to folks that were there for a year. They didn't necessarily let me take 8 weeks off because I had just started the job, but they gave me two weeks. "I think employers are becoming more generous with supporting both parents regardless of their gender. I think that is something of value for parents, especially if they don't have family close by to support them." *I thank the fathers for contributing their stories. Have a blessed Father's Day!*

# The Real History of Juneteenth and the Reason It's a Federal Holiday!

Codes: Texas required free Black people to sign contracts that effectively reduced them to enslaved people once more.

Those without contracts were arrested and then leased out to plantations.

Juneteenth became a federal holiday, and it was a long time in the making. Actually, becoming one came in an instant.

Legislation to recognize Juneteenth was first introduced in 1997 by Barbara-Rose Collins (D-MI). A resolution was passed in the House and the Senate, and a piece of paper was issued.

Satisfied, Congress did nothing else related to Juneteenth

come a national holiday. Her question was, would it occur during her lifetime?

On May 25, 2020, a 46-year-old Black man, George Floyd, encountered police outside a Minneapolis corner store.

He later died from his injuries, and his death became another statistic. On May 26, 2020, police issued a statement saying Floyd died after a "medical incident" and that he physically resisted and appeared to be in medical distress.

Minutes afterward, a video shot by a bystander was posted online. It went viral, and portions were shown on television stations worldwide.

Opal Lee was 89 years old when she led the March to Washington. She truly believed Juneteenth would one day be-

On June 15, 2021, the Senate unanimously passed the Juneteenth National Independence Day Act, establishing Juneteenth as a federal holiday. If you know anything about the U.S. Senate, you know Ted Cruz, Rand Paul, Joe Manchin, and Lindsey Graham didn't give a damn about Juneteenth, but they went along.

On June 16, 2021, the House of Representatives passed the bill without making any

2. The major issues usually addressed in such an action.  
3. Community resources and family court counseling services available to assist the parties.  
4. The procedure for setting, modifying, and enforcing child support awards, or modifying and enforcing legal custody or physical placement judgments or orders.  
(b) The Circuit Court Commissioner shall provide a party, for inspection or purchase, with a copy of the statutory provisions in this chapter generally pertinent to the action.
