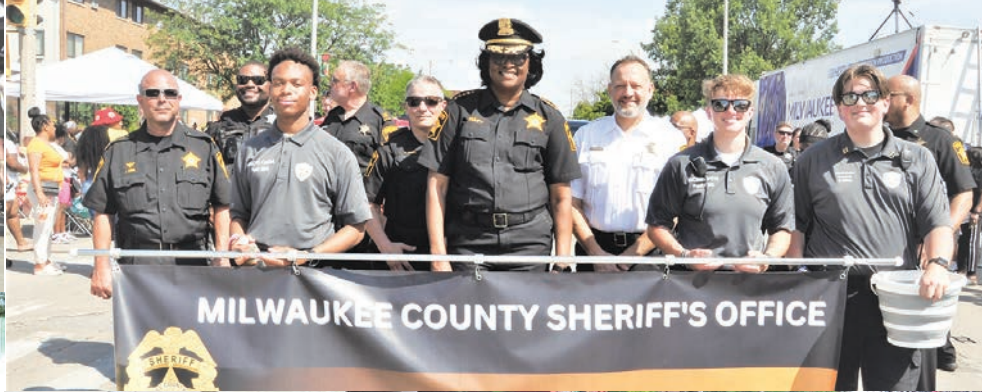

Over the last decade, thousands of people in Milwaukee have been injured or killed by speeding as traffic violence surges in the city.

The City of Milwaukee will launch a new campaign, Speeding - We Can Live Without It, on July 1.

Throughout the one hundred most dangerous days of driving this summer, the campaign aims to reduce the speeds of people driving by sharing stories of residents who have suffered the consequences of speeding.

A press conference is scheduled for Monday, July 1 at 10 a.m. at Milwaukee Public Library's Atkinson Branch, located at 1960 W. Atkinson Avenue.

Mayor Cavalier Johnson, Vision Zero, the Department of Public Works (DPW), Milwaukee Police Department (MPD), Milwaukee Fire Department (MFD), community partners and impacted families will be in attendance. Speakers will address the importance of this community-focused campaign and share how speeding has impacted their lives.

"With summer upon us, the City of Milwaukee, Department of Public Works, community partners, and those who have been impacted by

speed-related crashes are all committed to addressing this problem to improve the quality of life for our residents and save lives," said Milwaukee Mayor Cavalier Johnson.

Milwaukee is facing a crisis of speeding and reckless driving in recent years, and fatalities caused by car crashes have skyrocketed, from a low of 32 in 2013 to 80 in 2023.

The campaign will focus on the High Injury Network, the 10 percent of streets that have 58 percent of the crashes that kill or severely injure people (Source: MKECrashAnalysis-Report2022.pdf (milwaukee.gov)).

Reducing death and injury by slowing speeds on these streets is critical to making progress towards Vision Zero.

In collaboration with the campaign, MPD Traffic Safety Unit is conducting speed enforcement operations on the High Injury Network and throughout the city.

"Saving lives is as easy as driving the speed limit, not being distracted, and yielding to pedestrians.

Each of us can drive slower and help ensure that our friends, our parents, and our kids, are able to travel without fear or injury throughout Milwaukee. We deserve streets with zero traffic deaths," said Jessica Wineberg, Milwaukee's Vision Zero Policy Director.

The Speeding- We Can Live Without It campaign encourages the people of Milwaukee to:

- Slow down and drive the speed limit.

Mariahs's brother Jerrold Wellinger was killed by someone speeding in 2021. Alecia was hit and injured by a speeding driver in 2023.

Neither want to see anyone else go through the loss and pain they have experienced.

## PEST EXPERT PREDICTS A 'BUGS BOOM' IN BADGER STATE THIS SUMMER

Wisconsin is predicted to have a warmer summer than average with equal rainfall.

Increased activity predicted of cockroaches, ants, spiders, houseflies, bed bugs, centipedes, crickets and silverfish.

Meteorologists across the board are warning of extreme weather in the summer of 2024 across most of the continental USA. While natural events such as heatwaves, storms, floods, and tornadoes are some of the more devastating impacts of extreme weather, an often-overlooked consequence is the increase in bug activity. Although bugs generally don't cause the same devastating impacts as ex-

treme weather events, they can become a severe annoyance, and getting rid of them can become quite costly for homeowners.

The Pest Dude recently analyzed predicted summer 2024 temperatures and rainfall data from Climate.gov across each U.S. state to determine which pests are more likely to be a problem in each state.

Wisconsin is predicted to have a warmer summer than average with equal rainfall. This combination is likely to lead to an increase in activity of the following pests in the state: cockroaches, ants, spiders, houseflies, bed bugs, centipedes, crickets and silverfish.

Zachary Smith of The Pest Dude breaks down why each of these bugs is likely to be more frequent in Wisconsin in summer 2024, and how they can best be treated:

**Ants:**

**Why More Frequent:** Warm weather increases ant foraging activity, and rain can drive them indoors seeking shelter

**Treatment:**

**Ant Baits and Traps:** Place ant baits near entry points and along ant trails to attract and kill ants. Use bait stations that allow ants to carry the poison back to the colony.

**Seal Entry Points:** Inspect and seal cracks and gaps around windows, doors, and foundations to prevent ants from entering the home.

**Maintain Clean Surfaces:** Keep kitchen counters, floors, and food storage areas clean and free of crumbs, spills, and food residues that attract ants.

**Cockroaches:**

**Why More Frequent:** Warm temperatures and high humidity drive cockroaches indoors seeking food and shelter.

**Treatment:**

**Cockroach Baits and Traps:** Place baits and traps in areas where cockroaches are likely to travel, such as kitchens, bathrooms, and basements.

**Seal Entry Points:** Inspect and seal cracks, gaps, and openings around doors, windows, and pipes to prevent cockroaches from entering the home.

**Clean and Dry Environment:** Maintain a clean environment by regularly cleaning kitchen surfaces, disposing of garbage, and addressing any moisture issues.

**Centipedes:**

**Why More Frequent:** Moist, warm environments encourage centipede activity.

**Treatment:**

**Reduce Moisture:** Use dehumidifiers and fix leaks to lower humidity levels.

**Remove Clutter:** Eliminate clutter and debris that provide hiding places.

**Seal Entry Points:** Seal gaps and cracks around the home to prevent entry.

**Spiders:**

**Why More Frequent:** Warm temperatures increase spider activity and reproduction.

**Treatment:**

**Reduce Clutter:** Remove clutter and debris where spiders can hide.

**Seal Entry Points:** Seal gaps and cracks around the home to prevent spiders from entering.

**Spider Traps:** Use sticky traps to capture and monitor spider activity.

**Houseflies:**

**Why More Frequent:** Warm weather speeds up the breeding cycle of houseflies.

**Treatment:**

**Fly Traps:** Use sticky traps or UV light traps to capture flies.

**Maintain Cleanliness:** Regularly clean surfaces, dispose of garbage, and avoid leaving food out.

**Proper Food Storage:** Store food in sealed containers to prevent attracting flies.

**Bed Bugs:**

**Why More Frequent:** Increased travel and warmer weather contribute to bed bug infestations.

**Treatment:**

**Regular Inspections:** Inspect

mattresses, bed frames, and furniture for signs of bed bugs.

**Heat Treatments:** Use heat treatments or steam cleaning to kill bed bugs and their eggs.

**Professional Extermination:** Hire a pest control professional for thorough bed bug treatments.

**Crickets:**

**Why More Frequent:** Warm weather increases cricket activity and breeding.

**Treatment:**

**Reduce Moisture:** Fix leaks and reduce humidity levels to make environments less attractive to crickets.

**Seal Entry Points:** Seal gaps and cracks to prevent crickets from entering the home.

**Cricket Baits:** Use baits and traps to capture and reduce cricket populations.

**Silverfish:**

**Why More Frequent:** Humid, warm conditions promote silverfish activity.

**Treatment:**

**Reduce Humidity:** Use dehumidifiers and fix leaks to lower moisture levels.

**Seal Entry Points:** Seal gaps and cracks around the home to prevent silverfish from entering.

**Silverfish Traps:** Use sticky traps or baited traps to capture and monitor silverfish activity.

"My brother was in the median when two cars were racing. His car just shattered into pieces.

"He was only 22. He had so much to live for," said Johnson. "Every day, every time you're on the road, your speed matters. You have the power to make the streets safer for all of us."

The City of Milwaukee is partnering with community organizations like Friends of Lincoln Park, Martin Drive Neighborhood Association, Rooted & Rising, Villard Avenue BID and Westtown Association, along with Milwaukee County to decrease speeding this summer and beyond.

"The City and MPD have been focused on engineering and enforcement to address speeding and this campaign is adding education to the mix," said DPW Commissioner Jerrel Kruschke.

"In the ongoing effort for Vision Zero, we need to continue to layer strategies, so that they reinforce each other and maximize impact."

Dozens of billboards and building posters, along with bus ads, social media, and news stories, will raise awareness of the issue of speeding and educate the community on their ability to make change. In alignment with the High Injury Network, the campaign will focus on areas that have the most serious and deadly crashes.

# SCREEN SAFETY: Wisconsin Parents Are More Lenient on Kids' Social Media Use Than National Average, Finds Study!

Thirty-six percent said they monitor their children's online habits daily.

Most parents surveyed believe it is acceptable for children to start using social media at age 13 or older.

In an era when digital connectivity has become a staple of everyday life, social media's increasing threat to children has prompted urgent action.

The Surgeon General recently called on Congress to mandate labeling on social media apps, akin to the warnings on cigarettes and alcohol, to address these concerns.

This heightened awareness has spurred parents to take more active roles in monitoring their children's online activities.

A recent survey conducted by HostingAdvice involving 3,000 parents sheds light on the extent of parental controls on the websites and apps their children access.

The findings reveal a spectrum of practices and concerns, reflecting the diverse approaches parents take to safeguard their children's online experiences.

## Parental Monitoring Practices

According to the survey, half of Wisconsin parents (50%) actively control the websites and social media sites their children visit (however, this is lower when compared to the national average of 52%).

Among these, 36% said they monitor their children's online habits daily, showcasing a high level of vigilance.

The methods parents use to monitor or control their

children's internet usage vary, with some parents employing multiple methods:

**Regularly checking browser history:** Thirty-three percent of parents surveyed said they routinely check their children's browser history to stay informed about their online activities.

**Parental control software:** Twenty-five percent said they use parental control software to restrict access to inappropriate content and monitor usage.

**Discussions on online behavior:** Twenty-two percent of parents said they sit down with their children to discuss online behavior and instill safe internet practices.

**Occasional restrictions:** 18% said they occasionally restrict online access to ensure their children stay within safe digital boundaries.

Interestingly, the survey highlights significant geographic disparities in parental control practices. For instance, 80% of parents in South Dakota surveyed said they actively control what their children access online.

In contrast, only 30% of parents in Nebraska said they exercise similar levels of control.

## Primary Concerns About Social Media Use:

HostingAdvice also surveyed Wisconsin parents about their primary concerns regarding their children's social media use:

**Exposure to inappropriate content:** 44% of parents surveyed said they are most concerned about their

children being exposed to inappropriate content online.

**Potential for cyberbullying:** 27% cited cyberbullying as their primary concern, highlighting the pervasive nature of this issue when it comes to online interactions.

**Health implications of screentime:** 17% of parents said they worry about the health implications of significant screentime, including its impact on physical and mental well-being.

**Data security:** Eleven percent said they have concerns about the sharing of their children's data, underscoring the importance of privacy in the digital age.

## Age Appropriateness for Social Media Use

The survey also explored parents' views on the appropriate age for children to have their own social media accounts. The responses reflect a spectrum of opinions on this matter:

Forty-five percent of parents surveyed believe it is acceptable for children to start using social media at age 13 or older.

A more conservative 37% of parents said 16 or older is a more sensible age for children to engage with social media.

Thirteen percent of parents surveyed think it is okay for children to start using social media from age 10.

"As more information has come out about social media and how it impacts the emotional and mental well-being of our youth, I think it has become clear that more needs to be done. However, it can be

# THELMA

**Film features Richard Roundtree in last movie performance before passing**

They shouldn't have messed with this granny. She's coming for them—and she's packing heat!

Writer/actor and first-time director Josh Margolin has a wild imagination. One he honed while a member of various improvisational groups. He also has a 103-year-old grandmother he loves dearly. Hence the hilarity and premise of this scorned grandma movie that is a consistently endearing, low-budget indie film.

For nearly 98 minutes (editor Margolin), every moment in this action/comedy has a purpose and is so fun to watch your eyes won't veer from the screen.

Thelma Post (June Squibb, Nebraska) is 93 years old and still living alone in her L.A. home.

She's adored by her under ambitious, irresponsible grandson Danny (Fred Hechinger, *The Underground Railroad*), a twentysomething who can't keep a job.

Possibly he was over coddled by his mom (Parker Posey) and dad (Clark Gregg). Maybe he has mental/emotional issues. Nonethe-

less, Thelma still loves him. And so, that day she gets a desperate phone call from Danny, with this weird voice, and he says he needs \$10,000 for bail as he's been jailed after an incident, Thelma steps up to the plate. "I'm going to need to mail \$10,000 to this address." She sends the money off, only to find out that she's been scammed. A con man tricked her and impersonated her grandson.

The feisty nonagenarian is pissed!!! She's aided by her old friend Ben (Richard Roundtree, *Shaft*), her deceased husband's best bud. The two head to Van Nuys, CA, aboard Ben's trusty, two-person electric mobility scooter.

They're gonna retrieve her money. One way or another. At gunpoint if they have to!

The scam call setup focusses on a problem many seniors face and law enforcement can do little about. That idea seeds a very engaging storyline that has a natural momentum.

She's got to find the culprits. Anyone who goes along on her ride, in a theater or from a couch with a bag of chips, will follow her quest until it ends. In this case, that ending has

plenty of off ramps but struggles to find a definitive final moment before it hits a good one. That's the only part of



Margolin's very thoughtful, playful and emotionally involving script that falters. Otherwise, what's on screen is so fresh it's as if the writer/director was back in his improv days, asked audience members for a suggestion for a skit, and someone blurted out: "An old woman gets scammed by a con artist and..." Then he acted on it.

Viewers will love the main and supporting characters that

inhabit Thelma's world and the ones she meets along the way. All of them have distinctive personalities that the cast turns into animated portrayals. Squibb thoroughly embodies a determined old woman who's fired up and not going to take any s--- off anybody: "What about my money? Am I supposed to let them just have it!!!!"

She doesn't come off like a super hero, doesn't have super powers and the script gives her all of the characteristics, aches and pains a much older woman would have. Within those confines, Squibb takes care of business.

She's blunt, not tech savvy, has vision issues... and she exploits the potential of each of those secondary characteristics quite well. Love her demeanor and sense of humor.

Roundtree couldn't be more charming as the nursing home patient who is eager to have his debut in the home's presentation of Annie, but more than willing to jeopardize that chance to help his old friend.

Roundtree passed away October 2023, and this perform-

McDowell could have played it up. He's the actor from *A Clockwork Orange*, give him room to be flashy.

At times, Thelma encounters people she thinks she knows but really doesn't. It's an idiosyncrasy that isn't unusual for people who've lived a very long life. That and other challenges they face are on view in this touching film.

From older people living alone and facing dementia to the peculiarities of nursing homes.

Nice to find a writer who can share the everyday issues, indignities and oddities seniors face in a funny respectful and non-condescending way. Just humorous observations with touches of action film satire thrown in for good measure.

Margolin's direction is fluid throughout and never gets in the way. The homes (production designer Brielle Hubert) reflect the kind of interior spaces older people live in. The kinds that look like they're from another era.

The seniors' clothes (costume designer Amanda Wing Yee Lee) seem properly worn. Music swirls around the daring escapes, dramatic moments

and whimsical scenes appropriately (composer Nick Chuba).

Every gag, interaction and step of Thelma's harrowing trek is well documented by cinematographer David Bolen. That said, the film's tiny budget is obvious.

Thelma is here to lead super senior citizens into the 21st century and protect their dignity.

tricky to determine exactly what should be done, especially given the fact that each child is likely to interact with social media differently," said HostingAdvice consumer technology expert Christian de Looper.

Parents are increasingly aware of the potential dangers posed by social media, but awareness alone isn't enough.

The survey highlights the need for comprehensive strategies involving parents, educators, and policymakers to create a safe online environment for children.

"I think it's completely reasonable to raise age limits on social media and for there to be some kind of warning label. Additionally, it's important parents ensure that their children, especially young teens, are interacting with social media in a healthy way, and for limited periods of time," said Christian.

### Methodology

We selected 3,000 respondents from a geographically representative online panel of double opt-in members.

This selection was further tailored to meet the

precise criteria required for each unique survey. Throughout the survey, we designed questions to carefully screen and authenticate respondents, guaranteeing the survey's alignment with the ideal participants.

To ensure the integrity of our data collection, we employed an array of data quality methods. Alongside conventional measures such as digital fingerprinting, bot checks, geo-verification, and speeding detection, each response underwent a thorough manual review to ensure quality and contextual accuracy.

# MY HEAD START SUCCESS STORY!

There's nothing like adversity to prove who you are.

I've always been a strong-willed person but having children of my own has made me laser-focused on how to use my perseverance to carve out a legacy they will be proud of.

Until I enlisted in the Marine Corps at 18 years old, I lived at home in Hattiesburg, Mississippi, with my mother and six sisters.

Three of them were God sisters, but we were raised as biological siblings.

Like many other cities in the Deep South, Hattiesburg had an integral role in the Civil Rights Movement.

It was the largest site for the Freedom Summer voting registration campaign in 1964.

This historical connection isn't lost on me when I think about how, decades later, I was four years old in Head Start, memorizing Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s, "I Have a Dream" speech.

I often recall this memory because Dr. King is one of my heroes, and it reminds me that my Head Start teacher saw potential and capability in me beyond my years. She saw the determination in me. Life was tough growing

up. My mother, sisters, and I dealt with the persistent challenge of insufficient money, food, and no access to quality health-care. Since I was young, I wanted to make a difference and improve the lives of those in circumstances like the ones faced by my family.

I also wanted to go to college, so I joined the Marines as a path to get there. I think it's true that ingenuity is born of necessity.

While in the Corps, I made some mistakes that resulted in time in the brig and the loss of military benefits, but I'm a fighter.

I don't believe in giving up. After my military service, I had limited resources, so I found a way to work several jobs to pay for school and earn my bachelor's degree while supporting a young family.

When my physical disabilities made it painfully obvious that working a standard, "9-to-5" job wasn't going to work for me, I took my degree in audio engineering and my passion for music and launched a business as an event planner and songwriter.

And when hard times hit my business, the memory of reciting Dr. King's speech resurfaced.

I turned to Head Start. *"The ultimate measure of a man is not where he stands in moments of convenience and comfort, but where he stands at times of challenge and controversy."* – Martin Luther King, Jr.

Head Start was pivotal in preparing my twin boys for school while my wife and I

regrouped financially.

It's one thing to experience Head Start as a student, but as a parent, I gained an even deeper appreciation for the depth and scale of Head Start's impact on families and communities.

As parents, Head Start invited my wife and me into our children's classrooms. The teachers identified a speech issue with one of our boys and connected us with a speech therapist.

He speaks clearly (and non-stop) now. The staff saw how engaged I was as a dad and invited me to start a fatherhood group.

I also got involved with the policy council, was elected chairperson, and now I serve on the Episcopal Community Services (ECS) Board of Directors.

Today, I use all my plat-

forms and relationships to advocate for and promote Head Start and champion the needs of children, families, and veterans in my community, state, and nationally.

After years of making appeals, my military benefits have been partially restored, which has helped my wife and I purchase a family home.

Together, we have the privilege of raising the most amazing human beings in the world.

At times my circumstances have been mentally and physically debilitating, but I get up every day and keep going so my children can see that setbacks are on the flip side of success, and the two can coexist.

I want them to remember me as someone who never gave up.
