Fearless Fund Drops Grant Program for Black Women Business Owners in Lawsuit Settlement

A venture capital firm has closed a grant program for Black women business owners as part of a settlement with a conservative group that had filed a lawsuit alleging the program was discriminatory

NEW YORK (AP) — A venture capital firm has closed down a grant contest for Black women business owners as part of a settlement agreement with a conservative group that had filed a lawsuit alleging the program was discriminatory, both sides announced Wednesday.

The settlement came two months after a U.S. federal court of appeals panel ordered the Atlanta-based Fearless Fund to suspend the Strivers Grant Contest, which provided \$20,000 to businesses that are majority owned by Black women.

In a 2-1 ruling, the appeals court ruled that the American Alliance for Equal Rights, led by conservative activist Ed Blum, was likely to prevail in its lawsuit claiming that the program illegally discriminated on the basis of race.

The lawsuit against the Fearless Fund, the Atlanta-based firm that has helped grow popular companies like beauty retailer Thirteen Lune and restaurant chain Slutty Vegan, has been closely watched as a bellwether in the growing legal battle waged by conservative groups against corporate diversity programs.

Bolstered by the Supreme Court case that ended affirma-

tive action in college admissions, conservatives have targeted dozens of companies and government institutions and challenged a wide array of programs and policies bolstering diversity, equity and inclusion, known as DEI.

In a statement, Blum, who also brought the case that resulted in the affirmative action ruling, reiterated his view that “race-exclusive programs like the one the Fearless Fund promoted are divisive and illegal.”

In a statement, Arian Simone, CEO and co-founder of the Fearless Fund, said she was pleased to put the lawsuit behind her and continue with the firm’s mission of “helping and empowering women of color entrepreneurs in need.”

So far, none of the anti-DEI lawsuits have resulted in a precedent-setting ruling on the level of the Supreme Court decision on affirmative action.

Ben Crump, a civil rights attorney who represented the Fearless Fund, said that the settlement ensured that lawsuit ended without setting any such precedent.

Supreme Court ruling that could have eliminated race-based funding, we protected vital opportunities for the entire Black and brown community,” Crump said in a statement.

Still, a growing number of companies — most recently including Lowe’s and John Deere — have altered or dropped DEI programs amid the onslaught of lawsuits and

conservative activist pressure.

In statement, Blum said “it is to be hoped race-exclusive programs like the one offered by the Fearless Fund will be stopped and opened to everyone, regardless of their race.”

Blum added that he had encouraged the Fearless Fund to open the Strivers Grant Contest to women of other races rather than shut it down.

Other companies, including several law firms sued by Blum, have changed scholarships or fellowships to open it to all races.

Alphonso David, president and CEO of The Global Black Economic Forum and counsel to the Fearless Fund, shot back in an interview with The Associated Press that the “Fearless Fund was not going to allow Ed Blum to dictate how to run their business.”

David said the Strivers Grant was a small part of the Fearless Fund’s operations and had already been scheduled to wind down.

He said the settlement “is very narrow” and will not affect the venture capital’s firms investments or other activities.

The Strivers Grant Fund

was one of several programs run by the foundation arm of the Fearless Fund, which was founded with backing from investors including JPMorgan Chase & Co. and Mastercard, to address the wide racial disparity in funding for businesses owned by women of color.

In her statement Wednesday, Simone announced a new \$200 million debt fund (continued on page 3)

(continued on page 3) that will offer loans of between \$5,000 to \$250,000 to “under-resourced founders.”

David Glasgow, executive director of the Meltzer Center for Diversity, Inclusion, and Belonging at New York University’s School of Law, said the decision to settle the lawsuit was not surprising because “the gamble you are making in cases like this is that if you continue fighting you will get more adverse rulings that have the potential to cause wider damage.”

“People are certainly seeing the writing on the wall on how the six-justice conservative super majority in the Supreme Court would rule in DEI-related cases,” Glasgow said.

The Fearless Fund case and other lawsuits have revealed deep divisions among the country’s judiciary on the issue of DEI.

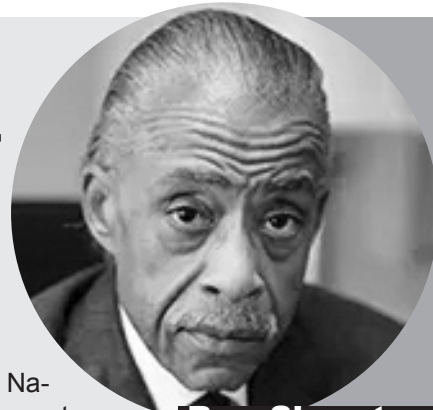
Two judges, appointed by former President Donald

Trump to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the 11th Circuit in Miami, sided with Blum’s argument that the grant program violates section 1981 of the 1866 Civil Rights Act, which prohibits discrimination on the basis of race when enforcing contracts.

The Reconstruction-era law was originally intended to protect formally enslaved people from economic exclusion, but anti-affirmative action activists have been leveraging it to challenge programs intended to benefit minority-owned businesses.

In sharp dissent, Judge Robin Rosenbaum, an appointee of former President Barack Obama, said none of the anonymous plaintiffs represented by Blum demonstrated that they had any real intention to apply for the grants and likened their claims of harm to soccer players trying to win by “flopping on the field, faking an injury.”

REV. AL SHARPTON RESPONDS TO DISMISSAL OF LAWSUIT AGAINST FEARLESS FUND AND FEARLESS FOUNDATION

NEW YORK, NY - Rev. Al Sharpton, Founder and President of the National Action Network (NAN), issued the following statement in response to the dismissal of the lawsuit against the Fearless Fund and Fearless Foundation:

“In the face of this hostility and a lawsuit that threatened to ban DEI, Arian Simone stood steadfast in her commitment to the mission of supporting those who are the most often overlooked in our economy. I stood with her since Day One and advised her because the attacks on Arian and the Fearless Fund speak to the historic efforts to cut the opportunity ladder out from under us. Her resilience through this challenge is a testament to her dedication and fortitude, and we owe her a debt of gratitude for her leadership.

Let’s not forget that the same right-wing legal activists who brought this case against the Fearless Fund and Fearless Foundation were the same ones who pushed the Supreme Court to gut affirmative action. They effectively gave themselves a license to attack any effort to bring in perspectives that have historically been left out of the conversation.

Diversity, equity, and inclusion became a lightning rod to the radical right, with ‘DEI’ becoming a dog whistle to punch down on already under-served communities. Yet those of us who have already seen the right to vote gutted and the right to education access dismantled stood up and alongside these woman to say we would not let them take the right to jobs.

With the dismissal of this case, the immediate threat that this lawsuit posed to DEI, workplace diversity, and free speech has been subdued for now, allowing the Fearless Fund and Fearless Foundation to resume their crucial work with renewed strength and purpose. But the fight to defend and promote workplace diversity will continue in board rooms, state legislatures, universities, the White House and beyond. All of us who understand the value of workplaces, and indeed an economy, that reflect the diversity of our nation will continue to defend DEI.”

Inside Sea Grant **Combating Plastic Pollution in Waterways** Mount Mary fashion dept. will explore eco-friendly fabrics through NOAA

Mount Mary University has received a grant from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA)’s National Sea Grant College Program and Marine Debris Community Action Coalition.

This funding will allow fashion students to explore sustainable fabrics and alternatives to synthetic materials, which contribute significant pollution into ground water each year.

The project will be a collaborative effort led by Wisconsin Sea Grant (WSG) and will run for two years beginning in September 2024.

Assistant professor of fashion Jessica Frantal will work with WSG to develop educational materials which will be used in ongoing efforts to bring attention to impacts of microfibers on water quality, as well as large scale issues of

sustainability and waste reduction within the fashion industry.

Funding will provide students with materials that would be otherwise cost prohibitive, such as plant-based leathers from sources like pineapples and mushrooms, in addition to other natural fiber fabrics.

Frantal sees the project as an opportunity to raise awareness about the threat to waterways from microplastic waste produced by synthetic fabrics.

She sees the university’s location near the Great Lakes and its commitment to driving social change as unique factors in its selection for this opportunity. “There is a growing apprehension of microplastics in general and in fashion specifically,” said Frantal.

“We hope that this project will get people to consider the impact of their purchasing decisions.”

New K3 Program to Open at St. Ann Center Program will launch Sept. 23 with open house planned for Sept. 20!

In response to the recent closure of multiple nearby K3 locations, St. Ann Center for Intergenerational Care will open a new K3 program at its Bucyrus Campus, 2450 W. North Ave. on Monday, Sept. 23. The community is invited to an open house on Sept. 20 from 5:30 p.m. - 6:30 p.m. at the campus to introduce the new program, and its teachers and administrators. Visitors can also tour the Bucyrus Campus and learn about its other childcare programming.

The new K3 program will run from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday through Thursday. Space is available to 16 students. The program will be staffed by Sr. Anne Theresa Anyiro, who earned a Master of Arts in Education from Mount Mary University. Valarie Turner, who has more than 18 years of child care experience, will serve as assistant teacher.

Focused on learning through play -- and embracing the same kind, compassionate care parents have relied on as part of St. Ann Center childcare programs for years -- the new preschool will prepare children for success in K4 and beyond by:

- Empowering students to guide their own learning experience

"I do have a lot of experience in this community, I know a lot about it and what this area needs," says St. Ann Center Bucyrus Campus Director of Childcare and Education, Bao Xiong, who spearheads the new K3 pro-

gram. and is a veteran of day care and preschool education communities in both Milwaukee and Waukesha counties. "A lot of our children and families don't have access to transportation [to get to other early childhood programs]. This neighborhood needs a quality K-3 program."

Xiong also notes the high ratio of special needs learners in the Bucyrus Campus neighborhood -- students she is eager to accommodate in the sunny, toy-filled classroom with large windows, plenty of room for imaginative play and two private bathrooms. St. Ann Center also offers parents the opportunity to build a childcare schedule that works best for their family, adding wraparound childcare to morning or afternoon to their child's K3 programming. The Bucyrus Center is open from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays. St. Ann Center accepts the Wisconsin Shares childcare subsidy to families who qualify.

The VBRI is nearing capacity and plans to expand its current team of 31 principal scientists to approximately 50 in the next 5-7 years. Each new scientist will bring a team of up to 10 new colleagues, exponentially increasing the research community and enhancing the culture of collaboration.



Versiti Blood Research Institute Breaks Ground on Expansion

The Versiti Blood Research Institute (VBRI), recognized as one of the world's premier blood health research centers, announced its expansion plans are moving forward at a ceremonial groundbreaking, located at 8727 West Watertown Plank Road at the Milwaukee Regional Medical Center campus in Wauwatosa. Construction on the ex-

pansion project is scheduled to begin this month with an estimated completion date in 2026.

New renderings of the VBRI addition were released to the public at the event.

The project is expected to have a total economic impact for the state of more than half a billion dollars by 2050. HGA is serving as the ar-

chitect and Mortenson is the general contractor for the new facility.

Versiti's president and chief executive officer Chris Miskel was joined by Wisconsin Assembly Speaker Robin Vos; Mayor of Wauwatosa Dennis McBride; Bob Simi, executive director of the Milwaukee Regional Medical Center; Jeff Gruhn, director of project development for Morten-

son's Wisconsin Operations; and approximately 100 community leaders to celebrate the additional services and research that this expansion will provide to the community and to the rest of the world.

The expansion is a state-of-the-art 79,000 square-foot addition that will nearly double VBRI's research capacity, add approximately 100 new jobs and generate an estimated \$19 million in additional tax revenue for the state of Wisconsin over 30 years.

The new addition will expand the VBRI's research capacity and promote the discovery of novel, more effective and less toxic therapies for a broad range of conditions that affect millions, positively impacting the health of residents across the state, nation and international community.

"Today, we celebrate a pivotal moment for the future of blood health as we break ground on the \$79 million expansion of the Versiti Blood Research Institute," said Chris Miskel, president and CEO of Versiti.

"This new, world-class facility will open in Wisconsin during 2026.

The expansion is a \$79 million project that will include donations and private funding.

The State Building Commission released \$10 million to support the VBRI's plans to build the addition, reaffirming the state's commitment to advancing blood health research.

Versiti is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit headquartered in Milwaukee, with more than 2,200 employees at its locations in Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, Texas and Wisconsin. Learn more at Versiti.org/InvestinginHope.

Respiratory viruses hospitalized over 800,000 people last fall and winter. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Black adults were more likely than Latino and White adults to be hospitalized for flu or COVID-19 at the peak of the 2023–2024 respiratory virus season.

"Respiratory illness usually surges during colder weather and can cause severe disease, hospitalization, and even death," said HHS Assistant Secretary for Public Affairs Jeffery A. Nesbit. "The

goal of the Risk Less. Do More. campaign is to increase confidence in vaccines that play an important role in preventing severe illness and to provide the information that everyone needs to make the decision to get vaccinated this fall and winter."

In addition to on-site vaccination activations, the tour stops will feature music, live DJs, health and wellness seminars (at select locations), on-site healthy food samples, and health education resources.

"Risk Less. Do More. will be a

crucial element of a multilayered response to encourage people to get vaccinated so they can keep doing more of what they love," said May Malik, senior advisor for public education campaigns at HHS. "The campaign is working closely with federal agencies, as well as national and local partners, to amplify and extend the reach of the campaign."
