New streetscaping enhances the identity of historic commercial district

The Historic King Drive Business Improvement District No. 8 (BID) recently hosted the Historic King Drive Streetscaping Unveiling, officially showcasing one of many signs enhancing the identity of the historic commercial district.

City officials, including Milwaukee Mayor Cavalier Johnson, Alderwoman Milele Coggs, Commissioner of City Development Lafayette Crump, Department of Public Works Commissioner Jerrel Kruschke and Milwaukee County Executive David Crowley, as well as additional

key partners involved in the streetscaping initiative, attended the event.

"This initiative is part of our ongoing efforts to enhance the streetscape and make the entire Historic King Drive BID even more attractive, welcoming, and enjoyable for our businesses, neighbors and visitors," said Ray Hill, Executive Director of the Historic King Drive BID.

"We extend our deepest gratitude to the City of Milwaukee — especially Alderwoman Coggs and Commissioner Crump — for their leadership in supporting the use of TID 41 to invest in the first phase of our streetscaping efforts."

The Historic King Drive BID collaborated with the City of Milwaukee for a multi-phased

approach to enhancing the King Drive corridor.

The initial phase was supported by \$735,000 from Tax Increment District 41 and includes signage, sculptures, public art installations, tree guards, trash receptacles and benches along Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Drive between North Avenue to Mckinley Avenue and Riverwalk to 6th Street.

"These signs and markers illuminate the rich history that

we have here in Bronzeville and provide an opportunity to highlight the folks who have made Bronzeville what it is today," shared Mayor Cavalier Johnson.

Parents sound off at first town hall since MPS publicized potential school closures

Tensions ran high earlier this week at Rufus King International High School, where Milwaukee Public Schools held the first of four town hall meetings to discuss potential school closures.

The district hoped to inform the public about its long-range facilities master plan and hear from parents and community members.

Cafeteria tables at the high school were packed with parents and concerned community members after school.

Many community members expressed a lack of trust in the district.

The consultant the district hired, Perkins Eastman, presented its long-range facilities master plan, which lays out the criteria for schools that could make them candidates for closure.

"Anytime we talk about change, it's always that potential, right? A lot of people grew up in the school, and they want that school to live on forever. And in a perfect world, we would want that as well," MPS Interim Superintendent Eduardo Galvan said.

The plan, driven by declining enrollment and aging infrastructure, outlines potential school closures, mergers, new construction,

'Concept' of a lie that would hurt Wisconsinites with preexisting health-related conditions!

NEW REPORT reveals over 2 Million Wisconsinites with preexisting conditions could be denied coverage or charged more under Trump's 'concept' of a health care plan

The Harris-Walz campaign recently released a new report that publicly unveils the "concept of a plan" that Trump and Vance are running on, in full, for the first time and its impact on Wisconsinites' health care.

The report outlines how many Wisconsinites would face certain consequences like higher prescription drug costs, loss of insurance, removal of certain essential benefits or other protections and limits on reproductive health care under

a Trump-Vance administration. In the first debate, Trump vowed to end the Affordable Care Act, saying he had the "concept of a plan" that he would enact instead.

Days later, Vance outlined specifics of this plan: promising to bring back high-risk pools that would skyrocket costs for Americans with preexisting conditions.

That comes after Trump has promised to "never give up" on trying to "terminate" the ACA,

which would rip insurance away from millions of Americans — including over 260,000 in Wisconsin — and raise costs for millions more.

"Donald Trump and JD Vance have told us their 'concept' of a health care plan, and it is devastating for Wisconsin families," said Harris cam-

paign Senior Policy Advisor Brian Nelson.

"They may not want Americans to see the details of their plan, but Vice President Harris and Governor Walz won't let them get away with hiding its effects.

"The new report our campaign is releasing lays out for the first time what their plan really is and how it would raise costs and remove peace of mind for millions of Americans.

It is a stark contrast with Vice President Harris' plan to continue strengthening the Affordable Care Act, bringing costs down for millions, mak-

ing prescription drugs less expensive, and getting more Americans insurance than ever before."

The new report includes an analysis of how the Trump-Vance plan would hurt Wisconsinites, including:

In Wisconsin, over 260,000 people could have to pay more under Trump's plans, with a middle-class family potentially facing premiums nearly \$12,000 more.

2.4 million people with preexisting conditions in Wisconsin could be denied health care coverage or charged thousands of dollars more under the

 tion, and programming investments over the next decade.

To address these issues, MPS proposes grouping schools into categories based on utilization rates, building conditions, and program offerings.

Each category would then be considered for different strategies, including closures, mergers, building additions or programmatic investments.

For example, a school that is operating at less than 50% capacity, has not experienced enrollment growth for five years, and is located within a mile of another underutilized school is a candidate for closure.

"We're trying to see what sort of interventions are potentially pragmatic and feasible that would help start to address those balances and really make sure that every kid has equal access and opportunities," Nathan Morris, a project manager for Perkins Eastman, said.

The district stopped short of saying which schools could fall into the closure and merger category. People at the meeting told a reporter that they wish they knew more.

"They're not going to tell us what their agenda

is until the eleventh hour," Yvonne Bonds, a retired educator, said.

"We've lost confidence in them, particularly integrity. We can't trust them," said Deborah Lee, who has nieces who go to MPS schools. "But we will see. I'm going to continue to keep following this and looking into it."

Milwaukee Alderwoman Sharlen Moore called the town hall a failure and blamed the administration.

"They set the consultant up for failure. Instead of having the opportunity to connect and engage with parents, the administration and the district continues to do the same old-same old. We've got to demand (something) different," Moore said.

A second and third town hall was held Tuesday and Wednesday at Parkside School for the Arts, 2969 S. Howell Ave; and Hamilton High School, 8135 W. Florist Ave. respectively.

A fourth town hall is scheduled for Thursday, October 3, at James Madison High School, 8135 W. Florist Ave.

There are two virtual town hall meetings that will be held via Zoom on Monday, Oct. 7, from 12 to 1 p.m. and 5:30 to 6:30 p.m.

MKE Cnty Board of Supervisors warn public about 'for-profit' colleges

Thirteen Milwaukee County supervisors issued a statement recently warning county residents about 'for-profit' colleges.

The supervisors were: Supervisors Sheldon Wasserman, Justin Bielinski, Anne O'Connor, Jack Eckblad, Shawn Rolland, Steven Shea, Sky Z. Capriolo, Patti Logsdon, Chairwoman Marcella Nicholson, Kathleen Vincent, Juan Miguel Martinez, Priscilla Coggs-Jones, and Caroline Gómez-Tom.

Their statement reads:

"We, as Milwaukee County Supervisors, stand with the Milwaukee Common Council in urging residents to be cautious of for-profit colleges and their misleading promises.

"In the past, for-profit institutions have taken advantage of Milwaukee residents, particularly those working in low-paying healthcare jobs, as well as students from low-income backgrounds, drawing them in with flashy advertising and leaving them burdened with massive debt and non-transferable credits.

"With the Arizona College of

Nursing planning to open a campus in Milwaukee, we feel it is our duty to warn the public once again.

"This institution is currently on probation in the state of Arizona and has been sued by a group of students in Dallas, Texas.

"We encourage prospective students to approach these for-

University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Milwaukee Area Technical College (MATC), Marquette University, Alverno College, Mount Mary University, or the Milwaukee School of Engineering.

"These schools have a long-standing history of success, offering accredited programs, transferable credits, and strong

profit colleges with extreme caution.

Trump-Vance plan for high-risk pools.

The Trump-Vance plan would roll back the Biden-Harris administration's work to cap the price of insulin at \$35 for seniors, cap the price of out-of-pocket drugs and negotiate with Medicare, which could harm nearly 1 million Wisconsin seniors.

In Wisconsin, the report finds that Trump's plans would impact 2.95 million women and 1.12 million women of reproductive age.

The new report comes ahead of this week's running mate debate, where JD Vance will face off against Governor Tim Walz.

Vance has been the lead cheerleader for the Trump-Vance health care plan. As the Washington Post reported, "Vance floats new health plans for chronically ill, reopening ACA debate," finding that "experts said the ideas sketched out by Vance threaten consumer protections enshrined in the 2010 health law, such as rules that guarantee health coverage to the tens of millions of Americans with preexisting conditions."

City residents given green-light to rake their leaves into street...until November 15!

City of Milwaukee residents may rake leaves into the street from October 1 through November 15. No special requests for leaf collection is necessary.

Leaf collection operations cycle through the city systematically beginning mid-October. Once leaf rake out ends on November 15, DPW makes one final collection sweep across the City. To be collected, ensure that leaves have been

raked out by the leaf rake out deadline. Leaves raked out after the deadline will not be collected.

Residents should rake their leaves into the curb lanes for collection to be composted to make a rich soil amendment.

Sanitation Services offers these tips for successful leaf collections:

Rake leaves loose into the curb lane. Leave a one foot gap between the leaves and the curb. The 1' gap helps ensure the equipment can collect all of the leaves and protects the equipment from being damaged and helps prevent flooding by allowing storm water to move to the storm drains.

Keep piles away from sewer grates, storm drains, and low hanging trees.

Include yard debris such as flowers, garden trimmings, and weeds on top of leaf piles.

Do not include grass clippings, pumpkins, litter, or bagged material.

Do not put brush in the leaf piles. Keep brush separate and located between the curb and sidewalk. Call 414 286-CITY or request a brush collection online.

At all other times of the year, leaves must be mulched on the property or taken to a Drop Off Center. New in 2024: Residents will be able to see where leaf crews are currently working and what routes are up next at milwaukee.gov/leaves. We will also continue our updating of the map for the final collection after the rake-out deadline.

'GOOD TIMES' STAR EMMY-NOMINATED ACTOR, JOHN AMOS, DIES AT 84

John Amos, the Emmy-nominated actor and pioneering television star who brought to life some of the most beloved characters in entertainment history, has died. He was 84.

His son, K.C. Amos, confirmed in a statement that Amos passed away more than a month ago, on August 21, in Los Angeles of natural causes. The younger Amos didn't say why he kept his father's death under wraps for more than a month.

"It is with heartfelt sadness that I share with you that my father has transitioned," K.C. said. "He was a man with the kindest heart and a heart of gold... and he was loved the world over. Many fans consider him their TV father. He lived a good life. His legacy will live on in his outstanding works in television and film as an actor."

Amos' acting career spanned over five decades, with his most iconic role being that of James Evans Sr., the no-nonsense, hard-working father on the groundbreaking CBS sitcom Good Times (1974-1979). The show, which was the first sitcom to center on an African American family, became a cultural touchstone, and Amos' portrayal of James Evans Sr. made him a symbol of strength and dignity for countless viewers.

However, his time on the series was cut short after three seasons due to creative differences with the show's producers. Amos famously clashed with the show's direction, objecting to what he saw as the stereotypical portrayal of his on-screen son, J.J., played by Jimmie Walker.

"We had a number of differences," Amos recalled in later interviews, according to the Hollywood Reporter. "I felt too much emphasis was being put on J.J. in his chicken hat, saying 'Dy-no-mite!' every third page." Amos' insistence on portraying a more balanced, positive image of the Black family on television led to his departure from the show in 1976, when his character was written out in a dramatic two-part episode.

Born John Allen Amos Jr. on December 27, 1939, in Newark, New Jersey, Amos began his professional life with dreams of playing football. He played the sport at Colorado State University and had brief stints with teams like the Denver Broncos and Kansas City Chiefs. But after a series of injuries and cutbacks, Amos transitioned to entertainment, beginning his career as a writer and performer.

Amos got his first major acting break as Gordy Howard, the good-natured weatherman on The Mary Tyler Moore Show, appearing on the iconic series from 1970 to 1973. He would go on to write and perform sketches on The Leslie Uggams Show and later landed roles in various television series and films.

In 1977, Amos received an Emmy nomination for his powerful portrayal of the adult Kunta Kinte in the landmark ABC miniseries Roots, a role that solidified his status as one of television's most respected actors. Amos' performance in Roots, one of the most watched and culturally significant TV events of all time, remains one of his most enduring achievements.

In addition to his success on television, Amos made his mark in films. He appeared in Melvin Van Peebles' groundbreaking blaxploitation film Sweet Sweetback's Baadasssss Song (1971) and The World's Greatest Athlete (1973). He was widely recognized for his role in Coming to America (1988), where he played Cleo McDowell, the owner of McDowell's, a fast-food restaurant parody of McDonald's. Amos reprised the role over three decades later in Coming to America 2 (2021).

His filmography also includes the Sidney Poitier and Bill Cosby classic Let's Do It Again (1975), The Beastmaster (1982), Die Hard 2 (1990), Ricochet (1991), Mac (1992), For Better or Worse (1995), The Players Club (1998), Night Trap (1993), and Because of Charley (2021).

Amos was also a familiar face on television throughout the 1980s, 1990s, and 2000s, with recurring roles in shows like The West Wing as Admiral Percy Fitzwallace, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, and The Fresh Prince of Bel-Air as Will Smith's stepfather. He appeared in The District, Men in Trees, All About the Andersons (as Anthony Anderson's father), and the

Netflix series The Ranch.

Beyond acting, Amos had a passion for writing and performing in theater. In the 1990s, when he found it challenging to secure roles in Hollywood, he wrote and starred in the one-person play Halley's Comet, about an 87-year-old man waiting in the woods for the comet's arrival. He toured with the production for over 20 years, performing in cities across the United States and abroad.

In addition to his onscreen and stage accomplishments, Amos co-produced the documentary America's Dad, which explored his life and career. He was also involved in Broadway, appearing in Carl Reiner's Tough to Get Help production in 1972.

John Amos' life and career were not without personal challenges. In recent years, he was embroiled in a public legal battle between his children, K.C. and Shannon, over accusations of elder abuse. This unfortunate chapter cast a shadow over his later years. However, his legacy as a beloved television father and one of Hollywood's pioneering Black actors remains untarnished.

Both K.C. and Shannon, children from his first marriage to artist Noel "Noni" Mickelson and his ex-wife, actress Lillian Lehman, survive Amos.

Dikembe Mutombo, a towering NBA Hall of Famer who was renowned for his defensive dominance and finger-wagging celebrations, has died from brain cancer, the NBA said in a statement on Monday. He was 58.

Mutombo, who was diagnosed with a brain tumor in 2022, was surrounded by his family, the NBA said.

"Dikembe Mutombo was simply larger than life," NBA Commissioner Adam Silver said in a statement. "On the court, he was one of the greatest shot blockers and defensive players in the NBA. Off the floor, he poured his heart and soul into helping others."

Mutombo was born in the Democratic Republic of Congo before moving to the United States and playing college basketball at Georgetown University. Drafted by the Denver Nuggets as the fourth pick in the 1991 draft, the seven-foot, two-inch center played with six NBA teams throughout his 18-year career and was an eight-time NBA All-Star.

In 2015, he was inducted into the Hall of Fame.

As CBS Sports noted, his 3,289 blocks rank second all-time in NBA history, and he was known for his signature finger wag celebration. Only Hakeem Olajuwon has blocked more shots in NBA history. In addition to the Nuggets, he played for the Atlanta Hawks, Philadelphia 76ers, New Jersey Nets, New York Knicks and Houston Rockets.

Mutombo is one of three players to win the NBA's Defensive Player of the Year four times.

He is perhaps most remembered for his dominant defensive performance in the 1994 playoffs, when he helped lead the Nuggets to a massive upset over the Seattle SuperSonics -- the first No. 8 seed to ever beat a No. 1 seed. Mutombo blocked an NBA-record 31 shots in the series and the Sonics head coach acknowledged that the center had psychologically intimidated his team.

"He got in our players' heads at the very beginning and never left," Se-

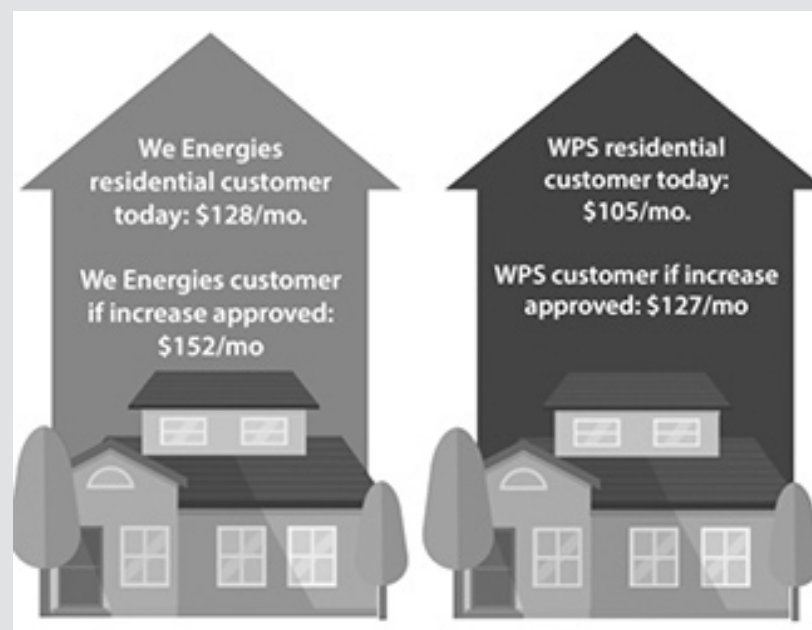
We Energies, WPS Customers: Make Your Voice Heard at Public Hearings on Big Rate Hikes This Week and Next

MADISON — We Energies and WPS customers can make their voices heard in rate cases that will set utility prices for 2025 and 2026.

Public hearings take place in Racine Tuesday, October 1st and in Milwaukee Thursday, October 3rd. The Public Service Commission will accept written comments for a short time after those hearings.

A hearing on the Wisconsin Public Service Corp. rate hike is planned for Thursday, October 10th in Ashwaubenton.

"Now is the time for customers paying the bills to speak out and tell the regulators what they think of utility price increases," said Tom Content, CUB Executive Director.

We Energies seeks total increases of \$605 million over the next two years (2025-26) for its electric and natural gas utilities.

This case comes after We

Energies customers already endured a double-digit hike during 2023 and 2024.

That amounts to a 19% increase for a typical customer, whose monthly electric bill would swell to \$152 by 2026 from \$128 today, under the utility's proposal.

When you add in the increase that took effect over the last two years, customers are facing a 36% jump from 2022 to 2026.

WPS is seeking total increases of \$220 million over the next two years (2025-26) for its electric and natural gas utilities.

This case comes after WPS customers already endured a double-digit hike from 2023 and 2024.

That amounts to a 20% increase for a typical customer, whose monthly electric bill would rise to \$127 by 2026 from \$105 today, under the utility's proposal.

Adding in the increase from the last two years, customers are facing a 28% jump from 2022 to 2026.

CUB is highlighting affordability and energy burden for low-income and moderate-income households plus the impact of these increases on people already struggling to make ends meet.

CUB has asked the PSC to bring down profits on rates and deny profits for closed power plants that aren't needed to keep the lights on.

CUB's proposal would save customers hundreds of millions of dollars. CUB is also calling for shareholders, not utility customers, to pay for bonuses for utility management.

In its testimony, CUB highlighted how the utility's shareholders have seen outsized gains as the company has posted record earnings growth supported by high profits allowed by the Public Service Commission.

Over that same period, customers' bills have doubled, and risen faster than the cost of living. (See chart below.)

"The affordability challenge cries out for more balance between shareholders and customers," Content told the PSC.

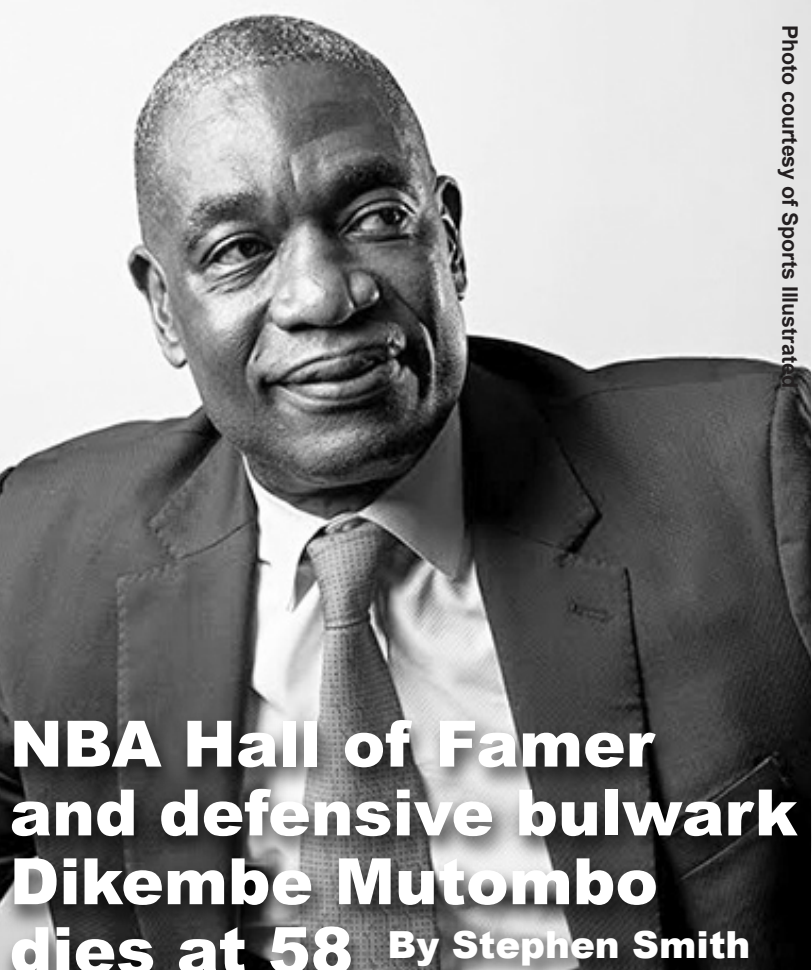

NBA Hall of Famer and defensive bulwark Dikembe Mutombo dies at 58

attle coach George Karl said.

Beyond basketball, Mutombo started the Dikembe Mutombo Foundation in the Congo in 1997. Its goal is to improve health, education and quality of life in the African country. He also serves on the board of Special Olympics International, the CDC Foundation and the National Board for the U.S. Fund for UNICEF.

Daryl Morey, 76ers president of basketball operations, said Monday that Mutombo was "very important" to the franchise.

"There aren't many guys like him," Morey said. "... Just an amazing human being what he did off the court for Africa."

76ers center Joel Embiid, who grew up in Cameroon, also expressed his condolences Monday.

"It's a sad day, especially for us Africans and really the whole world, because other than what he has accomplished on the basketball court, I think he was even better off the court," Embiid said. "Those are some of the guys — he's one of the guys that I look up to as far as having an impact, not just on the court but off the court. He's done a lot of great things. He did a lot of great things for a lot of people. He was a role model of mine."

Mutombo spent the latter part of his life as an ambassador for the NBA.

"There was nobody more qualified than Dikembe to serve as the NBA's first Global Ambassador," Silver said.

"He was a humanitarian at his core. He loved what the game of basketball could do to make a positive impact on communities, especially in his native Democratic Republic of the Congo and across the continent of Africa.

"I had the privilege of traveling the world with Dikembe and seeing firsthand how his generosity and compassion uplifted people. He was always accessible at NBA events over the years -- with his infectious smile, deep booming voice and signature finger wag that endeared him to basketball fans of every generation. -The Associated Press contributed to this report.

Harris's Appeal to Gen-Z and Millennials Serves as a Bridge Between Generations

(TriceEdneyWire.com) - It is refreshing to see a leader like Vice President Kamala Harris who understands the wide generational gap we have in our nation. There will always be situations where older and younger people maintain different perspectives on life and the nation's future based on their experiences, opinions, habits, and behavior. Harris's candidacy for president serves as a bridge between generations and has effectively found ways to close the gap in a relatively short time. Almost half of Gen Z (ages 16-27) respondents in a UCLA study said they were not motivated to

vote at all in the 2024 presidential election prior to Kamala Harris' nomination. In addition, 29 percent of Gen Z respondents who said they were not motivated to vote in the upcoming election before the change in the Democratic nominee say they are now motivated to vote for Harris. The vice president's campaign has a notable social media presence. It is through this presence that she has successfully inspired undecided voters. "Young adults are increasingly getting news from TikTok, reporting social media as the most authentic form of media," said

Yalda Uhls, founder and CEO of the UCLA Center for Scholars & Storytellers. "Our data shows that young people are very engaged with what's happening in the political sphere around them, and keeping up with the news seems to be influencing their desire to vote for Kamala Harris." For young people interested in voting for Harris, her identity as a woman of color was not a large motivating factor. Of Gen Z respondents, 82 percent cited reasons other than Harris's racial or gender identity when explaining their support for her.

Some respondents agreed with her stance on the issues; they see her as an exciting candidate that gives hope, and some liked what they learned about her on social media. "Contrary to Republican messaging about Kamala Harris being a DEI hire, young people seem more excited about her candidacy because of the tone and substance of her campaign rather than because of her race, ethnicity or gender," said Alisha Hines, the center's director of research from its 2023 Teens and Screens Report, which showed that young people are overwhelming interested in stories of hope—a defining mood of the Harris campaign. Young people are distancing

themselves from the political polarization we've become accustomed to seeing during previous election cycles. Harris has shown a unique ability to assess different demographics' true needs and concerns and then meet them at their point of need. Like older generations before them, Gen Zers and millennials (ages 28-40) should be able to have hope in their futures while pursuing the "American dream," allowing a new wave of younger leaders who understand the challenges of their peers to articulate to the American people. Harris's ability to be flexible when dealing with various demographics while still being authentic is a character trait that draws the support of young people. President Biden had the right message but was not the most effective messenger. Harris is also unique because she is an HBCU graduate. Just as she has found ways of successfully motivating and inspiring Gen Zers through social media, she can also connect with young Black voters from HBCUs in ways other candidates cannot. As a graduate of Howard University, she understands the cultural significance behind the HBCU homecoming. Homecoming is a special time of the year for students and alums on HBCU campuses. If Harris becomes president of the United States, there will be a sense of special pride in having someone from Howard University hold the highest office in the nation. It is the type of pride shared with all HBCU students and alums, not just those from Howard. As a Norfolk State University graduate, I will also share in the

proud moment of her election, as well as the journey of her historic campaign. The Harris-Walz campaign will kick off an HBCU Homecoming Tour across the battleground states of North Carolina, Georgia, Florida, Virginia, and Pennsylvania to reach Black Gen Z voters. "HBCUs are responsible for educating generations of leaders across all industries and remain some of the most distinguished institutions of higher learning in the United States—that is why as a proud Howard University graduate, Vice President Harris helped lead the Biden-Harris administration in investing \$17 billion into HBCUs across the country," said Harris-Walz 2024 Senior Advisor Trey Baker. "Engaging young Black voters and the broader HBCU alumni network across battleground states is a testament to the commitment of the Team Harris-Walz to truly meeting voters where they are at, to underscore the stakes of this election." —David W. For Vance at VP debate, facts about Haitians and Black votes don't matter

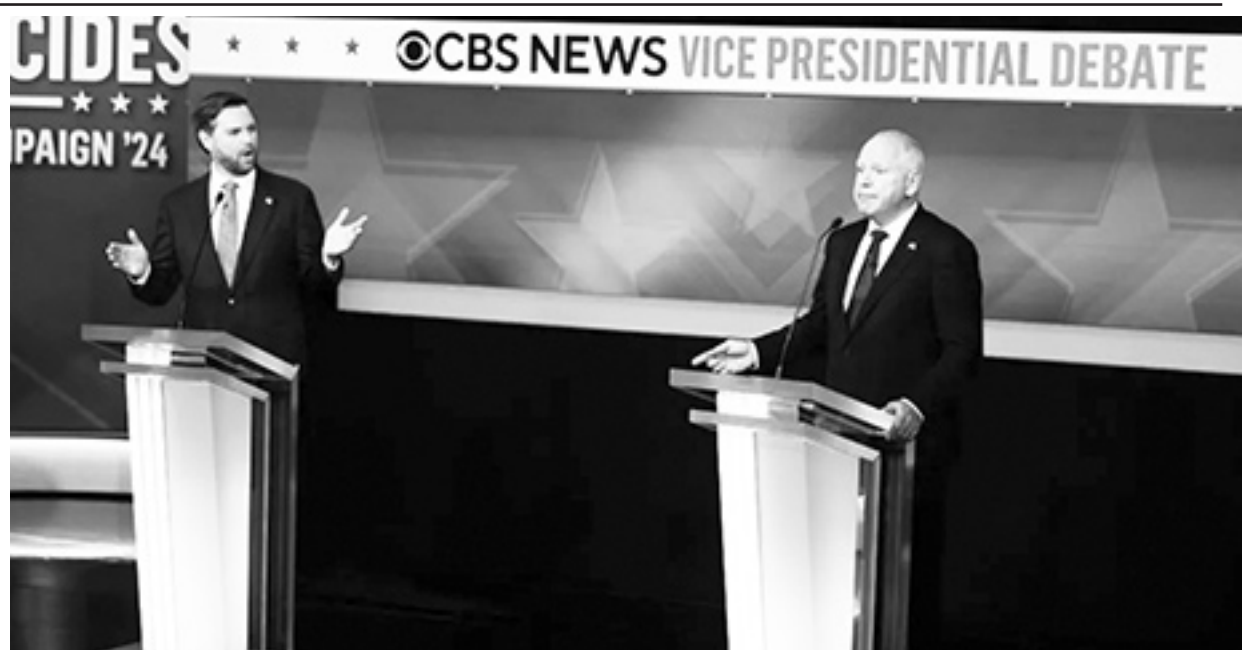

Though the vice presidential debate between the Democratic nominee, Minnesota Gov. Tim Walz, and Republican nominee, U.S. Sen. JD

Vance, was uncharacteristically cordial, and many felt Vance outperformed Walz, critics aren't mincing their words about Vance's inability to

tell the truth. "JD Vance is OK pushing a lie that he knows is a lie, perpetuating it on a national stage before millions of people," Democratic strategist Aleshia Cross told theGrio. "It doesn't matter to him who it harms."

During the Tuesday night debate, Vance, who for weeks parroted lies about Haitian migrants eating pets in Springfield, Ohio, went out of his way to interject when CBS moderator Margaret Brennan clarified for viewers that "Springfield, Ohio does have a large number of Haitian migrants who have legal status." The fact check was in response to Vance, who in defending criticisms from Walz on his past comments about Haitian immigrants appeared to suggest Haitians were not in the U.S. legally as a result of "Kamala Harris' open border." Walz slammed his Republican opponent, who he said "vilified" and "dehumanized" a "large number of people who were here legally in the community of Springfield." "Governor Walz brought up the community of Springfield, and he's very worried about the things that I've said in Springfield," said Vance. "You've got schools that are overwhelmed. You've got hospitals that are overwhelmed. You've got housing that is totally unaffordable because we brought in millions of illegal immigrants to compete with Americans for scarce homes." Cross said that "when given the opportunity to clean up the comments on Haitian migrants," Vance "chose not to." This is despite the Republican governor of Ohio, the Springfield city manager and others publicly saying that his claims were false. "He has painted Haitian migrants and migrants broadly as a scapegoat

for America's woes," the Democratic strategist continued. "It's something that we've seen that working-class white Americans particularly have jumped on when it comes to their push for deportation of migrants." Cross added, "This is about xenophobia and racism, and it was on full display last night as well." Jamarr Brown, executive director of the civil rights advocacy group Color of Change PAC, said that while Vance has received some praise for his debate performance, he wasn't impressed. "There may have been many folks who think that he is articulate or that he's a great debater, and actually, I think that he is just really slick and slimy," Brown told theGrio. "He lied, he ducked and he dodged all the real facts and answers to the questions." "Governor Walz reinforced he and Vice President Harris' commitment to serving all people, not just the rich, the white, and the well-connected," said Brown. By contrast, he said Vance "did nothing but parrot the same tired playbook of former president Trump." He added, "Including claiming to support policies that will help Black people but in actuality supporting policies like repealing the Affordable Care Act and expanding corporate tax cuts that will cause extreme harm." 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the higher leadership of our government and of our democracy, that scares Republicans." Brown dismissed Vance's claims about a peaceful transfer, telling theGrio, "There's not a peaceful transfer of power when on the day that the results are supposed to be certified, you send in a mob and told them to march down to the Capitol and don't let them steal this election." He also added, "[Trump] didn't attend the inauguration, which is also a symbolic ceremonial transfer of power. He left town before Biden got to town, and so he is not about the rule of law. He thinks he's above the law." Trump and Vance's refusal to accept the 2020 election results — despite being litigated in courts at least 60 times — also sets up a similar scenario in the 2024 election. The former president previously refused to commit to accepting the results this November. Brown emphasized that this is happening as Republicans in states like Georgia, North Carolina and Texas purge voters from the voter registration rolls for "a number of reasons." Black voters, he said, must stay "vigilant." "They can, at this point, enact the same types of initiatives they were trying to do in 2020 to prevent Black people from making it to the polls," he said. "We have to stay a part of the process and part of the system to make sure that the Donald Trumps and the JD Vances of the world don't get to unfairly wield power to maintain stability for themselves."
