ThriveOn Collaboration introduces café operator

Workforce training, teaching kitchen among ThriveOn King healthy food features

The ThriveOn Collaboration has selected Kinship Community Food Center, which serves residents in the Riverwest and Harambee neighborhoods, to operate a signature café in the historic ThriveOn King building.

In addition to bringing healthy food options to the dynamic community hub, the nonprofit partner will also bring to the table an innovative workforce training program for residents encountering barriers to employment.

“Kinship’s inclusion among the mosaic of partners contributing to the activation of ThriveOn King will help us meet two community-identified priorities at the same time,” said Greg Wesley, president and CEO of the Greater Milwaukee Foundation.

“In our initial visioning process and throughout our ongoing engagement, neighbors have consistently named access to nutritious food and access to jobs among their highest priorities.

Thanks to this arrangement, the collaboration can fulfill another promise to Bronzeville area residents.”

Led by the Greater Milwaukee Foundation, the Medical College of Wisconsin (MCW) and Royal Capital, the ThriveOn Collaboration invests in the health, educational, social and economic wellness of Milwaukee’s Halyard Park, Harambee and Brewers Hill neighborhoods and beyond.

In today's world, social drinking has become so normalized that many don't even realize when it slips into murky territory.

Whether it's with friends, co-workers, or even family, the line between casual drinking and something more concerning can be tough to spot.

Enter the concept of "gray area drinking" - it's not alcoholism, but it's definitely not harmless either. Sure, you're not downing shots at sunrise, but does that really mean there's no problem?

The tricky thing about gray area drinking is how easy it is to justify. Everyone around you might be drinking the same, if not more, so it doesn't seem like a big deal.

And if you're not knocking back a drink first thing in the morning, the habit probably doesn't raise any red flags, right? After all, society's idea of an "alcoholic" usually involves

extremes.

But the truth is, many people in this gray zone may be drinking emotionally, using it to cope with stress or just to take the edge off. And little by little, those casual sips start to pile up.

The reality? Even subtle shifts in how much you drink can have a bigger impact than you think. While most people know the dangers of alcohol addiction, fewer realize that even moderate increases in drinking can come with serious risks - think liver disease, heart problems, cancer, and diminished brain function.

To get a better sense of how widespread gray area drinking really is, MyBioSource surveyed over 3,000 adults across the country.

The findings? A staggering 50% of Wisconsinites (who drink) fall into this category - that's 1,827,731 people who are drinking more than they should, even if they wouldn't label themselves as having a problem.

The survey from MyBioSource didn't just stop at identifying the prevalence of gray area drinking. It also dug deeper into the specific habits and mindsets of these drinkers, and the results were eye-opening.

When asked how often they drank more than they initially planned, 30% of respondents admitted to doing so on a weekly basis.

An additional 11% confessed they found themselves drinking more than intended several times a week.

This sense of losing control, even if only occasionally, is a key sign of gray area drinking - where you might start with the best intentions, but the "just one more" mentality kicks in.

The emotional toll of these habits isn't lost on many, either. The survey found that 17% often felt guilty or concerned about their drinking, while 9% experienced these feelings frequently.

These numbers suggest that, for many, drinking isn't just about fun and relaxation - it's followed by a nagging sense of regret, hinting at a deeper awareness that something may not be quite right.

Social situations also add fuel to the fire, with 35% of respondents saying they struggle to say no to alcohol when they're

with others.

Whether it's peer pressure, the fear of being seen as the odd one out, or simply the atmosphere, it's clear that many find it difficult to set boundaries when alcohol is in the mix.

Perhaps one of the most telling findings comes from the question of stopping altogether. When asked how difficult it would be to quit alcohol for a month, 20% said it would be extremely challenging.

For many gray area drinkers, the idea of stepping away from alcohol, even for a short time, feels like an uphill battle. This speaks to the subtle grip that alcohol can have - people may not label themselves as having a drinking problem, but the thought of giving it up feels daunting.

Finally, 24% of respondents revealed that the longest they've gone without alcohol in the past year was less than a week.

This short period of abstinence reinforces the idea that alcohol is an almost constant presence in their lives, even if they don't see it as an issue.

"Many people don't realize that even moderate alcohol consumption can have serious health implications. Gray area drinkers may not exhibit the obvious signs of alcoholism, but

over time, they can still face an increased risk of liver disease, heart disease, certain cancers, and cognitive decline.

The reality is that any amount of regular alcohol use, especially when it creeps into emotional or excessive drinking, can take a toll on both physical and mental health," said a MyBioSource spokesperson.

Methodology

We selected 3,000 respondents (21+) from a geographically diverse online panel, ensuring that all participants and double opt-in members. This pool is further refined based on consumers of alcohol. To ensure the most relevant participants are included, our surveys incorporate screening questions that help verify and authenticate respondents.

To maintain the highest standards of data quality, we utilize a variety of advanced methods. In addition to standard tools like digital fingerprinting, bot detection, geo-verification, and speed checks, each response is thoroughly reviewed by a dedicated team member to confirm both quality and contextual relevance.

Open-ended answers are also carefully examined to identify any nonsensical or plagiarized content.

Their work centers around nourishment – addressing food security and wellness; belonging – fostering kinship and community engagement; and prosperity – creating economic stability and opportunity.

The café at ThriveOn King provides an opportunity to explore an emerging area of interest aligned with Kinship’s mission, that of a food-based social enterprise.

Expected to open later this fall for breakfast and lunch, Monday through Friday, the café will offer a welcoming dining experience, providing neighborhood residents nourishment, fellowship, and an opportunity to grow and thrive together.

Its scratch cooking offerings will include hot sandwiches, fresh and healthy bowls and salads, and grab-and-go options, as well as barista service.

Layered into the café operation will be Kinship’s established workforce training program that prioritizes social cohesion and healing and is designed to create employment opportunities for systems-impacted individuals.

For participants enrolled in its program, Kinship provides paid work experience in culinary arts, urban agriculture and hospitality, while integrating social connection and personal development, to open pathways to steady employment and economic mobility.

Among their many community partners in the program is another ThriveOn King tenant, JobsWork MKE, adding to the synergy being built in the community hub.

“We are committed to paving the way for career stability and personal healing, ensuring that everyone, including myself and all members of our workforce team, has the opportunity to grow and thrive together,” said Demonte Dismuke, workforce development manager for Kinship.

The Foundation is providing \$350,000 in grant funding over two years to support the workforce training component of the ThriveOn King café as a long-term investment in cultivating individual stability and employment. In the immediate term, the café is expected to create 10-12 jobs and also serve as a preferred catering service for the building.

“I have been able to push and work through challenges and big changes in my life that I’ve wanted to make for a long time because I have the support and love that I needed around me to show me that I had worth and that I was strong enough to change,” said Hope Wernicke, a current workforce trainee.

Leveraging kitchen as a classroom

The café at ThriveOn King will also be shared as the home of the MCW Teaching Kitchen led by Stuart Wong MD, Professor of Medicine and Director of MCW Center for Disease Prevention Research.

“Community-engaged culinary medicine programming will provide medical students learning opportunities to understand how to make lifestyle discussions part of their routine visits with patients and to set a positive example by making healthy choices themselves,” said Dr. Wong.

An example of this programming is a pediatric obesity educational program in collaboration with FoodRight, a Milwaukee-based nonprofit; Kinship; and Children’s Wisconsin in which MCW medical students learn to teach culinary skills and nutrition to students in Milwaukee schools.

ThriveOn King is home to the Foundation’s offices and convening spaces (fourth floor); MCW’s community engagement programs (second and third floors); and multiple community partners serving the community from their first floor locations including JobsWork MKE, Versiti on King and Malaika Early Learning Center.

Community gathering and wellness spaces are in use with availability set to expand as the building opens fully to the public. Construction continues on the residential portion of the development, aiming for completion in 2025.

Ta-Nehisi Coates, the public intellectual whose writing has sparked national conversations about reparations and race in the United States, has written a book indicting Israel for its mistreatment of Palestinians and occupation of their territory.

“The Message,” which comes out Tuesday, is Coates’ first nonfiction book in nearly a decade. It is a collection of three essays, the longest of which is about a 10-day trip Coates took to Israel and the West Bank last year, prior to the outbreak of the Israel-Hamas war on Oct 7.

Passages of the book that have been reprinted in reviews and articles — as well as Coates’ own reflections on the essay — have sparked praise and criticism of the analysis offered by Coates, who identifies as a “relative latecomer” to studying the conflict.

Written by a National Book Award winner frequently compared to James Baldwin, the influential Black intellectual of the Civil Rights era,

the book also aims to influence the way the conflict is discussed ahead of the one-year anniversary of Oct. 7, 2023 and at a time when the Israel-Hamas war has dominated American politics and discourse.

In the essay, titled “The Gigantic Dream,” and in interviews prior to the book’s publication, Coates draws on his own identity as a Black American and likens Israel’s control over West Bank Palestinians to the Jim Crow South.

He also questions the justification for Israel's founding after the Holocaust and criticizes "the elevation of factual complexity over self-evident morality" in the way the conflict is covered.

"I don't think I ever, in my life, felt the glare of racism burn stranger and more intense than in Israel," he writes in the essay, according to a recent cover story in New York Magazine.

"The pushing of Palestinians out of their homes had the specific imprimatur of the United States of America. Which means that it had my imprimatur."

Articles that praise and criticize the book both note that Coates' survey of the conflict is limited. According to coverage, the book does not discuss Hamas' Oct. 7 attack on Israel nor the ensuing war in Gaza, because he wanted to center it on what he saw.

The essay reportedly does not include the word "Hamas." Nor, according to the New York magazine story and others, does it discuss that Israel has faced decades of terror attacks on civilians from groups, including Hamas, that are publicly committed to the country's destruction. (Coates' publisher, Penguin Random House, did not respond to JTA's request for a review copy in time for publication.)

"He refuses to countenance conversations with Jews who don't share his opinions and don't denounce their nation," reads a critique of the book by Daniel Bergner in the Atlantic, Coates' former longtime professional home. In a sign of Coates' influence, the critique remained one of the Atlantic's most-read articles five days after its publication.

The review adds that Coates does not acknowledge "that to a great degree, Palestinian leadership as well as many Palestinian people share this eliminationist view [of Israel], which might help explain the forbidden roads and onerous checkpoints."

Asked on Monday why he did not write about attacks on Israel in the book, Coates said that views sympathetic to Israel are already represented in major U.S. outlets.

"There is no shortage of that perspective in American media. I am most concerned always with those who don't have a voice," he said in an interview on CBS. "I wrote a 260-page book. It is not a treatise on the entirety of the conflict between the Palestinians and the Israelis."

And though Coates' essay does not touch on Oct. 7 at length, in his interview with New York magazine editor Ryu Spaeth he accuses Israel of "genocide," a common charge of pro-Palestinian activists that Israel vigorously denies. He

also compared Hamas' Oct. 7 attack to Nat Turner's 1831 slave rebellion. After listing instances of Israeli mistreatment of Palestinians, he mused about whether he would have participated in Hamas' cross-border attack on Israel.

"And if that wall went down and I came through that wall, who would I be?" he said. "Can I say I'd be the person that says, 'Hey, guys, hold up. We shouldn't be doing this'? Would that have been me?"

Coates, who has not responded to a Jewish Telegraphic Agency request for comment, has also criticized the way leading American journalists and publications cover the region, accusing them of portraying an unequal reality as an even-handed conflict. In one instance, he said pro-Palestinian protesters on college campuses — whom some Jewish students across universities have accused of being hostile or antisemitic — have a better view of the conflict than some reporters.

"That kid up at Columbia, whatever dumb s— they're saying, whatever slogan I would not say that they would use, they are more morally correct than some mother—ers that have won Pulitzer Prizes and National Magazine Awards and are the most decorated and powerful journalists," he told New York magazine.

Coates' 10-day trip took place in 2023, months prior to Oct. 7, and he acknowledges that it was his first in-depth encounter with the conflict. Half of the trip was guided by writers associated with the Palestine Festival of Literature, or Palfest, and the other half was led by Israeli left-wing activists associated with the anti-occupation group Breaking the Silence.

In a blog post, he also listed well over a dozen books and articles he read to educate himself about the conflict. They include histories by Palestinian scholar Rashid Khalidi and Israeli scholar Benny Morris; Arthur Hertzberg's "The Zionist Idea," a compendium of Zionist writing; and works by Amy Kaplan, Nadia Abu El-Haj and other writers.

Coates has not appeared to lay out a detailed itinerary of the trip prior to the book's publication but has written and said that the trip took him to hotspots of the conflict that are popular stops for those seeking an introduction to the conflict and the region. Among the places he visited were Jerusalem's Temple Mount, which is revered by Muslims as the Noble Sanctuary; the West Bank city of Hebron, where Israeli troops guard a small enclave of Jewish settlers and restrict Palestinian movement; the Palestinian villages in the surrounding area; Yad Vashem, Israel's Holocaust museum; and cities including

Jerusalem, Tel Aviv, Haifa and Ramallah.

Coates has spoken repeatedly about the ideas he seeks to advance in the book, including the parallel between Israel's West Bank occupation and segregation in the United States, and his earlier perception that the conflict was too complex to understand.

"I thought I was going to another country, but in fact what amazed me was I actually felt that I was in the same country, but I was in a different time," Coates said at a Nov. 1, 2023, event in New York City sponsored by Palfest. "I was in the time of my parents and my grandparents."

He added that the conflict had been "made to sound as though you need a degree in Middle Eastern studies or, sometimes, a PhD, to really understand what's happening. But I understood the first day."


"The Message" follows 2015's "Between the World and Me," which explored Amer-

ican racism and the Black experience, and his landmark 2014 article, "The Case for Reparations," which elevated arguments for reparations for slavery to the forefront of the national conversation. In that article, Coates favorably cites reparations paid to Israel in the wake of the Holocaust, but now says that criticism of that comparison led, years later, to this book.

In interviews, Coates has questioned the justification for Israel's establishment in the wake of the Holocaust. "Does

industrialized genocide entitle one to a state? No," he told New York magazine. At the November 2023 event, he said Israeli Jews "take the wrong lesson" from their own history of persecution.

And in the blog post that functions as a bibliography for the essay, he sketches out what he calls a "frightful" scenario: "The emancipated enslaved; the oppressed colonizes; the vanquished ethnically cleanses; a people survive a genocide only to perpetrate another."
