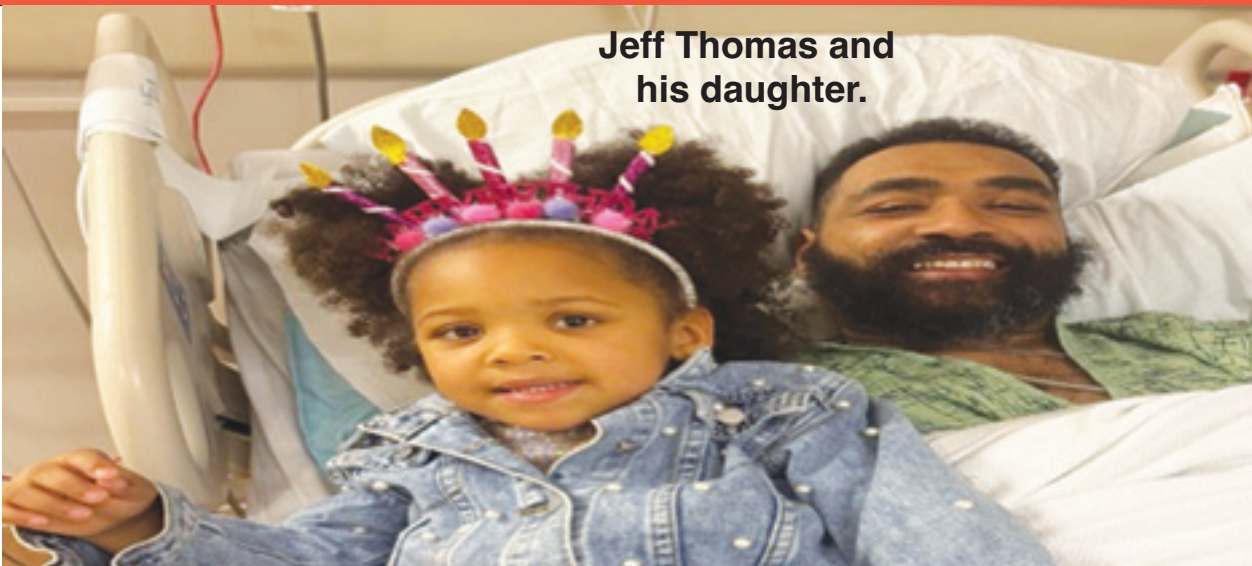

MINORITY DONOR SENSITIVITY MONTH AND BLACK HISTORY

The month of February is full of things to remember. It is Black History Month, a month set aside to honor the contributions made by African Americans in the growth of our nation.

Many questioned why a month for Black awareness, because for too long Black Americans had built plantations, the White House, designed the streets of Washington, DC., the development of a plethora of products and uses for the sweet potato by George Washington Carter of the famed Tuskegee Institute (now Tuskegee University).

The discovery of blood plasma by Dr. Charles Drew; Samuel Cornish and John Russwurm, the publishers of America's first Black newspaper, 'The Freedoms Journal.' Monumental civil rights legislation that advanced the cause of freedom and justice, such as the 'Brown v. Board of Education' ruling by the Supreme Court which struck down the prevailing belief of 'separate but equal.'

That case was argued on behalf of the plaintiff's before august judicial body by civil rights Atty. Thurgood Marshall (who would go on to become the first Black Supreme Court Justice.

Other iconic civil rights leaders such as Andrew Young, Whitney Young, Dr. William Finlayson; Judge Clarence C. Parrish, Phylis Wheatley, Dolores C. Tucker, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Malcolm X ... the list goes on, including pioneer stem cell researcher, Dr. Roland A. Pattillo.

In addition to the giants of Black History Month, the month of February also celebrates heart health.

The American Heart Association annually holds a nation wide promotion focusing on heart health. Heart disease kills more Americans than any other disease, especially African Americans who suffer an overwhelmingly high number of deaths from the disease.

Marquette Law school shines light on untold Black History

Black History Month is a time for reflection, education and recognition of the contributions African Americans have made throughout U.S. history.

At Marquette University Law School, a powerful presentation shed light on stories often left out of history books—stories that deserve to be told.

Hundreds of people gathered for Derek Mosley's presentation, "Things Your History Teacher Didn't Teach You: Blacks in History." Mosley, director of the Marquette Lubar Center, is passionate about sharing a more complete version of American history.

"The history I talk about in these lectures is U.S. history—a history that involves all of us," Mosley explained. "I never use the term 'Black history' because when you say Black history, it makes some people feel like it doesn't apply to them."

During the hour-long session, Mosley introduced the audience to lesser-known Black figures who played vital roles in shaping America—from pioneering inventors to unsung heroes right here in Milwaukee.

One of the stories that stood out was that of the Six Triple Eight, an all-Black women's battalion in World War II that sorted and delivered mail to U.S. soldiers.

Marquette Law school shines light on untold Black History "One of my favorite stories is the 'Six Triple Eight,'" Mosley shared. "There were 800 women in that battalion. Sadly, only two of them are still alive—but one is from Milwaukee!"

For many attendees, the presentation was a powerful reminder of the importance of knowing and understanding history.

"It's our social responsibility as Black people in Milwaukee to understand our history, our challenges and how we move forward," said Dasha Young, a Marquette alumna.

As Black History Month continues, Mosley hopes his presentation sparks deeper conversations about inclusion and historical accuracy. He's also using social media to educate others.

"For the past 14 years, I've been posting one Black history fact a day for 28 straight days, covering everything from athletics to music," Mosley said.

One of the most eye-opening moments of the session highlighted the long-lasting impact of slavery. Mosley pointed out a sobering truth—African Americans were enslaved in America for more years than they have lived free.

Quoting historian Carter G. Woodson, Mosley reminded the audience why Black History Month is essential.

"We have Black History Month because of Carter G. Woodson, who said, 'A people who don't know their history are aimless, wandering through society.' It's important to know where you come from so you understand where you're going."

Events celebrating Black History Month will continue throughout February, providing more opportunities for people to learn, reflect and celebrate.

As Mosley urged the audience, "Read it. Let it peak your interest. Then go out, Google it, and find out more."

Melik Abdul, a GOP strategist and member of the Black Americans for Trump Coalition, said that he's been "fielding a lot of calls" after President Donald Trump (without evidence) blamed DEI policies for the fatal collision between a commercial jet and an Army helicopter over the Potomac River in Washington, D.C., which left 67 people dead.

On CNN, Abdul said: "I know a number of people who voted for Donald Trump for the first time, they were so disgusted in what they felt has happened in the Biden administration."

He added, "This week, instead of talking about the economy, I was fielding questions on whether or not the Trump administration wanted to stop commemorating Black History month, Women's History Month, Hispanic Heritage Month."

While Trump says he recognizes February 2025 as National Black History Month on the White House website and cites Supreme Court Justice Clarence Thomas as an "American hero," many federal agencies including the De-

partment of Defense led by Pete Hegseth have announced that they have put a stop to race-based and gender-based commemorations.

Abdul added: "So when people said that they voted for Donald Trump because they were concerned about things like the price of eggs...because of Donald Trump's own doing, we're having to have this conversation about DEI."

Abdul added: "DEI for many people — and I call them the 'woke right' — it has become a stand-in for being Black and unqualified."

And what I would like the Trump administration to do — Susie Wiles, I love her, never met her, want to meet her one day — I want them to ask the team 'What was our message coming out of this week?' And if they say that they felt it was successful, then we're going to have a very long four years."

Washington, President Biden's nominee to lead the Federal Aviation Association (FAA), was unable to answer a number of questions and withdrew his name after the hearing. Note: Washington is Black.

Abdul commented on the Washington comparison: "Maybe he wasn't a good fit for this position. But the

Abdul replied to Jones: "Sure! He should've. But why didn't that threshold exist for Pete Hegseth? He has less practical and executive experience than Phil Washington."

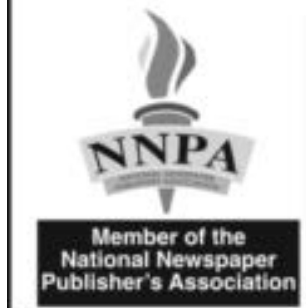

Black Ministers Call For Resistance Against 'White Christian Nationalism' Efforts Of Project 2025

Black church leaders are banding together amid the return of Donald Trump to the White House and calling for Black resistance against "white Christian Nationalism," aka Project 2025.

In a statement dated Jan. 1 and later published by Reel Urban News, over two dozen Black ministers issued "A Credo to Legatees of the Black Church Tradition." The statement calls for Black church leaders and its members to resist white Christian nationalism through bold acts of defiance.

Among the suggested acts of resistance include investing in Black-owned banks, supporting Black businesses, and providing scholarships to help students attend voca-

Where is the Black population in the US growing the most?

A new Pew Research report released Jan. 23 revealed that the Black population in the U.S. has seen substantial growth since 2000.

Over the past two decades, the Black population has increased by a third, rising from 36.2 million in 2000 to a staggering 48.3 million in 2023. This growth includes not only Black Americans but also individuals within the broader Black diaspora, such as those identifying as Hispanic, whose numbers grew by 210%. Immigration from regions like Africa and the Caribbean also played a significant role in the major increase.

Utah saw the most growth.

Among the states, Utah has experienced the most rapid growth in its Black population, surging by 89% from 2010 to 2023. While the report gave little data on what sparked the surge, a 2024 report from Lending Tree revealed that some Black residents living in the state were thriving.

Provo, Utah, in particular, stood out for having the lowest unemployment rate among Black residents, at just 3.6%, and ranked high in 6th place in terms of education, with 34.1% of Black adults holding a bachelor's degree or higher.

The median household income for Black residents in Provo in 2024 was \$59,471, placing it below the national

median of \$69,021, but the state made up for this area when it came to income.

Last year, the metro area contained the 13th-highest percentage of high-income earners, with 27.7% of Black households earning \$100,000 or more annually.

However, Provo's ranking for homeownership was more modest last year, coming in at 53rd, with 39.5% of Black residents owning their homes.

Arizona, Nevada, and Minnesota saw their Black populations grow by 60% between 2010 to 2023, ranking as the next-fastest-growing states with Black populations of at least 25,000 in 2010.

The states with the largest numerical increases in Black residents during the same period are also home to the largest overall Black populations.

Texas added 1.2 million Black residents, followed by Florida with an increase of 800,000, and Georgia which grew by 610,000.

Atlanta, Washington D.C., and Chicago were metro areas where the Black population grew significantly.

When it comes to metro areas, the New York City metropolitan area remains home to the largest number of Black residents, with about 3.8 million Black Americans living in the region in 2023, the Pew Research study noted. Other metro areas with large Black populations include Atlanta (2.3 million), Chicago (1.7 million) and Washington, D.C. (1.8 mil-

lion), famously dubbed Chocolate City.

According to data from Lending Tree's 2024 report, Washington, D.C., claimed the top spot for Black residents living financially well. The region excelled in three key areas: education, median income, and high-income earners, ranking high in all three areas.

The median household income for Black residents in the D.C. metro last year was \$82,045, which is 18.9% higher than the national median of \$69,021. This above-average income level often correlates with a higher proportion of residents in high-income brackets and a more educated population.

The data also revealed that 40.5% of Black households in the area earned \$100,000 or more, while 37.2% of Black adults aged 25 and older held at least a bachelor's degree. Ad-

ditionally, D.C. ranked in the top 10 for homeownership, with 51.3% of Black residents owning their homes.

In terms of percentage, Atlanta stood out with the highest share of Black residents in any metro area with at least 1 million Black residents, with nearly 37% of the population identifying as Black.

Other metro areas with high proportions of Black residents include Washington, D.C. (28%), Philadelphia (23%), and Detroit (23%).

Notably, between 2010 and 2023, Dallas saw the largest percentage increase in its Black population, growing by 47%. In contrast, cities like Detroit and Los Angeles saw little to no growth, with Detroit's Black population remaining steady and Los Angeles experiencing a slight decline of 1%.

tional schools and historically Black colleges and universities (HBCUs). Taking these actions would be in direct response to Trump’s recent executive orders, which fall in line with Project 2025, an agenda Black church leaders say “is informed by white Christian Nationalism.”

“We believe Black people should return to the ecumenical Black Church tradition and renew fellowship with their brothers and sisters,” the statement read, “to help fight and resist hegemonic practices which continue to endorse under-resourced public and private funding to abolish human poverty.”

The police killing of George Floyd in 2020 in the United States was an appalling act involving a group of officers who did not place much, if any, value on the life of a Black man.

In the agonizing nine minutes before he died under the knee of Derek Chauvin, Floyd cried out for air and for his mother.

Those moments, recorded by a passerby and shared widely and repeatedly over the days that followed, shocked the consciences of many Americans and others, triggering protests across the United States and in other countries, many of them led by the Black Lives Matter movement.

Chauvin was convicted of murder, and three other officers were convicted of other serious crimes.

While there is now greater awareness and scrutiny of racism and violence in policing, there is also a long record of reverting to old ways.

Indeed, deeply entrenched racial bias is rooted in the soul and psyche of North American society and globally.

When we think about Black Lives Matter, we typically think of criminal justice, but the movement also started a conversation about the lingering mental

health impacts of police brutality on those who experience it directly, as well as those who experience it vicariously.

Black trauma

The traumatizing after-effects of anti-Black racism also result from Black people's experiences within other social structures, such as employment, education and health care.

The trauma resulting from multiple forms of anti-Black racism has a legacy that took root during the colonial era and has endured, impacting the spiritual, emotional, psychological and mental well-being of Black people in societies harmed by colonialism, such as Canada, the U.S. and the United Kingdom.

I am a professor and the HOPE Chair in Peace and Health in the Global Peace and Social Justice Program at McMaster University.

I have been studying Black trauma for almost 20 years, and recently published a book on the subject, *From the Enlightenment to Black Lives Matter: Tracing the Impacts of Racial Trauma in Black Communities from the Colonial Era to the Present*.

The book documents that since the colonial era, Black bodies have been receptacles for trauma that carry the weight of the past and the present. Black trauma is deep, complex and continuing, and has harmful impacts on the mental health of Black people.

It includes the dehumanizing and lingering consequences of the slave trade, the social and economic subjugation of Black people in Jim Crow America and the racist social structures that persist there and in Canada, the U.K. and elsewhere.

For Black people, trauma results from racist assaults to their spiritual, emotional, mental, psychological and physical well-being.

When racism resides in the body in these visceral ways, it manifests as emotional pain and rage, and its lingering after-effects endure over generations.

Public health crisis

Addressing the public health crisis of racial trauma for Black people requires that racism be recognized as a legitimate issue in health education and training, research, clinical practice, mental health services and policy, and in the mental health system more broadly.

It also requires that mental health professionals not only become more culturally competent, but also develop skills in structural competency.

That means being prepared to play a role in dismantling the inequities embedded within our social structures, including addressing the impact of upstream factors (poverty, poor public infrastructure, etc.) on the mental health of Black and other marginalized populations.

Addressing racial trauma experienced by Black people also demands an analysis that appreciates racism's inter-generational and multifaceted features.

This analysis would examine how racism not only manifests itself over generations, but also at different levels, such as through everyday interactions between people (individual racism), within institutions (institutional racism), or through cultural dominance (cultural racism).

Challenging legacies

For too long, efforts to address disparities between Black and white people in education, labor, employment, health and other social structures have focused on attributing these disparities to pathologies presumed to be inherent to Black culture and Black people.

Instead, these efforts must be focused on identifying, dismantling and resolving the pathologies embedded within these social structures and peeling back the systems of power that impact mental health and well-being in Black communities.

Resolving structural pathologies that harm Black people must be accompanied by a willingness to understand and appreciate the complexities of Black life, Black trauma and Black responses to trauma that may appear maladaptive to many, but that are normal and natural responses to racism's intergenerational, multi-faceted and multilevel manifestations.

Finally, resolving Black trauma must involve challenging the colonial and imperial legacies that reside within psychiatry and other mental health professions. The Conversation
