(Editor's Note): The following are excerpts from Mayor Cavalier Johnson's recent 'State of the City' address, in which the mayor reported the accomplishments of city government for its residents—especially in the reduction of crime—while laying out the future goals and challenges Milwaukee still faces.

To the honored guests, elected officials, fellow residents and to all who join us this (Monday) morning, welcome.

Our city is resting upon a solid foundation, supported by hardworking residents, and rising to new heights.

I am gratified by the work that has brought us to this point, and motivated to accomplish even more.

We have gathered in a remarkable

new facility, a convention center built to welcome visitors and, more importantly, to spur economic growth.

As you can see, the Baird Center is a beautiful building, filled with contemporary technology and flexible spaces.

When it opened less than a year ago, the Baird Center doubled our convention capacity, welcoming more and more meetings, trade shows, and expositions with expectations of attracting 100,000 additional visitors each year.

More visitors equal more spending which is good for the city and the entire state of Wisconsin.

As we grow our hospitality industry, we are creating jobs. We are sustaining Milwaukee families and improving our entire economy.

At the forefront of this effort was the Presidential nominating convention our city hosted last July.

The Baird Center was a major part

of that event. We showed the nation—in fact, we showed the world—that Milwaukee is an ideal location to stage a gathering on a huge scale.

As I said from the outset, hosting a major party convention was not, in any way, a political statement.

No, our goals were purely economic. We had a successful week displaying our capabilities and our facilities in a way that will surely pay dividends for many years to come.

When it comes to reducing crime and violence, I insist on a two-pronged approach. I want accountability for those who break the law and I want robust prevention to keep Milwaukee young people on a positive path. Accountability and Prevention. That is the strategy that is producing results.

For three straight years, violent crime is down in Milwaukee. In each of the last three years, property crime

Gov. Evers highlights proposal to audit health insurance companies, expand access to affordable healthcare

MADISON — Gov. Tony Evers has been traveling around the state this week highlighting initiatives in his recently announced 2025-27 Executive Budget that make sweeping changes to the healthcare industry.

The changes includes several key initiatives to crack down on health insurance companies, while proposing to make Wisconsin the first state in America to start auditing insurance companies over denying Wisconsin's healthcare claims, ensuring Wisconsinites can get the healthcare they need when and where they need it—quicker and closer to home—and once again proposes expanding access to quality, affordable healthcare coverage.

The governor's visits come as Republicans in Washington are poised to cut funding for Medicaid, a critical tool that more than 1 million Wisconsinites utilize, including seniors, pregnant mothers, kids, and individuals with disabilities.

According to the Center for American Progress, if the Republican-led congress pass the current resolution, Wisconsin could lose over \$13 billion from the federal government over the decade, blowing a hole in the state's biennial budget.

Additionally, according to KFF, to cover the costs of lost federal revenue, Wisconsin would need to cover a projected additional \$5.8 billion of state investment over the decade to ensure folks continue to have healthcare, which KFF suggests could cause states to resort to resources to be reduced, taxes increased, or programs cut, and if the state doesn't cover the lost revenue could leave over 200,000 Wisconsinites without coverage.

"Far too many Wisconsinites feel the pressure of rising healthcare costs and feel like they're not getting a fair

shake from the healthcare industry.

"My budget cracks down on health insurance companies and prescription price gouging, lowers out-of-pocket healthcare costs from medication to insulin, and aims to reduce wait times and get Wisconsinites healthcare closer to home. It's about making sure our families, kids, seniors, and communities are getting the healthcare they need when and where they need it," said Gov. Evers. "Quality, affordable healthcare should not be a privilege afforded

only to the healthy and the wealthy.

"We have to do more to make sure Wisconsinites can access the care they need, keep the healthcare they have, and receive the coverage they pay for. Period."

Gov. Evers is proposing solutions to address the frustrating challenges Wisconsinites face with sweeping changes to the healthcare industry in Wisconsin:

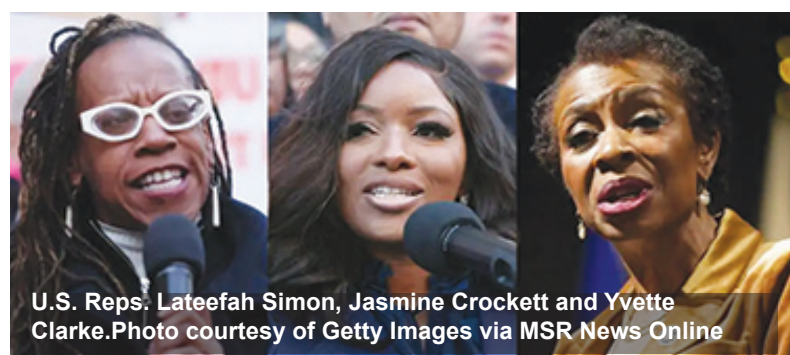
Gov. Evers is proposing to make Wisconsin the first state in America to start auditing insurance companies over denying Wisconsinites' healthcare claims. If an insurance company is denying Wisconsinites' claims too often, the state is going to audit them.

The governor also proposes creating an office that, for the first time in state history, would be devoted to helping Wisconsinites hold health insurers accountable and ensuring folks get the health insurance coverage they pay for.

Gov. Evers is proposing to create new standards to expand the healthcare services and procedures that insurance companies are required to cover.

This means more healthcare services and procedures will be covered by Wisconsinites' health insurance auto-

Black women, in particular, are at the forefront of this resistance, standing firm against Trump's harmful policies and ensuring their voices are heard.

Rising Leaders in the Congressional Black Caucus

Ahead of Trump's speech, members of the

is down, too. The biggest year-over-year changes in 2024 came in homicides and non-fatal shootings; both categories were more than 20% down from the previous year.

Milwaukee is demonstrably safer with fewer crimes and fewer victims of crime. That success is no reason to let up. When it comes to accountability, the city's efforts are led by the men and women of the Milwaukee Police Department.

My budgets are investing more in police personnel, aiming to add to the number of officers. Like cities across the country, Milwaukee is facing some recruiting challenges, and we are working hard to meet the staffing benchmarks laid out in state law.

Both Earn and Learn and Camp Rise offer young people information, guidance, and exposure to productive work – with real paychecks. Earn and Learn is work experience for teens and people in their early twenties. Over the years, tens-of-thousands of work opportunities have been offered.

Camp Rise is a unique program where we engage an even younger cohort of children with programming and service opportunities. And participants receive a stipend. I am not aware of any similar program – introducing kids to work – at such a young age anywhere else in the country.

When it comes to prevention, everyone needs to be part of the solution. Everyone needs to take part in making Milwaukee safer. I've asked teachers, preachers, business people, neighbors, relatives, and, especially, parents to step up.

On our streets, Milwaukee is safer, too. Fatalities on our roadways are down. We are making that a priority through our multifaceted Vision Zero effort. Education, yes. Legislative changes, yes. Enforcement, yes. And, physical changes to our streets, yes.

We have been measuring the effectiveness of traffic calming projects. It's clear; traffic calming is reducing the number of drivers who speed – and dramatically reducing the excessive speeding on the improved roadways.

Reckless driving undermines our safety. It is a direct affront to our sense of civility. Reckless driving must be brought under control, and we are making solid progress on our efforts to do so.

I want strength in our housing options, too. That's why I support comprehensive updates to our residential zoning rules.

Growing MKE is the product of listening and understanding the challenges. Renters, homeowners, and those left out of realistic housing options all have issues with the status quo.

The Growing MKE Plan aims to increase housing options across the city, support walkable urban neighborhoods, and complement City plans for housing affordability and environmental sustainability.

Can we increase homeownership? Can we affect the forces that drive rents higher and higher? Can we allow families to add a new residence to their property to accommodate an aging parent or a child moving back home? I believe the answers are yes.

With Growing MKE, we could see increased residential options along the city's commercial corridors adding new vitality and strength there.

We are working with Common Council members, including Alderman Mark Chambers and Alderwoman JoCasta Zamarripa, to advance Growing MKE. And, I'm hopeful we can make progress.

It's a fact, Milwaukee is in a battle to retain the talent we have and attract

new talent. I'm here to tell you we will lose out to other cities that are advancing innovative change if we allow the status quo to persist.

The price of rent and homeownership have climbed in recent years, so the cost of housing is an increasing expense in family budgets. For example, a recent study of fifty cities ranked Milwaukee 30th in the country – tied with New York City – on rental affordability for a minimum wage worker. We shouldn't be that expensive.

My administration is thoughtfully exploring ways the city can address the high cost of housing.

City government has long supported the development of housing for our lowest-income residents. What's changing is our willingness to support middle-market housing. We are finalizing a framework under which city support, including tax incremental financing, might be deployed to spur more workforce housing developments.

I recently convened a meeting of business leaders, and one executive told me their workers love Milwaukee. They want to be in the city and live in the city, but cannot afford to do so. I want to capture every business, every job, and every employee as a city resident because Milwaukee is a great place to call home. It's where you belong. That's why, as was recently reported in the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel, 30,000 people moved to our city in the last couple of years – adding to my goal of growing our population.

As more housing choices are available, the pressure on housing costs in our city can be lessened.

I am seriously troubled by the threats and interruptions to our fiscal partnerships with Washington. Hundreds of city staff, and numerous non-profit

agencies are funded, at least in part, by federal grants. Rescinding those grants can have devastating effects that we are working to avoid.

Our relationship with Madison is far more stable. The Governor's budget proposal includes some provisions that, if approved by the legislature, would benefit Milwaukee. There's a long process ahead for Wisconsin's biennial fiscal plan, and I will engage with lawmakers defending the interests of Milwaukee in the months ahead.

I have even more concern about what's happening in all Milwaukee schools. The classroom achievements of this city's children must improve. Milwaukee's future – our economic future, our social future, and our safety future, all rely on the knowledge and abilities of students currently in school.

No matter if it's public, private, or charter schools, we must produce graduates who can read proficiently, who can solve problems, and who can lead in organizations, businesses, community, and government.

Improvements in education are good for Milwaukee and good for the state of Wisconsin.

Your youngest residents have the potential. Like so many here, I started, stayed, and succeeded at MPS before it was a cool slogan. I see the same potential every day as an MPS parent. So many of our partners see the potential in our kids, too.

I am pleased the MPS School Board has selected a new superintendent, Dr. Brenda Cassellius. We have already had some positive discussions, and I feel she is ready to move MPS forward. The new superintendent has a track record of building community engagement and success. I share her view that we

have both an opportunity and an obligation to address what is not working at MPS.

Education is so important to our city that I am inviting Superintendent Cassellius to work more closely with the members of my cabinet. She knows I will be a partner, an advocate, and a participant in the work to improve our schools. I want to pursue that work with every interested party who shares the goal of improving MPS and education, overall, in Milwaukee.

In recent weeks, the Milwaukee Health Department has identified some MPS schools with lead hazards.

The department has issued orders and raised broader concerns. Look, learning environments must be safe. Cleanup, remediation, and ongoing maintenance have to be conducted with lead-safe procedures. There are no acceptable excuses. The legacy of lead paint has harmed too many children in Milwaukee, and under no circumstances can lead harm students in school.

We are working to eliminate even the smallest potential lead exposure by accelerating the replacement of lead service lines delivering water to homes in Milwaukee. The Milwaukee Water Works replaced 2,700 such lines in 2024, the most we have ever replaced in a year. We prioritize neighborhoods with a combination of factors including a higher incidence of childhood lead exposure. The work continues this year with a target of 35-hundred lead service lines replaced, and we are aiming to meet the ten-year goal we have set for fully replacing all lead laterals.

We are making important investments in infrastructure – investments that are making Milwaukee stronger and increasing sustainability.

City government's finances are far stronger than they have been in past

years. That's not to say we are well-off; our budgets will be particularly tight headed into the next years. However, we are not facing imminent fiscal disaster that was looming over City Hall just two years ago.

The sales tax collections have exceeded the initial Comptroller prediction by more than \$10-million. That adds to the stability of our pension obligations.

Let me close with this:

We are a stronger city with an economy that is keeping our residents employed. Businesses in Milwaukee continue to hire and our unemployment rate remains relatively low. We are investing in Milwaukee so that we are well situated for the challenges ahead.

We are a strong city, rich with cultural and entertainment advantages. The performing arts we host in Milwaukee are the finest in the region. Our museums are amazing. And, our sports teams compete right along with the best.

Our natural advantages make Milwaukee strong, as well. We are blessed with a Great Lake and three rivers, waterways that offer both recreation and a particularly valuable resource, water.

What truly makes Milwaukee strong is our people. Our residents work hard; they're making our city stronger. They are invested here, improving neighborhoods, raising families, participating in church activities and in community organizations. Our residents will sustain Milwaukee's strength. That has been the case for nearly 180-years, since our incorporation as a municipality. And, it will certainly be the case for the 180 years ahead.

Target Takes a Hit: \$12.4 Billion Wiped Out

Target Corporation's stock plummeted by approximately \$27.27 per share by the end of February, erasing about \$12.4 billion in market value.

The drop came on February 28, the designated economic blackout day, and coincided with mounting backlash over the retailer's decision to abandon its diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) commitments.

The National Newspaper Publishers Association (NNPA) has taken action through its Public Education and Selective Buying Campaign. NNPA President and CEO Dr. Benjamin F. Chavis Jr. said, "Black consumers helped build Target into a retail giant, and now they are making their voices heard. If corporations believe they can roll back diversity commitments without consequence, they are mistaken."

Reverend Jamal Bryant, pastor of New Birth Missionary Baptist Church in Georgia, has led calls for a "40-Day Target Fast," urging Black consumers to withhold their spending at the retailer.

"Black people spend \$12 million a day at Target," Bryant said. "If we withhold our dollars, we can make a statement that cannot be ignored."

The NAACP also issued a Black Consumer Advisory in response to Target's DEI rollback, warning Black consumers about corporate retreat from diversity initiatives.

The advisory urges them to support businesses that remain committed to investing in Black communities.

Target is also facing legal battles. Shareholders have filed lawsuits challenging the company's DEI policies, arguing that the com-

mitments hurt financial performance. Meanwhile, conservative groups have sued over Target's diversity efforts, claiming they discriminated against white employees and other groups.

"Consumers have the power to demand change, and Target is learning that lesson the hard way," Chavis said. —Article by Stacy Brown, NNPA/BlackPressUSA

Congressional Black Caucus (CBC) gathered to strategize on how to confront the rising tide of Trump's executive actions.

These actions have led to job losses, cuts to essential programs, and attacks on civil rights and equity initiatives. The CBC's Black women leaders are uniting to fight back and ensure that these regressive measures do not succeed.

Rep. Yvette Clarke (D-N.Y.), chair of the CBC, was vocal in her commitment to opposing Trump's policies.

She declared, "There are members [of the CBC]... with diverse constituencies, and we plan to confront Donald Trump, whether it's in the chambers of the House of Representatives or on the streets of America."

With unwavering resolve, Clarke and her colleagues are ready to stand in the way of any measures that threaten the well-being of their communities.

The Impact of Women's History Month

Trump's speech came during Women's History Month, an especially symbolic time for Black women in Congress, who continue to challenge his administration's actions.

Their leadership is critical to shaping the resistance, as they push back against policies that disproportionately affect Black communities and people of color.

Rep. Lateefah Simon (D-Calif.) took the opportunity to deliver a prebttal to Trump's address, speaking on behalf of the progressive Working Families Party.

Alongside Simon, leaders like Rep. Maxine Waters (D-Calif.), Rep. Jasmine Crockett (D-Texas), and Rep. Lauren Underwood (D-Ill.) have actively protested Trump's actions, particularly his mass firings and efforts to dismantle critical services. These leaders have stepped up to amplify the voices of their constituents, ensuring their concerns are heard.

A Fight for the People

In just six weeks, Trump's administration has made sweep-

ing cuts that affect thousands of federal workers and threaten vital programs. Policies aimed at cutting healthcare, pushing for mass deportations, and undermining government stability are being challenged by the CBC and other resistance movements.

Trump's ongoing trade war with China and other countries further complicates the situation, and his attacks on civil rights programs are being contested in the courts.

Rep. Simon spoke to theGrio, emphasizing the toll these policies are taking on marginalized communities.

She warned that Trump's actions would lead to a country that is "sicker" and "poorer." For many Black women, who

are not just fighting for themselves but for future generations who deserve a fair and just society.

Empowered and Unyielding Leadership

Rep. Simon, along with her colleagues in the CBC, is proud to be part of this resistance movement. The leadership of House Minority Leader Rep. Hakeem Jeffries (D-N.Y.) has been instrumental in empowering these women to take center stage in the battle against Trump's agenda.

Jeffries has encouraged freshmen Democrats like Simon to step up and speak out, helping them find their place in the fight for justice.

In response to Trump's address, several CBC members, including Rep. Crockett, took part in the 24-hour livestream event "State of the People," a direct challenge to the president's words. This virtual event presented a stark contrast to Trump's speech, amplifying the voices of those who refuse to be silenced by his policies.

Black Women Leading the Charge

Aimee Allison, the founder of She The People, an organization that empowers women of color in politics, praised Black women like Rep. Simon and Rep. Crockett for their steadfast leadership. She pointed out that while many Democrats are still trying to find their footing, Black women in Congress are meeting the moment with clarity and purpose.

"It's the role that we have played historically, and we're meeting the moment in a way a lot of other people won't or can't," Allison said.

The leadership of Black women in Congress is not just a moment of resistance—it's a movement that continues to build power and fight for the communities that have long been overlooked and underestimated.

As these women stand strong against the Trump administration, they are showing the world what it means to lead with resilience, courage, and unyielding strength.

have long been excluded from political power in the U.S., this moment represents a call not only to hold Trump accountable but to fight for justice and equality on every front.

Despite this disappointment, Rep. Summer Lee (D-Pa.) urged Black women to continue building the political power needed for future victories. She said, "We're building for them," referring to Black girls and boys who deserve a future free from state violence and environmental harm.

Lee spoke to the "ancestral courage" within Black women, acknowledging the history of resistance and strength that has always defined their activism.

matically—no delays, no hassle, no questions asked. (It also) helps to make sure Wisconsinites can get the healthcare they need when and where they need it—quicker and closer to home—by enabling the creation of statewide standards for maximum wait times for scheduling appointments.

Gov. Evers also proposes to make sure the services healthcare insurance companies cover are available within a minimum time and distance of the Wisconsinite buying their health plan.

Gov. Evers also proposes cracking down on surprise medical bills and the healthcare industry sending unpaid medical bills to collections or reporting to credit bureaus. Gov. Evers' plan would require health providers to give Wisconsinites notice of unpaid medical bills and would give Wisconsinites a six-month grace period by banning healthcare providers from reporting unpaid medical debt to collections or credit bureaus during that time.

No one should be in a mental health crisis wondering whether insurance will cover an in-patient stay to get help.

Gov. Evers also proposes banning health insurance companies from requiring pre-approval for in-patient mental health services so Wisconsinites in crisis can be safe and get life-saving care.

As part of Gov. Evers' plan to lower out-of-pocket costs for working families, make healthcare more affordable, and crack down on price gouging, Gov. Evers, during his state of the state address, announced his "Less for Rx" plan to lower prescription drug prices, improve oversight of drug companies, and protect consumers from price gouging on their medications, including removing the sales tax on over-the-counter medications, which would save Wisconsinites a projected \$70 million over the next two years, setting price ceilings for prescriptions,

capping the cost of insulin copays to \$35, and protecting Wisconsinites from price gouging on prescriptions.

Other highlights of the proposal: **LOWERING OUT-OF-POCKET COSTS FOR HIGH-QUALITY HEALTHCARE COVERAGE, HOLDING INSURANCE COMPANIES ACCOUNTABLE, AND IMPROVING INSURANCE TRANSPARENCY**

Gov. Evers believes healthcare should not be a privilege afforded only to the healthy and the wealthy. No one should ever have to choose between life-saving medication and care or putting food on the table and keeping a

roof over their head.

Wisconsinites should be able to get the healthcare they need when and where they need it and without breaking the bank, but too many Wisconsinites feel like they are not getting a fair shake when it comes to healthcare. Gov. Evers wants to change that.

The governor's budget takes bold new steps to hold health insurers accountable, protect consumers, prevent price gouging, and help Wisconsinites afford everyday, out-of-pocket costs.

EXPANDING ACCESS TO QUALITY, AFFORDABLE HEALTHCARE

Finally, as he has in his last three executive budgets, Gov. Evers is once again proposing to expand BadgerCare to provide quality, affordable healthcare coverage to more than 95,000 low-income Wisconsinites, while saving the state \$1.9 billion and drawing down an additional \$2.5 billion in federal funding over the biennium.

According to data from KFF, more than 1 million Wisconsinites, or roughly 20 percent of the state's total population, were enrolled in Medicaid as of August 2024, by with Medicaid covering one in seven adults between the ages of 19 and 64, one in three kids, four in seven nursing home residents, one in six Medicare beneficiaries, and one in three people with disabilities.

Studies have shown that in states that have expanded Medicaid, more people have access to healthcare, more people are able to use preventive health care services, and patients see improved health outcomes, more people are able to access treatment for mental health or substance use disorder challenges, and states with Medicaid expansion have seen a significant decrease in their mortality rates.

Further, analysis from KFF indicates that rural hospitals in states that have not expanded their Medicaid programs under the ACA fared worse financially than those in states that have expanded Medicaid, with median operating margins for rural hospitals being consistently higher in states that have expanded Medicaid programs than in non-expansion states from July 2017 to June 2022.

According to a Marquette Law School Poll, more than 70 percent of Wisconsinites think the state should accept federal funds to expand Medicaid, but despite this fact, currently, Wisconsin is only one of 10 states in the country and the only state of its Midwest neighbors that has not yet expanded Medicaid.
